



I. BACKGROUND

In a complaint filed with the Commission on October 20, 1980, Congressman Jim Mattox alleged that Thomas W. Pauken, a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from the 5th District of Texas, violated 2 U.S.C. §441b by accepting corporate contributions from and through Texas Forum, Inc. After reviewing information received from both Respondents, the Commission, on January 27, 1981, found reason to believe that Thomas Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b in connection with Mr. Pauken's use of the corporate-financed film "Whatever Works." Notification letters were sent to both Respondents after the Commission's findings and further information was requested and received by this Office including a copy of the subject film.

The film was viewed and analyzed by the Office of General Counsel in conjunction with other information provided by the respondents. On April 2, 1981, briefs of the General Counsel recommending no probable cause to believe were mailed to the respondents.

By letter of January 29, 1981, you notified respondent Mr. Thomas W. Pauken that upon review of the allegations contained in a complaint filed with the Commission and information supplied by Mr. Pauken you determined that Mr. Pauken violated 2 USC §441b. The letter did not mention any finding with respect to any other sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, ("the Act") even though the complainant made allegations with respect to other sections. I will assume for purposes of this response that the finding was, as stated, limited to 2 USC §441b and the finding was based, as stated, on information that Mr. Pauken showed the corporate financed film after he was a declared candidate.

Specific answers to questions posed in your letter are attached. The responses to questions #1 and #4 are not complete. Although general responses may be sufficient to dispose of the issues arising under this matter, more complete answers will be forwarded promptly as the information is currently being gathered. For purposes of this response and the arguments being made herein, I will generally describe the places and dates that the film was shown both before and after December 20, 1979. In addition although a copy of the film "Whatever Works" was not requested, a video tape copy is available for the Commission staff's review at any time.

Neither the answers to the Commission's questions nor arguments being made on behalf of the respondent will dispute the fact that the film was financed by corporate funds and that it was shown by the respondent for a period of time after he became a candidate under the Act. However, an analysis of the statute, the pertinent facts and Commission policy with respect to the statute all clearly demonstrate that Mr. Pauken did not commit a violation of 2 USC §441b.

It is first necessary to examine the subject statute and Commission interpretation of that statute. 2 USC §441b provides, in part, that it is unlawful for any corporation to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with any federal election. For the purpose of §441b, §441b(b)(2) provides that the terms "contribution or expenditure" shall include any direct or indirect payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit or gift of money, on any services, or anything of value to any candidate, campaign committee, or political party or organization in connection with any election. (emphasis added). The language "in connection with any election" has been viewed by the Commission to require that the purpose of the activity must be the nomination or election of the candidate. See Advisory Opinion 1978-15, 1978-4, and 1977-54.

Secondly, it is necessary to examine the pertinent facts in order to understand why there is no basis for the Commission finding probable cause to believe a violation of §441b was committed. These are:

- 1) Texas Forum was chartered as a non-profit corporation in May 17, 1979, as an educational entity formed for the purpose of promoting free enterprise and preserving our traditional American values. It was based in Dallas, Texas.
- 2) Respondent, a resident of Mesquite, Texas was a recognized expert on the activities of the so called New Left, a movement which many viewed as a threat to the objectives of the Texas Forum. He had written and lectured on the subject of the New Left.
- 3) Respondent has never been an officer or director of Texas Forum although he had a close relationship with its chairman and treasurer William D. Elliot.
- 4) Not long after the Texas Forum was established and some seven months before respondent became a candidate under the Act, it entered into an agreement for the production of a film "Whatever Works" which was to chronicle activities of the New Left.
- 5) Texas Forum entered into the agreement to make the film with respondent (who developed the concept of the film); Film Dallas Productions; and John Rudin.

- 6) The agreement was a bonafide relationship between the parties. It exposed respondent to substantial risk in the event that the film failed to generate sufficient revenue to pay for the considerable time and expertise which respondent contributed to making the film.
- 7) Neither film nor its presentation was to involve any language, picture or advertisement advocating the election of respondent or any other individual to any office. Its purpose was merely to carry out the objectives of Texas Forum.
- 8) Respondent agreed to provide services with respect to production and marketing the film.
- 9) The marketing strategy involved respondent making presentations of the film with a view towards selling the film to the group. Texas Forum charged \$500 for the film and approximately 50 prints were sold. These prints then became the property of the purchaser. Respondent would only appear when the film was promoted by Texas Forum.
- 10) Responsibility over marketing included total control over the scheduling of the film's presentations.
- 11) As the person responsible for marketing the film, respondent was identified as the contact point for the Texas Forum whose principal activity at that time was promotion of the film. AA
- 12) As the Texas Forum raised funds through the presentation of the film, it began discharging its obligations to respondent with final payments being made in August, 1980.
- 13) Although the Texas Forum conducted other activities, respondent's relationship was limited to the film. These other activities include a series of luncheons with business leaders at which various speakers were presented. These luncheons were, like the film, designed to promote the free enterprise system.
- 14) The film as produced and presented did not, as planned, advocate the election of respondent or any individual to any office. It was shown at locations all over the country to interested groups and/or organizations.
- 15) On December 20, 1979, respondent filed with the Clerk of the House of Representatives as a candidate for Congress in the 5th District of Texas.
- 16) During the early part of 1980 the respondent, then a candidate, continued his normal established practice of showing the film upon request on behalf of the Texas Forum both within and outside the District in which he was a candidate. As in those presentations prior to his candidacy, no mention was made of any candidacy, no literature was distributed promoting his candidacy and no contributions were solicited in support of his candidacy.

- 17) Texas Forum remains in existence and committed to its original objectives.

These facts established that the respondent had a legitimate relationship with Texas Forum for which he provided a valuable service. There is no evidence or even allegation that he was over paid for this service. The film was not written, produced, or presented with a view towards influencing the election in which respondent was a candidate. The film was shown in many areas of the country both before and after respondent became a candidate under the Act. The possibility that respondent would receive incidental benefit through the public exposure which he received in the course of presenting the film is not a basis for establishing a violation of 2 USC §441b or any other section of the Act.

Lastly it is necessary to examine advisory opinions issued by the Commission in response to requests set in a similar factual context confirm this conclusion.

These advisory opinions include:

- 1) Advisory Opinion 1977-68 wherein the salary paid to a bank lobbyist who was also a candidate was found not to be a contribution. In the opinion of the Commission so long as there was a bona fide employment relationship between the bank and the candidate and the compensation paid is exclusively in consideration of services performed then no contribution will have occurred.

As in this advisory opinion request, respondent Pauken had a bona fide relationship with Texas Forum for which he provided services of producing and distributing a film designed to promote Texas Forum's objectives. There is no evidence or allegation that the film was not consistent with the Texas Forum's objectives. As in this advisory opinion, the compensation paid respondent was exclusively in consideration of the services performed. The likelihood that the bank lobbyist would receive public exposure by virtue of his job and that this incidental exposure might benefit his candidacy did not alter the Commission's view of the Act as applied to the facts.

- 2) Advisory Opinion 1978-15 wherein a candidate was planning to act as chairman of fundraising operations for a charity affair. In this request, the candidate agreed prior to candidacy to serve as honorary chairman of the fundraising drive for a non-profit incorporated group. His responsibilities which began after he became a candidate were to include attendance at a luncheon and having his picture in a letter to be distributed to a wide area including the area in which he was a candidate. In that letter the candidate would be identified as a State

Assemblyman but no reference was to be made to his candidacy. In its opinion, the Commission said that although it is possible that the candidate's involvement in the fundraising activities may directly benefit his Federal candidacy, the major purpose of the activity is not the nomination or election of a candidate and hence neither a contribution nor an expenditure would occur. The Commission conditioned its opinion on factual assumptions similar to respondent's case. These were that other activities of the non-profit incorporated group did not involve solicitation or acceptance of contributions to the candidate's campaign and communications inviting participants did not advocate the election or defeat of any candidate for federal office.


The facts are comparable to respondent's case except that the candidate in this opinion had no control over the distribution of the invitations that were mailed throughout the Congressional District. The distinction does not alter the precedent of the opinion, however, for two reasons: (1) respondent's appearances were made in locations throughout the country in response to any interested group and not as in the opinion request essentially confined to the congressional district, and (2) distribution responsibility was one of the legitimate responsibilities undertaken by respondent in the agreement with Texas Forum.

There are other Advisory Opinions consistent with the thrust of the described opinions. These include Advisory Opinion 1978-88, 1980-16, 1977-54 and 1978-4.

The facts in this matter when viewed in the light of Commission policy support the contention that the relationship of Texas Forum and respondent both before and after the commencement of his candidacy was within the law. Presentation of the film as a candidate was consistent with a prior bona fide relationship between the two parties; neither the film nor its presentation involved any advocacy of respondents candidacy nor did they involve any solicitation of funds for his candidacy.

Accordingly, the Commission should find no probable cause to believe a violation has occurred and terminate this matter.

ANSWERS TO COMMISSION QUESTIONS

Q. 1) On what occasion did you show the film "Whatever Works" after December 20, 1979?

A. The specific dates and places are contained in records currently being shipped to Washington, D.C. and this information should be forwarded to the Commission promptly. Generally the film was presented to citizen's groups who requested the presentation. These presentations took place both within and outside the respondent's congressional district on approximately twenty occasions running through June of 1980 when the burdens of the campaign prevented further appearances. None of the presentations involved any advocacy for or solicitation on behalf of respondent's candidacy.

Q. 2) How did these occasions differ from your previous showings of the film?

A. There was essentially no difference between these occasions and those previous to respondent's candidacy.

Q. 3) How was the schedule for the film "Whatever Works" arranged?

A. Respondent, in his capacity as the film's distributor, made all the schedule arrangements based on requests by interested groups.

Q. 4) Please provide a schedule of the places and dates when you showed the film "Whatever Works".

A. Again, this information is still being gathered and will be provided promptly. Generally, the film was shown at numerous locations in a number of cities around the country and around respondent's home area. These showings began in September of 1979 soon after the film was complete and continued through the late spring of 1980. The total showings could be as many as seventy five presentations.

Q. 5) Did you purchase a copy of the film for yourself which you showed at any time?

A. No.

We did have an understanding with Tom Pauken that the film would not be used for political purposes of any kind, nor would any monies raised for support of the Texas Forum be raised in a political setting.

3. Texas Forum had no notice of if, when, or where the film would be shown by Tom Pauken. The information provided in the complaint pertaining to the showing of the film by Tom Pauken, was the first occasion we knew of the showings described in the complaint.



6. The production company that was principally responsible for shooting the film for Texas Forum ("FD Productions") hired persons from NRCC without approval from Texas Forum. There was no other way in which NRCC was involved with the film.



SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

In a complaint filed with the Commission on October 20, 1980, Congressman Jim Mattox alleged that Thomas W. Pauken, a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from the 5th District in Texas, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b by accepting corporate contributions from and through Texas Forum, Inc. Congressman Mattox also alleged that Mr. Pauken violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) and/or (e) by failing to register the Texas Forum, Inc., as an authorized committee; and that Mr. Pauken violated 2 U.S.C. § 434 by failing to report receipts of contributions from Texas Forum.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The complaint against Mr. Pauken includes a lengthy statement of facts which outlines the relationship between Thomas Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. as well as the principals involved in that corporation, and two other companies, Francis Associates and FD Productions.

In September, 1979, Thomas Pauken was traveling throughout the United States to show a film entitled "Whatever Works." According to several newspaper reports, "Whatever Works" is a documentary film that "delves into the actions of the 'New Left' and other controversial groups

and personalities of the Vietnam era." Mr. Pauken is the principal actor in the film. The film was produced by the Texas Forum, Inc., and filmed by FD Productions.

The complaint alleges that Respondent Pauken, while an active and announced candidate for federal office, accepted and used this film (which was paid for with corporate funds solicited by Texas Forum, Inc.) as a tool to promote his campaign. Mr. Pauken filed a statement of candidacy on December 20, 1979. The Dallas Times Herald, on January 5, 1980, reported that Pauken was showing the film to spread "his face around town as he prepared for another Congressional campaign against U.S. Representative Jim Mattox of Dallas." Congressman Mattox used this article, as well as other reports stating that Pauken was showing the film to politically influential groups and making money from the film, as evidence that Pauken was receiving financial and/or in-kind contributions from Texas Forum, Inc. The complaint specifically states that Mr. Pauken showed the film to the "politically influential" Petroleum Engineers Club of Dallas on January 4, 1980; and "another politically involved group," the Dallas Apartment Association on February 28, 1980. In addition, the complaint states that the film was distributed with the aid of the American Conservative Union.

Thomas Pauken responded to the complaint in a letter dated October 31, 1980. Mr. Pauken denied the allegations, and stated that in May, 1979, he entered into an agreement with Texas Forum, Inc., regarding the production and distribution of the documentary film entitled "Whatever Works." The agreement stated that Mr. Pauken would be mainly responsible for arranging the production and marketing of the film. This agreement was further refined in November, 1979. Mr. Pauken arranged for roughly 40 copies of the film to be sold and he received full payment from Texas Forum for performing his job to produce and market the film.

In addition, Pauken stated that "At no time did any solicitation by Texas Forum to raise money for production of the film directly or indirectly accrue to or benefit my political campaign." He denies that the Texas Forum ever solicited, accepted or expended monies on behalf of his candidacy; and he stated that the few times he showed the film in 1980 were for non-political events.

William D. Elliott, counsel for Texas Forum, Inc., responded to the complaint in a letter dated November 3, 1980. Mr. Elliott explained that an "arm's length" agreement was made between Texas Forum and Thomas Pauken in connection with the production of "Whatever Works." Elliott stated that this film was the only activity of the Texas Forum in which Tom Pauken was ever involved, and he explained that Texas Forum is active in a number of different activities. Mr. Elliott rejects the idea that Mr. Pauken used the film for political purposes and states that the agreement Texas Forum had with Pauken, which Pauken abided by, required that he not use the film in that manner. Elliott also stated that no monies were solicited or raised by the Texas Forum on behalf of Pauken's candidacy, and the only monies paid to Pauken were in accordance with their agreement.

Upon review of the facts stated in the complaint and the responses from Thomas Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc., it appears that there is reason to believe that a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b has occurred. This finding is based on the fact that Thomas Pauken showed the corporate-financed film after he was a declared candidate. In addition, neither he nor the Texas Forum, Inc. explained what role the American Conservative Union played in the distribution of the film. It is recommended that the Commission proceed in this matter and obtain additional information from the Respondents in connection with a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b.

In connection with the Complainant's allegation that a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 433 (e) had been committed, this section is no longer a part of the Act and will not be addressed in this report. In addition, since Texas Forum, Inc. is a non-profit corporation (and not incorporated for liability purposes only), it cannot exist as a political committee, and therefore, 2 U.S.C. §§ 433 and 434 are not relevant to this discussion.

Recommendations

1. Find reason to believe that Thomas W. Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b.
2. Send the attached letters to the Respondents.

Enclosed is a three (3) count complaint I am hereby filing with the Federal Elections Commission against Thomas W. Pauken, Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, 5th District, Texas; and the Texas Forum Inc.

The complaint contains documented information that shows Mr. Pauken has:

1. Knowingly and willfully accepted corporate campaign contributions from and through the Texas Forum Inc., in violation of 2 USC 441 (b);
2. Knowingly and willfully allowed an organization known as the Texas Forum, Inc. to solicit, accept and expend monies aggregating \$1,000 or more on behalf of his candidacy without reporting and registering the name of said organization as a principal and/or affiliated campaign committee as required in 2 USC 433 (a) and/or 2 USC 433 (e);
3. Knowingly and willfully failed to report financial and/or in-kind contributions from the Texas Forum, Inc. that have been used to directly benefit his political candidacy. This violates 2 USC 434.

While this complaint is addressed to three (3) specific violations of law, which come under the jurisdiction of the Federal Election Commission, the facts reveal that Tom Pauken and others may have violated other criminal and civil statutes as well.

In addition to the violations outlined above, Mr. Pauken may have violated 2 USC 701 et seq. in that he has knowingly and willfully concealed the "source, type, and amount of income (including honoraria and the date received) aggregating \$100 or more in value received from any source during the preceding calendar year." (emphasis added).

The instructions, which accompany the Candidate Financial Disclosure Statement, clearly direct the candidate that the "term 'income' is intended to be all-inclusive, as defined in the Act. The identity of the source and the amount or category of value of all income which exceeds \$100 from any one source must be disclosed separately" (emphasis added).

The great weight of evidence presented in this complaint points to an inextricable nexus between Tom Pauken the candidate and the Texas Forum, Inc., and its officers.

What is clear from the evidence is that the corporation Texas Forum, Inc., was created for the sole purpose of furthering the political candidacy of Tom Pauken.

The corporation was formed by his former campaign chairman and treasurer and former legal counsel. It produced a movie with funds derived from corporate and other sources and allowed this movie to be used by Mr. Pauken while he was an active and announced candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives.

Thousands of dollars have changed hands in connection with this film, and Mr. Pauken himself admits to benefiting personally from the production. Yet he has not revealed the sources of this remuneration as is required by law and has, on repeated occasions, refused to do so when pointedly asked.

Such refusals would indicate his failure to report this income is knowing and willful and therefore may subject Mr. Pauken and others to the criminal provisions of 18 USC 1001 and the civil provisions of 2 USC 706. If found guilty, Mr. Pauken and others may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both.

Inasmuch as these are serious violations, which come under the jurisdiction of the United States Justice Department, I am forwarding a copy of this letter and complaint to Mr. Kenneth Mighell, the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Texas.

Complainant would show the following:

Thomas W. Pauken (hereinafter referred to as Respondent Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as respondent Texas Forum) have failed to comply with the provisions of 2 USC § 441b (a), in that Respondent Pauken, as a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, has knowingly and willfully accepted and received unlawful corporate contributions from and through The Texas Forum, Inc., a corporation registered in the State of Texas. Respondent Pauken has accepted unlawful corporate contributions through the respondent Texas Forum, in that both Respondent Texas Forum and Respondent Pauken have solicited contributions from other corporate entities on respondent Pauken's behalf.

"Contribution" is defined in 2 USC § 441 (b) (2) as "any direct or indirect payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit or gift of money or any services, or anything of value." (emphasis added.) The facts outlined in this Complaint indicate that Respondent Pauken, while an active and announced candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, accepted and used a film, entitled "Whatever Works" (which was paid for with corporate funds solicited by the Texas Forum, Inc.), as a tool to promote his campaign. On numerous occasions, Respondent Pauken promoted his candidacy with this film including January 4, 1980, when he appeared before the politically influential Petroleum Engineers Club of Dallas; and again on February 28, 1980, when he appeared before another politically involved group, the Dallas Apartment Association. Respondent Pauken also promoted his candidacy by distributing the corporate-financed film with the aid of the American Conservative Union (ACU). (Statement of Facts at G.) The ACU is a political organization headed by Republican Congressman Robert Bauman of Maryland, that seeks to influence legislation and promote political candidates by, among other things, publishing and distributing statements and ratings of Members of Congress on how they voted on specific items of legislation.


II.

Respondent Pauken has failed to comply with 2 USC § 433 (a) and/or 2 USC § 433 (e) in that he has failed to register with the Federal Elections Commission and/or his principal campaign committee a "Statement of Organization for a Political Committee" for the Texas Forum. Respondent Pauken has knowingly and willfully allowed Respondent Texas Forum to accept contributions and to make expenditures in the aggregate exceeding \$1,000 on behalf of Respondent Pauken's candidacy.

"Expenditure" is defined in 2 USC § 431 (f) as any "purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value, made for the purpose of... influencing the... election... of any person to Federal office." (Emphasis added.)

III.

Respondent Pauken has failed to comply with the provisions of 2 USC § 434 in that he has knowingly and willfully failed to "file with the Commission reports of receipts" of financial and/or in-kind contributions, which he has received from respondent Texas Forum. Respondent Pauken has also converted corporate contributions received through respondent Texas Forum to his personal use.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A.

In 1976, Thomas W. Pauken a/k/a Tom Pauken was a candidate for the Texas State Senate in Dallas, Texas. His campaign chairman at that time was Bill Elliott a/k/a Wm. D. Elliott and his campaign legal council (sic) was Joe Morris a/k/a Joseph B. Morris. (Exhibit A)

B.

In 1978, Thomas W. Pauken a/k/a Tom Pauken was a candidate for the U.S. Congress. His campaign chairman and treasurer was Wm. D. Elliott. (Exhibit B)

C.

On May 17, 1979, Articles of Incorporation for The Texas Forum, Inc. (a tax exempt corporation prohibited from engaging in political activities) were filed in the office of the Secretary of State of Texas. The Texas Forum, Inc., was organized "to receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and subject to the restrictions hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended." (Emphasis added.)

Article 4, Section (2) of the Articles of Incorporation of The Texas Forum, Inc., state that "No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements)

any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office." (Emphasis added.)

The agent and president of the Corporation is listed as Wm. D. Elliott and the office location of The Texas Forum, Inc., is listed at 2400 One Dallas Center, Dallas, Texas 75201. The Secretary of The Texas Forum, Inc., is listed as Joseph B. Morris. (Exhibit C)

D.

Although the Articles of Incorporation of The Texas Forum, Inc., state the address of the corporation to be 2400 One Dallas Centre, Dallas, Texas, the 1980 Dallas telephone directory lists The Texas Forum at 5114 Willis Avenue, 826-4468. (Exhibit D)

E.

The 1980 Dallas telephone directory lists Tom Pauken at 5114 Willis Avenue, 826-4468. (Exhibit E)

F.

On September 9, 1979, The Dallas Morning News reported that Tom Pauken followed actress Jane Fonda to Washington, D.C., to show a film entitled "Whatever Works." The film was produced by The Texas Forum, Inc., and, according to Zack Burkett, the producer of the film and proprietor of FD Productions, a film company, the film cost \$100,000 to produce. Pauken was quoted as saying he intended to show the film everywhere Ms. Fonda was to appear, which, according to The Dallas Morning News' story, was to be in 50 cities over a 32-day period. Zack Burkett said the film was to be sold to "veterans, service and college organizations." (Exhibit F)

G.

On September 30, 1979, the Mesquite Daily News quoted Tom Pauken as saying that the film "Whatever Works" was "produced with the support of the Texas Forum and distributed with the

aid of the American Conservative Union." The American Conservative Union (ACU) is a political organization headed by Republican Congressman Robert Bauman of Maryland and located at 316 Pennsylvania Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C. 20003. The ACU seeks to influence legislation by, among other things, publishing and distributing statements and ratings of members of Congress on how they voted on specific items of legislation. (Exhibit G)

H.

There is no listing of any business corporation by the name of FD Productions with the Corporations Division of the Secretary of State's office in Austin, Texas; nor is there any partnership or any other business entity by that name listed with the State Comptroller's office in Austin, Texas, or in the Assumed Name Records of the Dallas County Clerk's office.

There is, however, a partnership by the name of Film Dallas registered with the State Comptroller's office in Austin, Texas, which has been assigned State Sales Tax Certificate No. 3000173319. The Film Dallas partnership was registered with the State Comptroller's office on January 1, 1973, and the principal officers of the partnership are listed as Zack Burkett and Frank R. Simon. The principal location and mailing address of Film Dallas is listed as 1221 Elmwood Dr., Richardson, Texas 75080. (Exhibit H)

I.

The 1978 Dallas Telephone Directory lists the firm of Film Dallas at 5114 Willis Avenue. (Exhibit I)

J.

On or before December 20, 1979, Tom Pauken filed a statement of candidacy with the Federal Elections Commission for the office of U.S. House of Representatives, District 5, Texas. (Exhibit J)

K.

On January 5, 1980, while Tom Pauken was an active political candidate for the U.S. Congress, the Dallas Times Herald reported that Pauken was actively showing the film "Whatever Works" to "any group that will let him in the door." It was also reported that Pauken was using the film to spread "his face around town as he prepares for another Congressional campaign against U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox of Dallas." The news report indicated that Pauken showed the film on Friday, January 4, 1980, to the politically influential Petroleum Engineers Club in Dallas and that the "film is being sold to companies and other interested buyers for \$500." (Exhibit K)

L.

On January 21, 1980, Tom Pauken was quoted in the Dallas Times-Herald as saying that he had personally made "a few thousand dollars" off the film. (Exhibit L)

M.

On February 2, 1980, Tom Pauken was quoted in The Dallas Morning News as saying he had "made less than \$5,000 from the Texas Forum/FD Productions film. (Exhibit M)

N.

On February 28, 1980, candidate Tom Pauken showed the film "Whatever Works" to an owner's breakfast seminar of the Dallas Apartment Association. (Exhibit N)

O.

On May 14, 1980, Thomas W. Pauken, candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from District 5, Texas, filed an "Ethics in Government Act--Financial Disclosure Statement" in which he reported his total 1979 calendar year income to be \$19, 720.00 and his total income for the period January 1, 1980, through May 14, 1980, to be \$7,016.62. The statement indicates that the sole source of Mr. Pauken's income was from the practice of law as a "self-employed attorney and counselor." The same document indicates that his holdings include an "office building/duplex at 5114 Willis Avenue (owned with father-- $\frac{1}{2}$ interest)." (Exhibit O)

P.

On May 19, 1980, the Dallas Times Herald quoted Pauken as saying he had made "between \$5,000 and \$10,000 on a film he made that features the political activities of actress Jane Fonda." (Exhibit P)

Q.

On September 16, 1980, both the Dallas Times Herald and The Dallas Morning News quoted Pauken as saying he "made about \$10,000 on the film," which he "co-wrote and starred in." William D. Elliott, president of the tax-exempt Texas Forum, Inc., was quoted as saying that \$50,000 in "contributions" had been received for the film but because the organization (Texas Forum, Inc.) is a "charitable group," he would not reveal the names of the contributors. (Exhibit Q)

R.

On or about September 9, 1979 Mr. Zack Burkett indicated that the film "Whatever Works" cost \$100,000 to produce (see Exhibit F). On or about September 16, 1980 Mr. Wm. D. Elliott indicated that the Texas Forum, Inc. received "about \$50,000

in contributions to produce the film "Whatever Works"
(see exhibit Q).

There are no facts on the record to indicate which,
if either, of these statements is correct.

S.

A high degree of financial and political interaction exists
between Tom Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. and the film making
enterprises, Film Dallas and FD Productions.

This financial interaction is of a personal as well as
political nature.

The facts show that Tom Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc.
are both listed at 5114 Willis Avenue. Pauken is also the
principal actor in and director of the corporation's only
work product, the film "Whatever Works." The facts also
indicate that he is the principal distributor (with the aid
of the American Conservative Union) and salesman of the film.

The political and financial relationship between Pauken
and the firms Film Dallas and FD Productions is equally
interconnected.

As was pointed out in statement of Facts I, the 1978
Dallas telephone listed both Film Dallas and FD Productions
in either the 1978 or 1979 Dallas telephone directories.

In 1980, both Film Dallas and FD Productions appear
in the Dallas telephone directory at 3416 Main Street.


On May 17, 1980, the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee
made a payment to a firm named "Francis Associates" in the
amount of \$6,200.00 The Pauken campaign committee lists
"Francis Associates" at 3416 Main Street. (exhibit T)

While the firm Francis Associates is not listed in the
Dallas telephone directory, a check with the Corporations
Division of the Texas Secretary of State's office reveals a
Francis Associates at 2006 Shaw Street in Wichita Falls,

Texas (817-766-0121). The corporation's charter number is 344316. When contactd by telephone in Wichita Falls, Texas, and asked if there was any relationship between Francis Associates of Wichita Falls and Francis Associates in Dallas, the receptionist replied that there was and that the Dallas contact person was Zack Burkett.

A review of the itemized expenditure statements of the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee indicate that a total of \$12,079.83 in campaign funds have been paid to Film Dallas, FD Productions and/or Francis Associates at either 5114 Willis Avenue and/or 3416 Main Street, Dallas, Texas (Exhibit U).

A total of \$27,224.99 in campaign funds have been paid out of the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee to addressees listed at 5114 Willis Avenue (Exhibit V).

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, all three of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE 1.

The name of the corporation is TEXAS FORUM, INC.

ARTICLE 2.

The corporation is a non-profit corporation.

ARTICLE 3.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE 4.

(1) The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are to receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational purposes either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

(2) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director of the corporation, officer of the corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no director or officer of the corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the

corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

(3) The corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(4) The corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, which would subject any person to the imposition of any tax under Section 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(5) The corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws which would subject the corporation to the imposition of any tax under Section 4943 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(6) The corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(7) The corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws which would subject any person to the imposition of any tax

under Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(8) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

(9) Upon dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, testing for public safety, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

Pauken stalks 'Hanoi-Jane'

Dallasite tries to foil Ms. Fonda with own weapon: a film

WASHINGTON — Dallas lawyer Tom Pauken followed actress Jane Fonda to Washington Wednesday with his new anti-New Left documentary film, *Whatever Works*.

The film, which includes shots of the actress on her visit to Hanoi during the Vietnam War and speculates on the political motives of her husband, Tom Hayden, was produced with financial support of the Texas Forum organization of Dallas and will be distributed with the aid of the American Conservative Union.

Ms. Fonda and Hayden spoke Wednesday at the National Press Club as a part of a 50-city, 32-day tour to argue for closing down the country's 72 nuclear power plants and to explain the Campaign for Economic Democracy, a plan to change the nation's economic

structure and to relieve "corporate pressure" in government.

PAUKEN, AN unsuccessful candidate for congress and who is expected to oppose U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox, D-Dallas, again next year, said he hopes to show the film everywhere Ms. Fonda and Hayden appear.

The film was produced by Zack Burkett and his FD productions of Dallas. Burkett hopes to recoup the \$100,000 cost by selling the film to veterans, service and college organizations. It also features Pauken interviewing persons on the subject of the New Left leaders.

Col. George Day, a former POW who appears in the film and accompanied Pauken at a news conference in Washington, charged that the Campaign for Economic Democracy, which has elected persons to office in California, is an anti-capitalist coalition

planning to convert the nation to a socialist or Communist system.

PAUKEN SAID the discussion of the movement and the film of Ms. Fonda joking with North Vietnamese soldiers is an attempt to educate young persons who may be unaware of the backgrounds of participants in anti-nuclear and New Left activities.

In their National Press Club appearance, Ms. Fonda and Hayden said the CED is aimed at a system in which there are more smaller companies and better public representation on boards of directors.

Hayden criticized socialism for creating state bureaucracy and said he preferred a "decentralized, grass-roots organization" instead of nationalization, and he described antitrust actions as a "liberal remedy which has declining value."

Pauken produces docum

The 60s, remembered as a decade of unrest, civil disobedience, demonstrations and violence, could be reported in the '80s, warns Dallas attorney and Mesquite resident Tom Pauken.

As a sort of preventive measure, Pauken has produced a documentary film that delves into the actions of the "New Left" and other controversial groups and personalities of the Vietnam era. The film is being made available to interested groups.

"I think the '80s are going to be very much like the '60s. I'm not looking forward to it" said Pauken, who ran unsuccessfully for Congress last year. He said he sees the potential for violence coming from the "New Left" and an organization headed by former peace revolutionaries Tom Hayden and Jane Fonda.

Hayden and Fonda, who have recently been involved in anti-nuclear power plant demonstrations, are currently on a 32-day tour to promote the Campaign for Economic Democracy, an organization Pauken said has its roots in the radical group Students for a Democratic Society.

As a college student in the early '60s and national chairman of College Republican, Pauken frequently debated against Hayden. "He's a very effective force and effective leader, but I'm disturbed by his actions," Pauken said.

"I decided something had to be done." That "something" was to produce the film, "Whatever Works," documenting the New Left, SDS, Fonda and Hayden and the Vietnam era demonstrators.

"The New Left was different from other activists who just wanted us to get out (of Vietnam). They wanted the

other side to win."

Footage of Fonda joking with North Vietnamese soldiers is one of the subjects of the film which features interviews with such people as Joan Buez, Col. George Day, a former POW and Congressional Medal of Honor winner and Reader's Digest editor Ken Tomlinson among others.

Pauken and Day traveled to Washington Wednesday for a press conference to promote the film.

Hayden and Fonda also were in Washington Wednesday.

The film will be made available to groups across the country to be shown in cities where Hayden and Fonda are appearing. Pauken said he will not be able to personally follow the two.

Among the groups interested in the film include college groups, labor unions, veteran groups, churches, the BBC and other television stations, Pauken said. However, the supporters

of the film "would mostly like young people to see it."

"Our thinking is the young people ought to have a different perspective of the '60s from what Hayden tells them," Pauken said. "It's like history to them," he said of the students born in the early '60s. "It's like, 'That's making me think,'" he added.

One student, he said he had been told, had reportedly asked Hayden at a rally about a 1962 statement he had made that "whole cities could be powered by nuclear energy."

The whole issue of nuclear energy, Pauken agreed, is a means to gain public support. "What issue will they use? Whatever works," he quoted from the film of the same title.

In California, members of the New Left have used issues such as rent control to get their candidates elected to public office, he said. Much of the

support of the film has come from Californians, Pauken added.

Although nuclear energy has been the crux of Hayden and Fonda's recent activism, the film is neither pro or anti-nuclear. "The film itself deals with the New Left," said Pauken, who added he would generally favor nuclear energy with safeguards to guarantee its safety.

Although he intends to oppose Jim Mattox for Congress again in 1980,

he said, asking how that could affect Texas votes.

Pauken still debating against Fonda, New Left

Dallas attorney Tom Pauken, who spent the 1960s as a Young Republican debating anti-war activists like Tom Hayden on college campuses, has experienced a strange sense of déjà vu recently.

The war has gone away. But Hayden and his wife actress Jane Fonda haven't.

Instead, Pauken has seen them pick up other issues, like nuclear power, to stir up a whole new crop of young people.

Not to be outdone by his former debating opponents, Pauken hasn't faded away either.

He's going at them again, this time with a documentary film entitled, "Whatever Works," which includes shots of Miss Fonda joking around with North Vietnamese soldiers on her visit to Hanoi.

Pauken is showing his expose of the New Left to any group that will let him in the door. He's not only

spreading the bad word about Hayden and Fonda, he's also spreading his face around town as he prepares for another congressional campaign against U. S. Rep. Jim Mattox of Dallas.

He showed both (the movie and the face) to the Petroleum Engineers Club of Dallas Friday.

"For the young people of today, the '60s were nothing more than what they see on TV about it," said Pauken, a former Army intelligence officer in Vietnam. "We wanted them to have an idea of what they were really like."

Pauken pictures the New Left as people who will use any issue to further their own political goals, which he believes are to take over the Democratic and convert the nation to a socialist system. He sees them as a force to be reckoned with instead of ignored.

"Some people may laugh at that, but I was one of the first people early in the 60s to suggest that the New Left would be a major force in the

60s. It certainly was," said Pauken.

The movie features not only Fonda and Hayden in film clips from the past two decades, but also singer Joaquin Baez in a sympathetic role. In one of the spots where the film showed some blurry camera work, Hayden talks Baez to in an on-the-run interview after a news conference.

Dr. Alan Saxe, who allowed Pauken to show the film to one of his University of Texas at Arlington political science classes, said he came away with a more negative view of Miss Fonda.

"The film was effective," he said, "especially the scenes of her with the North Vietnamese soldiers. I had never seen those scenes before."

However, said Saxe, he doesn't believe Hayden or his wife have a

chance of taking over the Democratic party.

"I don't think Hayden and Fonda have any broad-based support. They're just personalities," he said.

Saxe said he believes it's good that Pauken is raising the debate.

"On major college campuses, in the social sciences, there has been a leftist perspective in recent years. I think it's healthy to try to challenge the left."

The film, produced by Zack Burkett and his FD productions of Dallas, cost \$50,000 to make and was financially sponsored by the Texas Forum

of Dallas. The film is being sold to companies and other interested buyers for \$500. The operation will break even with a few more purchases, said Pauken.

Pauken not only did interviews for the movie, he was co-producer, co-director and co-writer.

Col. George Day, a former POW, also appears in the movie to blast Miss Fonda for her visits to Hanoi. Those visits, filmed and shown to POWs by the Communists, lowered the morale of the captives, he said.

"Jane Fonda is an outrageous liar,"

said Day. Later he repeats: "She is a hypocrite and a liar."

But Saxe said he doubts the movie will have much effect on young people. Neither, however, does he see college students rising up en masse to follow Hayden and Miss Fonda.

"If you showed the film on any college campus, the kids would maybe go to sleep," he said.

"They're so attuned to the media that they're not shocked, they're not dissuaded, they're not persuaded," he said. "The kids today are almost like rocks. They can't be moved."

Ron Calhoun / Debut as a lamb

Republican Tom Pauken has launched his second bid for the 5th Congressional District seat coming out of the chute more like a lamb than the lion he attempted to emulate in his unsuccessful 1976 campaign to unseat incumbent Democrat Jim Mattox.

In 1976 Pauken verbally clawed Mattox from start to finish. But when he recently announced a running mate, this year he told reporters he had adopted a New Year's resolution — "not to get mad at Jim Mattox no matter what he says about me."

"I think it's important to take the high road and talk about the issues," Pauken said, challenging Mattox to a series of issue-oriented debates.

After the news conference, reporters told him how long it would take the lamb to Pauken to be swallowed by the lion.

Pauken got somewhat riled when he was asked what he thought about friends of Mattox circulating copies of a report he (Pauken) filed with the House Ethics Committee showing that he made only \$10,000 practicing law in 1978.

Mattox has repeatedly raised questions about how Pauken supports his wife and four small children when he has spent most of the last four years campaigning. (In 1976, Pauken lost a race to State Sen. Bill Starnes.)

Pauken claimed he had implemented a 1976 income by dipping into savings and borrowing \$3,500 from the bank. He said his latest report to the ethics committee included all congressional candidates would show he made approximately

\$20,000 in 1978, most of it from practicing law, but some from other ventures, including sales of a film he made on the political activities of Jane Fonda and her husband, Tom Hayden. He said he had made "a few thousand dollars" off the film.

Ironically, Mattox denied all of this. He thinks anybody who would follow Jane Fonda around to make a film about her political activities is silly. Coming from a poor family, Mattox got himself, his brother and sister through college and has made a lot of money out of his law practice, stock and real estate dealings. The point he seems to be trying to sell is that Pauken is so obsessed with politics and winning an office — any office — that his family suffers.

The point that should be made is that it is sometimes difficult to discern what might become an "issue" in a campaign, or what motivates a voter to vote as he or she does. Political writers question candidates about all sorts of things, some of which have a direct bearing on how the candidates will vote or comport themselves in office and others which have no bearing at all. But whether the questions and responses are totally relative and completely incisive may not mean beans to your average voter.

Mattox apparently believes that how Pauken makes a living or whether he makes a living at all, will influence how people perceive the man and ultimately how they vote in the race.

Pauken told newsmen that questions about his ability to make a living and his income were only a continuation of the kind of tactics Mattox used in 1976 when "he called me a bunch of names. He doesn't talk about the issues. He gets into personalities."

For his part, Pauken said he intended to pursue issues of importance to influen-

scrapped middle-income families. Pauken would deny it, but maybe, just maybe, he wanted to subtly point out that Mattox's better status and high income level were out of tune with the 5th District electorate.

Pauken called for abolition of the marriage tax "under which a married couple filing a joint return pays more than twice that of unmarried couple living together. He wants tax incentives that would "make it easier for families to take care of their senior family members" and encourage small savers, particularly those who save for their children's education.

But in the final analysis, the outcome of the contest may depend more on demographic changes in the 5th District and who the presidential candidates are than the subtle and not-so-subtle thrusts by both candidates.

Pauken said the 5th District population had been declining in the predominantly black South Dallas precincts where Mattox beat him 1,600 votes to 500 votes in 1976, but was growing in the middle-income white precincts in Garland and Mesquite where he defeated Mattox. Pauken also claimed significant voter strength among young families moving into renovated housing in East Dallas — Mattox's home area.

If either of the Texas candidates — John Connally or George Bush — wins the GOP presidential nomination and Jimmy Carter is the Democratic nominee, turnout factors would be in Pauken's favor in the 5th. If Bush or Connally win the GOP nomination and Edward Kennedy is the Democratic nominee, the tide might still favor Pauken but not as much because Kennedy would turn out a heavy minority vote. If Ronald Reagan wins the Republican nomination, the tide would run in Mattox's favor regardless of whether the Democratic nominee was Carter or Kennedy.

Mattox announces for re-election

U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox, trying to return to those days in 1975 when he first ran for congress as a "fistsy, roll-up-your-sleeves fighter," announced for a third term Friday and quickly let any opponents know he would not "lie down and not swing back."

After Democrat Mattox won a second term to the 5th Congressional District in 1978 by an 800-vote margin, he promised he would not let his Republican opponent, Tom Pauken, again get away with taking so many verbal shots against him.

He repeated that promise Friday in a less-than-subtle warning to Pauken, the conservative lawyer who

once again has filed for the GOP nomination.

Mattox and Pauken have pledged to try to run the campaign on the issues this time and not let the election effort degenerate into the nasty name-calling battle that highlighted the 1978 affair.

Should it degenerate, however, Mattox left little doubt he would be more than willing to make as many offensive charges against Pauken as Pauken makes against him.

Mattox' only major shot at Pauken Friday came when he said Pauken's anti-New Left documentary film, featuring the political adventures of Jane Fonda, is really a "front" for Pauken to provide him income and allow him to campaign.

Pauken has denied that, saying he has made less than \$5,000 from the film, and most of his income is from his law practice.

Mattox said the film is similar to the old days of "red-baiting" and McCarthyism. He also theorized the film was one reason Republican Party officials tried so hard to find a primary opponent for Pauken.

Longtime Dallas businessman and civic leader Russell Perry announced Thursday he had decided not to challenge Pauken in the GOP primary, even though a survey showed Perry could have defeated both Pauken and Mattox.

Perry, who claimed he was too old to run, then endorsed Pauken.

Mattox' only other jab at Pauken was to say the reason Pauken moved

into the district was to seek political office. But those verbal darts were mild compared to the bitter 1978 campaign.

Mattox, trying to appeal both to the conservatives and liberals in the district and both to the Anglos and the 28 percent black and Mexican-American population, said his record has proven he is an independent, a "fiscal conservative, a humanitarian" and a strong supporter of individual rights.

He produced a list of 10 special interest groups that rate voting records. His rating in all of the groups ranged from 42 to 77 percent which indicates, he said, "nobody controls Jim Mattox and the only group of people I'm accountable to and listen to are my folks here at home."

~~Whatever Works~~ a film co-produced by Mr. Pauken shows how the controllers like to find a convenient target, then force the target to "play in the controllers ball park." He has been active in politics, serving two years as National Chairman of College Republicans, headquartered in Washington, D.C., and made an unsuccessful race for Congressman in the Fifth Congressional District.

Pauken says GOP fate hinges on running mate

Republican congressional candidate Tom Pauken, trying again this year to unseat Democratic Rep. Jim Mattox in the 5th District, says Ronald Reagan's selection of a running mate will be a "key" factor for GOP candidates in the general election.

Reagan is the apparent winner of the GOP presidential nomination now that George Bush has pulled out of the race. His campaign staff has commissioned a survey of Republican activists around the country on who they think would be the best vice presidential candidate for the party.

"I think Reagan will carry the 5th District," Pauken said Wednesday. "I think by how much he carries it depends on who else is on the ticket. That's a key. The selection by Reagan of his running mate is going to be more important than usual.

"I think he could carry it big. But the issue you hear is that Reagan needs help on foreign policy. The perception I get is that Mr. Carter is not competent in the foreign policy area but that Gov. Reagan is an unknown, so someone with foreign policy experience or background (as Reagan's running mate) would be helpful."

Pauken was narrowly defeated by Mattox in 1978 and already is knocking on doors in the 5th District for a second try. The 5th District, which covers East and Central Dallas County, is one of the top five districts in the country that have been targeted for turnarounds by the Republican National Committee.

Pauken said he also thought it was important that Reagan select a "younger man" as a running mate, and attempt to "reach out to all elements of the party and forge a conservative-moderate coalition."

Asked who he thought would be an ideal GOP vice presidential candidate, Pauken mentioned Bush, New York Congressman Jack Kemp, Indiana Sen. Richard G. Lugar and Tennessee Sen. Howard Baker.

"I think there is a good chance Reagan might pick Bush," Pauken said, noting that Bush barely lost the 5th District to Reagan in the Texas primary.

Mattox, meanwhile, has not been sitting still since he beat Pauken by only 800 votes out of more than 60,000 cast in the district in 1978.

Sources say he has been scurrying about the district spending a lot more time with constituents than he has in the past, and has been attending as many meetings as time permits with city councils, school boards and other organizations in the district.

His activity has paid off. He has taken at least one key political figure in Mesquite away from Pauken and brought him into his camp — City Councilman Joe D. Goggans.

In 1978, Goggans, a homebuilder, was on Pauken's campaign steering committee. Pauken, who now lives in Mesquite, won every precinct in the city except one.

But this year, Goggans is backing Mattox for re-election.

"After the election two years ago, in which I supported Tom wholeheartedly, Jim called up and said, 'Look, I want to work with you and I want to mend my fences.' Since that time, Jim has been very good about meeting with our council," Goggans said.

"When he comes into town, he has breakfast meetings with us and also has joint meetings with the school board. Jim and I still have political differences on certain issues, but I will say this: When we have had problems with the federal government, Jim has responded to us and has worked with us."

Goggans said Mesquite was trying to get federal help to build a municipal airport and was seeking a community development bloc grant to help pay for a drainage project in Southwest Mesquite. He said Mattox had helped in both areas.

Pauken passes off Goggans' switch to Mattox's arm-twisting as a member of the House Banking and Urban Affairs Committee.

"A guy who is on the Banking and Urban Affairs Committee can do a lot of favors for people and is going to get a few names," Pauken said.

For his part, Mattox continues to hammer away at his favorite theme — that his second battle with Pauken will turn on qualifications and experience. Mattox reminds that he has

been a member of the state legislature and Congress, while "the voters have rejected him (Pauken) twice" — once for the state Senate (in 1976) and once for Congress (in 1978).

Mattox continues to question how Pauken supports himself, his wife and four children while campaigning full time.

Pauken says he made a little more earlier this year by practicing law. He made between \$5,000 and \$10,000. If Jim he made that features political activities of active law firm and in growing money to the bank to pay living expenses.

He said he already has borrowed \$10,000 from the Mercantile National Bank and expects to borrow at least \$5,000 more to ride him through a November election.

Mattox, Pauken come out swinging

Film, defense votes targeted by bitter congressional opponents

MESQUITE — Near the end of a debate Monday between bitter political rivals Jim Mattox and Tom Pauken, a businessman asked, "Do y'all agree on anything?"

The head-to-head meeting of the two congressional candidates revealed about the only thing they agree on is opposition to mandatory wage and price controls.

The most glaring difference came in their interpretation of Mattox' voting record on national defense issues.

And, before the confrontation before the chamber of commerce in Mesquite ended, the candidates had exchanged mild insults, such as calling each other dishonest and Mattox accusing Pauken of being as "flakey" as actress Jane Fonda.

MATTOX, THE Democrat seeking his third term representing the 5th Congressional District, said an anti-New Left documentary put together by Pauken was backed financially by "folks in the nuclear power industry" who wanted Pauken to follow Ms. Fonda, an anti-nuclear activist, around the country and said that

Pauken has made some big money from the film.

Pauken, a conservative Republican making his second bid to unseat Mattox, said the financial backer of the film, Whatever Works, is a Dallas group called Texas Forum and that

contributions for the film come from various interest groups and individuals.

Pauken said he made about \$10,000 from the film, which he co-wrote and starred in.

Bill Elliot, president of Texas Forum, said about \$50,000 in contributions were received for the film. He would not reveal the names of the contributors because, he said, the organization is a "charitable group."

ELLIOT ALSO said the film does not deal with nuclear energy but with free enterprise. The forum was formed to promote free enterprise, he said.

"It takes an agile mind to grasp the point of the film, and Mattox does not have an agile mind," said Elliot, a longtime Pauken supporter.

After the debate, Mattox questioned why the \$10,000 Pauken made from the film was not listed on Pauken's financial disclosure statement.

In addition to discussing the film, the candidates took turns accusing each other of not telling the truth about whether Mattox is a strong supporter of national defense.

Mattox said in the year since he has been chairman of the National Defense Task Force of the House Budget Committee, defense spending increased by \$60 billion.

PAUKEN ACKNOWLEDGED the increase, but said Mattox had nothing to do with the increase in defense spending.

"He's not being honest when he says he is for a strong national defense," said Pauken, immediately drawing the ire of Mattox.

"I wish I could tell you my resentment," Mattox retorted angrily in answer to Pauken's comment.

While Mattox said he has voted for all the major increases for defense

spending, Pauken said the American Security Council has rated Mattox at only 40 percent of favorable voting.

Mattox, pointing out that he has made about 3,000 votes since being in congress, invited anyone to investigate any of those votes.

Pauken recalled Mattox' vote against a constitutional amendment that would have prohibited forced busing.

MATTOX SAID he opposes busing, has voted "three or four times" to create a legislative solution to forced busing, and the reason he voted against the amendment was because he does not believe it should be in the constitution.

Mattox then took the attack, saying if Pauken came to any businessman in the room and asked for a \$60,600 (congressional salary) job, he would be "laughed out of the room" because he does not have any experience or background.

Mattox, Pauken find little ground for agreement

MESQUITE — After U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox and Republican challenger Tom Pauken battled back and forth for 45 minutes Monday at a Mesquite Chamber of Commerce luncheon, somebody in the audience asked the two candidates if they agreed on "anything."

At first, there was silence.

Pauken finally said if there was any agreement, it was because Mattox had swiped several of his stands on issues. He charged Mattox had adopted his positions on giving tax incentives to small savers and tax relief to married couples after he found out how popular the stands were.

Then the two — who have been bitter foes since 1978 when they first clashed in the 5th District — went at it again.

Mattox countered that he had been in favor of giving tax relief to small savers and married couples for "a long time" and that Pauken was misrepresenting his record.

Mattox said Pauken backed the Kemp-Roth tax cutting bill, which favored families in the \$60,000-plus a

year tax bracket, while he had introduced a tax reduction bill favoring families making less than \$60,000.

He said there was nothing wrong with wealthy families getting a tax break, but "I don't represent those people. They live in Jim Collins' (3rd District (Northwest Dallas County))."

Pauken reiterated a charge he made at a Saturday news conference — that Mattox repeatedly had voted with the "liberal caucus" in the U.S. House and had one of the worst voting records on defense matters of any Texas congressman. He said the American Security Council had rated Mattox as voting "right" only 40 per cent of the time on defense.

Pauken also blasted Mattox for voting to give the Sandinista government in Nicaragua \$75 million in economic aid to help rebuild their war-shattered country. Pauken charged that the Sandinistas were bent on establishing a Castro-style government in the Central American nation, which would undermine U.S. interests.

Mattox replied he had cast 3,000 votes since he had been elected to the 5th District seat in 1976, and he defied Pauken to prove he had consis-

tently voted with "the liberal caucus."

He passed out a flyer he said indicated he was a moderate and representative of his "highly-diverse" district, which is 23 per cent black and 5 per cent other minorities.

The flyer showed Mattox had a 50 per cent "approval" record with the U. S. Chamber of Commerce; 42 per cent with the liberal Americans for Democratic Action and conservative Americans for Constitutional Action;

58 per cent with the National Association of Manufacturers; 50 per cent with the AFL-CIO; 50 per cent with the Conservative index; 48 per cent with Ralph Nader's Public Citizen-Congress Watch and 46 per cent with the Consumer Federation.

As for the American Security Council, Mattox said, "Sure, they don't like me because I don't buy everything they have to sell."

He charged that the organization was made up of defense contractors who wanted to spend \$250 billion a year on defense instead of the current \$170 billion a year.

"Since I have been on the Budget Committee, we have increased defense spending from \$110.5 billion to \$170.4 billion," Mattox said. "The need for increased defense spending is a given. The difference is the Republicans want to recommission some old battleships and build airplanes that will be outmoded before they come off the assembly line. I won't give a blank check to the Pentagon or any other agency."

On the illegal alien question, Pauken said he favored a return to the old practice of giving limited "green-card" visas to Mexican braceros to

work in this country. Mattox said he backed criminal or civil penalties against businessmen who hire illegal aliens.

A questioner in the audience asked Pauken who financed the "Jane Fonda" film he produced and has been showing widely throughout the 5th District, and how much money he had made off of it.

Pauken declined to answer the question directly. He claimed the film was a documentary about the "new left" that was still a threat to the internal security of this country.

Mattox claimed "some people in the nuclear power industry" financed the film as a campaign gimmick for Pauken through a "front" called the Texas Forum. He further charged Pauken had failed to report income from the film although he had been quoted as saying he had sold several copies of it for \$500 apiece.

After the luncheon, Pauken said the financiers of the film included "business, labor, veteran and student groups" and was headed by attorney William D. Elliott, former president of the Dallas County Republican Mens Club. He estimated he personally had grossed about \$10,000 on the film.



This letter is a response to the complaint filed on October 20, 1980, by Congressman Jim Mattox against me and the Texas Forum.

I categorically reject all allegations asserted in the complaint.

The summary facts are these:

1. Texas Forum, a non-profit corporation and I entered into an agreement regarding the production and distribution of a documentary film entitled "Whatever Works" in May 1979. Under the agreement, Texas Forum would finance the film, and I would perform various services, but be mainly responsible for arranging for the production and marketing of the film. I was to be paid as funds were available above and beyond the costs of the film.

2. On November 21, 1979, an agreement was entered into between FD Productions, the company that technically produces the film and Texas Forum establishing the amounts outstanding to me, FD Productions and others. As monies were available, I, along with other creditors of the Texas Forum, were paid.

3. The film was completed by fall of 1979. After that time, I was principally responsible for marketing the film. I have arranged for roughly 40 copies of the film to be sold. During the fall of 1979 when the film was being marketed, Texas Forum president, Wm. D. Elliott and I agreed that my telephone number would be used for those persons interested in inquiring about the film. The only purpose of using my telephone number was for inquiries about the film.

4. At no time did any solicitation by Texas Forum to raise money for production of the film directly or indirectly accrue to or benefit my political campaign. At no time, did the Texas Forum solicit, accept or expend monies on behalf of my candidacy. I agreed to produce and market a film for a fee. I performed my job and received full payment.



My fee for producing and marketing the film was fixed in 1979 and not dependent upon the number of times the film was shown. This letter is a response to the complaint filed in the above captioned matter by the Honorable Jim Mattox against the Texas Forum, Inc., of which I am president. The complaint was filed on October 20, 1980.

I am filing this complaint in my capacity as president of Texas Forum, Inc.

We deny all of the allegations made by the complainant.

Salient facts that are necessary to explain the relationship of the Texas Forum to Thomas W. Pauken, candidate for Congress from the Fifth District, Texas are as follows: The Texas Forum was chartered as a non-profit corporation on May 17, 1979. The Texas Forum was designed to be an educational, non-profit corporation formed for the purpose of promoting free enterprise and preserving our traditional American values.

Tom Pauken has never been an officer, founder, or director of the Texas Forum. The only activity of the Texas Forum in which Tom Pauken has been involved is the film. He has had no other involvement in the other activities of the Texas Forum.

Shortly after the Texas Forum was formed, it entered into an agreement with Thomas W. Pauken ("Pauken"), FD Productions and John Rudin for the purpose of the production of a film entitled "Whatever Works". This agreement was entered into at arms

length, and under which the three parties contracting with the Texas Forum, were to render services leading up to the production of the film.

The decision to produce the film was made solely by the directors of Texas Forum.

Included within the services to be rendered by Tom Pauken to the Texas Forum were total responsibility over the production and marketing of the film on behalf of Texas Forum. The fee to be paid to Tom Pauken was to be established a few months later when a clearer idea of the work involved was determined. It was understood by Pauken, FD Productions and John Rudin that they would be paid only if the Texas Forum had sufficient funds after the cost and expenses of producing the film were met.

During the summer of 1979 initial contributions were solicited from corporations and individuals to pay for production of the film. The film was completed in September 1979 and marketing of the film began at that point.

On November 21, 1979 an agreement was entered into between FD Productions, and the Texas Forum setting forth the financial obligations to FD Productions, Tom Pauken, John Rudin and others for their services rendered in connection with the production of the film. This agreement was negotiated at arms length and with free bargaining on both sides. With the exception of one or two payments made prior to the negotiation and execution of the agreement of November 21, 1979, as monies were available the Texas Forum began discharging its obligations to all of its creditors, including Tom Pauken, FD Productions and John Rudin. A copy of the agreement is attached as Exhibit A to this letter.

Tom Pauken served as contact point for the Texas Forum pertaining to this sale and distribution and production of the film. To control the disposition and use of the film, an agreement was prepared to be entered into by Tom Pauken on behalf of the Texas Forum whenever the film was sold. A copy of the form agreement is attached as Exhibit B. In some cases I executed the agreement as president, but most of the agreements were entered into by Tom Pauken on behalf of Texas Forum. For marketing reasons, Tom Pauken was designated as the contact point for persons interested in purchasing or renting the film, or discussing it. This is the reason why his telephone number was used in the Dallas Telephone Directory. Since the Texas Forum is not an enterprise that requires a permanent office, only for purposes of inquiring about the film was the telephone number at Tom's office to be used. For all other purposes, my office was used as the contact point for the Texas Forum.

In August, 1980 the last payment was made to Tom Pauken in complete settlement and discharge of any obligations the Texas Forum owed him.

The Texas Forum has engaged in a number of other activities apart from the production of the film, although the production of the film is the dominant activity of the Forum during its first year. For example, a series of luncheons have been held with young community and business leaders with speakers of interest to enlighten them on the free enterprise system and traditional American values. Approximately seven luncheons have been held during the past 12 months and each luncheon was attended by 30 to 40 individuals. Contributions were solicited at each luncheon.

In addition, several projects have been investigated. In particular, we considered producing a film on heroic activities during World War II on naval vessels having a connection with the State of Texas. Upon serious investigation and analysis the Board of Directors of Texas Forum rejected the project and referred it to the Texas Historical

Commission. Extensive meetings were held and discussions undertaken but it was rejected because of its irrelevance to our purposes.

Finally, serious thought has been given to establishing other branches and divisions of the Texas Forum and other cities in Texas, especially Houston. It was determined by the Board of Directors, that this expansion of our activities should wait until 1981 when time commitments can be rearranged.

The complaints filed against Texas Forum should be rejected for the following reasons:

1. The financial arrangement entered into between the Texas Forum and Tom Pauken was in 1979 and was for services rendered. Tom Pauken rendered those services, and the Texas Forum paid him in complete discharge of our obligation to him.

2. While Tom Pauken was the contact for the marketing and distribution of the film, he had no role or participation in the other activity in which the Texas Forum engaged. His role was merely an independent contractor and attorney for the Texas Forum for which the Texas Forum paid him reasonable fees. He has never been, and is not, a founder, officer or director of the Texas Forum.

3. No monies were solicited or raised by the Texas Forum on behalf of the political candidacy of Tom Pauken. Monies were raised for the Texas Forum for its purposes and any monies paid to Tom Pauken were in accordance with the Agreement entered into on November 21, 1979.

4. The agreement that we had with Tom Pauken required that he not use the film for political purposes. The Texas Forum rejects the idea that Mr. Pauken used the film to promote his political campaign. The occasions that he showed the film did not involve political appearances. He completely lived up to his agreement with the Texas Forum regarding the uses to which the film may be put.

Not only are most of the statements and facts presented in the complaint wrong and misleading, Texas Forum, Inc. and Tom Pauken have gone to great lengths to keep an arms length distance and business like approach in the production of this film. Tom Pauken performed services to the Texas Forum, and we paid him.

We shall be happy to cooperate to any degree necessary to resolve this ridiculous complaint. Please contact me at the above number if we can be of further assistance.



RECITALS

1. Texas Forum owns the rights to a certain film, the subject of this Agreement, and Purchaser wishes to purchase said film;
2. Texas Forum is willing to sell the film, but certain conditions with respect to the use of the film property are required to be made before the sale is consummated.

AGREEMENT

1. Sale. Texas Forum shall sell and Purchaser shall purchase the film property hereinafter described.
2. Purchase Price. The purchase price for the film shall be Five Hundred Dollars even (\$500.00), in cash.
3. Film Property. The film property being sold and purchased under the terms of this Agreement is titled, "Whatever Works".
4. Conditions Subsequent. Purchaser agrees to the following conditions for the use of the film, and any violation of these conditions without the express written permission of the Texas Forum will immediately void and terminate this contract of purchase and sale, and enable Texas Forum to exercise its right to regain possession of the film:
 - A. Purchaser shall not use the film to raise money;
 - B. Purchaser shall not exhibit the film for, or in support of, any political party or candidate for public office;
 - C. Purchaser shall not exhibit the film over any television, or radio medium for public consumption;
 - D. Purchaser shall not represent, expressly or impliedly, that it was responsible in any way for the production, direction, creation, or distribution of the film.
5. Damages. If Purchaser violates any of the conditions subsequent; described in Section 4 of this Agreement, then Texas

Forum shall, in addition to any other rights available to the Texas Forum, be entitled to liquidated damages in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

6. Waiver of any Conditions. In the event that Texas Forum waives any of the conditions described in Section 4, then it must do so in writing, and the written waiver must be signed by an officer of the Texas Forum.

7. Authority of Texas Forum. Texas Forum owns all rights to the film, and no party or person other than a duly elected officer of Texas Forum shall have the right to execute this Agreement, or make any representations or warranties with respect to the film.

8. Miscellaneous.

A. Assignment. The film or rights under this Agreement may not be assigned or transferred to any person, or corporation, or any entity without the express written permission of the Texas Forum.

This letter is a response to the complaint filed in the above captioned matter by the Honorable Jim Mattox against the Texas Forum, Inc., of which I am president. The complaint was filed on October 20, 1980.

I am filing this complaint in my capacity as president of Texas Forum, Inc.

We deny all of the allegations made by the complainant.

Salient facts that are necessary to explain the relationship of the Texas Forum to Thomas W. Pauken, candidate for Congress from the Fifth District, Texas are as follows: The Texas Forum was chartered as a non-profit corporation on May 17, 1979. The Texas Forum was designed to be an educational, non-profit corporation formed for the purpose of promoting free enterprise and preserving our traditional American values.

Tom Pauken has never been an officer, founder, or director of the Texas Forum. The only activity of the Texas Forum in which Tom Pauken has been involved is the film. He has had no other involvement in the other activities of the Texas Forum.

Shortly after the Texas Forum was formed, it entered into an agreement with Thomas W. Pauken ("Pauken"), FD Productions and John Rudin for the purpose of the production of a film entitled "Whatever Works". This agreement was entered into at arms

Tom Pauken served as contact point for the Texas Forum pertaining to this sale and distribution and production of the film. To control the disposition and use of the film, an agreement was prepared to be entered into by Tom Pauken on behalf of the Texas Forum whenever the film was sold. A copy of the form agreement is attached as Exhibit B. In some cases I executed the agreement as president, but most of the agreements were entered into by Tom Pauken on behalf of Texas Forum. For marketing reasons, Tom Pauken was designated as the contact point for persons interested in purchasing or renting the film, or discussing it. This is the reason why his telephone number was used in the Dallas Telephone Directory. Since the Texas Forum is not an enterprise that requires a permanent office, only for purposes of inquiring about the film was the telephone number at Tom's office to be used. For all other purposes, my office was used as the contact point for the Texas Forum.

In August, 1980 the last payment was made to Tom Pauken in complete settlement and discharge of any obligations the Texas Forum owed him.

The Texas Forum has engaged in a number of other activities apart from the production of the film, although the production of the film is the dominant activity of the Forum during its first year. For example, a series of luncheons have been held with young community and business leaders with speakers of interest to enlighten them on the free enterprise system and traditional American values. Approximately seven luncheons have been held during the past 12 months and each luncheon was attended by 30 to 40 individuals. Contributions were solicited at each luncheon.

In addition, several projects have been investigated. In particular, we considered producing a film on heroic activities during World War II on naval vessels having a connection with the State of Texas. Upon serious investigation and analysis the Board of Directors of Texas Forum rejected the project and referred it to the Texas Historical

Commission. Extensive meetings were held and discussions undertaken but it was rejected because of its irrelevance to our purposes.

Finally, serious thought has been given to establishing other branches and divisions of the Texas Forum and other cities in Texas, especially Houston. It was determined by the Board of Directors, that this expansion of our activities should wait until 1981 when time commitments can be rearranged.

The complaints filed against Texas Forum should be rejected for the following reasons:

1. The financial arrangement entered into between the Texas Forum and Tom Pauken was in 1979 and was for services rendered. Tom Pauken rendered those services, and the Texas Forum paid him in complete discharge of our obligation to him.

2. While Tom Pauken was the contact for the marketing and distribution of the film, he had no role or participation in the other activity in which the Texas Forum engaged. His role was merely an independent contractor and attorney for the Texas Forum for which the Texas Forum paid him reasonable fees. He has never been, and is not, a founder, officer or director of the Texas Forum.

3. No monies were solicited or raised by the Texas Forum on behalf of the political candidacy of Tom Pauken. Monies were raised for the Texas Forum for its purposes and any monies paid to Tom Pauken were in accordance with the Agreement entered into on November 21, 1979.


4. The agreement that we had with Tom Pauken required that he not use the film for political purposes. The Texas Forum rejects the idea that Mr. Pauken used the film to promote his political campaign. The occasions that he showed the film did not involve political appearances. He completely lived up to his agreement with the Texas Forum regarding the uses to which the film may be put.

This letter is a response to the complaint filed on October 20, 1980, by Congressman Jim Mattox against me and the Texas Forum.

I categorically reject all allegations asserted in the complaint.

The summary facts are these:

1. Texas Forum, a non-profit corporation and I entered into an agreement regarding the production and distribution of a documentary film entitled "Whatever Works" in May 1979. Under the agreement, Texas Forum would finance the film, and I would perform various services, but be mainly responsible for arranging for the production and marketing of the film. I was to be paid as funds were available above and beyond the costs of the film.

2. On November 21, 1979, an agreement was entered into between FD Productions, the company that technically produces the film and Texas Forum establishing the amounts outstanding to me, FD Productions and others. As monies were available, I, along with other creditors of the Texas Forum, were paid.

3. The film was completed by fall of 1979. After that time, I was principally responsible for marketing the film. I have arranged for roughly 40 copies of the film to be sold. During the fall of 1979 when the film was being marketed, Texas Forum president, Wm. D. Elliott and I agreed that my telephone number would be used for those persons interested in inquiring about the film. The only purpose of using my telephone number was for inquiries about the film.

4. At no time did any solicitation by Texas Forum to raise money for production of the film directly or indirectly accrue to or benefit my political campaign. At no time, did the Texas Forum solicit, accept or expend monies on behalf of my candidacy. I agreed to produce and market a film for a fee. I performed my job and received full payment.

5. The few occasions when I have shown the film in 1980 were non-political events. In each case, I was invited to show it. My fee for producing and marketing the film was fixed in 1979 and not dependent upon the number of times the film was shown. Also, I agreed with Texas Forum that the film was not to be used for political purposes.

These pertinent facts establish the absurdities of the complaint. Should you desire further discussion then please let me know.

Enclosed is a three (3) count complaint I am hereby filing with the Federal Elections Commission against Thomas W. Pauken, Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, 5th District, Texas; and the Texas Forum Inc.

The complaint contains documented information that shows Mr. Pauken has:

1. Knowingly and willfully accepted corporate campaign contributions from and through the Texas Forum Inc., in violation of 2 USC 441 (b);
2. Knowingly and willfully allowed an organization known as the Texas Forum, Inc. to solicit, accept and expend monies aggregating \$1,000 or more on behalf of his candidacy without reporting and registering the name of said organization as a principal and/or affiliated campaign committee as required in 2 USC 433 (a) and/or 2 USC 433 (e);
3. Knowingly and willfully failed to report financial and/or in-kind contributions from the Texas Forum, Inc. that have been used to directly benefit his political candidacy. This violates 2 USC 434.

While this complaint is addressed to three (3) specific violations of law, which come under the jurisdiction of the Federal Election Commission, the facts reveal that Tom Pauken and others may have violated other criminal and civil statutes as well.

In addition to the violations outlined above, Mr. Pauken may have violated 2 USC 701 et seq. in that he has knowingly and willfully concealed the "source, type, and amount of income (including honoraria and the date received) aggregating \$100 or more in value received from any source during the preceding calendar year." (emphasis added).

The instructions, which accompany the Candidate Financial Disclosure Statement, clearly direct the candidate that the "term 'income' is intended to be all-inclusive, as defined in the Act. The identity of the source and the amount or category of value of all income which exceeds \$100 from any one source must be disclosed separately" (emphasis added).

The great weight of evidence presented in this complaint points to an inextricable nexus between Tom Pauken the candidate and the Texas Forum, Inc., and its officers.

What is clear from the evidence is that the corporation Texas Forum, Inc., was created for the sole purpose of furthering the political candidacy of Tom Pauken.

The corporation was formed by his former campaign chairman and treasurer and former legal counsel. It produced a movie with funds derived from corporate and other sources and allowed this movie to be used by Mr. Pauken while he was an active and announced candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives.

Thousands of dollars have changed hands in connection with this film, and Mr. Pauken himself admits to benefiting personally from the production. Yet he has not revealed the sources of this remuneration as is required by law and has, on repeated occasions, refused to do so when pointedly asked.

Such refusals would indicate his failure to report this income is knowing and willful and therefore may subject Mr. Pauken and others to the criminal provisions of 18 USC 1001 and the civil provisions of 2 USC 706. If found guilty, Mr. Pauken and others may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both.

Inasmuch as these are serious violations, which come under the jurisdiction of the United States Justice Department, I am forwarding a copy of this letter and complaint to Mr. Kenneth Mighell, the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Texas.

Enclosed is a copy of a complaint I have filed with the Federal Elections Commission against Thomas W. Pauken, Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, 5th District, Texas and against the Texas Forum, Inc., a corporation registered in the state of Texas.

The facts in the enclosed complaint would show that Mr. Pauken has received substantial remuneration from this corporation as the principal actor in, and distributor of, a movie entitled "Whatever Works" that was produced by the corporation. As a candidate for federal office, Mr. Pauken is required by 2 USC 701, et seq. to report the "source, type and amount or value of income from any source, and the source, date and amount of honoraria from any source during the preceding calendar year, aggregating \$100 or more in value." (emphasis added)

The instructions that accompany the Candidate Financial Disclosure Statement clearly direct the candidate that the term "income" is "intended to be all inclusive, as defined in the act. The identity of the source and the amount or category of value of all income which exceeds \$100 from any one source must be disclosed separately." (emphasis added)

The facts in the enclosed complaint show Mr. Pauken has repeatedly refused to disclose the sources and amount of income that is required by the Candidate Financial Disclosure Statement.

The repeated refusal to comply with 2 USC 701 et seq. would subject Mr. Pauken to the criminal provisions of 18 USC 1001 and/or the civil provisions of 2 USC 706.

In as much as this violation may subject Mr. Pauken to a fine of not more than \$10,000 or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years or both, I would urge you to launch an immediate investigation into this matter for presentation to a federal grand jury.


Mr. Pauken also failed to list his rental income from his business properties as required and would be subject to the same penalties.

With respect to the Texas Forum, Inc., the facts in the enclosed complaint show that the corporation has violated its tax exempt charter. Article 4, Section (2) of the Articles of Incorporation of the Texas Forum, Inc. state that "no substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office."

In as much as the corporation Texas Forum, Inc. has allowed Mr. Pauken to use the film "Whatever Works" to further his candidacy (see exhibits K and N of the enclosed complaint), it may be subject to a loss of its tax exempt status.

Since this may involve a violation of the Internal Revenue Code, I urge you to refer this matter to the I.R.S. for a full investigation.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH The provisions of 2 USC § 437g(a) (1) and 11 CFR § 11.4, Complainant hereby files this Complaint.

Complainant would show the following:

I.

Thomas W. Pauken (hereinafter referred to as Respondent Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as respondent Texas Forum) have failed to comply with the provisions of 2 USC § 441b (a), in that Respondent Pauken, as a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, has knowingly and willfully accepted and received unlawful corporate contributions from and through The Texas Forum, Inc., a corporation registered in the State of Texas. Respondent Pauken has accepted unlawful corporate contributions through the respondent Texas Forum, in that both Respondent Texas Forum and Respondent Pauken have solicited contributions from other corporate entities on respondent Pauken's behalf.

"Contribution" is defined in 2 USC § 441 (b) (2) as "any direct or indirect payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit or gift of money or any services, or anything of value." (emphasis added.) The facts outlined in this Complaint indicate that Respondent Pauken, while an active and announced candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, accepted and used a film, entitled "Whatever Works" (which was paid for with corporate funds solicited by the Texas Forum, Inc.), as a tool to promote his campaign. On numerous occasions, Respondent Pauken promoted his candidacy with this film including January 4, 1980, when he appeared before the politically influential Petroleum Engineers Club of Dallas; and again on February 28, 1980, when he appeared before another politically involved group, the Dallas Apartment Association. (Statement of Facts,

Respondent Pauken also promoted his candidacy by distributing the corporate-financed film with the aid of the American Conservative Union (ACU). (Statement of Facts at G.) The ACU is a political organization headed by Republican Congressman Robert Bauman of Maryland, that seeks to influence legislation and promote political candidates by, among other things, publishing and distributing statements and ratings of Members of Congress on how they voted on specific items of legislation.


II.

Respondent Pauken has failed to comply with 2 USC § 433 (a) and/or 2 USC § 433 (e) in that he has failed to register with the Federal Elections Commission and/or his principal campaign committee a "Statement of Organization for a Political Committee" for the Texas Forum. Respondent Pauken has knowingly and willfully allowed Respondent Texas Forum to accept contributions and to make expenditures in the aggregate exceeding \$1,000 on behalf of Respondent Pauken's candidacy.

"Expenditure" is defined in 2 USC § 431 (f) as any "purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value, made for the purpose of... influencing the... election... of any person to Federal office." (Emphasis added.)

III.

Respondent Pauken has failed to comply with the provisions of 2 USC § 434 in that he has knowingly and willfully failed to "file with the Commission reports of receipts" of financial and/or in-kind contributions, which he has received from respondent Texas Forum. Respondent Pauken has also converted corporate contributions received through respondent Texas Forum to his personal use.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A.

In 1976, Thomas W. Pauken a/k/a Tom Pauken was a candidate for the Texas State Senate in Dallas, Texas. His campaign chairman at that time was Bill Elliott a/k/a Wm. D. Elliott and his campaign legal council (sic) was Joe Morris a/k/a Joseph B. Morris. (Exhibit A)

B.

In 1978, Thomas W. Pauken a/k/a Tom Pauken was a candidate for the U.S. Congress. His campaign chairman and treasurer was Wm. D. Elliott. (Exhibit B)

C.

On May 17, 1979, Articles of Incorporation for The Texas Forum, Inc. (a tax exempt corporation prohibited from engaging in political activities) were filed in the office of the Secretary of State of Texas. The Texas Forum, Inc., was organized "to receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and subject to the restrictions hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended." (Emphasis added.)

Article 4, Section (2) of the Articles of Incorporation of The Texas Forum, Inc., state that "No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements)

any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office." (Emphasis added.)

The agent and president of the Corporation is listed as Wm. D. Elliott and the office location of The Texas Forum, Inc., is listed at 2400 One Dallas Center, Dallas, Texas 75201. The Secretary of The Texas Forum, Inc., is listed as Joseph B. Morris. (Exhibit C)

D.

Although the Articles of Incorporation of The Texas Forum, Inc., state the address of the corporation to be 2400 One Dallas Centre, Dallas, Texas, the 1980 Dallas telephone directory lists The Texas Forum at 5114 Willis Avenue, 826-4468. (Exhibit D)

E.

The 1980 Dallas telephone directory lists Tom Pauken at 5114 Willis Avenue, 826-4468. (Exhibit E)

F.

On September 9, 1979, The Dallas Morning News reported that Tom Pauken followed actress Jane Fonda to Washington, D.C., to show a film entitled "Whatever Works." The film was produced by The Texas Forum, Inc., and, according to Zack Burkett, the producer of the film and proprietor of FD Productions, a film company, the film cost \$100,000 to produce. Pauken was quoted as saying he intended to show the film everywhere Ms. Fonda was to appear, which, according to The Dallas Morning News' story, was to be in 50 cities over a 32-day period. Zack Burkett said the film was to be sold to "veterans, service and college organizations." (Exhibit F)

G.

On September 30, 1979, the Mesquite Daily News quoted Tom Pauken as saying that the film "Whatever Works" was "produced with the support of the Texas Forum and distributed with the

aid of the American Conservative Union." The American Conservative Union (ACU) is a political organization headed by Republican Congressman Robert Bauman of Maryland and located at 316 Pennsylvania Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C. 20003. The ACU seeks to influence legislation by, among other things, publishing and distributing statements and ratings of members of Congress on how they voted on specific items of legislation. (Exhibit G)

H.

There is no listing of any business corporation by the name of FD Productions with the Corporations Division of the Secretary of State's office in Austin, Texas; nor is there any partnership or any other business entity by that name listed with the State Comptroller's office in Austin, Texas, or in the Assumed Name Records of the Dallas County Clerk's office.

There is, however, a partnership by the name of Film Dallas registered with the State Comptroller's office in Austin, Texas, which has been assigned State Sales Tax Certificate No. 3000173319. The Film Dallas partnership was registered with the State Comptroller's office on January 1, 1973, and the principal officers of the partnership are listed as Zack Burkett and Frank R. Simon. The principal location and mailing address of Film Dallas is listed as 1221 Elmwood Dr., Richardson, Texas 75080. (Exhibit H)

I.

The 1978 Dallas Telephone Directory lists the firm of Film Dallas at 5114 Willis Avenue. (Exhibit I)

J.

On or before December 20, 1979, Tom Pauken filed a statement of candidacy with the Federal Elections Commission for the office of U.S. House of Representatives, District 5, Texas. (Exhibit J)

K.

On January 5, 1980, while Tom Pauken was an active political candidate for the U.S. Congress, the Dallas Times Herald reported that Pauken was actively showing the film "Whatever Works" to "any group that will let him in the door." It was also reported that Pauken was using the film to spread "his face around town as he prepares for another Congressional campaign against U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox of Dallas." The news report indicated that Pauken showed the film on Friday, January 4, 1980, to the politically influential Petroleum Engineers Club in Dallas and that the "film is being sold to companies and other interested buyers for \$500." (Exhibit K)

L.

On January 21, 1980, Tom Pauken was quoted in the Dallas Times-Herald as saying that he had personally made "a few thousand dollars" off the film. (Exhibit L)

M.

On February 2, 1980, Tom Pauken was quoted in The Dallas Morning News as saying he had "made less than \$5,000 from the Texas Forum/FD Productions film. (Exhibit M)

N.

On February 28, 1980, candidate Tom Pauken showed the film "Whatever Works" to an owner's breakfast seminar of the Dallas Apartment Association. (Exhibit N)

O.

On May 14, 1980, Thomas W. Pauken, candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from District 5, Texas, filed an "Ethics in Government Act--Financial Disclosure Statement" in which he reported his total 1979 calendar year income to be \$19,720.00 and his total income for the period January 1, 1980, through May 14, 1980, to be \$7,016.62. The statement indicates that the sole source of Mr. Pauken's income was from the practice of law as a "self-employed attorney and counselor." The same document indicates that his holdings include an "office building/duplex at 5114 Willis Avenue (owned with father-- $\frac{1}{2}$ interest)." (Exhibit Q)

P.

On May 19, 1980, the Dallas Times Herald quoted Pauken as saying he had made "between \$5,000 and \$10,000 on a film he made that features the political activities of actress Jane Fonda." (Exhibit P)

Q.

On September 16, 1980, both the Dallas Times Herald and The Dallas Morning News quoted Pauken as saying he "made about \$10,000 on the film," which he "co-wrote and starred in." William D. Elliott, president of the tax-exempt Texas Forum, Inc., was quoted as saying that \$50,000 in "contributions" had been received for the film but because the organization (Texas Forum, Inc.) is a "charitable group," he would not reveal the names of the contributors. (Exhibit Q)

R.

On or about September 9, 1979 Mr. Zack Burkett indicated that the film "Whatever Works" cost \$100,000 to produce (see Exhibit F). On or about September 16, 1980 Mr. Wm. D. Elliott indicated that the Texas Forum, Inc. received "about \$50,000

in contributions to produce the film "Whatever Works"
(see exhibit Q).

There are no facts on the record to indicate which,
if either, of these statements is correct.

S.

A high degree of financial and political interaction exists
between Tom Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc. and the film making
enterprises, Film Dallas and FD Productions.

This financial interaction is of a personal as well as
political nature.

The facts show that Tom Pauken and the Texas Forum, Inc.
are both listed at 5114 Willis Avenue. Pauken is also the
principal actor in and director of the corporation's only
work product, the film "Whatever Works." The facts also
indicate that he is the principal distributor (with the aid
of the American Conservative Union) and salesman of the film.

The political and financial relationship between Pauken
and the firms Film Dallas and FD Productions is equally
interconnected.

As was pointed out in statement of Facts I, the 1978
Dallas telephone listed both Film Dallas and FD Productions
in either the 1978 or 1979 Dallas telephone directories.

In 1980, both Film Dallas and FD Productions appear
in the Dallas telephone directory at 3416 Main Street.
(exhibits R and S)

On May 17, 1980, the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee
made a payment to a firm named "Francis Associates" in the
amount of \$6,200.00 The Pauken campaign committee lists
"Francis Associates" at 3416 Main Street. (exhibit T)

While the firm Francis Associates is not listed in the
Dallas telephone directory, a check with the Corporations
Division of the Texas Secretary of State's office reveals a
Francis Associates at 2006 Shaw Street in Wichita Falls,

Texas (817-766-0121). The corporation's charter number is 344316. When contactd by telephone in Wichita Falls, Texas, and asked if there was any relationship between Francis Associates of Wichita Falls and Francis Associates in Dallas, the receptionist replied that there was and that the Dallas contact person was Zack Burkett.

A review of the itemized expenditure statements of the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee indicate that a total of \$12,079.83 in campaign funds have been paid to Film Dallas, FD Productions and/or Francis Associates at either 5114 Willis Avenue and/or 3416 Main Street, Dallas, Texas (Exhibit U).

A total of \$27,224.99 in campaign funds have been paid out of the Tom Pauken for Congress Committee to addressees listed at 5114 Willis Avenue (Exhibit V).

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, all three of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE 1.

The name of the corporation is TEXAS FORUM, INC.

ARTICLE 2.

The corporation is a non-profit corporation.

ARTICLE 3.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE 4.

(1) The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are to receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational purposes either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

(2) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director of the corporation, officer of the corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no director or officer of the corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the

corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

(3) The corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(4) The corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, which would subject any person to the imposition of any tax under Section 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(5) The corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws which would subject the corporation to the imposition of any tax under Section 4943 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(6) The corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(7) The corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws which would subject any person to the imposition of any tax

under Section 4945 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(8) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

(9) Upon dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, testing for public safety, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

ARTICLE 5.

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 1300 Fidelity Union Tower, Dallas, Texas, 75201 and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Wm. D. Elliott.

Pauken stalks 'Hanoi-Jane'

Dallasite tries to foil Ms. Fonda with own weapon: a film

WASHINGTON — Dallas lawyer Tom Pauken followed actress Jane Fonda to Washington Wednesday with his new anti-New Left documentary film, *Whatever Works*.

The film, which includes shots of the actress on her visit to Hanoi during the Vietnam War and speculates on the political motives of her husband, Tom Hayden, was produced with financial support of the Texas Forum organization of Dallas and will be distributed with the aid of the American Conservative Union.

Ms. Fonda and Hayden spoke Wednesday at the National Press Club as a part of a 50-city, 32-day tour to argue for closing down the country's 72 nuclear power plants and to explain the Campaign for Economic Democracy, a plan to change the nation's economic

structure and to relieve "corporate pressure" in government.

PAUKEN, AN unsuccessful candidate for congress and who is expected to oppose U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox, D-Dallas, again next year, said he hopes to show the film everywhere Ms. Fonda and Hayden appear.

The film was produced by Zack Burkett and his FD productions of Dallas. Burkett hopes to recoup the \$100,000 cost by selling the film to veterans, service and college organizations. It also features Pauken interviewing persons on the subject of the New Left leaders.

Col. George Day, a former POW who appears in the film and accompanied Pauken at a news conference in Washington, charged that the Campaign for Economic Democracy, which has elected persons to office in California, is an anti-capitalist coalition

planning to convert the nation to a socialist or Communist system.

PAUKEN SAID the discussion of the movement and the film of Ms. Fonda joking with North Vietnamese soldiers is an attempt to educate young persons who may be unaware of the backgrounds of participants in anti-nuclear and New Left activities.

In their National Press Club appearance, Ms. Fonda and Hayden said the CED is aimed at a system in which there are more smaller companies and better public representation on boards of directors.

Hayden criticized socialism for creating state bureaucracy and said he preferred a "decentralized, grass-roots organization" instead of nationalization, and he described antitrust actions as a "liberal remedy which has declining value."

Pauken produces docum

The 60s, remembered as a decade of unrest, civil disobedience, demonstrations and violence, could be reported in the '80s, warns Dallas attorney and Mesquite resident Tom Pauken.

As a sort of preventive measure, Pauken has produced a documentary film that delves into the actions of the "New Left" and other controversial groups and personalities of the Vietnam era. The film is being made available to interested groups.

"I think the '80s are going to be very much like the '60s. I'm not looking forward to it," said Pauken, who ran unsuccessfully for Congress last year. He said he sees the potential for violence coming from the "New Left" and an organization headed by former peace revolutionaries Tom Hayden and Jane Fonda.

Hayden and Fonda, who have recently been involved in anti-nuclear power plant demonstrations, are currently on a 32-day tour to promote the Campaign for Economic Democracy, an organization Pauken said has its roots in the radical group Students for a Democratic Society.

As a college student in the early '60s and national chairman of College Republican, Pauken frequently debated against Hayden. "He's a very effective force and effective leader, but I'm disturbed by his actions," Pauken said.

"I decided something had to be done." That "something" was to produce the film, "Whatever Works," documenting the New Left, SDS, Fonda and Hayden and the Vietnam era demonstrators.

The New Left was different from other activists who just wanted us to get out (of Vietnam). They wanted the

other side to win.

Footage of Fonda joking with North Vietnamese soldiers is one of the subjects of the film which features interviews with such people as Joan Baez, Col. George Day, a former POW and Congressional Medal of Honor winner and Reader's Digest editor Ken Tomlinson among others.

Pauken and Day traveled to Washington Wednesday for a press conference to promote the film.

Hayden and Fonda also were in Washington Wednesday.

The film will be made available to groups across the country to be shown in cities where Hayden and Fonda are appearing. Pauken said he will not be able to personally follow the two.

Among the groups interested in the film include college groups, labor unions, veteran groups, churches, the BBC and other television stations, Pauken said. However, the supporters

Pauken still debating against Fonda, New Left

Dallas attorney Tom Pauken, who spent the 1960s as a Young Republican debating anti-war activists like Tom Hayden on college campuses, has experienced a strange sense of déjà vu recently.

The war has gone away. But Hayden and his wife actress Jane Fonda haven't.

Instead, Pauken has seen them pick up other issues, like nuclear power, to stir up a whole new crop of young people.

Not to be outdone by his former debating opponents, Pauken hasn't faded away either.

He's going at them again, this time with a documentary film entitled, "Whatever Works," which includes shots of Miss Fonda joking around with North Vietnamese soldiers on her visit to Hanoi.

Pauken is showing his expose of the New Left to any group that will let him in the door. He's not only

spreading the bad word about Hayden and Fonda, he's also spreading his face around town as he prepares for another congressional campaign against U. S. Rep. Jim Mattox of Dallas.

He showed both (the movie and the face) to the Petroleum Engineers Club of Dallas Friday.

"For the young people of today, the '60s were nothing more than what they see on TV about it," said Pauken, a former Army intelligence officer in Vietnam. "We wanted them to have an idea of what they were really like."

Pauken pictures the New Left as people who will use any issue to further their own political goals, which he believes are to take over the Democratic and convert the nation to a socialist system. He sees them as a force to be reckoned with instead of ignored.

"Some people may laugh at that, but I was one of the first people early in the 60s to suggest that the New Left would be a major force in the

60s. It certainly was," said Pauken.

The movie features not only Fonda and Hayden in film clips from the past two decades, but also singer Joan Baez in a sympathetic role. In one of the spots where the film showed some blurry camera work, Hayden talked Baez to in an on-the-run interview after a news conference.

Dr. Alan Saxe, who allowed Pauken to show the film to one of his University of Texas at Arlington political science classes, said he came away with a more negative view of Miss Fonda.

"The film was effective," he said, "especially the scenes of her with the North Vietnamese soldiers. I had never seen those scenes before."

However, said Saxe, he doesn't believe Hayden or his wife have a

chance of taking over the Democratic party.

"I don't think Hayden and Fonda have any broad-based support. They're just personalities," he said.

Saxe said he believes it's good that Pauken is raising the debate.

"On major college campuses, in the social sciences, there has been a leftist perspective in recent years. I think it's healthy to try to challenge the left."

The film, produced by Zack Burkett and his FD productions of Dallas, cost \$50,000 to make and was financially sponsored by the Texas Forum

of Dallas. The film is being sold to companies and other interested buyers for \$500. The operation will break even with a few more purchases, said Pauken.

Pauken not only did interviews for the movie, he was co-producer, co-director and co-writer.

Col. George Day, a former POW, also appears in the movie to blast Miss Fonda for her visits to Hanoi. Those visits, filmed and shown to POWs by the Communists, lowered the morale of the captives, he said.

"Jane Fonda is an outrageous liar,"

said Day. Later he repeats, "She is a hypocrite and a liar."

But Saxe said he doubts the movie will have much effect on young people. Neither, however, does he see college students rising up en masse to follow Hayden and Miss Fonda.

"If you showed the film on any college campus, the kids would maybe go to sleep," he said.

"They're so attuned to the media that they're not shocked, they're not dissuaded, they're not persuaded," he said. "The kids today are almost like rocks. They can't be moved."

Republican Tom Pauken has launched his second bid for the 5th Congressional District seat coming out of the chute more like a lamb than the lion he attempted to emulate in his unsuccessful 1976 campaign to unseat incumbent Democrat Jim Mattox.

In 1976 Pauken verbally clobbered Mattox from start to finish. But when he recently announced

his candidacy again this year he told reporters he had adopted a New Year's resolution — not to get mad at Jim Mattox no matter what he says about me.

"I think it's important to take the high road and talk about the issues," Pauken said, challenging Mattox to a series of unscripted debates.

After the news conference, reporters took note on how long it would take the lion or Pauken to be swallowed by the lion.

Pauken got somewhat riled when he was asked what he thought about friends of Mattox circulating copies of a report he (Pauken) filed with the House Ethics Committee showing that he made only \$8,000 practicing law in 1978.

Mattox has repeatedly raised questions about how Pauken supports his wife and four small children when he has spent most of the the last four years campaigning. (In 1976, Pauken lost a race to State Sen. Bill Brownstein.)

Pauken claimed he had supplemented his 1978 income by dipping into savings and borrowing \$3,500 from the bank. He did his latest report to the ethics committee required of all congressional candidates would show he made approximately

\$20,000 in 1978, most of it from practicing law, but some from other ventures, including sales of a film he made on the political activities of Jane Fonda and her husband, Tom Hayden. He said he had made "a few thousand dollars" off the film.

Privately, Mattox ponder all of this. He thinks anybody who would follow Jane Fonda around to make a film about her political activities is fishy. Coming from a poor family, Mattox put himself, his brother and sister through college and has made a lot of money out of his law practice, stock and real estate dealings. The point he seems to be trying to sell is that Pauken is so obsessed with politics and winning an office — any office — that his family suffers.

The point that should be made is that it is sometimes difficult to discern what might become an "issue" in a campaign, or what motivates a voter to vote as he or she does. Political writers question candidates about all sorts of things, some of which have a direct bearing on how the candidates will vote or comport themselves in office and others which have no bearing at all. But whether the questions and responses are totally relative and completely incisive may not mean beans to your average voter.

Mattox apparently believes that how Pauken makes a living or whether he makes a living at all, will influence how people perceive the man and ultimately how they vote in the race.

Pauken told newsmen that questions about his ability to make a living and his income were only a continuation of the kind of tactics Mattox used in 1976 when "he called me a bunch of names. He doesn't talk about the issues. He gets into personalities."

For his part, Pauken said he intended to pursue issues of importance to inflation-

strapped middle-income families. Pauken would deny it, but maybe, just maybe, he wanted to subtly point out that Mattox's behavior stunts and high income level were out of tune with the 5th District electorate.

Pauken called for abolition of the marriage tax under which a married couple filing a joint return pays more income taxes than an unmarried couple living together. He wants tax incentives that would "make it easier for families to take care of their senior family members" and encourage small severa, particularly those who save for their children's education.

But in the final analysis, the outcome of the contest may depend more on demographic changes in the 5th District and who the presidential candidates are, than the subtle and not-so-subtle thrusts by both candidates.

Pauken said the 5th District population had been declining in the predominantly black South Dallas precincts where Mattox beat him 1,600 votes to 500 votes in 1976, but was growing in the middle-income white precincts in Garland and Mesquite where he defeated Mattox. Pauken also claimed significant voter strength among young families moving into renovated housing in East Dallas — Mattox's home area.

If either of the Texas candidates — John Connally or George Bush — wins the GOP presidential nomination and Jimmy Carter is the Democratic nominee, turnout factors would be in Pauken's favor in the 5th. If Bush or Connally win the GOP nomination and Edward Kennedy is the Democratic nominee, the tide might still favor Pauken but not as much because Kennedy would turn out a heavy minority vote. If Ronald Reagan wins the Republican nomination, the tide would run in Mattox's favor regardless of whether the Democratic nominee was Carter or Kennedy.



Mattox announces for re-election

U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox, trying to return to those days in 1975 when he first ran for congress as a "feisty, roll-up-your-sleeves fighter," announced for a third term Friday and quickly let any opponents know he would not "lie down and not swing back."

After Democrat Mattox won a second term to the 5th Congressional District in 1978 by an 800-vote margin, he promised he would not let his Republican opponent, Tom Pauken, again get away with taking so many verbal shots against him.

He repeated that promise Friday in a less-than-subtle warning to Pauken, the conservative lawyer who

once again has filed for the GOP nomination.

Mattox and Pauken have pledged to try to run the campaign on the issues this time and not let the election effort degenerate into the nasty name-calling battle that highlighted the 1978 affair.

Should it degenerate, however, Mattox left little doubt he would be more than willing to make as many offensive charges against Pauken as Pauken makes against him.

Mattox' only major shot at Pauken Friday came when he said Pauken's anti-New Left documentary film, featuring the political adventures of Jane Fonda, is really a "front" for Pauken to provide him income and allow him to campaign.

Pauken had denied that saying he has made less than \$5,000 from the film, and most of his income is from his law practice.

Mattox said the film is similar to the old days of "red-baiting and McCarthyism." He also theorized the film was one reason Republican Party officials tried so hard to find a primary opponent for Pauken.

Longtime Dallas businessman and civic leader Russell Perry announced Thursday he had decided not to challenge Pauken in the GOP primary, even though a survey showed Perry could have defeated both Pauken and Mattox.

Perry, who claimed he was too old to run, then endorsed Pauken.

Mattox' only other jab at Pauken was to say the reason Pauken moved

into the district was to seek political office. But those verbal darts were mild compared to the bitter 1978 campaign.

Mattox, trying to appeal both to the conservatives and liberals in the district and both to the Anglos and the 28 percent black and Mexican-American population, said his record has proven he is an independent "fiscal conservative, a humanitarian and a strong supporter of individual rights."

He produced a list of 10 special interest groups that rate voting records. His rating in all of the groups ranged from 42 to 77 percent which indicates, he said, "nobody controls Jim Mattox, and the only group of people I'm accountable to and listen to are my folks here at home."

~~Whatever Works~~ a film co-produced by Mr. Pauken shows how the controllers like to find a convenient target, then force the target to "play in the controllers ball park." Jane Fonda and her husband, Tom Hayden, are followed in some of their radical activities as examples of how the controllers operate.

Tom Pauken is a native Texan and grew up in Dallas. He received his law degree at Southern Methodist University after getting his undergraduate degree from Georgetown University on an academic scholarship. In 1967, he enlisted and served in Army intelligence three years, including a year in Vietnam. He is married and he and his wife and their four children live in Mesquite. He has been active in politics, serving two years as National Chairman of College Republicans, headquartered in Washington, D.C., and made an unsuccessful race for Congressman in the Fifth Congressional District.

Pauken says GOP fate hinges on running mate

Republican congressional candidate Tom Pauken, trying again this year to unseat Democratic Rep. Jim Mattox in the 5th District, says Ronald Reagan's selection of a running mate will be a "key" factor for GOP candidates in the general election.

Reagan is the apparent winner of the GOP presidential nomination now that George Bush has pulled out of the race. His campaign staff has commissioned a survey of Republican activists around the country on who they think would be the best vice presidential candidate for the party.

"I think Reagan will carry the 5th District," Pauken said Wednesday. "I think by how much he carries it depends on who else is on the ticket. That's a key. The selection by Reagan of his running mate is going to be more important than usual."

"I think he could carry it big. But the issue you hear is that Reagan needs help on foreign policy. The perception I get is that Mr. Carter is not competent in the foreign policy area but that Gov. Reagan is an unknown, so someone with foreign policy experience or background (as Reagan's running mate) would be helpful."

Pauken was narrowly defeated by Mattox in 1978 and already is knocking on doors in the 5th District for a second try. The 5th District, which covers East and Central Dallas County, is one of the top five districts in the country that have been targeted for turnarounds by the Republican National Committee.

Pauken said he also thought it was important that Reagan select a "younger man" as a running mate, and attempt to "reach out to all elements of the party and forge a conservative-moderate coalition."

Asked who he thought would be an ideal GOP vice presidential candidate, Pauken mentioned Bush, New York Congressman Jack Kemp, Indiana Sen. Richard G. Lugar and Tennessee Sen. Howard Baker.

"I think there is a good chance Reagan might pick Bush," Pauken said, noting that Bush barely lost the 5th District to Reagan in the Texas primary.

Mattox, meanwhile, has not been sitting still since he beat Pauken by only 800 votes out of more than 60,000 cast in the district in 1978.

Sources say he has been scurrying about the district spending a lot more time with constituents than he has in the past, and has been attending as many meetings as time permits with city councils, school boards and other organizations in the district.

His activity has paid off. He has taken at least one key political figure in Mesquite away from Pauken and brought him into his camp — City Councilman Joe D. Goggans.

In 1978, Goggans, a homebuilder, was on Pauken's campaign steering committee. Pauken, who now lives in Mesquite, won every precinct in the city except one.

But this year, Goggans is backing Mattox for re-election.

"After the election two years ago, in which I supported Tom wholeheartedly, Jim called up and said, 'Look, I want to work with you and I want to mend my fences.' Since that time, Jim has been very good about meeting with our council," Goggans said.

"When he comes into town, he has breakfast meetings with us and also has joint meetings with the school board. Jim and I still have political differences on certain issues, but I will say this: When we have had problems with the federal government, Jim has responded to us and has worked with us."

Goggans said Mesquite was trying to get federal help to build a municipal airport and was seeking a community development bloc grant to help pay for a drainage project in Southwest Mesquite. He said Mattox had helped in both areas.

Pauken passes off Goggans' switch to Mattox's arm-twisting as a member of the House Banking and Urban Affairs Committee.

"A guy who is on the Banking and Urban Affairs Committee can do a lot of favors for people and is going to get a few names," Pauken said.

For his part, Mattox continues to hammer away at his favorite theme — that his second battle with Pauken will turn on qualifications and experience. Mattox reminds that he has

been a member of the state legislature and Congress, while "the voters have rejected him (Pauken) twice" — once for the state Senate (in 1976) and once for Congress (in 1978).

Mattox continues to question how Pauken supports himself, his wife and four children while campaigning full time.

Pauken says he made a little more earlier this year by practicing law. He made between \$5,000 and \$10,000 on a film he made that features the painted activities of actress Jane Fonda and is borrowing money from the bank to pay living expenses.

He said he already has borrowed \$10,000 from the Mercantile National Bank and expected to borrow at least \$5,000 more to ride him through the November election.

Mattox, Pauken come out swinging

Film, defense votes targeted by bitter congressional opponents

MESQUITE — Near the end of a debate Monday between bitter political rivals Jim Mattox and Tom Pauken, a businessman asked, "Do y'all agree on anything?"

The head-to-head meeting of the two congressional candidates revealed about the only thing they agree on is opposition to mandatory wage and price controls.

The most glaring difference came in their interpretation of Mattox' voting record on national defense issues.

And, before the confrontation before the chamber of commerce in Mesquite ended, the candidates had exchanged mild insults, such as calling each other dishonest and Mattox accusing Pauken of being as "flakey" as actress Jane Fonda.

MATTOX, THE Democrat seeking his third term representing the 5th Congressional District, said an anti-New Left documentary put together by Pauken was backed financially by "folks in the nuclear power industry" who wanted Pauken to follow Ms. Fonda, an anti-nuclear activist, around the country and said that

Pauken has made some big money from the film.

Pauken, a conservative Republican making his second bid to unseat Mattox, said the financial backer of the film, *Whatever Works*, is a Dallas group called Texas Forum and that

contributions for the film came from various interest groups and individuals.

Pauken said he made about \$10,000 from the film, which he co-wrote and starred in.

Bill Elliot, president of Texas Forum, said about \$50,000 in contributions were received for the film. He would not reveal the names of the contributors because, he said, the organization is a "charitable group."

ELLIOT ALSO said the film does not deal with nuclear energy but with free enterprise. The forum was formed to promote free enterprise, he said.

"It takes an agile mind to grasp the point of the film, and Mattox does not have an agile mind," said Elliot, a longtime Pauken supporter.

After the debate, Mattox questioned why the \$10,000 Pauken made from the film was not listed on Pauken's financial disclosure statement.

In addition to discussing the film, the candidates took turns accusing each other of not telling the truth about whether Mattox is a strong supporter of national defense.

Mattox said in the year since he has been chairman of the National Defense Task Force of the House Budget Committee, defense spending increased by \$60 billion.

PAUKEN ACKNOWLEDGED the increase, but said Mattox had nothing to do with the increase in defense spending.

"He's not being honest when he says he is for a strong national defense," said Pauken, immediately drawing the ire of Mattox.

"I wish I could tell you my resentment," Mattox retorted angrily in answer to Pauken's comment.

While Mattox said he had voted for all the major increases for defense

spending, Pauken said the American Security Council has rated Mattox at only 40 percent of favorable voting.

Mattox, pointing out that he has made about 3,000 votes since being in congress, invited anyone to investigate any of those votes.

Pauken recalled Mattox' vote against a constitutional amendment that would have prohibited forced busing.

MATTOX SAID he opposes busing, has voted "three or four times" to create a legislative solution to forced busing, and the reason he voted against the amendment was because he does not believe it should be in the constitution.

Mattox then took the attack, saying if Pauken came to any businessman in the room and asked for a \$60,600 (congressional salary) job, he would be "laughed out of the room" because he does not have any experience or background.

Mattox, Pauken find little ground for agreement

MESQUITE — After U.S. Rep. Jim Mattox and Republican challenger Tom Pauken battled back and forth for 45 minutes Monday at a Mesquite Chamber of Commerce luncheon, somebody in the audience asked the two candidates if they agreed on "anything."

At first, there was silence.

Pauken finally said if there was any agreement, it was because Mattox had swiped several of his stands on issues. He charged Mattox had adopted his positions on giving tax incentives to small savers and tax relief to married couples after he found out how popular the stands were.

Then the two — who have been bitter foes since 1978 when they first clashed in the 5th District — went at it again.

Mattox countered that he had been in favor of giving tax relief to small savers and married couples for "a long time" and that Pauken was misrepresenting his record.

Mattox said Pauken backed the Kemp-Roth tax cutting bill, which favored families in the \$60,000-plus a

year tax bracket, while he had introduced a tax reduction bill favoring families making less than \$60,000.

He said there was nothing wrong with wealthy families getting a tax break, but "I don't represent those people. They live in Jim Collins' (3rd) District (Northwest Dallas County)."

Pauken reiterated a charge he made at a Saturday news conference — that Mattox repeatedly had voted with the "liberal caucus" in the U.S. House and had one of the worst voting records on defense matters of any Texas congressman. He said the American Security Council had rated Mattox as voting "right" only 40 per cent of the time on defense.

Pauken also blasted Mattox for voting to give the Sandinista government in Nicaragua \$75 million in economic aid to help rebuild their war-shattered country. Pauken charged that the Sandinistas were bent on establishing a Castro-style government in the Central American nation, which would undermine U.S. interests.

Mattox replied he had cast 3,000 votes since he had been elected to the 5th District seat in 1976, and he defied Pauken to prove he had consis-

tently voted with "the liberal caucus."

He passed out a flyer he said indicated he was a moderate and representative of his "highly-diverse" district, which is 23 per cent black and 5 per cent other minorities.

The flyer showed Mattox had a 50 per cent "approval" record with the U. S. Chamber of Commerce; 42 per cent with the liberal Americans for Democratic Action and conservative Americans for Constitutional Action;

58 per cent with the National Association of Manufacturers; 50 per cent with the AFL-CIO; 50 per cent with the Conservative index; 48 per cent with Ralph Nader's Public Citizen-Congress Watch and 46 per cent with the Consumer Federation.

As for the American Security Council, Mattox said, "Sure, they don't like me because I don't buy everything they have to sell."

He charged that the organization was made up of defense contractors who wanted to spend \$250 billion a year on defense instead of the current \$170 billion a year.

"Since I have been on the Budget Committee, we have increased defense spending from \$110.5 billion to \$170.4 billion," Mattox said. "The need for increased defense spending is a given. The difference is the Republicans want to recommission some old battleships and build airplanes that will be outmoded before they come off the assembly line. I won't give a blank check to the Pentagon or any other agency."

On the illegal alien question, Pauken said he favored a return to the old practice of giving limited "green-card" visas to Mexican braceros to

work in this country. Mattox said he backed criminal or civil penalties against businessmen who hire illegal aliens.

A questioner in the audience asked Pauken who financed the "Jane Fonda" film he produced and has been showing widely throughout the 5th District, and how much money he had made off of it.

Pauken declined to answer the question directly. He claimed the film was a documentary about the "new left" that was still a threat to the internal security of this country.

Mattox claimed "some people in the nuclear power industry" financed the film as a campaign gimmick for Pauken through a "front" called the Texas Forum. He further charged Pauken had failed to report income from the film although he had been quoted as saying he had sold several copies of it for \$500 apiece.

After the luncheon, Pauken said the financiers of the film included "business, labor, veteran and student groups" and was headed by attorney William D. Elliott, former president of the Dallas County Republican Mens Club. He estimated he personally had grossed about \$10,000 on the film.
