



SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On July 1, 1980, complainant, John E. Lee, Jr., sent a complaint to the Commission in which he apparently makes two allegations in connection with the 1979 primary election campaign of John Arthur Eaves for Governor of Mississippi. The complaint alleges that since his defeat in the primary election, candidate John Arthur Eaves has refused to make payments on or to renew bank notes, leaving co-signers on these notes liable for payment. It also alleges that some contribution checks and loans do not appear on contribution lists required by law. On August 7, 1980, further information was received from the complainant regarding the same allegations.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

After receiving the complaint, the Office of General Counsel sent five day notice letters to respondents. John Arthur Eaves received the letter addressed to him and responded in a letter dated July 19, 1980. The letters to the other two respondents were returned to the Commission. Notice to respondent John Arthur Eaves for Governor Committee was then sent to candidate John Arthur Eaves. We have been

unable to locate a current address for respondent Steven A. Patterson.

Complainant's allegations do not describe a violation of either the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or Chapters 95 and 96 of Title 26, U.S. Code. Therefore, the General Counsel recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that respondents have violated either the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or Chapters 95 and 96 of Title 26, U.S. Code.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find no reason to believe that respondents violated either the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or Chapters 95 and 96 of Title 26, U.S. Code.
2. Close the file.
3. Approve attached letters.



Dear Sir:

After speaking to one of your office staff today, I have decided to file the following complaint with your office. First let me tell you a few things about myself and how come these facts have been accumulated by me.

I retired from the U.S. Army as Staff/Sgt. on June 13, 1968 and went to work for the Natchez, Mississippi City Police as a Patrolman. Then in 1969 thru 1972 I worked for the State Penitentiary in Louisiana. My duties were to carry prisoners out on Court and Legal appointments. In 1973 I worked as Night Chief of Security for the Mississippi State Prison and bodyguard for the Prison Warden. In the spring of 1975 I had to retire on Social Security Disability.

In 1979 I got interested in politics. A personal friend of mine, was campaigning for John Arthur Eaves for governor of Mississippi. I attended quite a few fish fries and political meetings with . This gave me something to do with my time instead of sitting at home all of the time.

None of this cost me anything as I always rode with in his car and he always paid all of our expenses away from home.

After John Arthur Eave's defeat in the August 7, 1979's primary election as a candidate for Governor of Mississippi all of the notes at the banks that had been floated for the campaign began to come due and payable. then confided in me and did show me all of the bank notes that he had co-signed for John Arthur Eaves's campaign funds and asked me to check into them for him and see what could be done on them as John Arthur Eaves was refusing to pay anything on them. He also refused to sign them again for a renewal.

I explained to that I would have to get a private investigator's license, a bond, and a permit. These things furnished me funds to purchase. or no one else has paid me funds to investigate this for them.

After the campaign notes came due, John Arthur Eaves, Steve Patterson, the campaign manager, and Doctor James V. Woods, the finance chairman, have all been hard to find or will not communicate in any way with the men who

signed these notes for John Arthur Eaves. Some of these men who signed these bank notes have already lost their State jobs due to the fact that they were implicated in these campaigns.

lost his job. It is my understanding that who accompanied on many trips around the country to pick up checks that were to go to the campaign funds. stated to me that had picked up in the excess of fifty checks for over five hundred dollars each that do not appear on the contributions list. also stated that has a complete list of the checks, who wrote them, and how much they were written for.

Since all of this has come out, has lost his health. He has undergone surgery and has a heart condition. He has to turn his business over to his son.

At this stage all of the men who signed these notes for John Arthur Eaves stand to lose their jobs, their homes, and their life savings. Steve Patterson, the campaign chairman, is now the present governor's right hand man. John Arthur Eaves did state in my presence that Steve Patterson had taken all of the books and went over to the William Winter campaign with them.

Enclosed you will find a copy of the loans that I could get. There are some other loans from other banks that I know of but have not been able to get a hold of yet. None of these loans appear on the contributions list that is required by law.

It has been brought to my attention by several campaign workers that John T. Kelly, the chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigations in Mississippi, has been seen holding personal and private talks with John Arthur Eaves during his campaign for governor. I am not questioning his integrity or his ability to handle his job. I just don't know what his connections with John Arthur Eaves are. I cannot take my findings to the Mississippi State Attorney General, for he is an ex-law partner of John Arthur Eaves. I do not question Bill Allain's integrity or ability to handle this either. I do not know what his obligations, if there are any to John Arthur Eaves.

Even as I write this letter to you, I am doing so with reservations. were big fund raisers for the

John Arthur Eaves campaign.

was a key figure in manipulating the loans for the John Arthur Eaves campaign.

Now you see why I have come to you and am pleading for your help with this. It is more than a private investigator can handle and still live. I am sure you will receive full cooperation from the men who are on these notes, as they are active in the campaign itself, thanking you for any help and/or cooperation in this matter.

After speaking to one of your office staff today, I have decided to file the following complaint with your office. First let me tell you a few things about myself and how come these facts have been accumulated by me.

I retired from the U.S. Army as Staff/Sgt. on June 13, 1968 and went to work for the Natchez, Mississippi City Police as a Patrolman. Then in 1969 thru 1972 I worked for the State Penitentiary in Louisiana. My duties were to carry prisoners out on Court and Legal appointments. In 1973 I worked as Night Chief of Security for the Mississippi State Prison and bodyguard for the Prison Warden. In the spring of 1975 I had to retire on Social Security Disability.

In 1979 I got interested in politics. A personal friend of mine, _____, was campaigning for John Arthur Eaves for governor of Mississippi. I attended quite a few fish fries and political meetings with _____. This gave me something to do with my time instead of sitting at home all of the time.

None of this cost me anything as I always rode with _____ in his car and he always paid all of our expenses away from home.

After John Arthur Eave's defeat in the August 7, 1979's primary election as a candidate for Governor of Mississippi all of the notes at the banks that had been floated for the campaign began to come due and payable. _____ then confided in me and did show me all of the bank notes that he had co-signed for John Arthur Eaves's campaign funds and asked me to check into them for him and see what could be done on them as John Arthur Eaves was refusing to pay anything on them. He also refused to sign them again for a renewal.

I explained to _____ that I would have to get a private investigator's license, a bond, and a permit. These things _____ furnished me funds to purchase. _____ or no one else has paid me funds to investigate this for them.

After the campaign notes came due, John Arthur Eaves, Steve Patterson, the campaign manager, and Doctor James V. Woods, the finance chairman, have all been hard to find or will not communicate in any way with the men who

signed these notes for John Arthur Eaves. Some of these men who signed these bank notes have already lost their State jobs due to the fact that they were implicated in these campaigns. has
lost his job. It is my understanding that who accompanied
on many trips around the country to pick up checks that were
to go to the campaign funds. stated to me that
had picked up in the excess of fifty checks for over five hundred dollars
each that do not appear on the contributions list. also stated
that has a complete list of the checks, who wrote them, and
how much they were written for.

Since all of this has come out, has lost his health.
He has undergone surgery and has a heart condition. He has to turn his
business over to his son.

At this stage all of the men who signed these notes for John Arthur Eaves stand to lose their jobs, their homes, and their life savings. Steve Patterson, the campaign chairman, is now the present governor's right hand man. John Arthur Eaves did state in my presence that Steve Patterson had taken all of the books and went over to the William Winter campaign with them.

Enclosed you will find a copy of the loans that I could get. There are some other loans from other banks that I know of but have not been able to get a hold of yet. None of these loans appear on the contributions list that is required by law.

It has been brought to my attention by several campaign workers that John T. Kelly, the chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigations in Mississippi, has been seen holding personal and private talks with John Arthur Eaves during his campaign for governor. I am not questioning his integrity or his ability to handle his job. I just don't know what his connections with John Arthur Eaves are. I cannot take my findings to the Mississippi State Attorney General, for he is an ex-law partner of John Arthur Eaves. I do not question Bill Allain's integrity or ability to handle this either. I do not know what his obligations, if there are any to John Arthur Eaves.


