

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

This matter was generated as a result of a complaint filed by William Andersen against Bart Christensen (CA/27).

The complainant alleges that the Congress for Christensen Committee failed to report receipt of two contributions within 48 hours which his committee received less than twenty days before the primary election in accordance with 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

On November 1, 1982, G. Allan Kingston, chairman of the Committee, filed a response to the complaint. Kingston acknowledged the violation and stated that the two contributions were reported in the committee's next report because the officers were not aware of the 48 hour reporting obligation.

At the time these contributions were received, our "staff" consisted of only four of Bart's friends, all volunteers, none of whom had ever before been involved in a federal election campaign. We formed our Committee on May 13, 1982. None of us were aware of the 48 hour reporting requirement when the contributions in question were made a week later on May 21, 1982.

The July 15th filing reports that on May 21, 1982, the committee received a \$1,000 contribution from G. Allan Kingston and a loan of \$15,000 from the candidate. Since the California primary was held on June 8th, all contributions received between May 19 and June 6, 1982, should have been reported within 48 hours of receipt. Therefore, both of the contributions at issue here were reportable under 11 C.F.R. § 104.5.

While violations of 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5 have been committed, we do not believe that further action is warranted. Although not in a timely fashion, the contributions were reported prior to the filing of the complaint or notification by the Commission and substantial compliance has been achieved. Therefore, it is recommended that the Commission find reason to believe, take no further action and close the file.



As Mr. Andresen points out, a contribution of \$1000 and a loan from Bart Christensen were received by our Committee less than 20 days prior to the June 6th primary election. Both were reported at the next regular filing, although, unfortunately, we were not then aware that such contributions should be reported within 48 hours of receipt.

At the time these contributions were received, our "staff" consisted of only four of Bart's friends, all volunteers, none of whom had ever before been involved in a federal election campaign. We formed our Committee on May 13, 1982. None of us were aware of the 48 hours reporting requirement when the contributions in question were made a week later on May 21, 1982.

We hope that the fact that we reported these contributions at the next regular filing, and that we have fully complied with the reporting procedures for all subsequent contributions, will lead you to conclude that we have been in substantial compliance with the law.

Also, since this was a primary campaign, the contributions in question did not effect the campaign of Mr. Andresen's candidate, who was unopposed in the Democratic primary.

This matter was generated as the result of a complaint filed by William Anderson against Bart Christensen (27/CA).

The complainant alleges that the Congress for Christensen Committee failed to report receipt of two contributions which his Committee received less than twenty days before the primary election in accordance with 2 U.S.C. § 434(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5.

The two subject contributions were received on May 21, 1982, and were reported as such by the recipient Committee on its July 15 Quarterly Report. However, since the California primary was held on June 8th, all contributions received between May 19 and June 6, 1982, should have been reported within 48 hours of receipt pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 104.5.

It appears that the complainant's allegations will be sustained and we are therefore unable to terminate this matter without affording the respondent an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against him.



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

Dear Gentlemen:

It is my understanding that Section 104.5 of the Federal Elections Code requires that all contributions over \$1,000 received less than 20 days before an election shall be reported in writing within 48 hours to the Federal Elections Commission.

The July 15 filing of Bart Christensen, the Republican nominee in the 27th Congressional district in California shows that on May 21 he received a \$1,000 contribution from G. Allan Kingston and a loan of \$15,000 from himself. Our campaign staff has contacted the Commission and has been told that no records exist which would indicate that Mr. Christensen reported this contribution. The only disclosure of these contributions of which I am aware is contained in the July 16 filing of Mr. Christensen.

I would therefore like to formally request that this matter be investigated in order to determine whether, in fact, a violation of the federal election laws has occurred.


