

SUBJECT: Closing the file in MUR 1135

On May 26, 1981, the Commission accepted a conciliation agreement signed by Bryan E. Sharratt, counsel for the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee"). However, the file remained open in this matter pending the Committee's compliance with the provisions of the agreement, i.e, the return of the corporate and national bank contributions and the submittal to the Commission of front and back copies of the return checks in accordance with Paragraph VI, the payment of a \$500 civil penalty in accordance with Paragraph VII, and the fulfillment of these requirements within thirty days in accordance with Paragraph XI.

The respondent mailed a check in full payment of the civil penalty less than one month after receiving the Commission's notification that the agreement had been accepted. However, the Committee has had difficulty in submitting front and back copies of the return checks because the corporations have not deposited the checks promptly. Thus far, we have received front and back copies of twenty-six return checks out of the thirty-six return checks drafted in accordance with the agreement. On September 17, 1981, we received a letter from the Committee office manager stating that she had visited "all of the remaining companies concerned" and that these companies have agreed to deposit their checks. She also wrote that the Committee will continue to check with its bank and obtain copies of the remaining checks as they come in. (See Attachment 1).

In light of the fact that the penalty has been paid and the fact that copies of almost three-quarters of the return checks have been submitted, and in light of the assurance that the remainder of the checks will be submitted, the General Counsel recommends that the Commission close the file in this matter.

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. Reason to believe was found that the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) by accepting contributions from corporations.

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission and the Committee, having entered into informal conciliation, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Committee and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of a conciliation agreement under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. The Committee has been a registered political committee since 1972.

2. The Committee did not establish separate federal and non-federal accounts until February 8, 1979.

3. The Committee issued a booklet for the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Convention. In 1978, the Committee received contributions totalling \$250 from national banks and \$2,405 from corporations in the form of payments for advertising space in the booklet.

4. Political committees are prohibited by 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) from accepting contributions from national banks and corporations.

WHEREFORE, the Committee agrees:

V. The Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) by accepting contributions from national banks and corporations.

VI. The Committee will return the contributions listed on Attachment A to the appropriate national bank or corporation. The Committee will send copies of both sides of the cancelled return checks to the Commission.

VII. The Committee will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondent shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

GENERAL CONDITIONS


IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review

compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. It is mutually agreed that this agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.



On March 9, May 1, and September 14, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) in connection with its acceptance of contributions from corporations and national banks in 1978. These contributions came in the form of payments for advertising space in the Committee's 1978 Convention booklet. On January 7, 1980, this matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel.

After continuous correspondence between this office and the Committee treasurer and persons operating at his direction, the Commission, on October 30, 1980, directed this office to send a letter to the treasurer informing him of the opportunity to conciliate this matter informally. On November 11, 1980, the treasurer sent a response requesting that the Commission and the Committee enter into informal conciliation. (See Attachment 1). However, before proceeding to draft a proposed conciliation agreement, this office determined that it was necessary to ascertain the exact amount of national bank and corporate contributions received by the Committee. While we had first determined, based on the receipts sent by the Committee, that \$2,585 in contributions were received for such sources, a final review of the convention booklet revealed that there were seventeen advertisements not accounted for by receipts. Thus, this office asked the Committee to determine whether or not payment had been received. After an extensive search, the Committee determined that no

contributions were received for these advertisements.  
(See Attachment 2). 1/

Attached is a conciliation agreement which the  
General Counsel recommends be sent to the Committee.  
(See Attachment 3).

Recommendations

The General Counsel recommends that the Commission  
approve the attached conciliation agreement and letter  
to be sent to the treasurer of the Wyoming Democratic  
State Central Committee.





This matter involves the acceptance by the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") of contributions from corporations and national banks in the form of purchases of advertising space in the program booklet of the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Convention. On March 9, May 1, and September 14, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) in connection with the acceptance of these contributions. On January 7, 1980, this matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel. After continuous communication between this office and the Committee treasurer and persons operating at his direction, the Commission, on October 30, 1980, directed this office to send a letter to the treasurer informing him of the opportunity to conciliate this matter informally. On November 11, 1980, the treasurer sent a response requesting that the Commission and the Committee enter into informal conciliation.

This office is in the process of drafting a conciliation agreement that includes a requirement that the Committee return all of the prohibited contributions to their original sources. Attached to the agreement will be a list of all of the prohibited

sources and the amount received from each source. A re-examination of the available data reveals that there may have been corporate contributions in addition to those counted at the time of the First General Counsel's Report, and we are communicating with the Committee treasurer in order to determine the additional corporate sources. After obtaining this information, we will report to the Commission with a memorandum containing a proposed conciliation agreement.

I hereby request, on behalf of the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee, to enter into the process of informal conciliation prior to a Commission finding of probable cause. 

Dear Mr. Smith:

I appreciate your contacting me by phone earlier this week concerning your investigation of the above-referenced portion of our previous receipts of contributions and subsequent reports. Although I was appointed to my position as Treasurer last September and subsequently elected to that same position in December, I was not personally aware of these irregularities or the extent of previous concern and correspondence.

It is my understanding now that the ads sold for the program at the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Convention involved some contributions from corporations, national banks, or other prohibited contributors. Investigation into this matter and a determination of the amounts involved is complicated by the fact that your office has computed the total contributions based on the number and size of ads at \$6,570, our estimation using a similar technique is \$6,151, and the receipt books show a total of only \$5,171. While contributions over \$100 were initially itemized and we can easily determine which of these were improper contributions, the remainder of the ads were under \$100 each, were not itemized, and we appear to have only the receipt book and the appearance of the ad itself from which to determine the probable source of the contribution.

I have not been able yet to personally review all the previous correspondence concerning this matter, but I have had our new secretary pull out as much of the information as possible and have discussed it with her at great length. She is today sending you under separate cover from our Casper office a complete copy of the receipt books which recorded each contribution for the program. I hope that this will provide sufficient information from which we can all agree on the extent of irregular contributions.

Once this determination is made, I would propose that we immediately arrange for corrective action in the form of transfers from our Federal account and a return of contributions at least to the national banks. I would propose that the Central Committee then determine the advisability of actually returning all other contributions to the original contributors. I understand that this

remedial action does not in any way prevent the Commission from proceeding against the Party on account of these alleged violations, but I would hope that the Commission would consider that the original error was inadvertent and that these actions are being taken now in a good faith effort to remedy the situation to every extent possible.

I would also like to offer for consideration by the Commission all evidence that we may have in our records concerning the disposition of the proceeds of the contributions for ads in the program, as I believe that for the most part these funds were consumed by the total expenses of the convention for which they were being solicited and most or all of the remaining funds were spent for state-related activities. Although again I realize that this does not excuse the acceptance of improper donations, I believe the Commission might consider that the effect of the expenditure of those funds on any Federal election contest or other activity was minimal. I will, by copy of this letter, request that our present office manager attempt to determine from our records how much was spent for the publication of the program, as well as how much of the net proceeds from the sale of ads in the program was spent on other direct convention expenses. We will then attempt to determine how much of the remaining funds were spent for other state-related activities.

I will also, by copy of this letter, solicit comments from the previous treasurers and office managers concerning the existence and identification of any other records that might help us to determine the extent of any improper contributions and any other corrective action that we might be able to take.

With the hope that this information will be of assistance to you in your investigation, and with a commitment to working with you and the Commission to comply with all FEC laws and regulations, take whatever corrective action may be recommended, and bring this unfortunate situation to a mutually acceptable determination, I am


1. The amount of registration fees that were received.

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

On March 9, May 1, and September 14, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) in connection with its acceptance of contributions from corporations and national banks in 1978. The Committee was notified of the Commission's determinations on these dates and given an opportunity to demonstrate that no further action should be taken in this matter.

On January 7, 1980, this matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel and was numbered Matter Under Review ("MUR") 1135. Please refer to this number in all future correspondence.

As you know, this office has received information from you and from individuals operating at your direction as to the circumstances surrounding these contributions and their subsequent use. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(3), the General Counsel may recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with formal conciliation. However, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through informal conciliation prior to a Commission finding of probable cause if you indicate to this office by letter that you wish to enter into such a process. Moreover, we ask that you submit any further information which you may consider to be relevant. Please submit your request for informal conciliation and any information you may wish to provide to us within ten days of your receipt of this letter.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On January 7, 1980, the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") was referred to the Office of General Counsel (OGC) by the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) for receipt of contributions from corporations and national banks in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a).

BACKGROUND AND INVESTIGATION

In April, 1977, RAD sent a surface violation letter to the Committee because it had reported the receipt of \$120 in July, 1976, from a corporation. The Committee promptly responded that the \$120 was not a contribution but, instead, represented payment for an advertisement in the Committee's 1976 state convention program booklet. The Committee attached a document showing the amount collected from all advertisement sales, the cost of the program booklet, and the distribution of the remainder (\$710) to the county committees. No further action was taken until July, 1978, when RAD sent another surface violation letter because the Committee reported the receipt of contributions totalling \$390 in June, 1976, from two corporations and a labor organization. The Committee again responded that these were advertisement

sales for the 1976 state convention program booklet. RAD took no further action on the 1976 contributions.

On September 13, 1978, a surface violation letter was sent to the Committee because its 1978 July 10 Report disclosed the receipt of \$290 from two corporations. On March 9, 1979, another surface violation letter was sent because the 1978 10 Day Pre-Primary Report disclosed the receipt of another \$820 from six more corporations. On March 9, 1979, and May 1, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee had violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b based upon its failure to respond to the two surface violation letters.

Following the two RTB letters, the Committee's office manager called RAD to state that the corporate receipts represented advertisement sales for the program booklet for the 1978 State Democratic Convention (held on May 13 and 14, 1978). While the Committee did not maintain separate federal and non-federal accounts at the time of the convention, it did establish separate accounts on February 8, 1979. Therefore, RAD advised the office manager to transfer the appropriate amount into the non-federal account in order to, in effect, purge the federal account of the corporate money. The office manager stated that the Committee had "money problems" which precluded such a transfer at that time. Two days later, RAD called the office manager and advised her of AO 1978-46 (Republican Party of Texas) which dealt specifically with advertisements in a state convention booklet. RAD also requested a copy of the convention booklet.

The office manager promptly sent a copy of the booklet and stated that, if the corporate receipts were determined to be improper, the amount in question would be transferred to the non-federal account. The office manager also asked for patience and inquired whether or not installments would be acceptable.

On July 19, 1979, RAD sent a surface violation letter stating that the Committee's 1978 10 Day Pre-Primary Report disclosed the receipt of \$125 from each of two national banks. The letter also noted that several businesses advertised in the booklet but that some of the advertisement payments did not appear in the Committee's reports. On September 14, 1979, the Commission notified the Committee that it had found reason to believe that the Committee had violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b based upon its failure to respond to the July 19 surface violation letter. On October 22, 1979, RAD telephoned the Committee. During the phone conversation, the Committee admitted that the bank receipts had also been for convention advertising. RAD advised the Committee to refund the money and notify the Commission.

On January 7, 1980, this matter was referred to OGC. (See Attachment 1). On January 22, an OGC staff member contacted Bryan Sharratt, the new Treasurer of the Committee, in order to clear up questions as to the amount of advertisement proceeds received and reported and the sources of unitemized contributions (i.e., payments from advertisement purchasers whose names appeared in the program booklet but whose contributions were not itemized in the Committee reports). Mr. Sharratt agreed to review the Committee records and called on January 25. He stated that the Committee had a receipt book containing evidence of 125 advertisement payments totalling \$5,171. <sup>1/</sup> The OGC staff member suggested that he send copies of the receipts, a calculation of the cost of the program booklet, a calculation of the cost of the convention, and an explanation of two fundraising events listed in the program booklet as being part of the convention agenda (one at the Governor's Mansion and one at Congressman Roncalio's home). Mr. Sharratt stated a willingness to make appropriate refunds or transfers in an amount equal to the amount of the advertisement sales that he cannot prove were noncorporate. Mr. Sharratt also wrote a letter on January 25 stating that he would like to offer evidence that, for the most part, the proceeds from the advertisements were "consumed by the total expenses of the convention" and that "most or all of the remaining funds were spent for state related activities." (Presumably, this evidence would be provided through the receipt copies, calculations, and explanations which the OGC staff member suggested he send). He went on to state that, while he realized that this would not excuse the acceptance of improper donations, he wished to show that "the effect of the expenditures of those funds on any Federal election contest or other activity was minimal." (See Attachment 2).

The evidence received by OGC over the months that followed indicates that the advertisement proceeds were not, for the most part, consumed by the convention expenses and that the remaining funds were used for federal as well as non-federal activity.

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<sup>1/</sup> This figure differed from a figure of \$6,151 arrived at by a Committee worker who performed an estimate based upon the sizes of the advertisements in the booklets and the cost of each advertisement (e.g., full page for \$125, half page for \$80). The difference was explained as being due to the fact that payment was never received for some of the advertisements.

The \$5,171 figure also differed from the advertisement summary figures totalling \$4,996 in the 10 Day Pre-Primary and July 10 Quarterly Reports. This \$175 difference was attributed to the possibility that this money was received before or after the time periods covered by the two reports and was reported as unitemized receipts.

Copies of the receipts for the advertisement purchases were received by OGC on January 31, 1980. On May 5, the OCC staff member, in a telephone conversation with Mr. Sharratt, made a request for the rest of the information referred to in the January 25 telephone conversation. Mr. Sharratt stated that much of the information referred to in the conversation could be obtained through Sandra Ross, the former Chairman of the Laramie County Democratic Central Committee. Subsequently, Mr. Sharratt wrote to Ms. Ross asking for some of the information. (See Attachment 3).

On July 3, Ms. Ross sent a letter to the Commission stating her knowledge as to the fundraising activities. She stated that \$900 was received at the two fundraising receptions but that this sum consisted entirely of individual donations per drink served and was the amount of money available before payment was made for the liquor and food served. Ms. Ross also included a statement of the receipts and expenses of the convention which she claimed to be "a true and correct accounting." The statement listed total deposits as \$10,791.80, parenthetically noting that the convention registration fee was \$25 per person. Expenses totalling \$6,125.43 were listed. This left \$4,666.37 in net receipts which, according to the statement, were deposited into the treasury of the Laramie County Democratic Party, were subsequently used for the election of state and local officials, were not sent to the State Democratic party because the state convention was used as Laramie County's fund raiser, and were not used for the support of federal candidates. (See Attachment 4).

On July 28, the Committee's office manager sent this office a copy of the bill for the convention programs <sup>2/</sup> stating that the cost of production was \$1,918.85. (See Attachment 5). This figure is \$3,252.15 below the amount of money the Committee received in payments for advertising space in the program.

Thus, it appears that, since the net receipts of convention activities other than production of the program went into the treasury of the Laramie County Democratic Party, \$3,252.15 in net receipts went into the Committee's treasury for purposes other than the convention expenses. Furthermore, while the Committee made contributions of \$5,000 to each of two state office candidates in late September and early October, 1978, it also made contributions during this same period of \$5,000 to each of two federal candidates, Senate candidate Bob Adams and House candidate Bill Pagley.

<sup>2/</sup> The date on the invoice is April 28, 1980. After the OCC staff member called Mr. Sharratt and asked if the invoice was, in fact, for the 1978 booklets, the office manager sent a letter affirming that this invoice was for the 1978, not the 1980, programs. (See Attachment 6).

There is no evidence of any prior allocation of the leftover convention booklet money to state candidates only. Therefore, the receipts remaining from the convention booklet, receipts which are reported to have been received by the Committee, were available and were used for the support of federal candidates.

In late July, OGC reviewed the receipt book and compiled a list of the businesses whose contributions were not itemized in the Committee reports. Subsequently, a letter was sent to the Corporate Division of the Office of the Wyoming Secretary of State to ascertain which of the businesses on the list were incorporated. As a result of a review of the answers received by OGC in late August and a review of the reports from which this matter was generated, it appears that the Committee received \$2,335 in corporate contributions and \$250 in national bank contributions for the 1978 convention booklet. (See Attachment 7).

The respondent has not received any written notification from the Commission that informal conciliation is available prior to the probable cause stage if the respondent so requests. In light of the fact that Mr. Sharratt appears willing to concede that a violation has been committed and wishes to cooperate with the Commission in rectifying this matter, we believe that a letter should be sent informing him of the possibility of informal conciliation. If no request for informal conciliation is made within ten days of respondent's receipt of such letter, the staff will be prepared to issue a General Counsel's brief promptly.

This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. This law has, as you know, many and sometimes complex provisions. One such provision precludes a corporation or a union from making a contribution in connection with an election to Federal office. It does, however, permit a contribution by segregated funds established by corporations and by unions.

During review of the 10 Day Primary Report of Receipts and Expenditures filed with the Federal Election Commission, we noticed entries indicating that you may have accepted contributions prohibited by Federal law. A copy of that portion of your report is attached so that a review of your records can be made.

If you find your identification of the source of these contributions is incomplete or incorrect, please submit a statement which would clarify these particular matters for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

If you find you have accepted prohibited contributions, the Commission recommends that you return the full amounts to the donors. These returns should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as expenditures on your next report of receipts and expenditures.

Please notify the Commission within ten (10) days of receipt of this letter of the determination made on these matters. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Greg Denier (202/523-4048) our reports analyst assigned to you.







This letter is in response to yours dated July 14, 1978, concerning the 1978 Republican State Convention of Texas and the party newspaper published by the Republican Party of Texas. Specifically, you ask whether Federal statutes, regulations or FEC Advisory Opinions exist which would limit:

- (1) solicitation of corporate advertisements in a printed program for the 1978 Republican State Convention of Texas;
- (2) sale of exhibit space by the convention to corporations;
- (3) advertising by corporations in the Party's monthly newspaper.

The Federal statute relevant to your questions is 2 U.S.C. 544b. This provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended prohibits:

- (1) Contributions or expenditures by national banks and Federally chartered corporations in connection with any election to Federal, State, or local political office, and
- (2) Contributions or expenditures by any corporation in connection with any Federal election or "in connection with any primary election or political convention or caucus held to select candidates for" the offices of President, Vice-President, Senator, and Representative in Congress, and
- (3) Knowing acceptance of such contributions by any candidate, political committee or other person.

Therefore, to the extent the Republican State Convention of Texas is for the purpose of influencing or "in connection with" a Federal election and funds paid by corporations for advertising or exhibit space are used to defray expenses of the convention, those funds would be corporate contributions or expenditures that are prohibited under §441b(a) as outlined above. Similarly, the Party newsletter could not be financed with proceeds from corporate ads to the extent its purpose is to influence Federal election or it is connected with a Federal election.

Nominations of Federal office candidates by the Texas Republican Party were required under Texas law to be made by primary election (held on May 6, 1978) rather than Party convention. However the Republican State Convention of Texas, may still be deemed to be, at least in part, for the purpose of influencing or "in connection with" a Federal election. Texas law provides that State conventions be held "between the first and third Tuesdays, exclusive, in September." Tex. Elec. Code, art. 13.35. The duties of the State convention are outlined in Texas law and primarily relate to candidates for State offices. The convention also announces "a platform of principles" and elects officers and members for the State executive committee of the Party. See Tex. Elec. Code, arts. 13.37, 13.38. The Texas statute does not preclude the State Convention from activities involving communications influencing the election of candidates to Federal office or otherwise connected with a Federal election. Therefore, if the State Convention provides a forum for candidates for Federal office which involves (1) the solicitation, making or acceptance of contributions to a campaign for Federal office, or (2) any communication expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office, the Convention would be regarded as for the purpose of influencing and in connection with a Federal election. The prohibitions of 2 U.S.C. §441b would bar the financing of all Convention expenses with corporate treasury funds, but such funds could be used (assuming it is proper under Texas law) to defray Convention expenses that are not allocable to Federal election purposes.

In concluding that some expenses of the Convention may be allocable as influencing Federal elections, the Commission would not require that such allocable amount be further allocated to specific candidates for Federal office. Specific Federal candidate allocation would only be necessary where a Convention expenditure was made on behalf of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office to whom it could be directly attributed. See §106.1 of Commission regulations. If the Convention has any relationship to Federal elections, as discussed above, the expenses allocable to Federal election purposes must be paid from the Texas Republican Party's Federal campaign committee established pursuant to §102.6(a) of Commission regulations. The amount of expenditures allocable to the Federal campaign committee may be determined by using the formula set forth in §106.1(e) of Commission regulations. Other allocation formulas are explained in the Commission's response to Advisory Opinion Request 1976-72 and in a guideline published in the FEC Record of December 1977. (Copies are enclosed.)

If the State Convention is related only to State elections and does not involve any activities bearing on Federal elections as discussed above, expenses of the Convention would not be expenditures under the Act. Therefore, they would not have to be reported (assuming they are paid by a non-registered party organization); nor would the prohibitions of 2 U.S.C. §441b apply except as to contributions by national banks and corporations organized by authority of a law of Congress. (See also 2 U.S.C. §441e which bars contributions by foreign nationals in connection with an election to any political office.)

Regarding the acceptance of corporate funds for advertisements placed in a monthly party newsletter of the Texas Republican Party, the Commission concludes that under the Act such funds would be contributions. However, if proper under Texas law, proceeds from corporate ads could be accepted by the Party and used for State or local election purposes. The expenses

of preparing, publishing, and distributing the newsletter would be regarded as Federal election-related if communications carried in the newsletter are for the purpose of influencing the election of any person to Federal office. Thus if any material published in the newsletter relates to Federal elections, expenses incurred for the newsletter need to be paid, on an allocated basis, from the Federal campaign committee of the Texas Republican Party. The formulas mentioned above may be used to compute the allocable amount. In addition, an allocation based upon the column inches (or space) devoted to Federal candidates as a class, without express advocacy of specific Federal candidates, may be used to determine the amount of expenses required to be paid and reported by the Federal campaign committee of the Party.

However, if the newsletter includes communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office, the expenses of the newsletter attributed to those communications (to be determined by an allocation formula based on columns or amount of space utilized for the communication in relation to the entire newsletter) must be treated as a general election expenditure of the Party under 2 U.S.C. §441a(d). It must be paid from funds of, and reported by, the Federal campaign committee pursuant to §110.7 of Commission regulations. See also §104.2(b). This conclusion follows from Commission regulations on allocation which require that expenditures for "general administrative... and other day-to-day costs of political committees" have to be attributed to individual candidates for Federal office when they are "on behalf of a clearly identified candidate and the expenditure can be directly attributed to that candidate." 11 CFR 106.1(c)

On the other hand, if the Party's newsletter is completely devoid of both general and specific communications relating to candidates for Federal office, the expenses of preparing, publishing and distributing it would not involve contributions or expenditures under the Act and Commission regulations.

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Those portions of this opinion relating to the Party's newsletter supercede and modify, in part, the Commission's response to Advisory Opinion Request 1976-65, issued September 21, 1976.

This response constitutes an advisory opinion concerning the application of a general rule of law stated in the Act, or prescribed as a Commission regulation, to the specific factual situation set forth in your request. See 2 U.S.C. §437f.

DISSENTING OPINION OF COMMISSIONER HARRIS, AO 1978-46

I dissent from this opinion for the reasons outlined in my dissent to Advisory Opinion 1978-10.

I do not share the majority's view that "allocation" is the panacean solution to the difficult problems created under our Act by state party spending for mixed state/federal purposes. Nor do I agree that expenditures allocated to non-federal purposes may be paid out of "restricted" corporate and union treasury funds.

As I have argued previously, the allocation formulas on which the Commission rests its action today inevitably result in the attribution of all corporation and labor treasury contributions to state elections and all "unrestricted" individual and committee contributions to federal elections. Allocation thus "is of bookkeeping significance only rather than a matter of real substance." Aboud v. Detroit Board of Education, 431 U.S. 209, 237, n.35 (1976) citing Retail Clerks Local 1625 v. Schermernhorn, 373 U.S. 746 (1963).

The reality is that this mechanism provides a means by which corporations and unions can foot the bill for the greater part of a state party's administrative and operating expenses. By paying a larger share of these costs, corporations and unions subsidize the party's federal activities. Such subsidy is, in my opinion, a contribution in connection with federal elections in violation of 2 U.S.C. 441b.

Once again the Commission is thwarting the design of Congress to lessen the influence of corporate and union money in federal elections.





Dear Mr. Smith:

I appreciate your contacting me by phone earlier this week concerning your investigation of the above-referenced portion of our previous receipts of contributions and subsequent reports. Although I was appointed to my position as Treasurer last September and subsequently elected to that same position in December, I was not personally aware of these irregularities or the extent of previous concern and correspondence.

It is my understanding now that the ads sold for the program at the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Convention involved some contributions from corporations, national banks, or other prohibited contributors. Investigation into this matter and a determination of the amounts involved is complicated by the fact that your office has computed the total contributions based on the number and size of ads at \$6,570, our estimation using a similar technique is \$6,151, and the receipt books show a total of only \$5,171. While contributions over \$100 were initially itemized and we can easily determine which of these were improper contributions, the remainder of the ads were under \$100 each, were not itemized, and we appear to have only the receipt book and the appearance of the ad itself from which to determine the probable source of the contribution.

I have not been able yet to personally review all the previous correspondence concerning this matter, but I have had our new secretary pull out as much of the information as possible and have discussed it with her at great length. She is today sending you under separate cover from our Casper office a complete copy of the receipt books which recorded each contribution for the program. I hope that this will provide sufficient information from which we can all agree on the extent of irregular contributions.

Once this determination is made, I would propose that we immediately arrange for corrective action in the form of transfers from our Federal account and a return of contributions at least to the national banks. I would propose that the Central Committee then determine the advisability of actually returning all other contributions to the original contributors. I understand that this


remedial action does not in any way prevent the Commission from proceeding against the Party on account of these alleged violations, but I would hope that the Commission would consider that the original error was inadvertent and that these actions are being taken now in a good faith effort to remedy the situation to every extent possible.

I would also like to offer for consideration by the Commission all evidence that we may have in our records concerning the disposition of the proceeds of the contributions for ads in the program, as I believe that for the most part these funds were consumed by the total expenses of the convention for which they were being solicited and most or all of the remaining funds were spent for state-related activities. Although again I realize that this does not excuse the acceptance of improper donations, I believe the Commission might consider that the effect of the expenditure of those funds on any Federal election contest or other activity was minimal. I will, by copy of this letter, request that our present office manager attempt to determine from our records how much was spent for the publication of the program, as well as how much of the net proceeds from the sale of ads in the program was spent on other direct convention expenses. We will then attempt to determine how much of the remaining funds were spent for other state-related activities.

I will also, by copy of this letter, solicit comments from the previous treasurers and office managers concerning the existence and identification of any other records that might help us to determine the extent of any improper contributions and any other corrective action that we might be able to take.

With the hope that this information will be of assistance to you in your investigation, and with a commitment to working with you and the Commission to comply with all FEC laws and regulations, take whatever corrective action may be recommended, and bring this unfortunate situation to a mutually acceptable determination, I am



3. Verification that the funds raised at the two events advertised in the program (at the Governor's mansion and the Roncalio residence) were not used in direct support of any candidates for federal office.





On March 9, May 1, and September 14, 1979, the Commission found reason to believe that the Wyoming Democratic State Central Committee ("the Committee") violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) in connection with its acceptance of contributions from corporations and national banks in 1978. The Committee was notified of the Commission's determinations on these dates and given an opportunity to demonstrate that no further action should be taken in this matter.

On January 7, 1980, this matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel and was numbered Matter Under Review ("MUR") 1135. Please refer to this number in all future correspondence.

As you know, this office has received information from you and from individuals operating at your direction as to the circumstances surrounding these contributions and their subsequent use. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(3), the General Counsel may recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with formal conciliation. However, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through informal conciliation prior to a Commission finding of probable cause if you indicate to this office by letter that you wish to enter into such a process. Moreover, we ask that you submit any further information which you may consider to be relevant. Please submit your request for informal conciliation and any information you may wish to provide to us within ten days of your receipt of this letter.



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

Dear Mr. Smith:

I appreciate your contacting me by phone earlier this week concerning your investigation of the above-referenced portion of our previous receipts of contributions and subsequent reports. Although I was appointed to my position as Treasurer last September and subsequently elected to that same position in December, I was not personally aware of these irregularities or the extent of previous concern and correspondence.

It is my understanding now that the ads sold for the program at the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Convention involved some contributions from corporations, national banks, or other prohibited contributors. Investigation into this matter and a determination of the amounts involved is complicated by the fact that your office has computed the total contributions based on the number and size of ads at \$6,570, our estimation using a similar technique is \$6,151, and the receipt books show a total of only \$5,171. While contributions over \$100 were initially itemized and we can easily determine which of these were improper contributions, the remainder of the ads were under \$100 each, were not itemized, and we appear to have only the receipt book and the appearance of the ad itself from which to determine the probable source of the contribution.

I have not been able yet to personally review all the previous correspondence concerning this matter, but I have had our new secretary pull out as much of the information as possible and have discussed it with her at great length. She is today sending you under separate cover from our Casper office a complete copy of the receipt books which recorded each contribution for the program. I hope that this will provide sufficient information from which we can all agree on the extent of irregular contributions.

Once this determination is made, I would propose that we immediately arrange for corrective action in the form of transfers from our Federal account and a return of contributions at least to the national banks. I would propose that the Central Committee then determine the advisability of actually returning all other contributions to the original contributors. I understand that this


remedial action does not in any way prevent the Commission from proceeding against the Party on account of these alleged violations, but I would hope that the Commission would consider that the original error was inadvertent and that these actions are being taken now in a good faith effort to remedy the situation to every extent possible.

I would also like to offer for consideration by the Commission all evidence that we may have in our records concerning the disposition of the proceeds of the contributions for ads in the program, as I believe that for the most part these funds were consumed by the total expenses of the convention for which they were being solicited and most or all of the remaining funds were spent for state-related activities. Although again I realize that this does not excuse the acceptance of improper donations, I believe the Commission might consider that the effect of the expenditure of those funds on any Federal election contest or other activity was minimal. I will, by copy of this letter, request that our present office manager attempt to determine from our records how much was spent for the publication of the program, as well as how much of the net proceeds from the sale of ads in the program was spent on other direct convention expenses. We will then attempt to determine how much of the remaining funds were spent for other state-related activities.

I will also, by copy of this letter, solicit comments from the previous treasurers and office managers concerning the existence and identification of any other records that might help us to determine the extent of any improper contributions and any other corrective action that we might be able to take.

With the hope that this information will be of assistance to you in your investigation, and with a commitment to working with you and the Commission to comply with all FEC laws and regulations, take whatever corrective action may be recommended, and bring this unfortunate situation to a mutually acceptable determination, I am



Dear Mr. Moriarity:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. This law has, as you know, many and sometimes complex provisions. One such provision precludes a corporation or a union from making a contribution in connection with an election to Federal office. It does, however, permit a contribution by segregated funds established by corporations and by unions.

During review of the 10 Day Primary Report of Receipts and Expenditures filed with the Federal Election Commission, we noticed entries indicating that you may have accepted contributions prohibited by Federal law. A copy of that portion of your report is attached so that a review of your records can be made.

If you find your identification of the source of these contributions is incomplete or incorrect, please submit a statement which would clarify these particular matters for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

If you find you have accepted prohibited contributions, the Commission recommends that you return the full amounts to the donors. These returns should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as expenditures on your next report of receipts and expenditures.

Please notify the Commission within ten (10) days of receipt of this letter of the determination made on these matters. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Greg Denier (202/523-4048) our reports analyst assigned to you.

Dear Wyoming Friends,

I join you with mixed emotions at this, my last convention of our beloved Party as an elected official. For your support, your good will, your understanding and forgiveness of a few rash decisions over the years -- but mostly for all you have meant in contributing to the success of my career -- I shall always be deeply grateful to you.

I'm happy with my decision to retire from Congress. I look forward to a little more leisure, to a few limited pursuits, and to a lot of time with my family and my friends.

As soon as the people of Wyoming look around and realize what is happening to them, I believe there will be a burst of enthusiasm for the Democratic Party of Wyoming -- new members, new horizons, and a new role of leadership surpassing even the 1930's when for the first time in Wyoming history, and for a few short years, the Democratic Party was dominant in Wyoming.

I think a parallel can be drawn with what is happening in Nebraska today. If ever there was one area that was almost hopelessly GOP, it was our neighboring state. Yet, what was solid Republican country only a few short years ago is on the verge of becoming predominantly Democratic, with the very real possibility of having a Democratic Governor, two Democratic Senators, two of three House members Democratic, and a majority of voters registered Democratic.

And in Wyoming, too, I see a Legislature soon to be Democratic so that mistakes of the past, like permitting potable water to be used as a slurry for coal, can be rectified.

The Democratic Party must be the vehicle for the new leadership of Wyoming. That leadership will not come from those who crave the mineral wealth and the water, who so often have scant regard for the quality of living in Wyoming, some of whom are here to get all they can while the gettin' is good and the devil take the hindmost.

Nor will it come from our rich, regressive opposition party, a party still resolutely adhering to its traditional devotion to the fast dollar, and to an ever loyal promotion of corporate benefits first, and the public good second, if at all.

The leadership will not come by default, either. We must reach out to young people now, invite them to our events, and we must begin the search now for strong, attractive talent for every office at every level. Old leaders who are not doing this must step aside, and step aside gladly and voluntarily, now.

It can be done if we dedicate ourselves. I pledge my all, and call upon each of you to devote your time and effort to this exciting and most worthy goal. Nothing less than the destiny of Wyoming is at stake.

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
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

1978 - A Year of Optimism and Hard Work

It is often said that every election year is a tough one for Democrats in Wyoming; I suppose this is true, at least in terms of the work required of us at all levels of state politics. But the fact of the matter is that getting people elected to political office, and certainly getting oneself elected to political office, is hard work for anyone, Democrat, Republican or Independent.

But in most cases the rewards are commensurate with the effort and we are fortunate to live in a state wherein the size of one's campaign chest is not necessarily the most critical determinant of success. Unlike other states, in Wyoming elections cannot be "bought" in the sense of slick media campaigns and advertising saturation. Candidates still have to meet on a personal basis a large percentage of the voters. This factor means a good deal to Democrats who rarely have the type of wealthy candidates who represent the other party.

Are we Democrats willing to work a little harder than ever before; harder than our opposition? Can we really dedicate ourselves to make an unprecedented effort to elect Democrats to a clear majority of state offices? I cannot stress enough the importance of our doing so. Take a look around and you'll see why.

In many states the Republican Party is ebbing in membership, voice and strength. This is a recognized national trend. It seems voters are simply realizing that Republican politics are becoming too narrow to allow the stimulating exchange of ideas that discussion of today's complex issues requires. But in Wyoming the Republican Party appears to be doing better than in many other states despite the fact that it, too, tends to be closed and narrow of vision. The Democratic Party has always been much more tolerant of and open to divergent opinions. This is one reason why our party should grow as Wyoming grows, because we offer more voice and more representation to the majority.

My point is this: 1978 is a very critical year for Democrats in Wyoming because I feel we have a great opportunity to elect Democrats to majorities in the Legislature, to county offices and the five top elective offices. That is why I am optimistic. But we must exert ourselves; we must make it known that our party and our candidates and our platform represent the best hope for our state as we attempt to deal with the profound challenges confronting us.

I am optimistic because we have the wherewithal to triumph in this election year. We have good, strong candidates already entered in some of the major races. Several important slots still need to be filled and other good candidates are forthcoming. We have a lot

going for us in terms of our stands on the major issues. But if we fail to sieze thse opportunities it will be a double failure: we will have let down both our party and our state.

Let's show 'em what we really can accomplish in 1978; a year in which we can make history rather than simply repeat it.

Republican County Headquarters




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LAWS, ARTICLE III:

Section 1 - Composition. The Democratic State Convention shall be composed of delegates from the several counties as selected by the county conventions and apportioned as follows: Each county shall be entitled to one delegate for each 600, or major fraction thereof, votes cast in the state for national and state candidates of the Democratic Party (exclusive of candidates for the State Senate and State House of Representative) at the preceeding general election, the number of votes to be determined by taking the average of such votes as received by such candidates, and one delegate for each 3,000, or major fraction thereof, of the county's population as determined by the last Federal Census. A Democratic County Convention may double the number of delegates allocated to its county by providing that each such delegate shall have a half vote. The vote shall not be otherwise apportioned.

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POWERS AND DUTIES OF STATE CONVENTION

BY-LAWS - ARTICLE I:

Sec. 2 - The Democratic State Convention. The Democratic State Convention shall be the supreme governing body of the Democratic Party of Wyoming.

BY-LAWS - ARTICLE III:

Sec. 5 - State Convention Powers and Duties. The Wyoming State Democratic Convention has the following powers and duties;

- (a) To nominate electors of president and vice president of the United States;
- (b) To elect national committeemen and committeewomen;
- (c) To adopt a platform;
- (d) To select delegates and alternates to national nominating conventions;
- (e) To formulate or change the rules governing the internal organizations of the party which rules must include;
  - i. The time, place, manner of election and terms of office of party officers not provided by statute;
  - ii. The method of apportioning delegates and alternates to the state convention to each county;
  - iii. The method of selecting delegates and alternates to the national convention;
  - iv. The name, powers and duties of any standing committee of the state central committee and the state convention;
  - v. Rules of conduct for county and state conventions;
  - vi. Powers and duties delegated to county and state committees;
- (f) To conduct such other business as it deems necessary or proper.

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

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## CALL FOR THE 1978 DEMOCRATIC STATE CONVENTION

Pursuant to law and to the Rules, Regulations and By-Laws of the Democratic Party of the State of Wyoming, and at the direction of the Democratic State Central Committee, I, Don Anselmi, as Chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee hereby call the State Convention of said party to convene at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 13, 1978 in Cheyenne, Wyoming at the Hitching Post Inn for the purpose of adopting a platform, to select the delegates and alternate delegates to the 1978 National Party Conference in Memphis, Tennessee in December, 1978 and for such other purposes as directed and authorized by law.

Said convention shall be composed of 234 delegates with 234 alternate delegates for substitutions (subject to right of each County Convention to double its delegate strength by allowing 1/2 vote to each delegate and alternate in lieu of a full vote) each apportioned among the several counties.

## RESOLUTIONS AND PLATFORM COMMITTEE FUNCTIONS

### BY-LAWS - ARTICLE III:

#### Sec. 7 - Committees.


(c) The Resolutions and Platform Committee shall consist of members numbering between 19 and 41 as determined by the State Chairman. It shall consider all suggestions for resolutions and for the platform submitted by the Democratic County Conventions and by the County Democratic Central Committees and it shall make recommendations thereon to the Democratic State Convention. No suggestion for a resolution or for the platform shall be considered by the Resolutions and Platform Committee unless such resolutions shall have the endorsement of at least one county convention or of at least one County Central Committee or of the State Convention of the Young Democrats. No suggestion for a resolution or for the platform should be considered by the Democratic State Convention unless recommended by the Resolutions and Platform Committee for such consideration - provided that a suggestion for a resolution or for the platform presented by said committee for consideration by the convention may be rejected or accepted by the convention and may be amended by the convention if the amendment is germane to the subject of the said suggestion; and provided further that the convention may consider any suggestions for resolutions or for the Platform if such consideration is approved by a two-third vote of the delegation. Said committee shall meet during the week prior to the convention date at the call of the Democratic State Chairman.

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
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## COMMITTEE FUNCTIONS

### BY-LAWS - ARTICLE III:

Sec. 6 - Officers. The officers of the Democratic State Convention shall be: Chairman, Secretary, Parliamentarian, Sergeant at Arms, and Democratic State Chairman.

a. The Chairman shall preside over the convention and have all the powers and duties normally incident of the office of chairman.

b. The Secretary shall record the activities which occur on the convention floor, take and record votes, and accept exhibits and written reports and papers presented to the convention. The Secretary may appoint two clerks to assist him in his duties.

c. The Parliamentarian shall advise the Chairman on all issues of procedure coming before the convention and referred to him by the Chairman.

d. The Sergeant at Arms shall preserve order on the floor of the convention as directed by the Chairman. He may appoint aides as he deems necessary to assist him in these duties.

e. The Democratic State Chairman shall open the convention and perform the duties of the Convention Chairman during the organizing of the convention until the Chairman is elected. He shall assist the Chairman and Secretary in their duties, and he shall take over the duties of the Chairman in the event of the Chairman's absence or disability or at the request of the Convention Chairman.

f. The Convention Chairman shall be elected by a majority of votes of the convention delegates from the nominees presented by the nomination committee and by nomination from the floor.

g. The Secretary, Parliamentarian and Sergeant at Arms shall be appointed by the Convention Chairman.


Sec. 7 - Committees. The following committees shall be appointed as provided in Section 7(e) of this Article to act at each Democratic State Convention: (a) Nomination, (b) Credentials and Ballots, and (c) Resolutions and Platform. A Delegate Selection Committee shall be appointed as provided in Section 7(f) of this Article to act at such conventions held in those years in which Democratic National Conventions are held.

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
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


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

This letter is in response to yours dated July 14, 1978, concerning the 1978 Republican State Convention of Texas and the party newspaper published by the Republican Party of Texas. Specifically, you ask whether Federal statutes, regulations or FEC Advisory Opinions exist which would limit:

- (1) solicitation of corporate advertisements in a printed program for the 1978 Republican State Convention of Texas;
- (2) sale of exhibit space by the convention to corporations;
- (3) advertising by corporations in the Party's monthly newspaper.

The Federal statute relevant to your questions is 2 U.S.C. §441b. This provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended prohibits:

- (1) Contributions or expenditures by national banks and Federally chartered corporations in connection with any election to Federal, State, or local political office, and
- (2) Contributions or expenditures by any corporation in connection with any Federal election or "in connection with any primary election or political convention or caucus held to select candidates for" the offices of President, Vice-President, Senator, and Representative in Congress, and
- (3) Knowing acceptance of such contributions by any candidate, political committee or other person.

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Therefore, to the extent the Republican State Convention of Texas is for the purpose of influencing or "in connection with" a Federal election and funds paid by corporations for advertising or exhibit space are used to defray expenses of the convention, those funds would be corporate contributions or expenditures that are prohibited under §441b(a) as outlined above. Similarly, the Party newsletter could not be financed with proceeds from corporate ads to the extent its purpose is to influence Federal election or it is connected with a Federal election.

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Nominations of Federal office candidates by the Texas Republican Party were required under Texas law to be made by primary election (held on May 6, 1978) rather than Party convention. However the Republican State Convention of Texas, may still be deemed to be, at least in part, for the purpose of influencing or "in connection with" a Federal election. Texas law provides that State conventions be held "between the first and third Tuesdays, exclusive, in September." Tex. Elec. Code, art. 13.35. The duties of the State convention are outlined in Texas law and primarily relate to candidates for State offices. The convention also announces "a platform of principles" and elects officers and members for the State executive committee of the Party. See Tex. Elec. Code, arts. 13.37, 13.38. The Texas statute does not preclude the State Convention from activities involving communications influencing the election of candidates to Federal office or otherwise connected with a Federal election. Therefore, if the State Convention provides a forum for candidates for Federal office which involves (1) the solicitation, making or acceptance of contributions to a campaign for Federal office, or (2) any communication expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office, the Convention would be regarded as for the purpose of influencing and in connection with a Federal election. The prohibitions of 2 U.S.C. §441b would bar the financing of all Convention expenses with corporate treasury funds, but such funds could be used (assuming it is proper under Texas law) to defray Convention expenses that are not allocable to Federal election purposes.

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In concluding that some expenses of the Convention may be allocable as influencing Federal elections, the Commission would not require that such allocable amount be further allocated to specific candidates for Federal office. Specific Federal candidate allocation would only be necessary where a Convention expenditure was made on behalf of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office to whom it could be directly attributed. See §106.1 of Commission regulations. If the Convention has any relationship to Federal elections, as discussed above, the expenses allocable to Federal election purposes must be paid from the Texas Republican Party's Federal campaign committee established pursuant to §102.6(a) of Commission regulations. The amount of expenditures allocable to the Federal campaign committee may be determined by using the formula set forth in §106.1(e) of Commission regulations. Other allocation formulas are explained in the Commission's response to Advisory Opinion Request 1976-72 and in a guideline published in the VEC Record of December 1977. (Copies are enclosed.)

If the State Convention is related only to State elections and does not involve any activities bearing on Federal elections as discussed above, expenses of the Convention would not be expenditures under the Act. Therefore, they would not have to be reported (assuming they are paid by a non-registered party organization); nor would the prohibitions of 2 U.S.C. §441b apply except as to contributions by national banks and corporations organized by authority of a law of Congress. (See also 2 U.S.C. §441e which bars contributions by foreign nationals in connection with an election to any political office.)

Regarding the acceptance of corporate funds for advertisements placed in a monthly party newsletter of the Texas Republican Party, the Commission concludes that under the Act such funds would be contributions. However, if proper under Texas law, proceeds from corporate ads could be accepted by the Party and used for State or local election purposes. The expenses

of preparing, publishing, and distributing the newsletter would be regarded as Federal election-related if communications carried in the newsletter are for the purpose of influencing the election of any person to Federal office. Thus if any material published in the newsletter relates to Federal elections, expenses incurred for the newsletter need to be paid, on an allocated basis, from the Federal campaign committee of the Texas Republican Party. The formulas mentioned above may be used to compute the allocable amount. In addition, an allocation based upon the column inches (or space) devoted to Federal candidates as a class, without express advocacy of specific Federal candidates, may be used to determine the amount of expenses required to be paid and reported by the Federal campaign committee of the Party.

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However, if the newsletter includes communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate for Federal office, the expenses of the newsletter attributed to those communications (to be determined by an allocation formula based on columns or amount of space utilized for the communication in relation to the entire newsletter) must be treated as a general election expenditure of the Party under 2 U.S.C. §441a(d). It must be paid from funds of, and reported by, the Federal campaign committee pursuant to §110.7 of Commission regulations. See also §104.2(b). This conclusion follows from Commission regulations on allocation which require that expenditures for "general administrative... and other day-to-day costs of political committees" have to be attributed to individual candidates for Federal office when they are "on behalf of a clearly identified candidate and the expenditure can be directly attributed to that candidate." 11 CFR 106.1(c)

On the other hand, if the Party's newsletter is completely devoid of both general and specific communications relating to candidates for Federal office, the expenses of preparing, publishing and distributing it would not involve contributions or expenditures under the Act and Commission regulations.

Those portions of this opinion relating to the Party's newsletter supercede and modify, in part, the Commission's response to Advisory Opinion Request 1976-65, issued September 21, 1976.

This response constitutes an advisory opinion concerning the application of a general rule of law stated in the Act, or prescribed as a Commission regulation, to the specific factual situation set forth in your request. See 2 U.S.C. §437f.

DISSENTING OPINION OF COMMISSIONER HARRIS, AO 1978-46

I dissent from this opinion for the reasons outlined in my dissent to Advisory Opinion 1978-10.

I do not share the majority's view that "allocation" is the panacean solution to the difficult problems created under our Act by state party spending for mixed state/federal purposes. Nor do I agree that expenditures allocated to non-federal purposes may be paid out of "restricted" corporate and union treasury funds.

As I have argued previously, the allocation formulas on which the Commission rests its action today inevitably result in the attribution of all corporation and labor treasury contributions to state elections and all "unrestricted" individual and committee contributions to federal elections. Allocation thus "is of bookkeeping significance only rather than a matter of real substance." Aboud v. Detroit Board of Education, 431 U.S. 209, 237, n.35 (1976) citing Retail Clerks Local 1525 v. Schermerhorn, 373 U.S. 746 (1963).

The reality is that this mechanism provides a means by which corporations and unions can foot the bill for the greater part of a state party's administrative and operating expenses. By paying a larger share of these costs, corporations and unions subsidize the party's federal activities. Such subsidy is, in my opinion, a contribution in connection with federal elections in violation of 2 U.S.C. 441b.

Once again the Commission is thwarting the design of Congress to lessen the influence of corporate and union money in federal elections.

This letter is prompted by the Commission's interest in assisting candidates and committees who wish to comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended. During review of the 10 Day Pre-Primary Report of Receipts and Expenditures, we noticed entries indicating that you may have accepted contributions from national banks. Contributions by national banks are prohibited by the Act, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. 441b and 11 CFR 114.2. A copy of that portion of your report is attached for your review and clarification.

The Commission recommends that if you have accepted prohibited contributions that you return the full amount to the donors. These returns of the contributions should be reported immediately by letter and should be reflected as a contribution refund on your next report of receipts and expenditures. If the identification of the source of these contributions is incomplete or incorrect on the original report, please submit a statement for the public record. You may do so by amending your original report by letter.

In addition, the Commission notes, through review of the Committee's reports and examination of advertisements sold in the 1978 Wyoming State Democratic Party Convention Booklet, that several businesses advertised in the booklet. However, some of the payments of the advertisements did not appear in the committee's reports. Please explain.

Please notify the Commission within fifteen (15) days from the date of this letter of the determination made on this matter. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Lisa Stolaruk (800)424-9530, our Reports Analyst assigned to you. Our local number is (202)357-0023.


