
Dear Mr. Kenworthy:



CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Don Emerson. Probable cause has been found to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco ("Respondent") violated 2 U.S.C. Section 441b (11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(b)) as to one, but not the remainder, of the allegations in the complaint, as more particularly hereinafter set forth:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(4)(A)(i) do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding.

II. Respondent has received notice and had opportunity to respond and to be heard in this proceeding in accordance with 2 U.S.C section 437g(a).

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this Agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, was the state campaign committee for Assemblyman Bosco.

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2. Respondent conducted a poll on February 22, 23, and 24, 1982, prior to Douglas Bosco becoming a candidate for Congress, which, in part, tested Douglas Bosco's name recognition and as such was useful in determining whether he would subsequently become a candidate for Congress. The poll also covered other matters in connection with Douglas Bosco's official capacity as a California Assemblyman and unrelated to the subsequent federal election.
  3. The total cost of the poll was \$3,000.00 and was paid from the Respondent's treasury which contained corporate and union funds.
  4. The portion of the cost allocable to the subsequent federal campaign of Douglas Bosco is \$600.00.

V. Respondent's expenditure of the \$600.00 on behalf of a federal candidate from commingled funds is a violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b.

VI. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. Section 431, et. seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(1) concerning the

matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that any of the requirements or provisions contained in paragraphs VI and X of this agreement have been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.


IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Respondent shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to pay the civil penalty set forth in paragraph VI. of this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

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

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Don Emerson. Probable cause has been found to believe that the Bosco for Congress Committee ("Respondent") violated 2 U.S.C. Section 441b (11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(b) and 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(3) (11 C.F.R. Section 104.13)) as to some but not all of the allegations in the complaint as more particularly hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(4)(A)(i) do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding.

II. Respondent has received notice and had opportunity to respond and to be heard in this proceeding in accordance with 2 U.S.C Section 437g(a).

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this Agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

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1. Respondent, the Bosco for Congress Committee, was the principal campaign committee for Douglas H. Bosco's Congressional campaign.
2. The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, a California state committee formed in connection with Bosco's campaign and office as a California state assemblyman, conducted a poll on February 22, 23, and 24, 1982, prior to Douglas Bosco becoming a candidate for Congress, which, in part, tested Douglas Bosco's name recognition and as such was useful in determining whether he would subsequently become a candidate for Congress. The poll also covered other matters in connection with Douglas Bosco's official capacity as a California Assemblyman and unrelated to the subsequent federal election.
3. The total cost of the poll was \$3,000.00 and was paid from the state committee's treasury which contained corporate and union funds.
4. The portion of the cost allocable to the subsequent federal campaign of Douglas Bosco is \$600.00 and when Bosco subsequently became a candidate for Congress, a portion of the previously conducted poll then became an in-kind contribution in that amount.
5. At the time the poll was taken, the Respondent committee did not exist. When the Respondent

committee was later formed, it reported contributions which it received but failed to report a portion of the previously taken poll as an in-kind contribution.

V. Respondent's failure to report a portion of the previously taken poll as an in-kind contribution is a violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 434(b)(3) (11 C.F.R.1 Section 1104-13).

VI. Respondent for purposes of this agreement and the facts set forth above, does not contest that the receipt of the in-kind contribution in the nature of a portion of the previously conducted poll, is a violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b (11 C.F.R. Section 114.2(b)).

VII. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. Section 431, et. seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that any of the requirements or provisions contained in paragraphs VII. and XI. of this agreement have been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.





GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. Statement of the Case

This matter was generated as the result of a complaint filed by Don Emerson against the Bosco for Congress Committee ("the Congressional Committee") and the Committee to Elect Douglas Bosco ("the State Committee"). The complaint alleges that certain expenditures made by the State Committee were actually made on behalf of Douglas Bosco's congressional bid and should have been reported accordingly.

On September 29, 1982, the Commission found reason to believe that the following violations had been committed: (a) a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) (11 C.F.R. § 104.13) in that the congressional committee failed to report receipt of in-kind contributions from the State Committee; (b) a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b (11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b)) in that the state's contributions were made from commingled corporate funds; and, (c) a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) and § 434 in that the State Committee failed to register and file reports of receipts and expenditures.

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II. Legal Analysis

The complainant alleged that over \$7,000 in State Committee payments made for travel, lodging, polling and telephone services were made in connection with a federal election. The respondent has provided an explanation refuting each charge separately as discussed below.

Telephone Charge:

The office space at 1207 Fourth Street, Santa Rosa, is used as headquarters by the Congressional Committee and also houses the Santa Rosa Democratic Club, as well as literature and campaign materials for local democratic candidates; in addition, the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee also uses the premises.

The \$526 payment by the State Committee to the Congressional Committee represents payment made for use of the phones solely by the Democratic Central Committee for a voter registration drive lasting six months.

When the Congressional Committee began using the premises, they had additional lines installed for congressional use at their own expense for a total operational cost of \$3,500. The respondent maintains that the cost allocable to the State Committee probably exceeds the \$526 initial payment made by it. The respondent believes the allocation is a reasonable one by the federal committee because the State Committee merely paid for installation of some lines yet used the phones for six months. This Office concurs with counsel's position.

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Travel and Lodging Expenses:

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The complainant alleged that over \$7,000 paid for travel and lodging by the State Committee were in connection with Bosco's federal campaign. The respondent has submitted Bosco's travel itinerary during the relevant period showing dates, places, people, purpose of each appearance, etc. The response indicates that the expenditures were properly incurred by and paid for by the State Committee since Bosco's appearances were in connection with his State Assemblyman position. According to counsel, Bosco did not actively campaign in the primary except for a single event which was duly paid for by the Congressional Committee. His state appearances, which are the subject of this matter, included Caucus business, a State Speaker dinner, party appearances and speeches before special interest groups.

Counsel asserts that while Bosco kept a full speaking schedule in connection with his position as Chairman of the Assembly Democratic Caucus, he never campaigned for his Congressional bid at these appearances nor did he criticize his opponent. We believe that the itemized appearances by Bosco, although overlapping with his Congressional district, could be deemed to be primarily in connection with his state position and any benefit to his congressional campaign were incidental and are excluded from reportable campaign activities under 11 C.F.R. § 106.3(b)(3).

Polling Cost:

The complainant alleges that a poll conducted in 1982, paid for by the State Committee, should have been paid by the Federal Committee since its primary purpose was testing the waters.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 100.8(b)(1):

Funds received and payments made solely for the purpose of determining whether an individual should become a candidate are not expenditures. Activities permissible under this exemption include, but are not limited to, expenses incurred for: conducting a poll, telephone calls and travel, to determine whether an individual should become a candidate. The individual shall keep records of all such funds received and payments made. If the individual subsequently becomes a candidate, the funds received and payments made are contributions and expenditures subject to the limitations, prohibitions and requirements of the Act. Such contributions and expenditures must be reported with the first report filed by the principal campaign committee of the candidate, regardless of the date the funds were received or the payments made.

In his initial response to the complaint, counsel replied to this allegation by stating that the poll was "taken to determine public opinion on a variety of issues and also included popularity ratings of a number of public officials including Assemblyman Bosco, Senator Keene, Speaker Willie Brown, Senator Kennedy, Congressman Clausen and Governor Brown." Counsel stated that Bosco had taken other such polls in the past to ascertain constituency opinions on a number of issues.

In response to the Commission's reason to believe notification, counsel submitted a copy of the poll at issue here.

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He stated that his client was attempting to locate past polls taken by him as well as other public officials.

According to counsel, the poll was taken at a time when Mr. Bosco did not plan to run for Congress regardless of the results of the poll. Counsel submits that only a portion of the fifty responses called for in the poll can be considered testing the waters. The other questions are in connection with Bosco's Assemblyman position.

The Office of General Counsel has reviewed the poll and finds that certain questions would clearly be an aid to an individual's test of popularity and name recognition.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 106.4(e)(4), allocation of polling expenses may be computed by any method which reasonably reflects the benefit derived. If a certain percentage of the fifty questions are deemed to be federal expenditures, then a portion of the total cost of the poll is an in-kind contribution from the State Committee to the Federal Committee. In this case, we concur with counsel's position that approximately 20% of the poll may be considered a federal expenditure. Therefore, the amount of the in-kind contribution is \$600. (20% of \$3,000 equals total cost of poll in connection with federal election).

Because the State Committee's treasury contains corporate and union funds, its payment of the poll is a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b which prohibits corporate contributions in connection with federal elections. The \$600 in-kind contribution places both the State and the Federal Committees in violation of

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2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b). The Congressional Committee's failure to report receipt of the in-kind contribution places it in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13.

Because only \$600 of the questioned expenditures are considered to have been made in connection with a federal election, the \$1,000 threshold triggering registration and reporting by the State Committee has not been met. Therefore, we recommend no probable cause that the State Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 433 or § 434.


III. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Commission find:

1. Probable cause to believe that the Bosco for Congress Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13.
2. Probable cause to believe that the Bosco for Congress Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
3. Probable cause to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
4. No probable cause to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco violated 2 U.S.C. § 433.
5. No probable cause to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco violated 2 U.S.C. § 434.

This letter is in response to your letter of October 4, 1982.

1. The \$526.00 telephone charge:

The Santa Rosa Democratic Club rented the premises located at 1207 Fourth Street, Santa Rosa, California, on May 1, 1982. This office was rented to serve as a "United Democratic Headquarters" for numerous local democratic candidates to house their literature and campaign materials, hold meetings, etc. In addition, the space was shared by the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee and was also used as the headquarters for the Bosco for Congress Committee.

One of the primary, initial and ongoing uses made of the premises was to conduct a county-wide voter registration drive under the auspices of the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee. The coordinator of this drive was housed in these premises. Assemblyman Bosco's state committee paid the sum in question of \$526.00 for the initial installation of two telephone lines to this office. This sum was allocated by that Committee entirely to the county voter registration drive.

In fact, the registration drive conducted intensively from this office began in May 1982 immediately following the installation of this telephone service and continued through October 1982. The telephones were answered initially with the salutation: "voter registration"; and later "Democratic Headquarters". At no time have any of the phones into this office been answered with any salutation identifying Doug

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Bosco or the Bosco for Congress Committee. This \$526.00 payment was the only payment made by or on behalf of the registration drive for the use of the telephones for the entire six-month period, even though the actual expense attributable to their use of the phones was greater.

Numerous additional lines were installed at the expense of the Bosco for Congress Committee and all subsequent and other installation and telephone usage charges were paid for and reported by that committee. You will note that the Bosco for Congress Committee reports for the period beginning less than 20 days following the installation of the lines in question, show expenditures for telephone service at these premises in excess of \$3,400.00.

No part of the \$526.00 reported on Assemblyman Bosco's state report for the telephone service was allocated to the Bosco for Congress Committee. It was entirely allocated to the use of the Democratic Central Committee in connection with its voter registration drive. The actual value of the telephone useage in connection with the voter registration drive probably substantially exceeded that initial \$526.

Under the circumstances it is submitted that the allocation of that expense totally to the voter registration drive is more than reasonable, and that the subsequent reporting of nearly \$3500 in telephone charges by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the same period completely and adequately reports all telephonic expenses allocable and attributable to the federal congressional campaign.

In response to your inquiry concerning allocation of the operating expenditures for the shared headquarters, there has been and is no formal allocation other than the initial telephone installation as outlined above, and the Bosco for Congress Committee has paid and reported 100% of the utilities, telephones, etc. If you wish further documentation or evidence of the actual usage of these premises by the other committees and groups, please let me know in what form you wish the evidence and we will attempt to provide it.

## 2. The poll:

A copy of the poll in question is enclosed.

It has been a number of years since the taking of a prior poll in which Mr. Bosco was involved and we have been

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unable yet to locate a copy of previous poll questions. We are also attempting to locate copies of other polls conducted by other public officials and if we are able to locate them we will be happy to provide you with copies.

The poll in question was conducted on February 22, 23 and 24, 1982 at a time when it was Mr. Bosco's intent not to run for congress regardless of the results of the poll. It was conducted only in the County of Sonoma. The poll was designed, supervised and analyzed by the public opinion research group, Fairbanks, Canapary and Maullin as indicated in the reports. They were paid \$3,000.00.

The actual taking of the poll was done entirely by volunteer workers.

Upon my review of this poll I would probably have to concede that a portion of it could be considered a preliminary test of Mr. Bosco's popularity and name recognition. However, of the approximately 50 responses called for in the poll, only about 10 may arguably be designed to 'test the waters' as a preliminary to Mr. Bosco's congressional candidacy. The remainder of the questions are legitimate inquiries in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's official responsibility to his constituency.

To the extent that this poll should have been reported, the reporting requirements were both overlooked and misunderstood. It should be taken into account, in mitigation, that no attempt has been made to hide anything and that the full cost of the poll was reported in a public document in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's state committee.

I would be very much interested in the commission's specific views and comments, after an opportunity has been had to review the enclosed copy of the poll, regarding the possibility of resolving this matter through conciliation proceedings. In particular, I would ask that you consider the reasonableness of allocating 20% of the poll expense as a campaign activity.

### 3. Travel and lodging:

In connection with the allegations relating to travel and lodging expenses, the explanation set forth in the

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initial response of August 26, 1982, is accurate. I have enclosed copies of a complete itinerary of Mr. Bosco's appearances and travel for the first six months of 1982 showing dates, places, people, purpose, etc. This itinerary shows that the expenditures made during that period were consistently in connection with Bosco's normal activity as a California Assemblyman.


Prior reports of his state committee also show similar travel expenditures, none of which are related to the federal congressional campaign except to the natural unavoidable and incidental extent that any contact or appearance made by the Assemblyman may tend to increase his name recognition. That however is not enough to require the reporting of the expenses incurred in connection with Mr. Bosco's normal activities as a state legislator. Federal regulations specifically exclude incidental contacts from the definition of 'campaign-related activities'. 11 CFR Section 106.3(b)(3).

4. Sharon Usher:

Sharon Usher functions as Mr. Bosco's campaign manager. As such she has charge of all of the many duties relating to that responsibility including recruiting and supervising volunteer workers, campaign advertising, press and other media relations and coverage, planning and supervising precinct work, etc.

Based on a complaint filed with the Commission on August 5, 1982, and information supplied by you, the Commission determined on September 29, 1982, that there was reason to believe that: the Bosco for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Clayton Clement, have violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13; the Bosco for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Clayton Clement, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b); the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b); and the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433a and 434, provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), and instituted an investigation of this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find:

1. Probable cause to believe that the Bosco for Congress Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13.
2. Probable cause to believe that the Bosco for Congress Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
3. Probable cause to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).

4. No probable cause to believe that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco violated 2 U.S.C. § 433.


Submitted for your review is a brief stating the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within fifteen days of your receipt of this notice, you may file with the Secretary of the Commission a brief (ten copies if possible) stating your position on the issues and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. (Three copies of such brief should also be forwarded to the Office of General Counsel, if possible). The General Counsel's brief and any brief which you may submit will be considered by the Commission before proceeding to a vote of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within fifteen days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond twenty days.

A finding of probable cause to believe requires that the Office of General Counsel attempt for a period of not less than thirty, but not more than ninety days to settle this matter through a conciliation agreement.

This letter is in response to your letter of October 4, 1982.

**1. The \$526.00 telephone charge:**

The Santa Rosa Democratic Club rented the premises located at 1207 Fourth Street, Santa Rosa, California, on May 1, 1982. This office was rented to serve as a "United Democratic Headquarters" for numerous local democratic candidates to house their literature and campaign materials, hold meetings, etc. In addition, the space was shared by the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee and was also used as the headquarters for the Bosco for Congress Committee.

One of the primary, initial and ongoing uses made of the premises was to conduct a county-wide voter registration drive under the auspices of the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee. The coordinator of this drive was housed in these premises. Assemblyman Bosco's state committee paid the sum in question of \$526.00 for the initial installation of two telephone lines to this office. This sum was allocated by that Committee entirely to the county voter registration drive.

In fact, the registration drive conducted intensively from this office began in May 1982 immediately following the installation of this telephone service and continued through October 1982. The telephones were answered initially with the salutation: "voter registration"; and later "Democratic Headquarters". At no time have any of the phones into this office been answered with any salutation identifying Doug

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Bosco or the Bosco for Congress Committee. This \$526.00 payment was the only payment made by or on behalf of the registration drive for the use of the telephones for the entire six-month period, even though the actual expense attributable to their use of the phones was greater.

Numerous additional lines were installed at the expense of the Bosco for Congress Committee and all subsequent and other installation and telephone usage charges were paid for and reported by that committee. You will note that the Bosco for Congress Committee reports for the period beginning less than 20 days following the installation of the lines in question, show expenditures for telephone service at these premises in excess of \$3,400.00.

No part of the \$526.00 reported on Assemblyman Bosco's state report for the telephone service was allocated to the Bosco for Congress Committee. It was entirely allocated to the use of the Democratic Central Committee in connection with its voter registration drive. The actual value of the telephone useage in connection with the voter registration drive probably substantially exceeded that initial \$526.

Under the circumstances it is submitted that the allocation of that expense totally to the voter registration drive is more than reasonable, and that the subsequent reporting of nearly \$3500 in telephone charges by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the same period completely and adequately reports all telephonic expenses allocable and attributable to the federal congressional campaign.

In response to your inquiry concerning allocation of the operating expenditures for the shared headquarters, there has been and is no formal allocation other than the initial telephone installation as outlined above, and the Bosco for Congress Committee has paid and reported 100% of the utilities, telephones, etc. If you wish further documentation or evidence of the actual usage of these premises by the other committees and groups, please let me know in what form you wish the evidence and we will attempt to provide it.

## 2. The poll:

A copy of the poll in question is enclosed.

It has been a number of years since the taking of a prior poll in which Mr. Bosco was involved and we have been

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unable yet to locate a copy of previous poll questions. We are also attempting to locate copies of other polls conducted by other public officials and if we are able to locate them we will be happy to provide you with copies.

The poll in question was conducted on February 22, 23 and 24, 1982 at a time when it was Mr. Bosco's intent not to run for congress regardless of the results of the poll. It was conducted only in the County of Sonoma. The poll was designed, supervised and analyzed by the public opinion research group, Fairbanks, Canapary and Maullin as indicated in the reports. They were paid \$3,000.00.

The actual taking of the poll was done entirely by volunteer workers.

Upon my review of this poll I would probably have to concede that a portion of it could be considered a preliminary test of Mr. Bosco's popularity and name recognition. However, of the approximately 50 responses called for in the poll, only about 10 may arguably be designed to 'test the waters' as a preliminary to Mr. Bosco's congressional candidacy. The remainder of the questions are legitimate inquiries in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's official responsibility to his constituency.

To the extent that this poll should have been reported, the reporting requirements were both overlooked and misunderstood. It should be taken into account, in mitigation, that no attempt has been made to hide anything and that the full cost of the poll was reported in a public document in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's state committee.

I would be very much interested in the commission's specific views and comments, after an opportunity has been had to review the enclosed copy of the poll, regarding the possibility of resolving this matter through conciliation proceedings. In particular, I would ask that you consider the reasonableness of allocating 20% of the poll expense as a campaign activity.

### 3. Travel and lodging:

In connection with the allegations relating to travel and lodging expenses, the explanation set forth in the

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initial response of August 26, 1982, is accurate. I have enclosed copies of a complete itinerary of Mr. Bosco's appearances and travel for the first six months of 1982 showing dates, places, people, purpose, etc. This itinerary shows that the expenditures made during that period were consistently in connection with Bosco's normal activity as a California Assemblyman.

Prior reports of his state committee also show similar travel expenditures, none of which are related to the federal congressional campaign except to the natural unavoidable and incidental extent that any contact or appearance made by the Assemblyman may tend to increase his name recognition. That however is not enough to require the reporting of the expenses incurred in connection with Mr. Bosco's normal activities as a state legislator. Federal regulations specifically exclude incidental contacts from the definition of 'campaign-related activities'. 11 CFR Section 106.3(b) (3).

4. Sharon Usher:

Sharon Usher functions as Mr. Bosco's campaign manager. As such she has charge of all of the many duties relating to that responsibility including recruiting and supervising volunteer workers, campaign advertising, press and other media relations and coverage, planning and supervising precinct work, etc.



2. the Bosco for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Clayton Clement, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
3. the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
4. the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 434.

- (10) provide an itemized breakdown which shows the names and titles, if any, of the individuals involved in the lodging expenses reported by the State committee and provide a statement which explains the purpose for each such expenditure.

You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. Please file any such response within ten days of your receipt of this notification.



- (4) by whom the poll was conducted;
- (5) copies of past polls taken by the candidate as well as dates, area(s) and name(s) of poll takers;
- (6) a statement as to how the campaign headquarters for the Congressional committee allocates operating expenditures with the party committee housed in the same space;
- (7) a statement as to whether any portion of the telephone installation fee paid for by the State committee was allocated to the Congressional committee; and, if not, a statement as to why such allocation was not made;
- (8) a statement as to the purpose of all expenditures made by the Bosco for Congress Committee to Sharon Usher, i.e., what were the duties of Ms. Usher as "independent contractor"; in this regard, explain the relationship between Sharon Usher and the Congressional committee;
- (9) provide an itemized breakdown which shows the individuals involved, the mode as well as the points of travel as reported by the State committee, including dates and purpose;
- (10) provide an itemized breakdown which shows the names and titles, if any, of the individuals involved in the lodging expenses reported by the State committee and provide a statement which explains the purpose for each such expenditure.

You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter. Please file any such response within ten days of your receipt of this notification.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

This matter was generated as the result of a complaint filed by Don Emerson against (a) Douglas H. Bosco, a California State Assemblyman and a congressional candidate; (b) the Bosco for Congress Committee, the principal campaign committee of Bosco ("Congressional Committee"); (c) Clayton Clement, treasurer of the Congressional Committee; (d) The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, the state level committee which supports Bosco's Assemblyman campaign and other state and local candidates; and (e) Sharon Usher, treasurer of the state level committee.

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The complainant alleges that Douglas H. Bosco, an Assemblyman in California, has charged certain expenditures in connection with his congressional campaign to his Assemblyman state campaign. Complainant further states that payments made by the state committee for travel, lodging, polling and telephone services are in-kind contributions to the Bosco for Congress Committee. Because these in-kind contributions were not disclosed on the Report of Receipts and Disbursements filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee, violations of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) (3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13 are alleged to have been committed.

Additionally, because California State law permits corporate and union contributions in connection with State elections, the in-kind contributions were made from commingled funds alleged to be in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).

Based on the allegations above, complainant also states that since the State committee spent \$10,000 in connection with a federal election, it has exceeded the threshold triggering political committee status under the Act. Therefore, the Committee has allegedly failed to register and file in accordance with 2 U.S.C. § 433(a) and § 434.

#### FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The complainant alleges that the subject expenses reported by the State Committee were made when Bosco was not campaigning for State office and were actually in connection with his congressional bid.

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Bosco's reply, filed on his behalf by counsel, states that he did not actively campaign in the congressional primary election except for a single appearance in which he and his opponent attended an event sponsored by the Sonoma Democratic Club. The candidate says he attended the event on his way home from work and incurred no expenses.

Counsel states that as chairman of the Assembly Democratic Caucus, Bosco is required to travel extensively attending events and assisting other candidates in and out of his own district. Counsel further states that Bosco did not "use any of these appearances to campaign for his congressional race or to criticize his opponent... All expenditures incurred during the period from January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982, were authorized under California law and properly incurred in connection with Mr. Bosco's official capacity as State Assemblyman." There is no evidence to indicate that the State Committee's expenditures for travel and lodging by Bosco are reportable as in-kind contributions to the congressional committee.

Counsel replied to the allegations concerning the poll taken by the state committee by stating that it was "taken to determine public opinion on a variety of issues and also included popularity ratings of a number of public officials including Assemblyman Bosco, Senator Keene, Speaker Willie Brown, Senator Kennedy, Congressman Clausen and Governor Brown." Counsel also states that Bosco had taken other such polls in the past to ascertain constituency opinions on a number of issues.

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Because poll taking was a past practice of Bosco and included a survey of many issues, we do not believe the expenditure should be construed as being made in connection with a Federal election.

In response to the telephone allegations, counsel states that the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee shares office space in the candidate's headquarters. The telephone service referred to was installed in connection with the party committee's voter registration drive and was initially paid for by them.

When the congressional committee began to use the telephones, it began paying the bills and those expenditures were then duly reported to the Commission. Bosco's reports have been reviewed and the telephone expenditures referred to in his response have been reported. The initial telephone fees for use in connection with voter registration were reported by the State campaign. There is no evidence that a reporting violation has been committed.

It is the view of this Office that counsel for the respondents has sufficiently explained the reporting and use of both the federal and state accounts in connection with this matter. If the subject expenditures made by the State committee are not deemed to be federal expenditures, then the allegations concerning registration, reporting and corporate contributions by the State committee need not be addressed further. It is

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therefore recommended that the Commission find no reason to believe against the respondents and close the file.


RECOMMENDATIONS

1. the Bosco for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Clayton Clement, have violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.13.
2. the Bosco for Congress Committee and its treasurer, Clayton Clement, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
3. the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(b).
4. the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco and its treasurer, Sharon Usher, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 433a and 434.
5. Douglas Bosco has violated any provisions of the Act with respect to the allegations addressed in this MUR.
6. Approve and send the attached letters.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §437g(a) and 11 C.F.R. §111.4, I Don Emerson, submit this complaint alleging violations of various provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, by Douglas H. Bosco, a California State Assemblyman and a candidate for the United States House of Representatives for the California first Congressional District, the Bosco for Congress Committee, the principal campaign committee of Douglas H. Bosco, Clayton Clement, Treasurer of the Bosco for Congress Committee, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, a California committee which supports and opposes state and local candidates in California, and Sharon J. Usher, Treasurer of the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco.

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I --

FAILURE TO REPORT EXPENDITURES MADE  
IN CONNECTION WITH A FEDERAL ELECTION

Based on the information contained in the campaign disclosure reports filed pursuant to Federal and California law by the Bosco for Congress Committee and the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, complainant believes that a number of expenditures were made in furtherance of Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for Congress which were not reported on the pre-primary report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee covering the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982 (Exhibit A). These expenditures were made by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, a California political committee controlled by Assemblyman Bosco, which is registered and files periodic campaign statements pursuant to the California Political Reform Act of 1974, as amended. This committee was established in 1978 to support Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for the California State Assembly. While the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has made contributions to other California state candidates in a few isolated instances, the committee's primary purpose has been to support Assemblyman Bosco in his campaigns for the State Assembly.

A number of payments were reported on the California campaign statement filed by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco for the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982, which appear

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to have been made in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's Congressional campaign (Exhibit B). These payments include the following:

Assemblyman Bosco made numerous public appearances during the period January 1st through May 22nd as a candidate for Congress. Some of these appearances are documented in the attached newspapers articles (Exhibit C). No travel expenses were itemized on the campaign report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982. However, as outlined above, Assemblyman Bosco's state committee paid over \$7,000.00 for travel and lodging expenses during a period when Assemblyman Bosco was not a candidate for State office.

Moreover, according to the California campaign statement filed by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco a poll was paid for during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982. Douglas Bosco has been a member of the California Assembly for

four years. In 1980, Assemblyman-Bosco was unopposed in the primary election and lacked significant opposition in the general election. It is reasonable to conclude that this poll was conducted to assist Assemblyman Bosco in deciding whether he should run for Congress rather than to evaluate his chances for reelection to the State Assembly.

The report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982, disclosed that the Committee rented an office to serve as a campaign headquarters. There were no itemized expenditures for telephone installation or service during this period. However, during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made a payment to Pacific Telephone in the amount of \$526.00, despite the fact that it had no campaign headquarters during this period.

Based on the information contained in the Federal and California campaign disclosure reports, I believe and herein allege that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made payments for travel, lodging, polling and telephone service which were in kind contributions to the Bosco for Congress Committee. These in kind contributions were not disclosed on the Report of Receipts and Disbursements filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982 as required pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. §104.13.

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II --

USE OF CORPORATE AND UNION FUNDS  
IN CONNECTION WITH A FEDERAL ELECTION

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The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco is a California political committee which lawfully solicits and accepts corporate and union contributions for use in connection with California state and local elections. A review of the two most recent California campaign disclosure statements filed by this committee covering the periods July 1, 1981 through December 31, 1981 (Exhibit D) and January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 (Exhibit B) and a "late contribution report" filed on June 1, 1982 (Exhibit E) reveal that the majority of the Committee's Contributors are corporations, unions or other political committees which solicit and accept corporate and union funds. As outlined above, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco disclosed on its most recent California campaign statement that it paid for travel, lodging, telephone and polling expenses during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982, which complainant believes to have been used by Assemblyman Bosco in connection with his campaign for Congress. These inkind contributions were made with funds which had been received from corporations and labor unions in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b and 11 C.F.R. 114.2(b).

III --

THE COMMITTEE TO ELECT

DOUGLAS H. BOSCO

FAILED TO REGISTER AND FILE

REPORTS AS A POLITICAL COMMITTEE

Based on the information disclosed in the Federal and California campaign reports discussed above, complainant believes the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made inkind contributions to the Bosco for Congress Committee exceeding \$10,000.00 in value. Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, a political committee is defined as any committee or other group of persons which receives contributions in excess of \$1,000.00 during a calendar year or which make expenditures aggregating in excess of \$1,000 in a calendar year. (2 U.S.C. §431(4)(A) and 11 C.F.R. §100.5(a)). By making contributions to a federal candidate's principal campaign committee in excess of \$1,000.00 during calendar year 1982, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has qualified as a political committee under the Act. The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has failed to register and file reports as required by 2 U.S.C. §433(a) and 2 U.S.C. §434.

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
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IV --

I respectfully request that the Federal Election Commission commence an enforcement action pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §437g(a) in connection with the matters outlined herein.



# 'Money talks,' Bosco foe says

 Assemblyman Douglas Bosco's record of campaign contributions is proof the Occidental legislator is a "special interest candidate," according to his opponent in the Democratic congressional race.

The familiar issue of big money and influence was raised in a press release by Elk author Mike Koepf, former fisherman who has had less success raising money for his congressional bid.

Koepf said his efforts have generated contributions of only about \$5,000, a fraction of the \$70,000 to \$80,000 Bosco estimates he has raised for his congressional campaign.

"Doug Bosco is a master of political camouflage," Koepf said in a press release accompanied by his opponent's 1981 legislative contribution report. "He speaks with a liberal tongue about the economic plight facing the citizens of our North Coast, but when it comes time for financial backing his hand is out to the big money boys."

Koepf noted Bosco received 1981 campaign contributions from a variety of interests, including banks, associations and firms that would benefit from the assemblyman's membership on the Assembly Finance, Insurance and Commerce Committee.

"It's hard for me to imagine that a politician would really do much to fight the high interest rates crippling our North Coast economy when they receive money from the very banks that have set those high rates," said Koepf. "Money talks."

But Bosco said he has been "extremely impervious" to pressures from special interests.

"The most important bill in the legislature for the banks this session is to repeal the Wellenkamp

decision, and I have been the person in the Legislature who is holding up that bill," he said.

The Wellenkamp decision is a California Supreme Court ruling that allows the assumption of mortgages regardless of whether the lending institution agrees. A bill to repeal the decision, by Assemblyman Jim Costa of Fresno, has been stuck in the Assembly Financial Institutions subcommittee, which Bosco chairs.

Bosco also said that last year his fund raising was "the lowest of 120 members of the Legislature" and that much of the money he raised was due to his chairmanship of the Assembly Democratic Caucus.

"In California it is common practice to give money to legislative leaders and they give it to

other members," he said.

Koepf said Bosco received \$51,460 in contributions of \$100 or more last year, and only three of those contributions came from within the district. But, Bosco said, he received "many small contributions from within the district."

Bosco's total receipts for 1981 were \$72,856 — money intended for the Assembly campaign efforts he will give up with his run for Congress. More stringent federal campaign financing laws will severely limit the amount of legislative contributions the assemblyman can use in his congressional campaign.

"What's to become of this money?" asked Koepf. "Does he give it back? Could he donate it to the senior citizens centers of our North Coast to help defray the expense of their meals programs. I'd

like to know."

Bosco said he would not use money collected last year for his congressional campaign, but was unclear about where the funds would be used. Some of it will be used for voter registration efforts, he said.

"I don't believe it could be given as a gift, such as to senior centers," he said. "I would have to look at that."

Bosco also denied Koepf's suggestion that he has political ties to a Nevada-based real estate firm, the Hughes Organization of Las Vegas. Bosco said the firm once asked him to sponsor a bill to allow the company to develop some environmentally-sensitive coastal land in Southern California, but that he had refused to carry or support the legislation.

Bosco's contribution list has included more than one interest involved in ongoing legislation, however. Last year he received \$3,000 from Continental Airlines and \$1,000 from the company's lobbyist while he was sponsoring legislation to allow Continental employees to purchase the company.

Bosco also received \$500 from Beverly Hills developer Nathan Shapell the week before casting a deciding vote for a bill that would have allowed the builder to develop 2,000 acres in Ventura County. Bosco said he returned the contribution, however, and Gov. Brown subsequently vetoed the bill.

Bosco also authored a measure calling for the state to underwrite construction of a major genetic research facility. The sponsor of the proposal was an Alameda developer who wanted the facility built on his land, and who is an important Democratic contributor and a close friend of Assembly speaker Willie Brown.

# Koepf vs. Bosco, Bosco vs. Clausen and Reagan

Assemblyman Doug Bosco and author Mike Koepf met in Sonoma Thursday to mix it up over the Democratic congressional nomination but at least half the punches thrown were aimed at two men who weren't there

Bosco — clearly looking ahead to the November general election — made President Ronald Reagan and incumbent Rep. Don Clausen the primary targets of his comments during an hour-long exchange before the Sonoma Valley Democratic Club.

Meanwhile, Koepf peppered his remarks with references to the evils of special interest influence, an issue he has attempted to press against Bosco in earlier campaigning.

The sharpest disagreement between the two candidates came over the Cal Nickel mine in Del Norte County, a project made possible by Bosco's bill exempting a tributary of the Smith River from the state Wild and Scenic Rivers Act.

Bosco told the small gathering at Sonoma's First Congregational Church that the project would create 1,000 jobs and bring millions of dollars into an area of 30 percent unemployment. Environmental safeguards, he said, would be provided by 55 state and local agencies

administering 18 environmental laws.

But Koepf called the project "one of the most devastating environmental and economic projects that's ever occurred in Northwest California."

The former fisherman and Green Beret said the value of minerals planned for extraction — cobalt, chromium and nickel — has declined in recent years and the project is really an attempt by British and Canadian owners to increase the value of the company's stock.

"This particular bill greased the wheels for Cal Nickel's propaganda," said Koepf. "I predict the Cal Nickel project will never take place — will never produce one job."

Frequently throughout the evening Koepf referred to special interests and big money campaigning, both of which he has previously attempted to link to Bosco.

"I don't think we should send a special interest candidate to Washington D.C.," he said. "I think we should try something new."

In answer to a question about previous political experience, Koepf said he is the "non-professional politician, non-attorney candidate" in the race.

But it was Bosco who leveled the most pointed comments of the evening, virtually all aimed at Reagan

and the man he hopes to face in November, 20-year incumbent Clausen.

The Occidental Assemblyman noted government is facing the possibility of cuts in social programs at the same time Reagan is advocating \$1.5 trillion in defense spending over the next five years.

"There's no doubt in my mind

that \$1.5 trillion could go a long way toward easing the burden on people in this country," he said.

Bosco said he doubts that Congress will approve the president's defense proposals.

"No one took it seriously even from the beginning, except Don Clausen, who was one of the first

ones to come out and say he favors President Reagan's budget this year," he said.

The Assembly Democratic Caucus chairman said Reagan had promised to be a "record breaking president" and had made good on his vow. He said that more Americans are now unemployed than any time since 1933, that the \$48 billion first quarter federal deficit is the largest in the country's history, that farm income is the lowest it's been since 1932, that last year's 18.6 percent mortgage interest rate was the highest in history, that 1981's 1.8 million housing starts are the lowest since 1946 and that last year's 17,013 bankruptcies are the most since 1933.

"I think the Republicans have a lot of records they can run on and we're ready to take them on," he said.

Bosco, who has made opposition to utility rate increases his hallmark in the Legislature, accused Clausen of voting for three bills that have increased California utility users' bills and said a bill Clausen recently co-sponsored with the intent of limiting offshore disposal of nuclear wastes would actually do just the opposite.

## Candidates' TV debate unlikely

Congressional candidate Douglas Bosco has sidestepped a request by his Democratic primary opponent for a televised debate, saying he will participate only if Republican incumbent Don Clausen also joins the fray.

The debate challenge, a perennial tactic of political underdogs, was issued several weeks ago by Elk author Mike Koepf, who also is seeking the Democratic congressional nomination.

Koepf said that Bosco had not answered written requests for a debate and calls to his office produced answers that were "circumlocutive and supercilious."

"Bosco is making himself scarcer than a groundhog that has seen his own shadow," said Koepf. "I think Bosco is trying to pretend that I do not exist as his opponent in the June primary."

Such tactics also are not uncommon among campaign frontrunners. But Bosco, an Occidental Assemblyman, told The Press Democrat he is willing to debate Koepf if the proper forum presents itself.

"I've always been willing to debate any of my opponents," he said. "I feel, though, that we should debate in front of community groups who sponsor candidates' nights. I don't think it's to our advantage to just set them up."

Bosco said he would meet Koepf in traditional forums such as League of Women Voters candidates nights, and Saturday both men appeared at a forum sponsored by the Sierra Club. But the assemblyman said he would not be part of a debate set up specifically for television unless Clausen, who is running unopposed in the Republican primary, also participated.

To debate without Clausen, said Bosco, would be to allow the incumbent to demand equal air time under federal fairness doctrine.

Clausen was unavailable for comment Friday, but it is highly unlikely he would participate in a debate with opponents. The incumbent has historically avoided face-to-face exchanges, and Press Democrat files show only two instances in 20 years of campaigning where Clausen has met an opponent in a public forum.

It also was unclear Friday whether a debate by opponents of one party would require a television station to provide equal time to those running in another primary.

Koepf said he takes Bosco's response as "an affront."

"I think the voters want to see what the character is behind the name and where the candidate stands on the issues," he said. "I don't intend to hide out in Elk."

## Bosco, Koepf in accord on issues

A Sierra Club roundtable dialogue Saturday brought together the two Democrat candidates for California's Second Congressional seat, Assemblyman Doug Bosco and North Coast fisherman and novelist Mike Koepf.

Each wants a chance to unseat Rep. Don M. Clausen, Crescent City, longtime Republican incumbent.

Before an environmentalist group, however, they exhibited few differences on the issues. Both came out for sustaining agricultural lands and protecting wildlife, preserving resources, and developing alternative energy sources. They came out for the Bilateral Nuclear Weapons Freeze, controlled growth and jobs as if they were apple pie and The American Way.

Both viewed with alarm the Peripheral Canal, the "monopolistic" policies and power of Pacific Gas & Electric Company, and legislators' bowing to special interests.

They differed on the proposed Cal-Nickel Project, a \$250 million strip mining and ore processing operation to be built on Gasquet Mountain near the Smith River in Del Norte County. Bosco considers the environmental controls adequate, arranged to have a tributary excluded from the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act prohibitions on dams, and sees the 450 additional jobs as a boon to the North Coast where 28 percent of workers are unemployed.

Koepf is "totally opposed to this high stakes, international rip-off" and wants to keep the Smith River "as clear as \$12 vodka." Accepting the project, he said, would not only set a bad precedent jeopardizing other river systems but "benefit Canadian, British and possibly South African money groups."

He sees a dangerous precedent in allowing a smelter that he believes can produce acid rain in spawning areas of salmon and other anadromous fish.

Bosco detailed his fight in the Assembly to preserve agricultural lands, saying he's end-run around the opposition — Contra corporate farmers, realtors, construction and some other farmers — by pushing for self-financed elections to shortcircuit their campaign contributions.

He drew the scorn of some wildlife preservationists for legislation he sponsored allowing and hunting of predators on public lands.

Bosco and Koepf appeared with Assembly candidates for the Assembly seat Bosco is Democrat Dan Hauser and Republican Patrain, both of Arcata.

Sierra Club officer Bill Irwin said that table participants were invited selectively. Invited were Clausen and Dave Redick, a Democrat candidate for the congressional seat, and assembly candidates Scott Keene, Democrat, Wayne Bass, Republican, or Leota Goulet, Republican, Assembly Member.

The following response to the complaint in the above referenced matter is being submitted in behalf of Douglas H. Bosco, Bosco for Congress Committee, Clayton E. Clement, Committee to Elect Douglas Bosco, and Sharon Usher.

The complaint's allegations that a number of expenditures were made "in furtherance of Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for congress which were not reported on the pre-primary report filed . . . (for) the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982" are unsupported by the facts contained in the complaint and are based upon erroneous conclusions.

Assemblyman Bosco did not actively campaign in the primary election except for a single event in the City of Sonoma which was reported in the newspaper articles attached to the complaint. He was invited to participate in this event along with his primary opponent Mike Koepf, by the Sonoma Democratic Club which solely sponsored the event. Mr. Bosco attended the event on his way home from Sacramento on a Thursday evening and did not make any expenditures or incur any expenses.

As chairman of the Assembly Democratic Caucus, Assemblyman Bosco is required and expected to travel extensively to assist other candidates and attend events in and out of his own district. In addition, he has kept a full schedule of speaking engagements and

appearances within his district in connection with his office. These do not constitute campaign appearances and Mr. Bosco did not use any of these appearances to campaign for the Congressional race or to criticize his opponent.

California law allows any member of the legislature to use campaign funds for any expenses incurred while conducting official business or campaigning for another candidate. All expenditures incurred during the period from January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 were authorized under California law and properly incurred in connection with Mr. Bosco's official capacity as State Assemblyman. Thus the allegation in the complaint that Bosco "was not a candidate for State office" is irrelevant and misleading. The complaint fails to show any improper or unreported federal campaign expenditures.

The poll referred to in the complaint was taken to determine public opinion on a variety of current issues and also included popularity ratings of a number of public officials including Assemblyman Bosco, Senator Keene, Speaker Willie Brown, Senator Kennedy, Congressman Clausen and Governor Brown. It was taken at a time when he was not a candidate for Congress and when the Bosco for Congress committee did not exist. It was an authorized and appropriate use of State campaign funds under California law and was properly reported as shown by the exhibits submitted with the complaint.

The allegations in the complaint regarding the telephone service also jump to an unsupported conclusion. Under the funding and auspices of the State Democratic Party, the Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee shares office space in the Bosco for Congress Headquarters. The Sonoma County Democratic Central Committee conducts a countywide voter registration drive, and the telephone service was initially installed in connection with this voter registration drive. The state Committee to Elect Douglas Bosco contributed campaign funds to assist in this drive and properly reported the expenditure. This was not a part of the Bosco for Congress campaign and it was an authorized and appropriate use of campaign funds under California law. When the Bosco for Congress Committee began to use the telephones, the expenditures were properly reported in F.E.C. filings.



The following response to the complaint in the above referenced matter is being submitted in behalf of Douglas H. Bosco, Bosco for Congress Committee, Clayton E. Clement, Committee to Elect Douglas Bosco, and Sharon Usher.

The complaint's allegations that a number of expenditures were made "in furtherance of Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for congress which were not reported on the pre-primary report filed . . . (for) the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982" are unsupported by the facts contained in the complaint and are based upon erroneous conclusions.

Assemblyman Bosco did not actively campaign in the primary election except for a single event in the City of Sonoma which was reported in the newspaper articles attached to the complaint. He was invited to participate in this event along with his primary opponent Mike Koepf, by the Sonoma Democratic Club which solely sponsored the event. Mr. Bosco attended the event on his way home from Sacramento on a Thursday evening and did not make any expenditures or incur any expenses.

As chairman of the Assembly Democratic Caucus, Assemblyman Bosco is required and expected to travel extensively to assist other candidates and attend events in and out of his own district. In addition, he has kept a full schedule of speaking engagements and

appearances within his district in connection with his office. These do not constitute campaign appearances and Mr. Bosco did not use any of these appearances to campaign for the Congressional race or to criticize his opponent.

California law allows any member of the legislature to use campaign funds for any expenses incurred while conducting official business or campaigning for another candidate. All expenditures incurred during the period from January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 were authorized under California law and properly incurred in connection with Mr. Bosco's official capacity as State Assemblyman. Thus the allegation in the complaint that Bosco "was not a candidate for State office" is irrelevant and misleading. The complaint fails to show any improper or unreported federal campaign expenditures.

FAILURE TO REPORT EXPENDITURES MADE

Based on the information contained in the campaign disclosure reports filed pursuant to Federal and California law by the Bosco for Congress Committee and the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, complainant believes that a number of expenditures were made in furtherance of Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for Congress which were not reported on the pre-primary report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee covering the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982 (Exhibit A). These expenditures were made by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco, a California political committee controlled by Assemblyman Bosco, which is registered and files periodic campaign statements pursuant to the California Political Reform Act of 1974, as amended. This committee was established in 1978 to support Assemblyman Bosco's candidacy for the California State Assembly. While the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has made contributions to other California state candidates in a few isolated instances, the committee's primary purpose has been to support Assemblyman Bosco in his campaigns for the State Assembly.

A number of payments were reported on the California campaign statement filed by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco for the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982, which appear

to have been made in connection with Assemblyman Bosco's Congressional campaign (Exhibit B). These payments include the following:

Assemblyman Bosco made numerous public appearances during the period January 1st through May 22nd as a candidate for Congress. Some of these appearances are documented in the attached newspapers articles (Exhibit C). No travel expenses were itemized on the campaign report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982. However, as outlined above, Assemblyman Bosco's state committee paid over \$7,000.00 for travel and lodging expenses during a period when Assemblyman Bosco was not a candidate for State office.

Moreover, according to the California campaign statement filed by the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco a poll was paid for during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982. Douglas Bosco has been a member of the California Assembly for

four years. In 1980, Assemblyman Bosco was unopposed in the primary election and lacked significant opposition in the general election. It is reasonable to conclude that this poll was conducted to assist Assemblyman Bosco in deciding whether he should run for Congress rather than to evaluate his chances for reelection to the State Assembly.

The report filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982, disclosed that the Committee rented an office to serve as a campaign headquarters. There were no itemized expenditures for telephone installation or service during this period. However, during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made a payment to Pacific Telephone in the amount of \$526.00, despite the fact that it had no campaign headquarters during this period.

Based on the information contained in the Federal and California campaign disclosure reports, I believe and herein allege that the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made payments for travel, lodging, polling and telephone service which were in kind contributions to the Bosco for Congress Committee. These in kind contributions were not disclosed on the Report of Receipts and Disbursements filed by the Bosco for Congress Committee for the period April 1, 1982 through May 19, 1982 as required pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §434(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. §104.13.

USE OF CORPORATE AND UNION FUNDS  
IN CONNECTION WITH A FEDERAL ELECTION

The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco is a California political committee which lawfully solicits and accepts corporate and union contributions for use in connection with California state and local elections. A review of the two most recent California campaign disclosure statements filed by this committee covering the periods July 1, 1981 through December 31, 1981 (Exhibit D) and January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982 (Exhibit B) and a "late contribution report" filed on June 1, 1982 (Exhibit E) reveal that the majority of the Committee's Contributors are corporations, unions or other political committees which solicit and accept corporate and union funds. As outlined above, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco disclosed on its most recent California campaign statement that it paid for travel, lodging, telephone and polling expenses during the period January 1, 1982 through May 22, 1982, which complainant believes to have been used by Assemblyman Bosco in connection with his campaign for Congress. These inkind contributions were made with funds which had been received from corporations and labor unions in violation of 2 U.S.C. §441b and 11 C.F.R. 114.2(b).

Based on the information disclosed in the Federal and California campaign reports discussed above, complainant believes the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco made inkind contributions to the Bosco for Congress Committee exceeding \$10,000.00 in value. Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, a political committee is defined as any committee or other group of persons which receives contributions in excess of \$1,000.00 during a calendar year or which make expenditures aggregating in excess of \$1,000 in a calendar year. (2 U.S.C. §431(4)(A) and 11 C.F.R. §100.5(a)). By making contributions to a federal candidate's principal campaign committee in excess of \$1,000.00 during calendar year 1982, the Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has qualified as a political committee under the Act. The Committee to Elect Douglas H. Bosco has failed to register and file reports as required by 2 U.S.C. §433(a) and 2 U.S.C. §434.



# Koepf vs. Bosco, Bosco vs. Clausen and Reagan

Assemblyman Doug Bosco and author Mike Koepf met in Sonoma Thursday to mix it up over the Democratic congressional nomination but at least half the punches thrown were aimed at two men who weren't there

Bosco — clearly looking ahead to the November general election — made President Ronald Reagan and incumbent Rep. Don Clausen the primary targets of his comments during an hour-long exchange before the Sonoma Valley Democratic Club.

Meanwhile, Koepf peppered his remarks with references to the evils of special interest influence, an issue he has attempted to press against Bosco in earlier campaigning.

The sharpest disagreement between the two candidates came over the Cal Nickel mine in Del Norte County, a project made possible by Bosco's bill exempting a tributary of the Smith River from the state Wild and Scenic Rivers Act.

Bosco told the small gathering at Sonoma's First Congregational Church that the project would create 1,000 jobs and bring millions of dollars into an area of 30 percent unemployment. Environmental safeguards, he said, would be provided by 55 state and local agencies

administering 18 environmental laws.

But Koepf called the project "one of the most devastating environmental and economic projects that's ever occurred in Northwest California."

The former fisherman and Green Beret said the value of minerals planned for extraction — cobalt, chromium and nickel — has declined in recent years and the project is really an attempt by British and Canadian owners to increase the value of the company's stock.

This particular bill greased the wheels for Cal Nickel's propaganda," said Koepf. "I predict the Cal Nickel project will never take place — will never produce one job."

Frequently throughout the evening Koepf referred to special interests and big money campaigning, both of which he has previously attempted to link to Bosco.

"I don't think we should send a special interest candidate to Washington D.C.," he said. "I think we should try something new."

In answer to a question about previous political experience, Koepf said he is the "non-professional politician, non-attorney candidate" in the race.

But it was Bosco who leveled the most pointed comments of the evening, virtually all aimed at Reagan

and the man he hopes to face in November, 20-year incumbent Clausen.

The Occidental Assemblyman noted government is facing the possibility of cuts in social programs at the same time Reagan is advocating \$1.5 trillion in defense spending over the next five years.

"There's no doubt in my mind

that \$1.5 trillion could go a long way toward easing the burden on people in this country," he said.

Bosco said he doubts that Congress will approve the president's defense proposals.

"No one took it seriously even from the beginning, except Don Clausen, who was one of the first

ones to come out and say he favors President Reagan's budget this year," he said.

The Assembly Democratic Caucus chairman said Reagan had promised to be a "record breaking president" and had made good on his vow. He said that more Americans are now unemployed than any time since 1938, that the \$48 billion first quarter federal deficit is the largest in the country's history, that farm income is the lowest it's been since 1932, that last year's 18.6 percent mortgage interest rate was the highest in history, that 1981's 1.8 million housing starts are the lowest since 1946 and that last year's 17,043 bankruptcies are the most since 1933.

"I think the Republicans have a lot of records they can run on and we're ready to take them on," he said.

Bosco, who has made opposition to utility rate increases his hallmark in the Legislature, accused Clausen of voting for three bills that have increased California utility users' bills and said a bill Clausen recently co-sponsored with the intent of limiting offshore disposal of nuclear wastes would actually do just the opposite.

"That bill if read carefully, will actually tend to liberalize the dumping of wastes and will be antitheti-

cal to our interests in the said.

And, he said, Clausen that he did not understand implications of the continuing tax deduction congressmen were hard-

"In fact, he voted times," Bosco said.

The two-term Assemblyman said the group Clausen has introduced for a second bill which retroactive to last year's third bill which made changes to allow time the first two.

"The Congress clearly shows that the decision on the House floor were voting on," said Bosco. "I can say if you vote on these times and don't know voting on then you've been in Congress."

On the issue of utility rate increases, Bosco said he would have increased benefits and reduced Congressional on the system as an incentive to salvage the troubled system.

Both candidates oppose inheritance tax. "I oppose all that because I think it's enough," said Koepf.

# Candidates' TV debate unlikely

Congressional candidate Douglas Bosco has sidestepped a request by his Democratic primary opponent for a televised debate, saying he will participate only if Republican incumbent Don Clausen also joins the fray.

The debate challenge, a perennial tactic of political underdogs, was issued several weeks ago by Elk author Mike Koepf, who also is seeking the Democratic congressional nomination.

Koepf said that Bosco had not answered written requests for a debate and calls to his office produced answers that were "circumlocutive and supercilious."

"Bosco is making himself scarcer than a groundhog that has seen his own shadow," said Koepf. "I think Bosco is trying to pretend that I do not exist as his opponent in the June primary."

Such tactics also are not uncommon among campaign frontrunners. But Bosco, an Occidental Assemblyman, told The Press Democrat he is willing to debate Koepf if the proper forum presents itself.

"I've always been willing to debate any of my opponents," he said. "I feel, though, that we should debate in front of community groups who sponsor candidates' nights. I don't think it's to our advantage to just set them up."

Bosco said he would meet Koepf in traditional forums such as League of Women Voters candidates nights, and Saturday both men appeared at a forum sponsored by the Sierra Club. But the assemblyman said he would not be part of a debate set up specifically for television unless Clausen, who is running unopposed in the Republican primary, also participated.

To debate without Clausen, said Bosco, would be to allow the incumbent to demand equal air time under federal fairness doctrine.

Clausen was unavailable for comment Friday, but it is highly unlikely he would participate in a debate with opponents. The incumbent has historically avoided face-to-face exchanges, and Press Democrat files show only two instances in 20 years of campaigning where Clausen has met an opponent in a public forum.

It also was unclear Friday whether a debate by opponents of one party would require a television station to provide equal time to those running in another primary.

Koepf said he takes Bosco's response as "an affront."

"I think the voters want to see what the character is behind the name and where the candidate stands on the issues," he said. "I don't intend to hide out in Elk."

# Bosco, Koepf in accord on issues

A Sierra Club roundtable dialogue Saturday brought together the two Democrat candidates for California's Second Congressional seat, Assemblyman Doug Bosco and North Coast fisherman and novelist Mike Koepf.

Each wants a chance to unseat Rep. Don M. Clausen, Crescent City, longtime Republican incumbent.

Before an environmentalist group, however, they exhibited few differences on the issues. Both came out for sustaining agricultural lands and protecting wildlife, preserving resources, and developing alternative energy sources. They came out for the Bilateral Nuclear Weapons Freeze, controlled growth and jobs as if they were apple pie and The American Way.

Both viewed with alarm the Peripheral Canal, the "monopolistic" policies and power of Pacific Gas & Electric Company, and legislators' bowing to special interests.

They differed on the proposed Cal-Nickel Project, a \$250 million strip mining and ore processing operation to be built on Gasquet Mountain near the Smith River in Del Norte County. Bosco considers the environmental controls adequate, arranged to have a tributary excluded from the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act prohibitions on dams, and sees the 450 additional jobs as a boon to the North Coast where 28 percent of workers are unemployed.

Koepf is "totally opposed to this high stakes, international rip-off" and wants to keep the Smith River "as clear as \$12 vodka." Accepting the project, he said, would not only set a bad precedent jeopardizing other river systems but "benefit Canadian, British and possibly South African money groups."

He sees a dangerous precedent in allowing a smelter that he believes can produce acid rain in spawning areas of salmon and other anadromous fish.

Bosco detailed his fight in the Ass preserve agricultural lands, saying he's end-run around the opposition — Central corporate farmers, realtors, construction and some other farmers — by pushing fully financed elections to shortcircuit their campaign contributions.

He drew the scorn of some wildlife preservationists for legislation he sponsored allowing and hunting of predators on public lands.

Bosco and Koepf appeared with television for the Assembly seat. Bosco is Democrat Dan Hauser and Republican Pat Partain, both of Arcata.
