

#### SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The complainant alleges: (1) that the National  
Conservative Foundation ("NCF") made an in-kind contribution  
to Dornan for United States Senator ("DFUSS") by producing  
and paying for the broadcast of a television program on  
which Congressman Dornan appeared, and (2) that DFUSS failed  
to report on Schedules A and B the receipt and repayment of  
two loans from multicandidate committees that were otherwise  
reported on Schedule C.

**FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS**

**I. Whether NCF made a contribution to DFUSS.**

According to information provided by complainant and not refuted by respondent NCF, Congressman Dornan appeared on one segment of a television series produced and paid for by NCF. NCF is a non-profit corporation. The series was entitled "American Forum." According to a reference in the October 1981 issue of Conservative Digest provided by complainant (see Attachment 1, p. 5), the television series was planned to run throughout the United States once a week over a thirteen week period, beginning roughly on August 8, 1981. Materials provided by complainant described the series' purpose as follows:

American Forum, sponsored by the National Conservative Foundation, will highlight, explore, and examine positions and new ideas in foreign affairs, economics, the rejuvenation of the free enterprise system, the re-establishment of order and stability in international trade, new policies vis-a-vis the Soviet Union and other adversaries, and new approaches to government on the state and national levels.

The materials provided by complainant further indicate that in addition to Congressman Dornan, other prominent personalities appeared on various segments of the program, including White House chief of staff James Baker, Richard Viguerie, James Watt, Rev. Jerry Falwell, and Phyllis

Schlafly. See Attachment 1, p. 5. Although a reference in what is identified by complainant as a NCF brochure states that "Terry Dolan, NCF Chairman, and California Congressman Bob Dornan will co-host the show," (see Attachment 1, p. 4) the response of respondent NCF indicates that Congressman Dornan only appeared in the first segment. See Attachment 2, pp. 2,6 . Apparently, four California television stations aired the show. See Attachment 1, p. 5 .

At the time that Congressman Dornan's appearance on the program was aired (the starting dates on stations varied across the country), he had filed a Statement of Candidacy. See Attachment 1, p. 7. It is worthy of note, however, that according to respondent DFUSS, the program was produced by NCF (though not broadcast) many months before Congressman Dornan filed as a candidate. See Attachment 3, p. 1.

Section 441b(a) of Title 2, United States Code, prohibits a corporation from making a contribution or expenditure in connection with a federal election. The term "contribution or expenditure" is defined at § 441b(b)(2) to include "any direct or indirect payment ... or gift of money, or any services, or anything of value ... to any candidate ... in connection with any [federal] election." The central issue, therefore, is whether NCF's payment

for the production and broadcast of the segment of American Forum on which Congressman Dornan appeared was "in connection with" a federal election.

The Commission has addressed several similar situations in the advisory opinion process. In Advisory Opinion 1981-37, for example, the Commission sanctioned a candidate's participation in a series of public affairs forums produced by a corporation and sponsored by corporations. This approval was conditioned on (1) the absence of any communication expressly advocating the nomination of the candidate or the defeat of any other, and (2) the avoidance of any solicitation, making, or acceptance of campaign contributions in connection with the forums. See also, analogously, Advisory Opinion 1977-42 (permitting a candidate to host a radio talk show); MUR 1418/1419 (finding no reason to believe that the corporate producers and broadcasters of radio shows on which Governor Jerry Brown appeared violated § 441b).

There is no indication that any communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of any candidate were contained in the American Forum segment at issue, or that any contributions were solicited, made, or accepted. Respondent NCF specifically denies that this occurred and

further asserts that Congressman Dornan was not even identified as a candidate for federal office. See Attachment 2, pp. 2,7.

In view of the foregoing, this office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe NCF or DFUSS violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b.

II. Whether DFUSS failed to fully report two loans.

DFUSS reported the receipt of two loans of \$5,000 each on Schedule C of its report covering July 22, 1981, through December 31, 1981. See Attachment 1, p. 8. The Schedule C entries indicated that the loans were received on July 17, 1981, from the National Conservative Political Action Committee and the Committee for the Survival of a Free Congress and that the loans were repaid in full on August 17, 1981. \*/ DFUSS failed, however, to include with its report Schedule A entries for the receipt of each loan and Schedule B entries for the repayment of each loan.

Section 434(b)(3) and (5) of Title 2, United States Code, require political committees to report the identification of each person who makes a loan to the committee and the name and address of each person who receives a loan repayment, together with the dates and amounts. Commission regulations parallel

these statutory provisions. 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(4)(iv) and (b)(4)(iv). While the statute and regulations do not expressly indicate that a committee must report loan receipts and payments on Schedules A and B, as well as Schedule C, the Commission's forms make this explicit. See Instructions for Detailed Summary Page, FEC Form 3, Line 13(b); Instructions for Preparing Schedule C, Loans Owed by the Committee. Moreover, this requirement is implicit in the Commission's regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(d) which seem to mandate Schedule C reporting of debts and obligations separately, and in addition to, the reporting obligation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and (5) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(4)(iv) and (b)(4)(iv).

While there appears to be reason to believe DFUSS violated the reporting requirements, this office does not believe that any further action is warranted. In response to the filing of the instant complaint, DFUSS filed amendments for its Schedules A and B which list the respective receipt and repayment of the loans in question. See Attachment 3. In light of the fact that the public record was not misleading in the first place (all of the information in question was on the original DFUSS Schedule C), and the fact that DFUSS promptly corrected the omission when apprised of the situation, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission find reason

to believe DFUSS violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and (5), but that no further action be taken.

**RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Find no reason to believe National Conservative Foundation or Dornan for United States Senator violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) in connection with the production and broadcast of a television program called American Forum.
2. Find reason to believe Dornan for United States Senator violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and (5) by failing to include Schedule A and B entries for certain loans received and repaid, but take no further action.
3. Close the file in this matter.
4. Send the attached letters.

COMPLAINT

1) The National Conservative Foundation has produced a television program, AMERICAN FORUM, and has obtained time for its broadcasting on television stations throughout the United States. Co-hosts on that program were John T. Dolan and Rep. Robert Dornan (R-CA). (See Exhibit A)

2) Between August 8 and August 17, 1981, four (4) television stations in California broadcast AMERICAN FORUM. (See Exhibit B)

3) On July 29, 1981, prior to the broadcasting of this program, Rep. Dornan filed a statement of organization with the Commission as a candidate for the United States Senate from California (Dornan For United States Senator). (See Exhibit C)

4) On July 17, 1981, Rep. Dornan became a qualified candidate for the United States Senate by accepting two loans

of \$5000 each from National Conservative Political Action Committee (NCPAC) and Committee For The Survival of a Free Congress (CSFC) (See Exhibit D) according to Sections 100.3(a)(1) and 100.7(a)(1) of the Commission's regulations.

5) The production and broadcast of AMERICAN FORUM, constituted an in-kind contribution to the Dornan For United States Senator Committee. (Sec. 100.7(a)(1))

6) National Conservative Foundation has never filed with the Commission as a political committee and has, therefore, in no way reported such a contribution.

7) Therefore, National Conservative Foundation violated the Act by failing to report an in-kind contribution to a Federal candidate and Dornan For United States Senator Committee violated the Act by failing to report an in-kind contribution.

8) Additionally, Dornan For United States Senator failed to report as receipts or expenditures the two loan transactions referred to in part 4). NCPAC reported receipt of the loan payment in full on August 24, 1981. (See Exhibit E)

9) Therefore, Dornan For United States Senator violated the Act by failure to report appropriately the receipt and disbursement of the loans as required by Sec. 102.9(a)(3) and Sec. 102.9(b)(1)(i) & (ii).

Wherefore, I request that the Commission initiate a compliance matter on this Complaint pursuant to 2USC Sec. 437g and 11CFR Part III.




# New Conservative TV Show On The Air

This letter is written in reply to your letter to National Conservative Foundation, dated March 16, 1982, with which was enclosed a copy of a complaint filed by Committee for American Principles. In the complaint, reference is made to a television program produced by National Conservative Foundation, which was co-hosted by Rep. Robert Dornan. Because Rep. Dornan is a candidate for nomination and election to the United States Senate, it is alleged that National Conservative Foundation made a contribution to Rep. Dornan in violation of the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. This matter has been numbered MUR 1431.

Enclosed herewith, for your records, is a Statement of Designation of Counsel, signed by the President of National Conservative Foundation, designating the undersigned as its counsel in connection with this matter.

National Conservative Foundation is a corporation, which was organized under the Nonprofit Corporation Act of the Commonwealth of Virginia and which is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. As a part of its educational programs and activities, National Conservative Foundation produced a television program entitled, "American Forum." The purpose of the program is described in the brochure of National Conservative Foundation, a copy of which was attached to the complaint as Exhibit A, as follows:

"American Forum, sponsored by the National Conservative Foundation, will highlight, explore and examine positions and new ideas in foreign affairs, economics, the rejuvenation of the free enterprise system, the re-establishment of order and stability in international trade, new policies vis-a-vis the Soviet Union and other adversaries, and new approaches to government on the state and national levels."

The brochure also states that the format of the program was to focus "on the major issues confronting concerned Americans" and they featured "unrehearsed debates between articulate conservatives and liberals who hold opposite views on the issues, incisive commentary by political headliners, behind-the-scenes interpretations and insights, and an opportunity for viewers to call in and express their opinions." Clearly the purpose and format of the program is a public affairs forum as described in Advisory Opinion 1981-37.

National Conservative Foundation produced thirteen editions of American Forum. Of the thirteen, Rep. Dornan appeared in the first or pilot edition. It is that pilot which is the subject of this matter. The program contained no communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of Rep. Dornan or the defeat of any other candidate. Furthermore, there was no solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions in connection with the program. No political advertising was sold by National Conservative Foundation for presentation during or adjacent to the program. Rep. Dornan was not identified on the program, or in materials produced by National Conservative Foundation about the program, as a candidate for Federal office. All of these points are verified in the attached affidavit by the President of National Conservative Foundation.

Because Committee for American Principles did not allege the program contained a communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of Rep. Dornan, or the defeat of any other candidate, or that there was a solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions in connection with the program, the affidavit of the President of National Conservative Foundation should be accepted as dispositive of this matter. This is because the Federal Election Commission has ruled that, where the purpose of an activity is not to influence the

nomination or election of a candidate for Federal office, no contribution or expenditure results under the Act.

In Advisory Opinion 1981-37, for example, the Commission determined that corporations and labor unions may purchase tickets and/or advertising for a public discussion program moderated by a Member of Congress without making a contribution to the Member. That Advisory Opinion is particularly noteworthy, because it expressly superceded those portions of Advisory Opinions 1975-8, 1975-13, 1975-20 and 1975-108, which held that all speeches of a candidate for Federal office made before a substantial number of people, who comprise part of the electorate with respect to which the individual is a candidate, are presumably made for the purpose of enhancing the individual's candidacy. In addition, Advisory Opinion 1981-37 qualified Advisory Opinion 1977-31, where the Commission had held that a corporation's employment of a candidate as an announcer for a series of corporate sponsored radio announcements constituted something of value and, therefore, a contribution to the candidate.

The Commission has expressed the view in a number of advisory opinions that, under certain specific circumstances, the cost of activities involving appearances of candidates for Federal office would not constitute a contribution or expenditure. Each of those opinions considered an activity the major purpose of which was something other than the nomination or election of a candidate and where (1) there was no communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of the person appearing or the defeat of any other Federal candidate, and (2) there was no solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions for the candidate in connection with the activity. See Advisory Opinions 1981-37, 1980-22, 1978-56, 1978-15, 1977-54 and 1977-42.

In light of the foregoing, the allegation of Committee for American Principles fails and National Conservative Foundation should be dismissed as a respondent in this matter. If necessary, however, National Conservative Foundation will make available to the Office of General Counsel a three-quarter inch



This letter is written in reply to your letter to National Conservative Foundation, dated March 16, 1982, with which was enclosed a copy of a complaint filed by Committee for American Principles. In the complaint, reference is made to a television program produced by National Conservative Foundation, which was co-hosted by Rep. Robert Dornan. Because Rep. Dornan is a candidate for nomination and election to the United States Senate, it is alleged that National Conservative Foundation made a contribution to Rep. Dornan in violation of the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. This matter has been numbered MUR 1431.

Enclosed herewith, for your records, is a Statement of Designation of Counsel, signed by the President of National Conservative Foundation, designating the undersigned as its counsel in connection with this matter.

National Conservative Foundation is a corporation, which was organized under the Nonprofit Corporation Act of the Commonwealth of Virginia and which is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. As a part of its educational programs and activities, National Conservative Foundation produced a television program entitled, "American Forum." The purpose of the program is described in the brochure of National Conservative Foundation, a copy of which was attached to the complaint as Exhibit A, as follows:

"American Forum, sponsored by the National Conservative Foundation, will highlight, explore and examine positions and new ideas in foreign affairs, economics, the rejuvenation of the free enterprise system, the re-establishment of order and stability in international trade, new policies vis-a-vis the Soviet Union and other adversaries, and new approaches to government on the state and national levels."

The brochure also states that the format of the program was to focus "on the major issues confronting concerned Americans" and they featured "unrehearsed debates between articulate conservatives and liberals who hold opposite views on the issues, incisive commentary by political headliners, behind-the-scenes interpretations and insights, and an opportunity for viewers to call in and express their opinions." Clearly the purpose and format of the program is a public affairs forum as described in Advisory Opinion 1981-37.

National Conservative Foundation produced thirteen editions of American Forum. Of the thirteen, Rep. Dornan appeared in the first or pilot edition. It is that pilot which is the subject of this matter. The program contained no communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of Rep. Dornan or the defeat of any other candidate. Furthermore, there was no solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions in connection with the program. No political advertising was sold by National Conservative Foundation for presentation during or adjacent to the program. Rep. Dornan was not identified on the program, or in materials produced by National Conservative Foundation about the program, as a candidate for Federal office. All of these points are verified in the attached affidavit by the President of National Conservative Foundation.

Because Committee for American Principles did not allege the program contained a communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of Rep. Dornan, or the defeat of any other candidate, or that there was a solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions in connection with the program, the affidavit of the President of National Conservative Foundation should be accepted as dispositive of this matter. This is because the Federal Election Commission has ruled that, where the purpose of an activity is not to influence the

nomination or election of a candidate for Federal office, no contribution or expenditure results under the Act.

In Advisory Opinion 1981-37, for example, the Commission determined that corporations and labor unions may purchase tickets and/or advertising for a public discussion program moderated by a Member of Congress without making a contribution to the Member. That Advisory Opinion is particularly noteworthy, because it expressly superceded those portions of Advisory Opinions 1975-8, 1975-13, 1975-20 and 1975-108, which held that all speeches of a candidate for Federal office made before a substantial number of people, who comprise part of the electorate with respect to which the individual is a candidate, are presumably made for the purpose of enhancing the individual's candidacy. In addition, Advisory Opinion 1981-37 qualified Advisory Opinion 1977-31, where the Commission had held that a corporation's employment of a candidate as an announcer for a series of corporate sponsored radio announcements constituted something of value and, therefore, a contribution to the candidate.

The Commission has expressed the view in a number of advisory opinions that, under certain specific circumstances, the cost of activities involving appearances of candidates for Federal office would not constitute a contribution or expenditure. Each of those opinions considered an activity the major purpose of which was something other than the nomination or election of a candidate and where (1) there was no communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of the person appearing or the defeat of any other Federal candidate, and (2) there was no solicitation, making or acceptance of campaign contributions for the candidate in connection with the activity. See Advisory Opinions 1981-37, 1980-22, 1978-56, 1978-15, 1977-54 and 1977-42.



(6) That the format of the programs consisted of discussions with various guests of major issues of public concern, nonpartisan debates between individuals who hold

(9) That none of the programs contained any communication expressly advocating the nomination or election of Rep. Dornan or of any other candidate, or the defeat of any candidate.


