MINUTES OF AN OPEN MEETING OF THE FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION THURSDAY, DECEMBER 16, 2010

Chairman Matthew S. Petersen called the Federal Election Commission to order in an open meeting at 10:36 A.M. on Thursday, December 16, 2010, with a quorum present.

I. CORRECTION AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Petersen recognized Vice Chair Bauerly, who

MOVED to approve Agenda Documents No. 10-79 and 10-80, the minutes for the meetings of November 18 and December 2, 2010.

The motion carried on a vote of 6-0 with Commissioners Bauerly,

Hunter, McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively.

II. DRAFT ADVISORY OPINION 2010-29

Working Families Party of Oregon by Cathy Highet, Esq.

<u>Agenda Document No. 10-77</u> Circulated December 10, 2010 (Submitted Late)

Chairman Petersen recognized Vice Chair Bauerly who

MOVED to suspend the rules on the timely submission of documents so that the Commission may consider Agenda Documents No. 10-77, 10-78, 10-78-A and 10-81.

The motion carried on a vote of 6-0 with Commissioners Bauerly, Hunter, McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively.

Chairman Petersen recognized Ms. Jessica Selinkoff of the General Counsel's Office who presented the draft advisory opinion concerning the application of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and Commission regulations to the status of the Working Families Party of Oregon as a State committee of a political party.

Chairman Petersen recognized Vice Chair Bauerly who

MOVED approval of Agenda Document No. 10-77, the draft of Advisory Opinion 2010-29, and authorize the General Counsel's Office to make technical and conforming changes.

The motion carried on a vote of 6-0 with Commissioners Bauerly,

Hunter, McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively.

III. DRAFT ADVISORY OPINION 2010-30

Citizens United by Michael Boos, Esq.

<u>Agenda Document No. 10-78-A (Draft B)</u> Circulated December 10, 2010 (Submitted Late)

The Chairman noted that counsel, Mr. Michael Boos, was present to answer any questions the Commission may have during the discussion.

Chairman Petersen recognized Ms. Esther Heiden of the General Counsel's Office who presented the draft advisory opinion concerning the application of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and Commission regulations to the rental of email lists to Federal candidates, political party committees, and political committees. A discussion followed.

Chairman Petersen recognized Commissioner Hunter who MOVED to approve Agenda Document No. 10-78, known as Draft A.

<u>The motion failed on a vote of 3-3</u> with Commissioners Hunter, McGahn, and Petersen voting affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Bauerly, Walther and Weintraub dissented.

Chairman Petersen recognized Vice Chair Bauerly who

MOVED to approve Agenda Document No. 10-78-A, Draft B in Advisory Opinion 2010-30.

<u>The motion failed on a vote of 3-3</u> with Commissioners Bauerly,

Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Hunter, McGahn and Petersen dissented.

Chairman Petersen instructed the General Counsel's Office to issue the appropriate letter to the requestor that the Commission was able to reach consensus on responses to the questions concerning coordinated expenditures and coordinated communications but was not able to approve a response concerning corporate facilitation by the required four affirmative votes.

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Chairman Petersen recognized Commissioner Weintraub who noted

that three audit reports were not on the agenda and hoped that any

differences could be resolved so the Commission could move forward on

these matters.

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IV. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

A. <u>Election of Chair</u>

Chairman Petersen recognized Commissioner Hunter who

MOVED to elect Vice Chair Cynthia L. Bauerly to serve as Chair of the Federal Election Commission for 2011.

Chairman Petersen recognized Commissioner Walther who

seconded the nomination.

The motion carried on a vote of 5-0 with Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the

decision. Commissioner Bauerly did not vote.

B. <u>Election of Vice Chair</u>

Chairman Petersen recognized Commissioner Weintraub who

MOVED to elect Commissioner Caroline C. Hunter to serve as Vice Chair of the Federal Election Commission for the year 2011.

The motion carried on a vote of 5-0 with Commissioners Bauerly,

McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the

decision. Commissioner Hunter did not vote.

V. <u>2011 MEETING DATES</u>

Chairman Petersen recognized Vice Chair Bauerly who

MOVED to approve Agenda Document No. 10-81.

The motion carried on a vote of 6-0 with Commissioners Bauerly,

Hunter, McGahn, Petersen, Walther and Weintraub voting affirmatively
