order in an open meeting at 2:05 P.M. on Thursday, March 7, 2013 with a

quorum present.

Chair Weintraub recognized Mr. Neven Stipanovic of the General

Counsel's Office who presented an update on the status of the petition for

rulemaking submitted by the Center for Individual Freedom. The

Commission published a notice of availability in the Federal Register on

October 26, 2012 seeking public comment and received three comments.

Mr. Kevin Deeley of the General Counsel's Office participated in the

discussion that followed.

Chair Weintraub recognized Vice Chairman McGahn who

MOVED to initiate a rulemaking based on the Petition for Rulemaking to Update 11 C.F.R. § 104.20(c)(8)and (c)(9) filed by the Center for Individual Freedom on October 5, 2012, and instruct the Office of the General Counsel to draft a direct final rule to strike "pursuant to 11 C.F.R. 114.15" from 11 C.F.R. § 104.20(c)(8) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.20(c)(9).

The motion failed by a vote of 3-2 with Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, and Petersen voting affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners

Walther and Weintraub dissented.

Chair Weintraub recognized Commissioner Walther who

MOVED to dismiss the Petition for Rulemaking.

The motion failed by a vote of 2-3 with Commissioners Walther and

Weintraub voting affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, and Petersen dissented.

Chair Weintraub recognized Commissioner Walther who

MOVED to direct the Office of the General Counsel to draft a notice of disposition pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 200.4(b) and include a summary of the statements expressed by the Commissioners.

General Counsel Anthony Herman and Mr. Kevin Deeley of the

General Counsel's Office participated in the discussion that followed.

The meeting recessed at 2:28 P.M. and reconvened at 2:50 P.M. with

a quorum present.

General Counsel Herman and Mr. Kevin Deeley of the General

Counsel's Office participated in the discussion that continued.

Chair Weintraub recognized Commissioner Walther who

MOVED to continue this discussion in executive session pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 2.4(b)(7) and to determine, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 2.7(d), that business so requires and no public announcement was possible.

The motion carried by a vote of 5-0 with Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, Petersen, Walther, and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the

decision.

executive session. The open meeting reconvened at 3:48 P.M. with a

quorum present to resume discussion on the Petition for Rulemaking.

The motion carried by a vote of 5-0 with Commissioners Hunter,

McGahn, Petersen, Walther, and Weintraub voting affirmatively for the

decision.
