

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Barbara Pollei, campaign manager for Thomas E. Petri (6/WI). An investigation was conducted, and reason to believe was found that The Friends of Loehr Committee (Respondent) violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) (2) by broadcasting radio ads which did not state that such ads were paid by the Association of State, County and Municipal Employees; Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality on behalf of the Loehr Committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (4) (A) (i).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this Agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent was the principal campaign committee for Gordon E. Loehr, 1982 candidate for the U.S. House

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of Representatives from the Sixth Congressional District of Wisconsin.

2. Respondent authorized production and broadcast of a series of radio advertisements clearly advocating the election of candidate Gordon E. Loehr. Such ads were scheduled and aired prior to the primary election.

3. The radio advertisements in 2, above, were authorized by Respondent and paid by the AFSCME - PEOPLE. Payments for the ads totaled \$4,287.56.

4. The subject radio advertisements did not contain a statement that they were authorized by the Respondent committee, but paid for by other persons (i.e., AFSCME - PEOPLE).

V. Respondent failed to include the required authorization and payment statement in the advertisements in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) (2).

VI. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (5) (A).

VII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a) (1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement


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or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.





CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by a signed, sworn, and notarized complaint by Barbara Pollei, campaign manager for Thomas E. Petri (6/WI). An investigation was conducted, and reason to believe was found that AFSCME - PEOPLE (Respondent) violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) by making expenditures expressly advocating the election of candidate Gordon E. Loehr without stating in the communication that the ads were authorized by the Friends of Loehr Committee, but paid for by AFSCME - PEOPLE.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C.

§ 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this Agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent, AFSCME - PEOPLE, is a political committee registered with the FEC.

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2. During the 1982 primary election, Respondent paid for production costs and broadcast time for a series of radio advertisements in support of congressional candidate Gordon E. Loehr (6/WI).

3. The radio advertisements in 2, above, were authorized by the Friends of Loehr Committee and paid for by Respondent. Payments for the ads totaled \$4,287.56.

4. The subject radio advertisements did not contain a statement explaining that they were authorized by the candidate's principal campaign committee, but paid for by other persons (i.e., Respondent).

V. Respondent failed to include the required authorization and payment statement in the advertisements in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2).

VI. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement

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

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. ALLEGATIONS

The Friends of Loehr Committee ("the Loehr Committee") and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees; P.E.O.P.L.E. violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) by broadcasting radio advertisements which did not state that such ads were paid by P.E.O.P.L.E. on behalf of the Loehr Committee.

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

According to a complaint filed on October 8, 1982, by Barbara Pollei, campaign manager for Thomas E. Petri, the Loehr Committee ran a series of radio ads which were paid for by P.E.O.P.L.E. Complainant submitted an affidavit from a radio station vice president along with copies of advertising contracts and tapes of the aired ads to support the allegation that a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) occurred when the AFSCME committee paid for Loehr's advertisements without stating so in the radio spots. The two advertising contracts, dated September 7 and 9, 1982, which were supplied with the complaint,

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document advertising totaling \$1,795.70 apparently paid by AFSCME.

On November 1, 1982, counsel for the Friends of Gordon E. Loehr Committee responded to the complaint with copies of the Loehr Committee's 1982 October 15 Quarterly Report covering the period in question, August 26, 1982 through September 30, 1982. The Loehr Committee reported an in-kind gift from AFSCME for "radio advertising" totaling \$3,755.45. On its September Monthly report, AFSCME's national committee, P.E.O.P.L.E., reported disbursements to several radio stations for "in-kind radio time" on behalf of Gordon E. Loehr. P.E.O.P.L.E.'s report indicates that it purchased radio time for the Loehr Committee totaling \$2,849.75 for the period and \$3,445.45 for the election.

In its response to notification of the complaint, dated January 10, 1983, P.E.O.P.L.E. explains that it made in-kind contributions rather than direct contributions because its check would not have cleared in time to have the ads run prior to the election. P.E.O.P.L.E. states that, "those responsible for placing the ads either were not aware that the advertisements did not contain an appropriate disclaimer or failed to consider the implications of the combination of the purchase of this radio time by P.E.O.P.L.E. and the disclaimer which was contained in the ads."

P.E.O.P.L.E.'s response to the complaint concedes that omitting the appropriate disclaimer may constitute a "technical" violation of the Act, but the statement offers several factors

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which may mitigate the seriousness of the violation.

P.E.O.P.L.E. asserts that the "violation was merely an oversight" which did not occur in other campaigns which P.E.O.P.L.E. supported. P.E.O.P.L.E. states that no deception was involved concerning its contributions as the advertising agreements stated the source of payment. P.E.O.P.L.E. also attests that its staff is now "fully aware of the Act's requirements" so that similar problems will not recur.

III. LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) states that whenever any person makes an expenditure financing communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, such communication, if paid for but authorized by a candidate, an authorized political committee, or its agents, shall clearly state that the communication is paid for by such other persons and authorized by the authorized political committee.

The Loehr Committee treasurer indicated in a telephone conversation that the Loehr Committee authorized AFSCME's purchase of the radio advertising time. Both committees reported the in-kind contributions. Clearly, the communication should have stated P.E.O.P.L.E.'s payment and the Loehr Committee's authorization in accordance with the statute. 1/

1/ If P.E.O.P.L.E. paid for any production costs of the ads, such payment should have been noted in the ad. AO 1980-70. However, P.E.O.P.L.E.'s statement indicates that its in-kind contribution was limited to air time only.

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Therefore, the Office of General Counsel recommends findings of reason to believe against the Loehr Committee and P.E.O.P.L.E. for violations of 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) (2).

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find reason to believe that the Friends of Gordon E. Loehr Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) (2).
2. Find reason to believe that the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees; P.E.O.P.L.E. Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a) (2).
3. Approve attached letters.



Our client, Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality (PEOPLE), a political committee affiliated with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) has asked us to respond to the complaint in the above-captioned matter.

As we understand it, the complaint alleges that a violation of 2 USC Section 441d and Section 110.11 of the Commission's regulations occurred in connection with certain radio advertisements placed for the congressional campaign of Gordon E. Loehr in the Sixth Congressional District in Wisconsin. Specifically, the complaint alleges that radio advertisements for Gordon Loehr were broadcast on three radio stations, KFIZ, WYTL, and WOSH and that the ads stated that they were "paid for by the friends of Gordon E. Loehr, John Dewane, Treasurer" although they were in fact paid for by AFSCME. Our client has just completed its internal investigation of these allegations, and has determined that there may in fact have been a technical violation of the provisions of the Act.

Just a few days before the September 14, 1982 primary in this congressional district, a decision was made by PEOPLE to assist the campaign of Gordon Loehr by financing the cost of broadcasting radio advertisements on several stations in the Sixth Congressional District. While this support would normally

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have been given through a contribution made directly to the candidate's campaign committee, there was apparently concern among the staff of the PEOPLE Committee that such a check would not clear in time for the advertising to be placed prior to the primary. For this reason, the checks to purchase the radio time were made payable directly to the radio stations in question. The advertisements in questions closed with the statement that they were "paid for by the friends of Gordon E. Loehr, John Dewane, Treasurer." Apparently, those responsible for placing the ads either were not aware that the advertisements did not contain an appropriate disclaimer or failed to consider the implications of the combination of the purchase of this radio time by PEOPLE and the disclaimer which was contained in the ads. In the course of its internal investigation, respondent also discovered that similar purchases of radio advertising time had been made in connection with this campaign at four other radio stations not referred to in the complaint. All of these expenditures were properly reported as in-kind contributions by respondent in its September report to the Commission.

While respondent concedes that the above actions may constitute a technical violation of the Act, respondent believes that no further compliance action by the Commission is required for the following reasons:


1. The violation was merely an oversight which occurred due to the urgency of the situation;
2. There was no intent to deceive the listening public, in fact, if one examines the "AGREEMENT FORM FOR POLITICAL BROADCASTS" for purchase of advertising on stations WYTL and WOSH attached to the complaint, the form itself states that the broadcast time was paid for by AFSCME, the organization with which PEOPLE is affiliated;*
3. While PEOPLE was actively involved in dozens of other races, we can find no other situation in which a similar mistake was made;

* In fact, this broadcast time was paid for by PEOPLE, not AFSCME.

4. Although substantial in-kind contributions were made by PEOPLE to the Loehr campaign, the Act's contribution limitations were not exceeded; and
5. This problem will not recur, since respondent's political staff is now fully aware of the Act's requirements and has also been made aware of ways of transferring funds to avoid problems related to clearance of checks.

While respondent regrets its error in this matter, for the reasons set forth above we urge the Commission to close this matter without further action. The undersigned is available to meet with appropriate members of the General Counsel's staff to discuss this matter further if that would be helpful.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Friends for Loehr Committee ("the Loehr Committee")
violated 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)(1)(iv)
by broadcasting radio advertisements which did not state that
such ads were paid for by another political committee.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

On October 8, 1982, the Office of General Counsel received a
complaint filed by Barbara Pollei, campaign manager for Thomas E.
Petri, against the Friends for Loehr Committee, campaign
committee for Gordon E. Loehr. Both Mr. Petri and Mr. Loehr were
candidates for Congress from Wisconsin's Sixth District.

The complaint alleges that the Friends for Loehr Committee
violated 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)(1)(iv) by running radio


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advertisements which did not state that such ads were paid for by another political committee. The complaint mentions that the ads were paid for by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), but does not name the union as a respondent.

Our expedited report to the Commission noted that we would defer notification of AFSCME's involvement in the complaint until it was clear which of its union locals or national political committees may have purchased the ads on behalf of the Loehr Committee and until we could determine the applicable violations. 1/ Since that time, the Loehr Committee responded to the complaint notice and the in-kind expenditures in question appeared on reports filed by the Loehr Committee and by the National Committee of AFSCME - P.E.O.P.L.E.

Because the complaint mentions AFSCME, we would offer its P.E.O.P.L.E. committee the opportunity to respond to the complaint prior to recommending reason to believe. We expect to make the appropriate recommendations when AFSCME - P.E.O.P.L.E. responds to receipt of the complaint.

Our client, Public Employees Organized to Promote Legislative Equality (PEOPLE), a political committee affiliated with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) has asked us to respond to the complaint in the above-captioned matter.

As we understand it, the complaint alleges that a violation of 2 USC Section 441d and Section 110.11 of the Commission's regulations occurred in connection with certain radio advertisements placed for the congressional campaign of Gordon E. Loehr in the Sixth Congressional District in Wisconsin. Specifically, the complaint alleges that radio advertisements for Gordon Loehr were broadcast on three radio stations, KFIZ, WYTL, and WOSH and that the ads stated that they were "paid for by the friends of Gordon E. Loehr, John Dewane, Treasurer" although they were in fact paid for by AFSCME. Our client has just completed its internal investigation of these allegations, and has determined that there may in fact have been a technical violation of the provisions of the Act.

Just a few days before the September 14, 1982 primary in this congressional district, a decision was made by PEOPLE to assist the campaign of Gordon Loehr by financing the cost of broadcasting radio advertisements on several stations in the Sixth Congressional District. While this support would normally

have been given through a contribution made directly to the candidate's campaign committee, there was apparently concern among the staff of the PEOPLE Committee that such a check would not clear in time for the advertising to be placed prior to the primary. For this reason, the checks to purchase the radio time were made payable directly to the radio stations in question. The advertisements in questions closed with the statement that they were "paid for by the friends of Gordon E. Loehr, John Dewane, Treasurer." Apparently, those responsible for placing the ads either were not aware that the advertisements did not contain an appropriate disclaimer or failed to consider the implications of the combination of the purchase of this radio time by PEOPLE and the disclaimer which was contained in the ads. In the course of its internal investigation, respondent also discovered that similar purchases of radio advertising time had been made in connection with this campaign at four other radio stations not referred to in the complaint. All of these expenditures were properly reported as in-kind contributions by respondent in its September report to the Commission.

While respondent concedes that the above actions may constitute a technical violation of the Act, respondent believes that no further compliance action by the Commission is required for the following reasons:

1. The violation was merely an oversight which occurred due to the urgency of the situation;
2. There was no intent to deceive the listening public, in fact, if one examines the "AGREEMENT FORM FOR POLITICAL BROADCASTS" for purchase of advertising on stations WYTL and WOSH attached to the complaint, the form itself states that the broadcast time was paid for by AFSCME, the organization with which PEOPLE is affiliated;*
3. While PEOPLE was actively involved in dozens of other races, we can find no other situation in which a similar mistake was made;



4. Although substantial in-kind contributions were made by PEOPLE to the Loehr campaign, the Act's contribution limitations were not exceeded; and
5. This problem will not recur, since respondent's political staff is now fully aware of the Act's requirements and has also been made aware of ways of transferring funds to avoid problems related to clearance of checks.

While respondent regrets its error in this matter, for the reasons set forth above we urge the Commission to close this matter without further action. The undersigned is available to meet with appropriate members of the General Counsel's staff to discuss this matter further if that would be helpful.

On October 8, 1982, the Office of General Counsel received a complaint filed by Barbara Pollei, campaign manager for Thomas E. Petri, against the Friends for Loehr Committee, campaign committee for Gordon E. Loehr. Both Mr. Petri and Mr. Loehr are candidates for Congress from Wisconsin's Sixth District.

The complaint alleges that the Friends for Loehr Committee violated 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)(1)(iv) by running radio advertisements which did not state that such ads were paid for by another political committee.

The complainant submitted an affidavit from a radio station vice president along with copies of advertising contracts and tapes of the aired ads to support the allegation that the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) committee paid for Loehr's advertisements without stating so in the radio spots.

The issue raised concerning 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a)(1)(iv) may not pose complex legal questions; however, this matter cannot be resolved without further investigation and consideration of a response from the Friends of Gordon Loehr. 1/ On October 13, 1982, this Office





These radio advertisements were placed in violation of Chapter 1 of the Federal Election Commission Regulations, Section 110.11, and this complaint is filed pursuant to Section 111.4 of Chapter 1 of the Federal Election Commission Regulations. 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

It is my understanding that: If the time is to be used by the candidate himself within 45 days of a primary or primary runoff election, or within 60 days of a general or special election, the above charges represent the lowest unit charge of the station for the same class and amount of time for the same period; where the use is by a person or entity other than the candidate or is by the candidate but outside the aforementioned 45 or 60 day periods, the above charges do not exceed the charges made for comparable use of such station by other users.
