GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. Status

On August 24, 1976, the Commission determined by a vote of 6-0 that there was reason to believe that a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, had been committed in the above-captioned matter. By letter of August 26, 1976, the Commission notified the respondent of this action, and consistent with my report to the Commission I requested that within ten days the respondent supply certain specific information (see attached letter).

No response has been received other than a request for an extension of time within which to answer. In view of the unresolved factual issues herein, I am recommending that a field investigation be commenced.

II. Issues

The central allegation in this matter is whether

an unreported \$20,000 expenditure to a group called Opinion Research Associates, Inc., was used at least in part to defray the cost of services rendered to respondent's Congressional campaign and, if so, the extent to which this expenditure involved corporate contributions.

III. Outline of Investigation

A. Evidence or Information Sought

1. The surveys, reports on the surveys and any other work performed by Opinion Research Association, Inc. in connection with the \$20,000 payment (August 1975) and similar information with respect to the March 1976 poll and an explanation as to the disparity of costs of the two polls.

2. The compensation received by Butcher and Forde directly or indirectly for their work done in conjunction with the August 1975 survey and the compensation received by them for comparable services in conjunction with other surveys.

3. Whether any corporate monies were used to pay Opinion Research and if so the amount and corporation involved.

4. Any agreements, including available copies, concerning the amount or manner of compensation to be received by Messrs. Butcher and Forde for their services

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to the Congressional campaign.

5. Whether there were any other expenditures made from the Badham Committees for the purpose of influencing his candidacy for Congress.

B. Resources



The above information could be obtained by a field investigation. Investigators would review the reports filed by the Badham Congressional Committee with the FEC; the reports of the Badham Fund; the Elect Badham '74 Fund and the Badham Committee filed with the State of California; and any candidate reports. The investigators also will examine pertinent records of the above candidate's committees. They would also obtain and review, if necessary, copies of corporate records of Opinion Research, Inc., which involve the allegations relating to the August 1975 survey.

They would, if necessary, interview the following:

Robert E. Badham, the respondent  
William Butcher, campaign worker  
Arnold Forde, campaign worker  
Donald L. McGrew, owner of Opinion Research, Inc.  
and other persons employed by Opinion Research  
having direct knowledge of the matters alleged  
in the complaints.

C. Personnel Requirements

We are advised by the Investigative Section of the Office of Compliance and Disclosure that the field investigation will require 3 staff members, and take approximately 7 days.

It is respectfully submitted that your Commission will never obtain by exchanges of correspondence information sufficient to enable it to make an intelligent determination in the referenced matter, and that there are important factual issues which can only be discovered upon oral examination of witnesses.

Two central issues raised in my complaints on file with your Commission are: Whether, by means of payments of funds having their origin in corporate gifts, Mr. Badham actually obtained the campaign management services of Mr. William Butcher and Mr. Arnold Forde instead of a poll pertaining to the concerns of his State of California office as Mr. Badham claims; and, whether Mr. Badham actually loaned his own personal funds to his campaign for the Republican nomination for Congress from the 40th California Congressional District.

Your Commission can be, and probably already has been, furnished a large number of ex parte denials of wrongdoing under the oath of Mr. Badham and others. With respect to the first of those two issues, even Mr. Butcher and Mr. Forde themselves might state the conclusion that they received none of the funds paid by Mr. Badham to Opinion Research, or that they rendered only polling services on Mr. Badham's behalf in exchange for funds

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they received from that firm; but, oral examination, however, might adduce facts which would require your Commission to reject that conclusion.

I am informed that Mr. Badham has stated that his decision to stand for Federal office had not been made at the time he ordered the Opinion Research poll; I can produce witnesses who, in response to process, at least, will testify that Mr. Badham had announced his intention to seek the 40th Congressional District Republican nomination several months before he ordered that poll.

Further, information necessary to determine the scope of the poll, or even whether the activities conducted were in the nature of a poll, can be obtained only by the questioning of live, percipient witnesses.

With respect to the second of those two issues, I am informed, and can produce witnesses who can testify, that Mr. Badham was without funds to lend his campaign, and without credit which would enable him to borrow such funds in usual commercial and financial channels. I am confident that by resort to hearings or depositions your Commission could readily obtain testimony indicating that loans were made to Mr. Badham by or with the assistance of persons who desired that Mr. Badham succeed in his attempt to obtain the Republican nomination for Representative from the 40th California Congressional District.

In view of the foregoing it is hereby respectfully requested that your Commission order hearings or depositions at which testimony of witnesses may be presented in the referenced matter.

Dear Mr. Chairman and Members:

This office represents the respondent in each of the above-referenced matters, Robert E. Badham.

By letter dated August 26, 1976, received on August 30, 1976, General Counsel John G. Murphy, Jr. communicated to me the request of the Commission to provide certain items of additional information, and requested that this information be submitted within ten days of the receipt of that letter, and be in the form of sworn affidavits.

On behalf of Mr. Badham, I am formally requesting an extension of time in which to provide the information requested, to September 22, 1976.

I submit that this request should be granted for four reasons, inter alia, as set forth further herein: (1) there is good cause for granting the request; (2) no prejudice will result from granting the request; (3) the lengthy delays by the Commission staff in prosecuting these matters in a timely manner thus far precludes the staff from objecting to this request; and (4) the Commission staff was timely notified of this request.

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(1.) There is good cause for the request because it was impossible to assemble the information requested within the ten days allotted, and it will not be possible to complete assembling that information and have the affidavits of the several witnesses that will be necessary completed and signed, until approximately September 20 or 21, 1976.

The Commission's letter was received by this office on Monday, August 30, 1976. It was necessary to discuss the matter with Mr. Badham to prepare the reply, since he was the only person known to me who had the necessary information, but Mr. Badham, who presently holds office as a California state assemblyman, was in Sacramento for the closing days of the current legislative session, and could not return to his district office and meet with me regarding this matter until Friday, September 3, 1976. We held a lengthy meeting on that day, in which it became apparent that considerably more time and work would be needed to assemble the information requested and prepare our response. The following week, however, included two legal holidays (Monday, September 6, Labor Day, and Thursday, September 9, Admission Day) on which I had other commitments. That left only two working days before the expiration of the ten-day period, but because of my court schedule and other commitments on those days I could not devote the substantial time needed to complete our response.

Mr. Badham will be in Washington, D.C., for the entire week of September 13-17, 1976, on a previously-scheduled trip that includes state legislative business and cannot be changed, and will therefore be unavailable to complete assembling the material requested by the Commission, to sign his affidavit, and to review the affidavits I will be preparing for other individuals.

Thus, the earliest this information could be assembled and completed will be the week of September 20, 1976.

I emphasize to the Commission that we still intend to be completely cooperative with the Commission and to provide whatever information is requested as relevant to the Commission's inquiry. I feel it necessary to provide the documentary evidence, explanatory and verifying affidavits, and written argument all at the same time, however, to

ensure that no one piece of evidence which, taken alone, might be subject to varying interpretations, be construed against us and a precipitous action be urged on the Commission by its staff, before the rest of our evidence is presented.

(2.) There will be no prejudice due to the additional time requested. The subject matter of the complaint concerns actions that were taken up to and during August, 1975, over a year ago. There is no allegation of ongoing violations, nor will there be any loss of evidence or other prejudice from any delay.

(3.) The lengthy delays in bringing this matter this far preclude the Commission staff from opposing this request on any grounds that timeliness is a factor at this point. My letter to the Commission of August 18, 1976 outlined the lengthy delays we have encountered in this matter. Briefly, these complaints were filed with the Commission on or about April 2, 1976, and May 25, 1976. (Conflicting statements by the Commission staff at various times have assigned different numbers to each of these complaints, so that it is not clear which complaint is being dealt with under which number, so they are not referred to herein by number.) Mr. Badham was first notified on June 4, 1976, that my complaint had been filed, but a copy of the complaint was not enclosed by the Commission, and was later sent in response to a prompt request by Mr. Badham and received on June 25, 1976. We timely responded with a lengthy written explanation of the factual background, and offered full cooperation to the Commission and its staff, including to voluntarily provide any additional information requested (by letter dated July 6, 1976). Various items of correspondence were subsequently received from the Commission staff, including, on July 9, a copy of a second complaint filed by one of the original two complainants, and on July 30, a notice and a copy, for the first time, of the complaint filed on or about April 2, 1976. All communications from the Commission to Mr. Badham were promptly and timely responded to.

Despite our prompt responses and offers of cooperation and additional information, upon request, the Commission staff did not request any more information, and did not present this matter to the Commission until late August, 1976, over four months and three months, respectively, since the complaints


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were filed with the Commission, and almost three months since the first notice to Mr. Badham from the Commission. There is no reason whatsoever for this lengthy delay, which is not due to any fault of Mr. Badham's, but is apparently due to nothing more than a lack of a sense of urgency on the part of the staff. Because of this lengthy delay by the staff, however, the staff cannot at this point be heard to oppose this request for additional time of less than two weeks, based on good cause, to provide additional information.

(4.) The Commission staff was timely notified of this request. When it became apparent to me on Tuesday, September 7, that the answers could not be prepared within the ten days allotted, I telephoned Commission attorney Andrew Athy, informed him it would not be possible to prepare our response within the ten days allotted, and asked for additional time to September 22, 1976, based on the reasons given in paragraph (1.), above. Mr. Athy told me the General Counsel's office would respond. On Thursday, September 9, Commission attorney David Spiegel called my office, which I learned of in checking for messages on that holiday, and when I returned his call that day, he denied my request for additional time to September 22, and offered only two or three days additional time. I informed him at that time that two or three days would not help, and that I would make this request to the Commission.

Conclusion. For the reasons given, I respectfully request that Mr. Badham be given until September 22, 1976, to provide to the Commission the information requested in its letter of August 26, 1976, that the Commission not take any further action before that time, and that at the time of the next Commission meeting at which these matters will be considered the Commission take into consideration any information provided by Mr. Badham on or before September 22, 1976.

Following is a description of the matters covered in a conversation with Darryl Wold, who is the counsel for respondent in the above numbered MURs:

1) Mr. Wold requested a two to three week extension of time to respond to the questions that we posed to him, as counsel for his client. I indicated that the Commission is under a duty to proceed expeditiously, and this was particularly true in this matter since it is now an investigation. I indicated that we might be able to agree to a delay of 2 to 3 days, but no more. Mr. Wold indicated that this was unacceptable.

2) Mr. Wold indicated that he was prepared to conciliate the matters at issue in the two MURs. In particular he indicated that Mr. Badham was prepared to report the \$20,000 spent for the poll as an expense related to his ongoing Federal Campaign and that he would repay corporate contributions that might have been involved in the \$20,000. However, Mr. Wold did not indicate the percentage of corporate contributions involved or how we will determine what this percentage was. I indicated to Mr. Wold that in view of the outstanding factual issues in the matter, particularly in the area of corporate contributions, we could not conciliate at this time. I also indicated that the conciliation phase of compliance matters occurred at the close of a Commission investigation and at this time the investigation was not closed.

3) Mr. Wold indicated that he was hesitant about supplying any more information to the Commission because of the fact that his client might eventually be subject to penalties under the Federal Election Campaign Laws.



Dear Mr. Wold:

This letter is sent to you in your capacity as counsel to Robert E. Badham, respondent in each of the above-captioned matters.

As we had previously indicated, in each of the above numbered matters under review, complainants had alleged that Mr. Badham had made a \$20,000 expenditure to a group called Opinion Research Associates, Inc., which was used in part to defray the cost of services rendered to his Federal Congressional campaign, but was unreported as such; in addition, complainants asserted that the expenditure to Opinion Research Associates, Inc., involved corporate money.

Based on the allegations set forth in the above numbered matters under review, the response to these complaints, and available reports, the Federal Election Commission has found that there is reason to believe that Mr. Badham has committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §§434 and 441b. In making this determination the Commission has also considered your letter and telegram of August 18, 1976.

Under the Act, Mr. Badham has an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against him. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter.

In particular, the Commission would appreciate it if you would supply the following information:

1. Please submit a copy of the surveys, the reports of the results of the surveys, and copies of



any other work performed by Opinion Research Associates, Inc., in connection with your \$20,000 payment. I would also appreciate if you would include an explanation as to the disparity between the costs of the August 1975 poll and the March 1976 poll.

2. Submit a statement of the compensation received by William Butcher and Arnold Forde directly or indirectly for their analysis of the August 1975 survey. Were any monies paid to Messrs. Butcher and Forde for the preparation of the survey?
3. Were there any corporate monies used to pay Opinion Research Associates, Inc.? If so, state the amount and corporations involved.
4. Please supply any agreements as to compensation received by Messrs. Butcher and Forde for their role in your campaign.

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

General Counsel's Report

I. Summary of Allegations

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The two complaints raise the same underlying issue. It is alleged that a \$20,000 payment from a state political fund (The Badham Fund) containing corporate money was in fact an expenditure on behalf of respondent's candidacy for Congress. Both complaints further allege that the \$20,000 expense for the poll was excessive and that in fact the payment also covered a fee for William Butcher and Arnold Forde as consultants to the Congressional campaign.

In addition, one complainant alleges that respondent's campaign for Congress began as much as five months before he announced or began reporting.

II. Evidence

The above complaints were received separately. MUR 121 (76) was received from a Mr. Harry Jeffrey on April 6, 1976 and MUR 156 (76) was received from a Mr. John G. Schmitz on May 28, 1976. Both Schmitz and Jeffrey opposed Badham in the primary election. On June 29, 1976, a second complaint

was received from Schmitz. It raised the same issues but also enclosed a copy of an action filed in the Superior Court of California which seeks to delay the Secretary of State's certification of Badham as the Republican nominee. This second complaint also asks the Commission to file a suit to declare void the Republican primary in the 40th Congressional District of California. In support of his complaint, Schmitz submitted newspaper articles that discuss the close relationship of Butcher and Forde with Opinion Research Associates, Inc. and suggest that the services of Forde and Butcher were highly valuable in Badham's Congressional area.

The respondent was forwarded a copy of both complaints. His response to the Schmitz complaints was received on July 6, 1976. This response also deals with the issues set forth in the Jeffrey complaint.

The response states that \$20,000 was expended from the "Badham Fund" to pay for the poll conducted by Opinion Research Associates, Inc. It concedes that the Badham Fund contained corporate money (permissible under California Law). The response also indicated that Arnold Forde and William Butcher were not only consultants and analysts for the poll but they also planned and conducted Badham's Congressional campaign. However, although indicating that he decided to

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run for Congress on the basis of the findings of the poll, respondent contends that he did not become a candidate until after the results of the poll were received. In this connection, Badham's federal reports indicate no contributions or expenditures until after the date of the poll. The response contends that the \$20,000 fee was for the poll exclusively and he encloses a letter confirming an oral agreement to this effect (there was allegedly no written contract). Respondent claims that the services of Butcher and Forde with regard to the federal campaign were obtained by means of an agreement separate and distinct from the contract for the poll and that the agreement provided compensation based on commissions received from vendors to the campaign and a \$10,000 bonus if respondent was successful. However, no copy of this agreement was furnished.

Copies of the State reports regarding the Badham Fund were submitted by Schmitz. These reports filed pursuant to California law show that expenditures of \$34,608.72 including \$20,000 for the poll, were made from this fund during 1975. Other than a \$10,000 obligation listed after the election, Badham's Congressional report shows no expenditures to Butcher and Forde. Moreover, the April 1976 report shows that \$750 was paid to Opinion Research Associates, Inc. in March 1976 for another survey and an additional payment of \$1,200 in February 4, 1976 for opinion lists.

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The reports also show that \$26,400 was raised within one month of his announced candidacy.

### III. Analysis

The underlying issue in these MURs is whether the \$20,000 payment from the Badham Fund to Opinion Research Associates, Inc. qualifies as an expenditure within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. Section 431(f). If it does, it should have been reported by respondent pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 434. Moreover, assuming there was an expenditure, it appears to involve corporate monies and thus, there would be an apparent violation of 2 U.S.C. Section 441b.

The essential facts bearing on the expenditure issue are controverted.

The initial issue is the purpose of the \$20,000 payment to Opinion Research Associates, Inc. Respondent asserts that it was made solely to pay for a poll which predated the effective date of his candidacy; complaints allege that the monies paid were in substantial part for services rendered by Opinion Research Associates, Inc. on behalf of Badham's federal candidacy. Respondent asserts that there was no written agreement as to the payment in spite of the large amount of money involved. However, it is uncontroverted that the individuals who analyzed the poll for Opinion Research Associates, Inc. also planned and directed respondent's campaign for Congress. According to the reports

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on file, Butcher and Forde received no direct compensation for their services other than, allegedly, a promise of \$10,000 if Badham won the nomination and the privilege to collect commissions from vendors to the campaign. A subsequent poll conducted by Opinion Research Associates, Inc., in March 1976 for Badham was reported as costing \$750. In view of the disparity between the costs of the August 1975 and the March 1976 polls and the failure of Mr. Badham to provide any written agreements for the cost of the earlier poll or the expenses paid to Messrs. Butcher and Forde, there is reason to believe a further investigation as to the purpose of the \$20,000 payment is warranted.

Even assuming that the \$20,000 payment did in fact cover only the cost of the poll, the respondent has admitted that the results of the poll were instrumental in his decision to be a candidate for Congress. Indeed, that decision was admittedly made within several days of the time the results were known. Although respondent's reports do not indicate that he was a candidate at the time the poll was made, the facts surrounding the timing and use of the poll create a strong argument for the proposition that its cost must be reported as an expenditure within the meaning of Section 431(c). Indeed, under the proposed Commission regulation dealing with

this issue (§100.7(b)(2)),<sup>\*/</sup> there would be no question that the costs were an expenditure, at the time respondent became a candidate.

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Finally, complainant Schmitz asserts that Badham was actively seeking the Republican nomination for Congress months before his announced candidacy. In support of this he cites a conversation he had with Badham on April 18, 1975 wherein Badham allegedly stated that he had at that time definitely decided to run. In a phone conversation with Andrew Athy, Jr., of the General Counsel's staff, Schmitz related that he knew two individuals who could testify in support of his claim.

In addition to the \$20,000 for the poll, the State reports of the Badham Fund show \$14,608.72 in expenditures during 1975. These facts alone, however, do not establish reason to believe that Badham had reportable campaign activity beyond the survey of August 1975. If the investigation relative to the survey develops evidence that would support the claim that pre-September 3, 1975 expenditures were made then this matter can be reopened.

#### IV. Recommendation

It is uncontroverted that respondent spent \$20,000 -- whether for a poll or for other consulting services -- which ultimately appear to have benefitted his Federal campaign.

<sup>\*/</sup> Section 100.7(b)(2) reads as follows:

Since the \$20,000 expense is unreported and since there may be corporate monies involved, it is our view that there is reason to believe that respondent has committed a violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 and 441b. We recommend that the respondent be so notified and given a "reasonable opportunity," to supply answers to the particular questions in the attached letter. Should respondent fail to furnish an adequate response, we are prepared to recommend the initiation of a field investigation.

(2) Payments made for the purpose of determining whether an individual should become a candidate, such as those incurred in conducting a poll, if the individual does not otherwise subsequently become a candidate. If the individual becomes a candidate, the payments are expenditures, and must be reported with the first report filed by the candidate or the principal campaign committee of the candidate, as appropriate, regardless of the date the payments were made.

As we had previously indicated to you, in each of the above numbered matters under review, complainants had alleged that you made a \$20,000 expenditure to a group called Opinion Research of California which expenditures were actually used in part to defray the cost of services rendered to your Federal Congressional campaign, but were unreported as such; in addition, complainants asserted that the expenditure to Opinion Research involved corporate money.

Based on the allegations set forth in the above numbered matters under review, your response to these complaints, and available reports, the Federal Election Commission has found that there is reason to believe that you have committed a violation of §§434 and 441b of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of this matter.

The Commission asks that you voluntarily comply with the following requests for information:

1. Please submit a copy of the surveys, the reports of the results of the surveys, and copies of any other work performed by Opinion Research Associates, Inc., in connection with your \$20,000 payment.



2. Submit a statement of the compensation received by William Butcher and Arnold Forde directly or indirectly for their analysis of the August 1975 survey. Were any monies paid to Messrs. Butcher and Forde for the preparation of the survey?
3. Were there any corporate monies used to pay Opinion Research Associates, Inc.? If so, state the amount and corporations involved.
4. Please supply any agreements as to compensation received by Messrs. Butcher and Forde for their role in your campaign.

This information should be provided in the form of sworn statements by individuals with personal knowledge of the matters alleged and submitted within ten days of receipt of this letter.

Dear Mr. Athy:

I have discussed your proposed Conciliation Agreement with Congressman Badham, and am returning to you a revised version, with my changes noted, which we are prepared to sign if the Commission approves it.

The principal changes to part IV, paragraphs A and B, which as proposed in your draft would require a stipulation to a violation of two different code sections. We are not willing to make those stipulations because at the time the expenditure in question was made, the Regulations bringing expenditures for "testing the waters" under coverage of the Act had not yet been promulgated, and there was no fair notice under the language of the Act itself that such expenditures would be covered by the Act. We recognize, however, that the Commission intends to include expenditures of this nature within the scope of the Act in the future by virtue of Regulations the Commission has since promulgated, and are willing to stipulate to that. We are also willing, as we have stated from the beginning of this matter, to file whatever reports the Commission feels is appropriate in the interest of full disclosure under the spirit of the Act, and to refund whatever amount the Commission feels is reasonably

appropriate in the circumstances to avoid the taint of corporate contributions being used for federal campaign purposes.

After the Commission staff has had a chance to review this, please let me know as soon as possible if you will accept this Conciliation Agreement, so that we may terminate this rather lengthy proceeding.

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter having been initiated by separate complaints filed by Mr. Harry Jeffreys and Mr. John H. Schmitz, an investigation having been conducted, and the Commission having made the determinations required by 2 U.S.C. §437(b)(a)(5) relative to alleged violations of 2 U.S.C. §434(b) and §441b(a);

Now, therefore, the respective parties herein, the Federal Election Commission and the respondent Robert E. Badham, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to §437g(a)(5), do hereby agree as follows:

- I. That the Federal Election Commission has jurisdiction over the respondent and the subject matter of this proceeding.
- II. That respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.
- III. That the pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:
  - A. That the respondent announced his candidacy for Congress on September 4, 1975.
  - B. That the Badham Congressional Committee is the principal campaign committee for Robert E. Badham's candidacy for Congress in 1976.
  - C. The Badham Fund is a political fund created by the respondent for his successive campaigns for re-

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election to the state assembly. Following the 1974 elections the name of the then current campaign fund "Elect Badham '74" was changed to "The Badham Fund." The receipts contained in this account consist primarily of transfers from Elect Badham '74 Committee which had received direct contributions from corporate treasury funds and individuals as well as transfers from previous checking, savings, or C.D. accounts established by or since January, 1971. The receipt of monies from corporations is permissible under California law.

D. The Badham Fund, which made total expenditures of \$34,608.72 during 1975, paid \$10,000 on August 3, 1975 and a second \$10,000 on August 13, 1975 for a survey from Opinion Research.

E. That an investigation by Federal Election Commission personnel of the cash flow to and from the Badham Fund indicates that at the time of the payments to Opinion Research, 17.1% of the monies in the Fund consisted of corporate donations. Using this percentage, \$3,389 of the payment to Opinion Research consisted of corporate funds.

F. That the Opinion Research survey encompassed the California 74th Assembly District and the 40th Congressional and examined respondent's prospects for election to Congress in 1976 and State Senate or County Supervisor in 1978 with an emphasis on respondent's chances in the Congressional race.

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G. The report on the findings of this survey were submitted to respondent on September 2, 1975 two days before he announced his candidacy.

H. That no part of the payment was reported pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §434(b).

I. That the payment was fully reported pursuant to California Law on reports filed with the California Secretary of State and with the Orange County Registrar of Voters on January 19, 1976.

J. That all contributions to the fund from which the payment was made were fully reported pursuant to California Law on reports filed with the California Secretary of State and with the Orange County Registrar of Voters for reporting periods prior to the date of the payment.

IV. Wherefore, respondent agrees as follows:

A. That under regulations first proposed by the Commission subsequent to the date the payments in question were made in August, 1975, and now pending before Congress for approval after submission to Congress on \_\_\_\_\_, 1977 the Commission will

- (1) Require payments made for the purpose of determining whether individuals should become a candidate for Congress to be reported as expenditures under 2 U.S.C. §434; and

- (2) Prohibit the making of expenditures as defined from funds consisting of contributions

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from both individuals and corporate treasuries, pursuant to the authority given to the Commission under the Federal Election Campaign Act Amendments of 1976.

B. That during the entire course of the investigation undertaken by the Commission pursuant to complaints filed with the Commission relative to the payment in question by two of the respondent's 1976 congressional primary campaign opponents, respondent has cooperated fully with the Commission, and has repeatedly offered to file whatever amended reports the Commission feels appropriate.

C. Respondent will file within thirty days an amended report of receipts and expenditures with an entry indicating the \$20,000 expenditure at issue herein for the period during which the expenditure was made and to file an amended report for any subsequent period required on account of this expenditure.

D. Respondent will return to the Badham Fund \$3,389. said sum representing the amount of corporate monies used to pay Opinion Research.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

A. The Commission on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for



This office represents the candidate complained against in the above referenced matters, Robert E. Badham.

By telegram to you as chairman of the Commission, on this date, I formally requested on behalf of Mr. Badham that when these matters are presented to the Commission by the General Counsel that the Commission not find reason to believe that violations of the Federal Elections Act have occurred, and that these complaints be dismissed, on the grounds that the Commission has failed to act on these complaints for over four and one-half and three months, respectively, since the complaints were first filed, and the candidate complained against has thereby been and will be severely and unnecessarily prejudiced by any investigation or adverse finding by the Commission at this late date because of the proximity of the general election.

These complaints were filed with the Commission by primary election opponents of Mr. Badham in April and in late May, 1976, late in the California primary campaign.

Notice that either of these complaints had been filed was first given to Mr. Badham by the Commission staff by letter dated June 4, 1976, but because a copy of the complaint itself was not enclosed with the letter by the Commission's staff, the complaint was not received by Mr. Badham until

June 25, 1976. I promptly responded on behalf of Mr. Badham by letter dated July 6, 1976, and have been waiting for Commission action ever since. I have requested prompt action by telephone to the Commission staff attorneys on several occasions, but to no apparent avail.

We are about to enter the last two months of the general election campaign, and it is now apparent that any action the Commission might take will be taken during this critical period, and will take the candidate's time away from campaigning, will be current news in middle of the campaign, and will, if adverse to Mr. Badham, provide invaluable campaign material for Mr. Badham's opponent. Any commission action at this time, therefore, adverse to Mr. Badham, will work to his substantial prejudice because of the proximity of the general election campaign.

Further, the Commission is required by 2 USC 437g(3)(A) to act expeditiously in these matters, but it has not done so, through no fault of Mr. Badham's.

For these reasons, it is my opinion that any action by the Commission after this lengthy delay would unfairly and unnecessarily prejudice Mr. Badham if the Commission action should be adverse to him, would be in violation of the requirements of Section 437g of the Federal Elections Act, and would be a clear denial to Mr. Badham of due process of law.

On these grounds, I request on behalf of Mr. Badham that the Commission not find reason to believe that a violation of the Federal Elections Act has occurred, and that the complaints be dismissed.

Please bring this request to the attention of the Commission when and if it meets to consider either or both of the above matters.



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

Dear Mr. Thomson:

It is respectfully submitted that your Commission will never obtain by exchanges of correspondence information sufficient to enable it to make an intelligent determination in the referenced matter, and that there are important factual issues which can only be discovered upon oral examination of witnesses.

Two central issues raised in my complaints on file with your Commission are: Whether, by means of payments of funds having their origin in corporate gifts, Mr. Badham actually obtained the campaign management services of Mr. William Butcher and Mr. Arnold Forde instead of a poll pertaining to the concerns of his State of California office as Mr. Badham claims; and, whether Mr. Badham actually loaned his own personal funds to his campaign for the Republican nomination for Congress from the 40th California Congressional District.

Your Commission can be, and probably already has been, furnished a large number of ex parte denials of wrongdoing under the oath of Mr. Badham and others. With respect to the first of those two issues, even Mr. Butcher and Mr. Forde themselves might state the conclusion that they received none of the funds paid by Mr. Badham to Opinion Research, or that they rendered only polling services on Mr. Badham's behalf in exchange for funds

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they received from that firm; but, oral examination, however, might adduce facts which would require your Commission to reject that conclusion.

I am informed that Mr. Badham has stated that his decision to stand for Federal office had not been made at the time he ordered the Opinion Research poll; I can produce witnesses who, in response to process, at least, will testify that Mr. Badham had announced his intention to seek the 40th Congressional District Republican nomination several months before he ordered that poll.

Further, information necessary to determine the scope of the poll, or even whether the activities conducted were in the nature of a poll, can be obtained only by the questioning of live, percipient witnesses.

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With respect to the second of those two issues, I am informed, and can produce witnesses who can testify, that Mr. Badham was without funds to lend his campaign, and without credit which would enable him to borrow such funds in usual commercial and financial channels. I am confident that by resort to hearings or depositions your Commission could readily obtain testimony indicating that loans were made to Mr. Badham by or with the assistance of persons who desired that Mr. Badham succeed in his attempt to obtain the Republican nomination for Representative from the 40th California Congressional District.

In view of the foregoing it is hereby respectfully requested that your Commission order hearings or depositions at which testimony of witnesses may be presented in the referenced matter.



This letter is in response to the request from William Oldaker, Assistant General Counsel to the Commission, dated July 30, 1976, re: MUR 121 (76). In that letter, Mr. Oldaker requested a written response from us, within 15 days, to the allegations of a complaint enclosed with the letter, signed by Harry Jeffrey.

I formally object to a request from the Commission that we respond to the allegations of the complaint, and that the Commission consider the complaint, on the grounds the complaint is not sworn to by the person filing the complaint, as required by the Act.

I also object to the request by the Commission that we respond to the allegations of the complaint, on the further grounds that the complaint has been filed over four months ago, and no notification has been given to us of the complaint until this late date, close in time to general election. The action of the Commission in opening a new complaint at this late date is clearly prejudicial to the election campaign of Mr. Badham, and this unreasonable delay does not afford him procedural fairness.

I also formally request that the Commission immediately clarify in writing exactly which complaints it is investigating, identified by the person signing the complaint, the date on which it was signed, and the MUR number assigned to the complaint. Information I have received by telephone



First, I vigorously object to the Commission opening a second investigation, in addition to the one already underway, solely in response to a second complaint from the same individual, i.e., John G. 



rived from commissions collected from the suppliers to which they send their candidates.

Among those suppliers are The Delta Group—a telephone

bank service—which Butcher and Ford operate; Opinion Research of Long Beach, a polling firm; Below, Tobe and Associates, computer specialists; Computer Mailing Inc., of Los Angeles, and Advertis-

ers Mailing Service; a Sacramento photographer and several printing firms.

Supervisor Riley paid Butcher and Forde \$10,000 to run his election campaign. The money, he said was paid

directly to Opinion Research, which turned it over to the campaign managers.

Only Slemons was required to pay his \$10,000 fee "up front," because "He was a long shot," Butcher said.

"Our obligation to a client ends when the last vote is counted," Butcher said.

"When the election is over, we walk away. We don't try to advise and we don't try to tell them what to do once they're in office. We just walk away. We're professionals."

In fact, they claim, they don't have any solid political beliefs they'd try to push off

were for Republicans, although one of those was a nonpartisan supervisorial campaign.

Butcher is State Controller Ken Cory's brother-in-law, and through Cory and other campaigns the two have managed to become linked in some minds to the Richard O'Neill-Dr. Louis Cella Jr. political machine.

Many Republican primary candidates tried to brand their Butcher-Forde-backed opponents as part of the Cel-

la-O'Neill machine because of this.

But Butcher said they turned to GOP races this year "because that's where the candidates and the money was."

But there are candidates they wouldn't touch, Butcher added, not naming anyone.

"Basically," he said. "we don't think it really matters who gets elected — except to the presidency. The presidency is the only job" in which the winning candidate can have a dramatic effect on the

lives of everyone in the country," Butcher said.

For the rest, "does it really matter to the average guy who gets elected?" he asked.

"They're not going to have that much power when they get in office, they're just one of a large group, and their vote and influence is diluted," he said.

"I sometimes wonder whether it would really matter whether we had any government at all."

But when Bill Butcher and Arnold Forde hire on to man-

age a political campaign, "Butcher and Forde manage the whole thing," Forde said.

"We usually have a couple of interviews before we decide whether we'll take a client, and if we do, the first thing is to develop a complete campaign plan," he said.

"We believe strongly in research, and we coordinate the whole campaign," said Forde. "We decide the message (he later agreed "image" might be a better term) we want to deliver for the candidate, and then we deliver it."

Butcher said each partner averages a 70-hour work week when a campaign is in full swing and they handle all campaign work themselves.

"That's why we can beat Spencer-Roberts. They'll take as many jobs as they can get, then hire some kid, give him a handbook and assign him to be someone's campaign manager. They win a lot, but they lose a lot, too. We don't like to lose."

He said the first thing done is a computer-prepared political, social and economic breakdown of the district.

"Then we plan all the opponents' campaigns.

"In the Jim Slemons campaign we planned how we'd run (Marian) Bergeson's campaign, then we did (Henry) Quigley's and (Bill) Cros-

by's. We planned the best campaign we could for each one, then sat down and said 'if that's what they'll do, how should we plan Slemons' to beat them?'"

Slemons "had weaknesses," Butcher said, "and we didn't want him attacked by the other candidates. So we started late (he filed his nominating papers in the 74th Assembly District's GOP race on the last possible day and didn't begin serious campaigning until late May) and gave him what appeared to be endorsements from some prominent Republicans.

"We went after the very conservative element... and played on Leisure World voters' reluctance to vote for a woman. We did extra mail-

ings to Leisure World, and we concentrated on Oceanside (in the San Diego County portion of the huge district) where none of the candidates were well known."

Slemons operates a Mercedes Benz dealership, but the quality of the auto a car dealer sells makes no difference to the voters. (Please Turn To Page C5)

# Some Campaign Tactics Called Deceptive; 1 Candidate Badly Beaten

Butcher said. "A car dealer is a car dealer, and they have a bad image. We played that down by calling him a corporation president and businessman."

Butcher and Forde also kept their candidate from making many public appearances, and when he did he was instructed to avoid answering issue-oriented questions.

The effectiveness of Butcher-Forde's campaign planning and campaign tactics is illustrated by the successes of Slemmons and Assemblyman Robert Badham.

In planning Badham's 40th district congressional campaign, Butcher and Forde placed emphasis on his 14 years in the Assembly, calling him an experienced, mature lawmaker. They tried to keep him neutral in the GOP presidential battle and pushed the image of a Badham who was conservative but not a far-out conservative like his major opponent, John Schmitz.

Slemmons, on the other hand, was portrayed as a Ronald Reagan conservative and his legislative inexperience was called a virtue, Mrs. Bergeson's experience a vice.

The districts — Badham's 40th congressional and Slemmons' 74th Assembly — share virtually the same boundaries

and the same pool of GOP voters. In the heavily populated Newport Beach area, according to research specialist Forde, voters who backed Mrs. Bergeson tended to support Badham, while Reagan and Schmitz supporters tended to vote for Slemmons.

Slemmons and Badham won their respective races, and the campaigns were so well choreographed that Slemmons managed to do well in areas where the Badham vote should have helped Mrs. Bergeson.

Both men did well in the San Diego portion of the district, which their opponents tended to neglect (Badham, who won by fewer than 1,200 votes in the district's 499 precincts, got more than half his margin in the 46 San Diego County precincts alone), and Slemmons did much better in areas where his name was unknown before the election than in areas where he was identified as a car dealer—all according to plan.

Mrs. Bergeson blames her defeat on Butcher-Forde's last-minute mailing blitz on Slemmons' behalf. "It was very difficult to counteract," she said, "and it was an unfair campaign that used deceptive material."

Materials prepared by Butcher and Forde for Slemmons, who won the GOP nom-

ination against what were thought to have been impossible odds, drew screams of outrage from other Republican candidates.

The mailers and pamphlets included a piece emblazoned with the large-type announcement that "Ronald Reagan Says: Vote for Jim Slemmons." In very small type above "Ronald Reagan" were the words "Campaign Chairman for..."

The same piece told GOP voters that "Robert Badham Says: Vote for Jim Slemmons." Badham, the district's popular incumbent, was vacating his Assembly post to seek the GOP nod for congress. His successful campaign was managed by Butcher and Forde.

As in the "Reagan" literature, a small-type legend above "Robert Badham Says" bore the barely readable legend, "Campaign Chairman for..."

The campaign chairman, in both cases, was Willard S. Voit, scion of the Voit rubber family and a prominent county Republican.

There were four "different" endorsements, none naming the endorser but relying solely on fancy sounding titles; all actually were the same person.

Was it an attempt to mislead voters?

Mrs. Bergeson, who lost to Slemmons although she was thought by most observers to

be unbeatable, thinks it was.

Butcher and Forde say the mailer was semantically correct. Bill Voit is all those things, so information in the mailer was truthful, they maintain.

"We will never do anything illegal," Butcher said. "We won't even let our candidates tack signs onto telephone poles—that's against the law."

In the 71st Assembly District race, Butcher and Forde managed Buena Park councilman Jesse Davis' campaign.

One memorable mailer, in very large type, said Davis was proudly announcing the endorsements of Congressman Jerry Patterson and Assemblyman Paul Carpenter. In very small type at the bottom of the page, the text went on to say that Davis was announcing his support of Patterson and Carpenter, not vice versa.

Later in the interview, he admitted that the Davis mailer "probably" went too far and that he and Butcher "might not" use that style of implied endorsement in the future.

With few exceptions, said Butcher, "We write every word that goes out on behalf of our candidates. And we never put out anything without the candidate's approval," Forde added.

"Mailers are the way we get the message across" to the voters, he said. "We use

the best quality materials, because that's what catches the voter's eye when he pulls a half-dozen brochures out of his mail box. He'll look at the most eye-catching one and throw the rest away."

Not all of the Butcher-Forde campaign material makes voters want to run out and cast a ballot for the Butcher-Forde candidate, however.

Andy Banks hired the pair to do his campaign, and Andy Banks was supposed to win.

He had money and the support of his boss, John Briggs, the incumbent who was vacating the 69th Assembly seat to run for state Senate (Butcher and Forde ran that successful campaign, too).

But Butcher and Forde put together a campaign that many believe hurt rather than helped.

Through letters on Briggs' Assembly stationary and through phone calls by persons representing themselves as spokesmen for Republican headquarters, voters were asked to support "your" or "our" Republican candidate, Andrew Banks. The implication was clear — Banks was the only GOP contender, the one officially endorsed by "Republican headquarters."

Six of Banks' seven GOP opponents called a press conference to blast the tactic and William Dannemeyer, who stomped Banks in the final tally, used ensuing newspaper

stories in his mailers, driving home the point that Briggs was trying to buy the Assembly post for his aide and that the campaign and candidate were marred by unethical tactics.

Butcher and Forde don't agree with that analysis, but were unable to voice any other reason for Banks' defeat.

And interviews with political observers and voters who live in the district showed that it was a backlash against the Banks-Butcher-Forde tactics that destroyed Banks' voter appeal.

Butcher, however, said he was "proud" of the campaign and would run it the same way if he had it to do over again.

"We love what we do," said 39-year-old Arnie Forde, the team's research and materials expert.

"If you offered me the chance to do anything else in the world, to be anywhere else, I'd tell you I'd just as soon be right here, behind this desk."

Butcher agreed. "I'd rather do this than anything else in the world."

Butcher's been in the "business" since he was 14, although for the first 10 years he worked without pay. He started as a volunteer campaign worker for Richard Hanna during the former Democratic congressman's 1956 Assembly campaign and

managed his successful bid in 1962 to become the first Democrat elected to Congress from Orange County.

"When other Democrats would drop by and ask Dick how he managed to get elected, he'd tell them to talk to me, and several asked me to help with their campaigns.

"Finally, it got so bad that I couldn't do anymore and started telling them no. Then one guy said he wanted me and wouldn't take no for an answer. He asked if money would change my mind.

"It did."  
Forde was an Orange County real estate agent in 1960 when he decided he wanted to run for office. "I started asking people what to do, and they told me to work for the party for awhile."

He became executive director of the county Democratic central committee and in that position began working on other politicians' campaigns "and I decided that was more fun than being a candidate."

"Arnie and I were bitter political enemies for about five years," Butcher said. The friction began in the Ken Cory-Paul Carpenter Democratic Assembly race in 1966.

They bumped heads in several other primary contests. Then, in 1970, Forde was hired to handle the supervisory bid of a millionaire banker named Ronald Caspers.

Caspers was trying to unseat an incumbent, and Forde knew he had a hard fight ahead.

"Bill was developing new techniques in campaigning — he was the first to use computer mailings, so I brought him in to do Caspers' mailings."

"We hit it off and did so well together in that campaign that we never thought about breaking up afterwards," Butcher said.

They haven't wearied of the 12-hour days, the name calling and the strain on their family lives after all those years. But they are looking for something new to occupy their time.

"We'd like to find someone who wants to be a United States Senator," Butcher said. "Somebody between 25 and 50 who has the personal and financial commitment to work for six to 10 years to get there."

"We'd even be willing to move to a new state. What we're thinking of is finding someone like this and working with him constantly to make him a Senator. Nobody's ever done that before."

"Can you imagine the experience it would be, the thing we'd learn, the techniques we could try out, the book we could write?"

I hope you put this in your story," he said, "maybe the guy we're looking for will be it and get in touch with us."

# They Don't Pick Political Favorites, Just Winners

In the wee hours of one of those traditional election night parties, the bearded political adviser pondered the results being posted and then turned to two of his clients.

He had good news and bad news for them.

For Assemblyman Robert Badham, who at that moment was running behind in his effort to win the Republican nominatin for Rep. Andrew J. Hinshaw's 40th Congressional District seat, the news was good.

"You're going to win it," the expert predicted.

But, for Mayor Jesse Davis of Buena Park, trying for the Democratic nomination in the 71st Assembly District, the news was bad, even though Davis held a slight lead at the time.

"We've lost it," he confessed.

When the final precincts were totaled, some six hours later, Bill Butcher, who has been looking at election results since he was 15, was proved to be absolutely correct.

Butcher, 35, essentially a computer expert as well as a political analyst, makes up half of a two-man team that has become one of the most successful and most controversial political campaign teams in California.

His partner is Arnold Forde, who celebrates his 40th birthday this week.

Together since 1970, Butcher and Forde had racked up a record of 28 victories and one defeat prior to the June 8 election, most of them in Orange County. This time, their average dropped off: In six races they won three, lost two and got their sixth candidate into a November runoff.

That still isn't a bad track record for any political

IRVINE — It almost sounds like something out of George Orwell's "1984" but a pair of political consultants here say they are looking for someone who would like to become a U.S. Senator — in eight to 15 years.

Bill Butcher, a partner in the firm of Butcher and Forde, which has made a practice of running successful — if controversial — political campaigns since 1970, says the applicant can be male or female but should be between 30 and 50 years old with considerable time and financial resources available.

"It's something we've wanted to do for a long time — at least five years," explained Butcher, who has a reputation as an expert in the use of computers for elections.

campaign organization, but this time, there was a new element: In several of the races, opponents campaigned as much against Butcher and Forde as their clients.

At one point, a group of Republican candidates in the 69th Assembly District called a press conference to complain about a telephone bank operation used by the pair, saying they would take their complaints to the state's Fair Campaign Practices Commission.

"The idea is to find a state, analyze, the political situation and set up an 8-to-15-year program to build a candidate for a successful Senate campaign.

"We have the plan all ready to go. What we need is a person who is completely clean from politics and who has the desire to become a senator."

Butcher said the firm would pick the right state — "it probably wouldn't be California but it could be" — move the person in and build him an image to develop the person from the time of decision to election.

"It would take a minimum of eight years," Butcher said, "plus a lot of time and money. But, it would be a tremendous academic and political exercise and would probably make great material for a book."

Butcher and Forde tend to laugh off such incidents.

"Take the phone bank thing," Butcher said. "We've used that same thing for 10 years but this year a few people screamed. We changed one word and the Republican Central Committee said it was okay, but nine candidates felt they had to call a press conference over that one word. To me, that's a lot of wasted effort."

Unfortunately for Butcher and Forde, their crystal ball

clouded up in that particular campaign. Their candidate in the 69th, Andrew Banks, was beaten.

The telephone bank complaints, which also erupted in the 71st Assembly and the 74th Assembly district races, centered around callers identifying themselves as being from "Republican headquarters" and urging voters to back one of the Butcher-Forde candidates.

Critics call such maneuvers "political flim-flam," designed to mislead the voter. It is an age-old tactic in politics, But critics of Butcher and Forde contend the two have refined such tactics to the highest — or lowest — level.

Some examples:

—Voters in every city in the 1st Supervisorial District this year received computer letters and brochures from candidate Philip Anthony describing him as a mayor and councilman. But, the letters neglected to say that Anthony is the mayor and a councilman in Westminster, which has only a tiny portion of the 1st District's population.

Also in the Anthony campaign, computer letters told Democrats that Anthony was a former party chairman and that his opponent, Harry Yamamoto, had once run against the 72nd Assembly District incumbent, a Democrat. Republican voters were also told about Yamamoto's previous Democratic political efforts but there was no mention of the fact that Anthony was a Democrat.

—Mayor Jesse Davis and auto dealer Jim Siemons, who eventually won in the 74th Assembly District, sent out mailings announcing endorsements of well-known candidates or party officials. It took a careful reading of the small print to learn that it was Davis and Siemons who were doing the endorsing, not the other way around.

—A computer letter for Siemons implied that four prominent persons were endorsing his candidacy. Only a

politically astute reader would realize that the four persons were, in actuality, only two whose varied political associations were carefully couched in different terms.

Forde simply shrugs off most of the criticism.

"What the hell," he argued, not without validity, "look at what some of the others did. Max Binswanger, for instance, ran an ad with a picture of himself and John Wayne, calling it 'Two Gritty Guys.' But, the truth was that Wayne had endorsed our guy, Tom Riley, who was Binswanger's opponent. Unfortunately Wayne was in Mexico at the time and couldn't object."

Both Butcher and Forde argued that their role is that of advocates, just as is the lawyer who argues his client's case in court.

"We don't use untruths or lies," Butcher explained. "We couldn't do that and stay in business very long. But it is our job to deal with our candidate's strengths and the opponent's weaknesses.

"We expect the other guys to do the same thing to us. We plan on having them attack our clients. If they don't, then that's their problem, not ours."

But, as much as they defend their roles, the two also are aware they themselves have become political issues.

"Maybe we've been concentrating too much on Orange County," Forde finally admitted during a recent post-election discussion. "We don't think we should be a campaign issue. That's not our job and it could start hurting our clients. We may start spreading out and start doing some races in Los Angeles County."

That would be a new venture for Forde, who has confined most of his political activity to Orange County.

A native of Chicago, he came to California while in the Navy and liked it so well he stayed to get a degree in economics at California State University, Long Beach.

After that, he went into the real estate business in Orange County and became involved in politics in 1965. After working in a few campaigns, he got actively involved in helping financier Ronald Caspers win election to the county Board of Supervisors in 1970.

After Caspers was sworn in, one of his first acts was to appoint Forde to the County Planning Commission. At the time, Caspers became part of a new majority on the board which was aligned with the powerful political interests of Dr. Louis J. Cella Jr., Richard J. O'Neill, Fred Harber and Supervisor Robert Battin. Forde was in a close circle of advisers, taking part in strategy sessions and, on occasion, representing Caspers in meetings with 5th District land owners and developers.

He also became partner in some real estate dealings with O'Neill and Cella — one of which backfired on him.

Forde was a partner in a firm known as the Viejo Capital Co. which acquired title to a piece of property in Mission Viejo, which became the site for Mission Community Hospital. Later, the County Planning Commission forced a series of delays on a use permit application by another nearby hospital, which threatened that facility's ability to obtain federal funds.

It was not until Forde's interest in the competing hospital was disclosed that the commission got around to approving the use permit. Soon after, Forde stepped down from the commission, a move which several sources said was triggered by the embarrassment Caspers had suffered in the incident.

Today, when he isn't working on political campaigns, Forde keeps track of a string of liquor stores he owns, most of them in partnership with millionaire rancher and Democrat Richard J. O'Neill. And he spends a lot of time in Aspen, Colo., where he owns a fast-food restaurant.

Butcher, whose family moved to Westminster when he was in the 6th grade, broke into politics at the age of 15 when he took part in Richard T. Hanna's 1956 campaign to win a special election to the State Assembly.

By 1958, Butcher had become Hanna's assistant campaign manager and, in 1960, at the age of 19, he took over as manager.

When Hanna left the Assembly in 1962 to run for Congress, Butcher also handled that winning campaign and became Hanna's administrative assistant in Washington.

"I was the youngest aide in the history of Congress," Butcher said during a recent interview. "I beat out Lyndon Johnson, who was also 21 when he was an administrative assistant but was a few months older than I."

After four years in Washington, Butcher returned to Orange County to manage Hanna's 1966 campaign. But the publicity that surrounded Hanna as the first Orange County Democrat in Congress already had started Butcher in what was to become his full-time career.

"A lot of people wanted me to work on their campaigns," he said, "and I was getting too busy to do my regular job, so I started saying no. They kept asking me, however, and we finally arrived at money as the best way to make me change

Unlike Forde, Butcher doesn't drift away from politics in the off-season. Instead, he zeroes in on campaigns in other areas and has handled election efforts in Arizona, New Jersey, Nevada, San Diego and Northern California in recent years.

As one of the "Hanna kids" from Westminster, Butcher was in strong company. One of his campaign compatriots was a young former basketball player from Orange Coast College and UC Berkeley named Kenneth Cory, who, in 1966, ran for Hanna's former seat in the Assembly and won. Cory, who married Butcher's sister, became state controller in 1974.

Another of the political youngsters from Westminster was Philip Anthony, who, at the age of 26, won a seat on the City Council and later served two years as chairman of the Orange County Democratic Central Committee.

Although the two political consultants first got together in the 1970 Caspers campaign, they had known each other before.

"We hated each other's guts up until then," Butcher said with a laugh, "but we found out we could work together."

The Caspers campaign, which cost more than \$80,000 — the most ever spent for a supervisor's race up to that time — also taught the pair a lesson about politics and set the pattern for most of their future campaigns.

"Allen (Alton Allen, the incumbent supervisor) could have raised a lot of money in the primary," Butcher said, "but he decided to hold off until the general election, apparently anticipating that he would be in a runoff."

"But, we poured the money into the primary and won it, so there was no runoff. After that, all Allen's group could do was sit around and wonder what had gone wrong."

Since then, one trademark of any Butcher-Forde campaign is that it is bound to be expensive.

It is a charge neither man denies.

"There are no replays in politics," Butcher explained. "You can't sit around later and say, 'Well, that didn't work, so now we'll try this.' We budget to win against our opponent's best possible campaign and we spend what we feel it takes to beat them. It's just a matter of dollars and the candidate's own resources.

"A lot of people really budget to lose by spending at the lowest possible level. Then, if they should get more, they think that's glorious. But, there's one big problem. You can't effectively spend those last-minute dollars because you haven't planned for them.

"We often spend more than what we later learn was needed," he admitted. "But, we don't lose very many races.

"It's also something of a fallacy that we are more expensive than anyone else," he added. "We also cull out a lot of campaign stuff that saves as much as our fee in some cases."

That brings up the question of what it costs to hire Butcher and Forde.

According to them the price varies, depending upon the candidate, his chances of getting elected and the quality or quantity of his opposition.

Two years ago, the pair reportedly offered to handle the general election campaign of incumbent Supervisor David

Baker for \$50,000, a proposal that Baker eventually rejected despite being in serious trouble.

"We offered to do it for that," Forde explained, "because we would have had to eliminate another campaign to handle him and it would have been a lot more time consuming.

"But," added Butcher, "we could have won for him. I'm absolutely convinced of that."  
Baker lost.

The \$50,000 fee is an exception, however, the two maintained. During the last primary, their fees ranged between \$10,000 and \$20,000, although there were no set amounts.

But those are their figures. Thanks to a loophole in the state's political fund reporting laws, little, if any, of the money paid to Butcher and Forde ever shows up on their candidates' financial disclosure reports.

That is because they normally are paid through commissions on contracts they negotiate for various phases of campaign work. Butcher said the arrangement is similar to that used by many advertising agencies.

"We do have contingency fees with a couple of clients if they win," he explained, "but the rest of our money comes from agency fees."

Nor do Butcher or Forde feel that such an arrangement is wrong, in spite of the fact that their involvement in a campaign does not appear on the legal disclosure reports.

"Campaign laws were ready-made for the pros," Butcher admitted, "and we have a guy on retainer whose job is to check those laws and tell us what we can and cannot do. Commissions aren't banned, as far as I know, and we don't feel it is wrong, anymore than it is for an ad agency."

"The reason we work the way we do is because many places have two price lists — one for the candidates and one for the pros. By using us, the candidate can get a better price for the same work."

The Butcher-Forde team has traditionally been associated with Demo-

crats, although there have been exceptions. But this year they worked for a number of Republicans — James Slemons in the 74th Assembly, Andy Banks in the 69th, Assemblyman Robert Badham in the 40th Congressional District and Thomas F. Riley in the nonpartisan 5th Supervisorial race. Their only Democratic clients were Phil Anthony, in the nonpartisan 1st Supervisorial District, and Jesse Davis in the 71st Assembly.

Forde says the change was not one of philosophy. "The Democrats are mostly already in office but (James) Whetmore's retirement in the 35th State Senate and (Rep. Andrew) Hinshaw's indictment and conviction plus Battin's indictment opened up a lot of seats and the majority of candidates happened to be Republicans."

Butcher claims that political affiliations are unimportant.

"We're pros," he argued "and we'll work for anyone we think can win. We've turned down a lot of candidates who have come to us for help. We don't always pick the favorites but typically our clients are among the leaders. Our fees are pretty stiff and if someone looks like a cinch winner they won't choose us."

"However, we have no ties with any organization, group or party."

Butcher also insisted they are not interested in political power.

"There are no lingering liabilities with us," he said. "We get paid for what we do and we go away after the election. The candidate doesn't owe us anything just because he got elected. We're not even interested in what happens afterwards. We can work for liberals or conservatives alike and often do, even in the same campaign period."

Forde said most candidates do not need the team after they've won election once. "Why should someone pay our fee if they don't need us? But, on the other hand, we've never had a

client who wouldn't come back if we were needed."

The key to a successful campaign, according to Butcher and Forde, is knowing the area involved and using the techniques that fit it best.

In Northern California, San Diego, Los Angeles or Nevada, that might well be a strong radio and TV campaign.

But, in Orange County where there are no major TV outlets, the basic techniques are the use of computer letters, direct mailings, and telephone banks.

Butcher also is a firm believer in precinct-walking by the candidate.

"I never ran for office — and that's something I'd never do — I'd start early and walk as much as I could, even though it is stupid, boring and the hardest job one can do. In a big win, it probably wouldn't make much difference but in a tight race, that is probably second (in importance) only to raising money."

"If I had to, I'd rank the best techniques as: Dollars, walking precincts and having a good background in business or government."

"Frankly, I'd rather have the candidate walk than go to candidate meetings, because you can reach more people in the same amount of time."

But for Butcher and Forde the real key to a winning campaign is dollars — money to finance the mailings, computer letters, telephone banks, brochures, opinion surveys and the other trademarks of their campaigns.

The two said they spend a lot of time on candidate brochures, insisting on good quality work.

"One of our biggest problems is trying to beat down the candidate's desires to save a couple hundred bucks," Butcher said. "We're really tough in that respect, but we really only want to please our client once — on election night."

"We're also death on wasting money on junk like signs, badges and things like that. We won't have a billboard, for instance, unless the candidate goes around us or gets one donated. They're just not useful to anything but the client's own ego."

"When we write a budget, we know when everything is going to happen, right down to election day. We lay out a game plan like a football coach beginning about 100 days before the election."

"Actually the last couple of weeks we spend a lot of our time keeping the candidate from doing things on his own. If the plan is well done, there's no need to change it, unless someone drops an atom bomb on you at the last minute."

Forde said having a game plan means the campaign will not waste time reacting to the other side.

"You assume the other guy is going to score some points," he said. "Hell, no one expects to win unanimously. But, you know your guy's weak points going in and you plan for them."

When the two agree to take on a campaign they follow a rigid schedule of preparation, although there is no formal division of campaign duties between them.

"The first thing we do," Butcher explained "is to sit down and play war games with strategy. Arnie will take the opponent's campaign and I'll take ours. Then, we'll switch to try to shoot down the other guy. When we're finished, we put them together and see who wins."

"We spend hours and hours at that

then we both get into researching the campaign and the district. When it is all over, we lay out our game plan. After that, Arnie tends to zero in on the financing side, while I do the rest — the writing, the letters, the contracts and overseeing the schedules. But, we also change around sometimes so that he'll do some writing or criticize mine and I'll take a look at the financing side, just so we each know what is happening."

"We try to project the candidate in a way that is consistent with his philosophy, but we also recognize the areas that we feel are the most important to his campaign."

"For instance," said Forde, "if our guy is against high-density residential development, opposes off-shore drilling and wants wider street lines, we'll tell him which ones are the most important and relevant to his campaign."

"We have polls, but we try to take the candidate as he is and build around him. We'll point out where he and the public agree and emphasize that. It's up to the other guy to point out where he differs with the public."

To some extent, Butcher and Forde

seem to enjoy their "bad guy" reputations, which they see as logical reaction to their ability to win.

Said Forde, "Politics in general has a low reputation and anyone involved tends to be held in low regard, especially in the post-Watergate period."

"Actually," added Butcher, "when people meet us for the first time, they tend to be pretty tense wondering what kind of guys we are."

"We even hired one woman who had heard so much about us that she actually quivered when she first came to work. But, we like to feel that after people meet us, they find out that we're not really monsters."

"We don't like to be a campaign issue, like we became this time. However, the longer our winning streak goes on, the more desperate our opponents get. What's funny is that many of the people who say we're so bad tried to hire us for their own campaigns."

"For instance, in the 74th District, we talked to four candidates before joining Slemons' campaign. I suppose, the longer our streak goes on, the more we'll become an issue... even when others are doing the same things."

Since getting together in the Caspers' campaign, the pair has handled most of the major Democratic campaigns in the county, plus those for every present member of the Board of Supervisors.

However, Butcher hedges a bit on the controversial 1972 reelection campaign for Supervisor Robert Battin against attorney William Werke, which, to many observers, was perhaps the dirtiest campaign in recent county history.

"We worked on that one," Butcher admitted, "but we didn't get into it until the last month or so of the general election. Frankly, that was the most screwed-up campaign I've ever seen. Everyone and his brother was involved in that one and, honest to

God, no one knew what anyone else was doing." Butcher denied having any connection with one controversial tactic in that campaign, the mailing of phony letters from President Richard Nixon and Sen. Edward F. Kennedy to Republican and Democratic voters.

The letters were sent during the latter part of the campaign and purported to show support for Battin from each of the men. However, a post-election check with the offices of each, showed that neither had written an endorsement for Battin.

"No, I didn't write them," Butcher said, in response to a question. "And, I'm telling you the truth when I say I don't know who did. So many people were working on that campaign that when someone tells you they don't know who did what, you can believe them."

During a prelection interview, the two men agreed to make some predictions about the outcome of their various races. It is interesting to look back now and see how well they turned out.

Both Butcher and Forde agreed then that Badham's congressional race could be their toughest because of a relatively large field and the fact that former Rep. John G. Schmitz carried a built-in bloc of votes. However, Badham eked out a victory by slightly more than 1,000 votes.

In contrast, both men felt their strongest client was Andrew Banks in the 69th Assembly District. Butcher called Banks "the most certain winner we have." However, Banks lost the Republican primary to one-time Democratic Assemblyman William Dannemeyer by nearly 2 to 1.

Butcher and Forde felt that Siemons, in the Republican 74th Assembly race, was probably their least likely winner. They noted that he was competing in a large field, had started late, lacked established support and, as an auto dealer, was in a profession that had a poor reputation.

Siemons won the nomination handily, soundly defeating the prelection favorite, Mrs. Marian Bergeson of Newport Beach.

Both men also were reasonably confident that Jesse Davis, Mayor of Buena Park, would win the Democratic nomination in the 71st District, noting that he was the mayor of the district's largest city, had been around a long time and was running a strong campaign.

Davis lost to Chet Wray, a United Auto Workers official. As for the two supervisorial races, the pair said they felt Riley would do well, although they admitted the campaign

had been several times as costly as they had anticipated. They indicated that Anthony should manage to at least make it into the runoff against Santa Ana Councilman Harry Yamamoto.

As it turned out, they were right in both cases. Riley's campaign was almost a classic Butcher-Forde operation.

As an appointed supervisor and a retired Marine Corps brigadier general, Riley was a political neophyte. Thus, when Butcher and Forde approached him last August, he accepted their proposal to handle his campaign.

At the time, Riley had no known opposition and the pair set up a commission structure and a budget that admittedly were low-key, feeling there would be little real work to do. Then, just before the close of the candidate filing period, a wealthy retired trucking executive, Max Binswanger, jumped into the campaign.

"That really turned things around," said Butcher, "and we had to draw up a brand new budget."

John Rau, who served as Riley's official campaign manager, said Binswanger's challenge did more than that.

"We wound up with three budgets," he explained. "The first one, a medium one and a maximum one, based on what we thought Binswanger might spend."

"We even had to revise the maximum one finally, after our mailing costs went sky-high because of a sudden jump in the number of registered voters. It wasn't anyone's fault; that's just the way it happened."

Riley wound up spending more than \$200,000. But, as Butcher explained, "we had to budget to win and we had to figure out how much Binswanger might spend, then match it or beat it."

As it turned out, Binswanger, who dumped \$90,000 of his own money into his campaign at first, did not continue to spend heavily and wound up spending only about half as much as Riley.

But, as Rau said after the election, "we had no way of knowing that beforehand. We had to assume that he had it and that he'd spend it."

As for Banks, he admitted that he "was shocked by his loss to Dannemeyer but refused to lay the blame on Butcher and Forde.

"Somehow," he said, while studying the results of the primary, "we didn't do the right thing." Then, he paused . . . but, they (Butcher and Forde) are still the best ones around. They are expensive as hell, but

you get what you pay for. If the same circumstances came up again, I'd use them again, without a doubt."

Jubilant over his victory, Dannemeyer said he felt voters had rejected the Butcher-Forde type of campaign.

"Their basic premise that they would be able to deceive the voters came back to haunt them," he said. "Like the phone bank and the letter which tried to give Banks the

status of being the Republican Assemblyman . . . It all came back in their face. It's sad, frankly, that we have to see that type of tactic and I hope it is stopped."

However, Butcher said a post-election survey of 300 voters in the 69th District — commissioned in an effort to "find out what happened" — indicated that Dannemeyer's win was not a reaction to Banks' campaign tactics.

"Only 1.6% — four people — said they voted for Dannemeyer because they didn't like Banks' campaign tactics and only one person thought to mention that they objected to the implication that Banks was the GOP candidate," Butcher said.

"The real reason was that we simply underestimated the depth of the voters' commitment to Dannemeyer. The outcome was almost exactly parallel with the results of an earlier survey, which means that those who initially supported Dannemeyer stayed with him all the way.

"If we had realized that, we would have run more of an anti-Dannemeyer campaign in an effort to overcome that. Frankly, I really wasn't all that impressed by the things that Danne-

meyer did during the campaign. He would up with the same vote he'd have gotten if there hadn't been any campaign at all.

"But, I'll say this for him," Butcher continued. "I have never seen a candidate with a commitment from the voters in so many different areas. For instance, our survey showed that people were voting for Dannemeyer because he was the most conservative, because of his past record, because of his honesty and integrity and because he was the most experienced and qualified.

"I just hope he doesn't screw up."

Dear Commissioners:

Pursuant to the request of your General Counsel, John G. Murphy, Jr., of June 4, 1976, this letter is submitted in response to the complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission by John G. Schmitz, dated May 25, 1976.

This response is directed to what we take to be the allegations of the complaint, that the \$20,000 payment from a state legislative campaign fund (The Badham Fund) maintained by an incumbent state assemblyman, Robert E. Badham, to Opinion Research was in fact a payment made for political research and opinion sampling for a congressional campaign, and/or for advance payment to campaign managers for a congressional campaign. Since we do not feel either allegation is well taken, we have not delved into what percentage of the funds in The Badham Fund at the time the payment was made may have been corporate contributions, but will assume for purposes of discussion that at least some corporate contributions were involved.

This letter will outline the events that did in fact transpire, by way of background for your consideration of this matter. We will be glad to provide affidavits or further information on any aspect of this matter you feel is relevant to your consideration.

Background and Payment to Opinion Research

"The Badham Fund," from which the payment in question was made, is the campaign fund maintained by incumbent State Assemblyman Robert E. Badham for expenses of his campaigns for re-election to the State Assembly, for expenses of travel between his district and the State Capitol in Sacramento, and for miscellaneous expenses related to constituent service from his district office. The most recent solicitation and receipt of contributions into this fund was in 1974, in connection with Assemblyman Badham's 1974 re-election campaign.

In mid-1975, early in his seventh term as a state assemblyman, Assemblyman Badham began consulting with several close political associates regarding the possibilities of running for higher office in 1976, instead of for re-election to the state assembly. Although various offices were talked about, including the congressional seat Badham eventually ran for, no decision was made, and during this entire period of discussion Badham assiduously and deliberately avoided making any public statements or commitments, soliciting any contributions, or taking any overt action, to run for any particular office in 1976, and repeatedly told supporters that he himself had not yet made a decision. During this period Badham did meet or talk on occasions with various possible opponents for different offices, and to the extent he could, attempted to persuade these potential opponents of the seriousness of his own possible intentions to run for whatever political office the opponent may have been considering, to the end of keeping the field clear. One such meeting was held, as the complaint alleges, with John G. Schmitz, newspaper publisher William Moses, and Badham, in April, 1975, but neither Badham nor Mr. Moses have the recollection of the categorical statements made during that meeting that Mr. Schmitz alleges.

In mid-summer, 1975, Badham decided to use a part of the funds in The Badham Fund to take an in-depth public opinion survey as a basis for making a decision as to what direction to go at that point in his political career.

The purpose of the survey, as it was eventually contracted for, would be to assess Badham's strength and position in general as an incumbent assemblyman, and specifically to assess the viability of the various options potentially open to him in the near future: campaigns for re-election to his present assembly seat in 1976, or for election to a state senate seat likely to open up in 1978, to a congressional seat with a vulnerable incumbent in 1976, or to a county supervisorial seat up for election in 1976 and again in 1978. Badham's assembly district is almost completely contained

within the boundaries of the district of these other offices, and the boundaries of these districts generally coincide with each other, making one survey and analysis useful in examining a number of options. The survey would also incidentally be used to measure the relative strength of likely candidates for Badham's assembly seat, should he not run for re-election.

In early August, 1975, Badham entered into an agreement with Opinion Research of California, one of the leading survey research firms in California, to take this survey and to provide a written analysis. By the terms of the agreement, Badham would receive the exclusive services of Opinion Research and their consultants, William Butcher and Arnold Forde, to design and conduct the survey, analyze the results in light of their independent study of socio-economic patterns, vote patterns, and media effectiveness in the area surveyed, and based on that analysis, to make a written report and recommendation to Assemblyman Badham. Because of the mounting pressures on Badham from various supporters to make a decision, and previously-scheduled "state legislative report" meetings in the district on September 4, 1975, the survey was to be completed and the full written report delivered to Badham no later than September 1, 1975.

No formal written agreement was drawn, but a letter confirming the agreement described, dated August 14, 1975, was sent to Badham by Opinion Research, and a copy is attached.

Pursuant to this agreement, the \$20,000 complained of was paid to Opinion Research for the survey and analysis, in the form of two checks drawn on The Badham Fund, dated August 3, 1975 and August 13, 1975, in the amount of \$10,000 each. This expenditure was duly reported on the "Committee Campaign Statement" filed with the California Secretary of State by The Badham Fund, as required by state law, for the period July 1, 1975, through December 31, 1975.

The survey results and the written report were delivered to Badham, along with a verbal presentation, at a meeting with Butcher and Forde on or about September 1, 1975.

#### The Congressional Campaign

Based on the results of the survey, Badham made his decision to run for the republican nomination for congress in 1976 against an incumbent shown by the survey to be very vulnerable, rather than wait for the speculative eventuality of a senate or

supervisory seat to open up in 1978. It should be emphasized that the entire cost of the survey in question was paid, and the entire product received and used, before the decision was made to run for congress, and before any overt act was taken.

The chronology of the events initiating the congressional campaign, subsequent to the survey and analysis, emphasizes this sequence:

- 9/3/75 - Badham makes first announcement of intent to run for Congress to cocktail party of close supporters, and first appeal for donations.
- 9/4/75 - Badham makes first public announcement of intent to run for Congress at previously-scheduled "legislative report meetings" at two locations in his assembly district. These events were similar to meetings held by Assemblyman Badham in previous years.
- 9/4/75 - The Badham Congressional Committee is formed, and Statement of Organization signed and mailed to the Clerk of the House, in anticipation of receiving contributions from appeal on September 3, 1975.

#### Campaign Management Services

No campaign management services were provided for or in any way included in the \$20,000 paid to Opinion Research for the survey and analysis work. Subsequent to the agreement with Opinion Research for the survey work, and separate and apart from that agreement, the independent services of William Butcher and Arnold Forde were engaged to plan and direct Badham's campaign for Congress. Their fee for this service consisted of commissions they would receive from various vendors whose services they would engage for printed material and telephone banks, and of a guarantee of an additional \$10,000 management fee if Badham won the primary nomination.

#### Alleged Use of Survey for Congressional Campaign

As outlined above, the purpose of the survey was to provide information on which to make a decision whether to seek another office, and which of several offices were potentially winnable. The survey was not designed to be a campaign tool, and did

not probe extensively into potential campaign issues. As evidence of its limitations for campaign purposes, the Badham Congressional Committee itself paid \$750 to Opinion Research on March 16, 1976, for survey work for campaign purposes (reported on Report filed with the Federal Elections Commission for the period 1/1/76 through 3/31/76).

Argument

Assemblyman Badham did not believe the \$20,000 payment could be construed as a payment in connection with a campaign for federal office, since he was not a candidate at the time the payment was made, and was actually considering several options. The allegations of the complaint, we feel, are without foundation, because a survey taken for bona-fide independent purposes before a decision is made to run for congressional office does not become a congressional campaign expenditure simply by virtue of that subsequent decision, and because no portion of that expenditure paid for any campaign management services of any kind.

After the decision was made to run for Congress, a committee was formed and looked into the federal reporting requirements, but no indication was found that this payment had been made illegal by a decision to run for Congress made after the payment was made and after the product was received and had seen its use.

Further research in light of the inquiry from the Federal Elections Commission has, however, turned up indications, such as those in Regulations proposed on May 26, 1976, that there is a body of opinion that this is at least a murky area, and there are ramifications to this type of expenditure that at least bear inquiry by the Commission. Thus, while we are firmly of the opinion that not only was there no intent to violate federal campaign expenditure requirements, but that there was in fact no violation, we are completely willing to provide the Commission with whatever information they will need to make a decision in this matter, and further, we will be completely guided in our actions by any eventual decision of the Commission. Every effort has been made by the Badham Congressional Committee so far, evidenced in no small part by the time put in by the CPA who is the Committee's treasurer, to comply with the letter and, to the extent it could be determined, with the spirit of the Federal Elections Campaign Act. In this developing area, we recognize that there may be opinions of interpretation different than ours, and we will be guided by the decision of the Commission so that we will be in complete compliance with the requirements in this instance also.

The Federal Election Commission has received a complaint asserting that you have committed violations of certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the Act). In particular, the complaint alleges that you made a \$20,000 expenditure to a group called Opinion Research of California which expenditures were actually used in part to defray the cost of services rendered to your Federal Congressional campaign, but were unreported as such; in addition, the complaint asserts that the expenditure to Opinion Research involved corporate money. A copy of the complaint is enclosed with this letter.

The Commission is forwarding this information to you to apprise you that these matters have been raised; it has made no determination that the matters fall within its jurisdiction or that the allegations made set forth any violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

The Commission is presently reviewing this matter to determine what action, if any, it should take. Under the Act the Commission must consider such matters expeditiously; accordingly, please submit within 10 days of receipt of this letter any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of the matters set forth in the complaint. Dear Mr. Chairman:

In accordance with Public Law 94-283, Section 109, I am herewith filing a sworn complaint against Robert E. Badham, who is purported to be the successful Republican primary candidate for nomination to the House of Representatives from the 40th Congressional District in California.

The basis for the complaint is Mr. Badham's use in his campaign of at least \$20,000 in corporate donations. I am informed and believe and based thereon state that certain contributions were originally made to him in California State Legislative campaigns, were commingled with individual contributions, and were subsequently utilized in his Federal Congressional campaign for the June 8, 1976 primary election.

In support of this complaint, I have attached and incorporated as if fully set forth herein, Exhibit "A", a summary of evidence extracted from Mr. Badham's campaign committee reports in his election contests for the California State Legislature. Additionally, I have included as a part of Exhibit "A" documents which I am informed and believe are true and complete copies of Mr. Badham's election committee reports as filed with the California Secretary of State.

It is my position that these additional and illegal funds

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materially aided in Mr. Badham's narrow winning margin of 1147 votes, and since there is no specific adequate remedy enumerated in Public Law 94-283, it is respectfully requested that the Federal Elections Commission file a civil suit to declare that Mr. Badham illegally won the election, that the 40th Congressional District of California Republican primary election of June 8, 1976, is void, and that Mr. Badham be assessed a civil penalty of \$20,000.

It is further respectfully requested that since the winners of the California primaries will be certified on July 2, 1976, such action be initiated at the earliest possible time.



In previous election contests for the California State Assembly Mr. Badham reported spending the following amounts:

The summary of the Badham Fund for the period January 7, 1975 to December 31, 1975 shows total expenditures of \$34,608.72. This large amount, spent in a non-election year, when contrasted with the total amounts expended in Mr. Badham's 1970, 1972 and 1974 California Assembly election contests evidences that commingled corporate funds were spent to obtain the Republican nomination to the United States Congress in the 40th California Congressional District.

It is my belief that Assemblyman Robert Badham stated his intention to seek a nomination to Congress prior to the expenditure of commingled corporate funds and that this intention was known to Opinion Research of California officials. It is my further belief that this \$20,000 expenditure was intended to be a management consultant fee for both the primary and general election races and such intention had been stated to other members of the California Assembly. Said statements were made during the year 1975 and prior to the date he formally announced his candidacy for Congress.

Regarding the "Badham Fund" and expenditures from it, it is hereby requested that your Commission ascertain the following information:

- A. The exact dates of the expenditures listed covering the period January 7, 1975 to December 31, 1975;
- B. The names of all persons who attended the events in said report;
- C. The specific campaign matters discussed at such events;
- D. The identify of the owners of Opinion Research of California;
- E. The persons in Opinion Research of California Mr. Badham or his representatives dealt with in the transactions which resulted in the expenditure of \$20,000 of corporate funds;
- F. The dates on which such discussions and negotiations were held; and,
- G. The specific details of such discussions, negotiations and resultant campaign services.

It is submitted that such information would reveal the true but illegal nature of this expenditure; and that it would further reveal

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that officials and/or representatives of Opinion Research of California may have conspired with Mr. Badham to circumvent the Federal Election Law under the guise of conducting a public attitude poll related to matters pertinent to Mr. Badham's duties as a member of the California State Legislature when in fact such survey would reasonably cost no more than \$2,500, and that any higher amount paid to Opinion Research of California, i.e., \$20,000, would be patently excessive. I submit that an examination of the contents of this public attitude poll will confirm this contention and will confirm that the poll and the expenditure for it were designed to be useful in Mr. Badham's race for the United States Congress. It is my information and belief that the owners or proprietors of Opinion Research of California are Arnold Forde and William Butcher. I am informed and believe and based thereon state that Mr. Forde and Mr. Butcher served as managers for Mr. Badham's campaign. I am informed and believe and based thereon state that it is the practice of Mr. Forde and Mr. Butcher to obtain their remuneration for service as campaign managers by means of payments back to them of moneys received from candidates by other entities participating in the campaign, and that one such entity is Opinion Research of California. The "Badham Congressional Committee" report dated April 10, 1976, shows expenditures to Opinion Research of California totaling \$1,950 in addition to the expenditure of \$20,000 to Opinion Research of California out of the "Badham Fund" - which I am informed and believe included commingled corporate money. I submit that this supports my belief and contention that the said \$20,000 expenditure was intended

to purchase campaign services related to Mr. Badham's efforts to seek Federal office, utilizing corporate money left over from his California State Assembly campaign funds.

The Federal Election Commission has received a complaint asserting that you have committed violations of certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the Act). In particular, the complaint alleges that you made a \$20,000 expenditure to a group called Opinion Research of California which expenditures were actually used in part to defray the cost of services rendered to your Federal Congressional campaign, but were unreported as such; in addition, the complaint asserts that the expenditure to Opinion Research involved corporate money. A copy of the complaint is enclosed with this letter.

The Commission is forwarding this information to you to apprise you that these matters have been raised; it has made no determination that the matters fall within its jurisdiction or that the allegations made set forth any violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

The Commission is presently reviewing this matter to determine what action, if any, it should take. Under the Act the Commission must consider such matters expeditiously; accordingly, please submit within 10 days of receipt of this letter any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's analysis of the matters set forth in the complaint. I would find it helpful if the submissions were made in the form of sworn statements by individuals with personal knowledge of the matters alleged.

To whom it may concern:

As a candidate for the Republican nomination to the United States House of Representatives from California's 40th Congressional District, I think that it would be appropriate for the Federal Election Commission to look into a significant and questionable expenditure made by State Assemblyman and declared congressional candidate Robert E. Badham. I am of the opinion that Mr. Badham may have used corporate contributions collected for a State Assembly race. Such corporate contributions are prohibited in his congressional campaign by the Federal Election Campaign Law, Title 18, Chapter 29, Section 610.

Under California law, the corporate contributions were legal when they were made. At that time Mr. Badham was a State Assemblyman seeking re-election to the State Assembly and not prohibited from accepting corporate contributions.

I have enclosed materials to support my contention; review of the enclosed exhibits will show:

- 1. After the 1974 general election in which Assemblyman Badham was re-elected to the California State Assembly, he transferred \$45,972 from the ELECT BADHAM '74 FUND to the BADHAM FUND. Both of these official funds were depositories for contributions raised in support of his assembly election.

Investigation of financial statements submitted to the California Secretary of State will show that the ELECT BADHAM '74 FUND and consequently THE BADHAM FUND contained corporate money.

- 2. During the period from July 1, 1975 through December 31, 1975, the BADHAM FUND made a \$20,000 expenditure to Opinion Research, 1232 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California 90804, for a "District/Area In Depth Demographic Study & Research." The quoted text was verified with the California Secretary of State's Office.

Opinion Research of California, the same firm receiving the \$20,000 expenditure, is the campaign management firm handling the congressional campaign of Mr. Badham.

Several questions necessarily arise from these facts:

- 1. Local experts in the field of public opinion polls agree that \$20,000 is an exorbitant sum for a poll of either the 7th Assembly District (Badham's) or the 40th Congressional District. Since Mr. Badham's financial statements to the F.E.C. indicated no payment to his campaign management firm, it is conceivable that a portion of the \$20,000 fee was a retainer to Opinion Research to handle the congressional race.
- 2. See the verbiage of the poll invoice as described in congressional explanation. If the latter, then should it not have appeared in the financial statements submitted to the F.E.C.?

I believe that the poll was directed to voters outside the limits of the 74th Assembly District (i.e. the 40th Congressional District). This would clearly indicate the congressional intent of the survey.

I believe that Mr. Badham failed to follow proper procedures regarding the use of his BADHAM FUND contributions. My legal counsel informs me that Mr. Badham could have properly used the BADHAM FUND for this expenditure if Mr. Badham had 1) declared the BADHAM fund as personal income, and 2) paid the appropriate taxes for this personal income. Use of corporate money constitutes a serious violation of the law.

I would hope that the Federal Election Commission investigates this matter at the earliest opportunity. The primary election is June 8th and corrective action, if appropriate, should take place before that date.

If the Federal Election Commission finds merit in this complaint, I believe that Mr. Badham should be required to pay \$20,000 to Opinion Research from his BADHAM CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE fund. This is the fund that should have made the expenditure in the first place.



# Badham 'Leads' Schmitz in Campaign

Assemblyman Robert Badham (Newport Beach) said today he will be the front runner in the republican primary campaign for the 40th Congressional District despite John Schmitz' sudden entry into the race Wednesday.

Badham said the conservative former congressman's decision to run "came as somewhat of a surprise but it wasn't unforeseen by my campaign planning."

"My polls indicate I am the leader in this race and one more candidate isn't going to make much difference one way or the other," Badham said, scoffing at the claim by Schmitz that 39 percent of the district voters support him.

Schmitz said in a telephone interview his campaign will be geared to compete with Badham and "the political machine that's been running things around here." Both Badham and Schmitz are from Newport Beach. Both are considered conservatives.

Schmitz charged Badham has opened himself to attack for hiring longtime political operatives

Bill Butcher and Arnold Ford to conduct his campaign. "That will be a problem for Bob because Butcher and Ford have been linked in the past to the Cella organization," Schmitz asserted, referring to Dr. Louis Cella, one of California's biggest campaign donors who has been indicted by a grand jury. "Badham denied belonging to a political machine, but conceded he has hired Ford's and Butcher's firm, Opinion Research, to conduct his campaign."

Badham turned the gun on Schmitz, contending, "John's always been controlled by a certain cadre of individuals who tell him what to do and when to do it."

Schmitz' entry into the congressional race means he has abandoned a bid for the Republican U.S. Senate nomination.



### CONTRIBUTORS

In the 1972 primary, Badham received contributions from many established "name" Republicans: J.S. Flour, Bob Beaver, Tom Rogers, Joe Irvine, Bill Dannaneyer, Willard Voit, Carl Kymle, Keith Gaede, Gus Owen, Henry Segerstrom, Pat Nagel, Willis Clemons, Marshall Duffield, Herbert Strosheim. This is the last Assembly election in which Badham received a large number of individual contributions. (He did receive some individual contributions in 1973 from various people, including: Vic Andrews, Marcia Bents, Ron Caspers, Jim Beam, Gary Burrill, and Bruce Swartout. Also contributing in 1973 were these repeaters from 1972: Henry Segerstrom, Herb Strosheim, Marshall Duffield, Tom Rogers, J.S. Flour, and Willard Voit.)

Also contributing in the 1972 primary were 16 corporations, including two air line--Golden West and Air California--and two oil companies--Union Oil of California and Standard Oil of Calif. Various special interest groups also contributed: California Savings and Loan League, Western Mobile Industries, Calif. Funeral Directors, Calif. Brewers Association, Calif. State Employees Assn. The General Telephone Employees Good Government Club contributed \$600.

In the general election of '72 over half of his contributors were corporations or special interest groups. There were no "name" Republicans listed for the general election. Among the corporations contributing were three finance companies, two banks, two department stores, and four trucking firms. Included in the 17 associations or committees that contributed in the '72

general were six from the medical professions and two from the financial people--loan and finance assn and the bankers assn.

Listed contributions for the '72 election were: CREPAC (Calif. Real Estate PAC) \$750; United for California \$1,500.

As 1973 was a non-election year, Badham normally would not have to file. However the Waxman-Dymally Act was to take affect and to start fresh everyone had to declare what they received in 1973.

The "name" contributors have already been listed above. Most of his contributions came from corporations--56 in all. Listed contributions were: Irvine, Co. \$1,400; Don Koll Co. \$1,000; a pharmaceutical firm whose name is not legible on our copy of the report, \$1,000; AVCO Community Development, \$750. Among the rest of the corporations were 18 temporary help companies, four law firms, and two companies from the oil industry. There were 17 associations or committees which gave to his fund in 1973 including two associations of temporary help companies.

Badham entered the 1974 primary with such a surplus of funds from '73 that he took in very few contributions for his primary election. His big contributors were: R.S. Barnes, \$100; Randall Smith, \$100; Don Cooper, \$100; Saffell & McAdam, \$100; Calif. Barber College Assn, Inc., \$75; Pacific Lighting Corp., \$200; Associated Master Barbers + Stylists of Calif., \$100.

There were three individual contributors to Badham in the general election of '74: Gary Burrill, \$100; Ed Hieth, \$25; and Ralph and Dorothy Clock, \$50. Sixteen corporations gave money

to Badham including two insurance companies, two finance companies, and two oil companies. Thirty-seven associations or committees also gave money in the fall of '74: four from the insurance people, three from the medical professions, three from the financial institutions, and three alcoholic beverage associations.

After the '74 general election, Badham transferred all the surplus monies from his Elect Badham '74 account into a new account--The Badham Fund and named himself treasurer. In 1975 this fund only received one contribution, \$500 from the May Co.

Badham formed a new committee at the beginning fo 1975 called the Badham Committee. This committee received a \$500 contribution from the Western Mobile Home Indusrty PAC. This was the only contribution for the reporting period of 1-7-75 to 6-30-75.

The next reporting period was from 7-1-75 to 12-31-75. During this time the Badham Fund reported receiving no monies.

The Badham Committee reported receiving two contributions: \$100 each from Charles Franklin and Ray Campbell.

He formed the Badham Congressional Committee in the summer of 1975.

The first report of this committee showed \$26,400 received in contributions--all from individuals. Among those contributing were: Doroty and Glen Stillwell, \$1,000 each; John Lusk, \$1,000; Ed Ward, \$1,000; John Rau, \$1,000; George Jeffries, \$1,000; K.W. Carlson, \$1,000; Alexander Bowie, \$1,000; Gene Washburn, \$500; Nancy Shook, \$500; Pat Nagel, \$500; Robert Charbonneau, \$500; G. D. Buccola, \$400. Also contributing were: Bob Beaver, \$200; E. B. Buster, \$200; Frank Michelena, \$300; Paul Presley, \$300; Henry Segerstrom, \$200; Jim Siemens, \$200.

The first report of the congressional committee was for the quarter ending September 30, 1975. The latest report by the congressional committee, for the last quarter of 1975, show contributions received of \$4,025. The big contributors were: Gary Rollason, \$500; George Argyros, \$1,000. The rest were \$100 or \$200 contributions.

EXPENDITURES

Most of Badham's expenditures, as reported, were related to campaigning. There are, however, a few items I wish to point out.

Either Badham started out 1972 with a surplus of funds from his previous campaigns or he ended the year with a deficit because he spent more in 1972 than he raised. The figures are: raised, \$33,850; spent, \$35,009; deficit, \$1,159.

In the primary of '72 his committee spent \$258 for a poll done by the Orange County Observer--the newspaper of the Orange County Republican Central Committee.

His Elect Badham '74 Committee, in its 1973 report, showed an expenditure of \$31.58 to Nancy Bettcher to attend a campaign college. Bettcher at that time was on his legislative staff not his campaign staff.

Another interesting note is that the 1973 report for the Elect Badham '74 Committee showed \$56,619 in contributions, \$10,893 in expenditures, for a balance of \$45,736. Yet the first filing of the same committee in 1974 showed cash on hand at \$47,217--a net gain of \$1,481 in unaccounted for receipts. Also during the same first report \$38 was reimbursed to Nancy Bettcher for her lodging and expenses at a State Republican function at San Jose, CA.

During this filing period, 1-1-74 to 5-7-74, Badham paid taxes of \$296 Federal and \$2 State on the interest from the investments of the campaign contributions received in 1973.

There were no other expenditures worthy of note in 1974 from this fund.

At the close of the elections in '74, Badham transferred the balance of the money, \$45,972, from Elect Badham '74 to The Badham Fund.

The first filing period for the Badham Fund was 12-8-74 to 1-6-75. During this period it expended \$469.93. Included in the expenditures was a payment of \$114.25 to BankAmericard for "entertainment (staff & constituent)" and \$40.90 for "staff Christmas." Also there was listed \$10 for office petty cash. During this period Badham paid \$593 in U.S. taxes, and \$157 in California taxes on interest earned in 1974.

For the period 1-7-75 to 6-30-75, the Badham Fund spent \$7,516, leaving it with a balance of \$39,134. Included in the expenditures was a total of \$239 ± spent on "staff expense". Nancy Betcher received \$37.

The Badham Committee was formed during this reporting period but showed no expenditures.

In the next reporting period, 7-1-75 to 12-31-75, the Badham Fund spent \$27,092, leaving it with a balance of \$11,997. The big expenditure was the \$20,000 paid to Opinion Research of California for "District/area indepth demographic study and research." The majority of the remaining \$7,000+ was spent under the listing of campaign promotion. For the items listed as staff expenses the total was \$347 ±.

The big expenditure for the Badham Committee for this period was \$250 to the RSCCC for the Congressional Target Dinner Committee.

The congressional committee showed no expenditures for the quarter ending September 30, 1975. But the filing does show debts of \$5,881 accrued from fund raising activities. The year-end report of this committee showed the payments of the above mentioned debts as the only expenditures.

The congressional committee had a balance of \$24,094 at the end of the last quarter.

The following are various points I think you might want to discuss with the attorneys:

- At the end of 1974 when Badham transferred the surplus monies from Elect Badham '74 to The Badham Fund, he listed the business of the Badham Fund as 1649 Westcliff Dr., Newport Beach. This is the address of his legislative office.
- The total of the various staff expenditures mentioned above in the report is \$820 +. Nancy Bettcher received \$108 +. This could be important as Nancy Bettcher as always worked on Badham's Legislative staff and not on his campaign staff. Also, some of the staff expense items are listed in off-election years when he did not have a campaign staff--let alone a campaign headquarters that would require petty cash.
- An item to watch would be the Badham Committee. On the report, under the heading "Name of candidate and office," it listed "Robert E. Badham, Assembly, 74th District." This should be watched to see if any money raised by the committee is used on a campaign other than a campaign in 74th District race.
- A possible inference could be drawn from his expenditures all those items listed in 1975 as campaign promotion, that he had made his mind up to run long before the official announcement.
- Ninety-two corporations and eighty associations or committees contributed to Badham since the 1972 primary. All the amounts are not available due to the old filing laws.

To whom it may concern:

As a candidate for the Republican nomination to the United States House of Representatives from California's 40th Congressional District, I think that it would be appropriate for the Federal Election Commission to look into a significant and questionable expenditure made by State Assemblyman and declared congressional candidate Robert E. Badham. I am of the opinion that Mr. Badham may have used corporate contributions collected for a State Assembly race. Such corporate contributions are prohibited in his congressional campaign by the Federal Election Campaign Law, Title 18, Chapter 29, Section 610.

Under California law, the corporate contributions were legal when they were made. At that time Mr. Badham was a State Assemblyman seeking re-election to the State Assembly and not prohibited from accepting corporate contributions.

I have enclosed materials to support my contention; review of the enclosed exhibits will show:

1. After the 1974 general election in which Assemblyman Badham was re-elected to the California State Assembly, he transferred \$45,972 from the ELECT BADHAM '74 FUND to the BADHAM FUND. Both of these official funds were depositories for contributions raised in support of his assembly election.

Investigation of financial statements submitted to the California Secretary of State will show that the ELECT BADHAM '74 FUND and consequently THE BADHAM FUND contained corporate money.

2. During the period from July 1, 1975 through December 31, 1975, the BADHAM FUND made a \$20,000 expenditure to Opinion Research, 1232 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California 90804, for a "District/Area In Depth Demographic Study & Research." The quoted text was verified with the California Secretary of State's Office.

Opinion Research of California, the same firm receiving the \$20,000 expenditure, is the campaign management firm handling the congressional campaign of Mr. Badham.

Several questions necessarily arise from these facts:

1. Local experts in the filed of public opinion polls agree that \$20,000 is an exhorbitant sum for a poll of either the 74th Assembly District (Badham's) or the 40th Congressional District. Since Mr. Badham's financial statements to the F.E.C. indicated no payment to his campaign management firm, it is conceivable that a portion of the \$20,000 fee was a retainer to Opinion Research to handle the congressional race.
2. Does the verbiage of the poll indicate an Assembly or Congressional orientation? If the latter, then should it not have appeared in the financial statements submitted to the F.E.C.?

I believe that the poll was directed to voters outside the limits of the 74th Assembly District (i.e. the 40th Congressional District). This would clearly indicate the congressional intent of the survey.

I believe that Mr. Badham failed to follow proper procedures regarding the use of his BADHAM FUND contributions. My legal counsel informs me that Mr. Badham could have properly used the BADHAM FUND for this expenditure if Mr. Badham had 1) declared the BADHAM fund as personal income, and 2) paid the appropriate taxes for this personal income. Use of corporate money constitutes a serious violation of the law.

I would hope that the Federal Election Commission investigates this matter at the earliest opportunity. The primary election is June 8th and corrective action, if appropriate, should take place before that date.

If the Federal Election Commission finds merit in this complaint, I believe that Mr. Badham should be required to pay \$20,000 to Opinion Research from his BADHAM CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE fund. This is the fund that should have made the expenditure in the first place.



Assemblyman Robert Badham (R-Newport Beach) said today he's still the front runner in the Republican primary campaign for the 40th Congressional District despite John Schmitz' sudden entry into the race Wednesday.

Badham said the conservative former congressman's decision to run "came as somewhat of a surprise but it wasn't unforeseen

by my campaign planning."

"My polls indicate I am the leader in this race and one more candidate isn't going to make much difference one way or the other," Badham said, scoffing at the claim by Schmitz that 39 percent of the district voters support him.

"John can claim anything he wants and usually does," Badham said.

Schmitz said in a telephone interview his campaign will be geared to compete with Badham and "the political machine that's been running things around here." Both Badham and Schmitz are from Newport Beach. Both are considered conservatives.

Schmitz charged Badham has opened himself to attack for hiring longtime political operatives

Bill Butcher and Arnold Ford to conduct his campaign.

"That will be a problem for Bob because Butcher and Ford have been linked in the past to the Cella organization," Schmitz asserted, referring to Dr. Louis Cella, one of California's biggest campaign donors who has been indicted by two grand juries.

Badham denied belonging to a political machine, but conceded

he has hired Ford's and Butcher's firm, Opinion Research, to conduct his campaign.

"I needed a professional staff because I don't have time to conduct a campaign and conduct Assembly business at the same time," Badham said. "That doesn't make me part of a machine."

Badham turned the gun on Schmitz, contending, "John's always been controlled by a certain cadre of individuals who tell him what to do and when to do it."

Schmitz' entry into the congressional race means he has abandoned a bid for the Republican U.S. Senate nomination.





In the 1972 primary, Badham received contributions from many established "name" Republicans: J.S. Flour, Bob Beaver, Tom Rogers, Joe Irvine, Bill Dannameyer, Willard Voit, Carl Kymla, Keith Gaede, Gus Owen, Henry Segerstrom, Pat Nagel, Willis Clemons, Marshall Duffield, Herbert Strosheim. This is the last Assembly election in which Badham received a large number of individual contributions. (He did receive some individual contributions in 1973 from various people, including: Vic Andrews, Marcia Bents, Ron Caspers, Jim Beam, Gary Burrill, and Bruce Swartout. Also contributing in 1973 were these repeaters from 1972: Henry Segerstrom, Herb Strosheim, Marshall Duffield, Tom Rogers, J.S. Flour, and Willard Voit.)

Also contributing in the 1972 primary were 16 corporations, including two air line--Golden West and Air California--and two oil companies--Union Oil of California and Standard Oil of Calif. Various special interest groups also contributed: California Savings and Loan League, Western Mobile Industries, Calif. Funeral Directors, Calif. Brewers Association, Calif. State Employees Assn. The General Telephone Employees Good Government Club contributed \$600.

In the general election of '72 over half of his contributors were corporations or special interest groups. There were no "name" Republicans listed for the general election. Among the corporations contributing were three finance companies, two banks, two department stores, and four trucking firms. Included in the 17 associations or committees that contributed in the '72

general were six from the medical professions and two from the financial people--loan and finance assn and the bankers assn.

Listed contributions for the '72 election were: CREPAC (Calif. Real Estate PAC) \$750; United for California \$1,500.

As 1973 was a non-election year, Badham normally would not have to file. However the Waxman-Dymally Act was to take affect and to start fresh everyone had to declare what they received in 1973.

The "name" contributors have already been listed above. Most of his contributions came from corporations--56 in all. Listed contributions were: Irvine, Co. \$1,400; Don Koll Co. \$1,000; a pharmaceutical firm whose name is not legible on our copy of the report, \$1,000; AVCO Community Development, \$750. Among the rest of the corporations were 18 temporary help companies, four law firms, and two companies from the oil industry. There were 17 associations or committees which gave to his fund in 1973 including two associations of temporary help companies.

Badham entered the 1974 primary with such a surplus of funds from '73 that he took in very few contributions for his primary election. His big contributors were: R.S. Barnes, \$100; Randall Smith, \$100; Don Cooper, \$100; Saffell & McAdam, \$100; Calif. Barber College Assn, Inc., \$75; Pacific Lighting Corp., \$200; Associated Master Barbers + Stylists of Calif., \$100.

There were three individual contributors to Badham in the general election of '74: Gary Burrill, \$100; Ed Hieth, \$25; and Ralph and Dorothy Clock, \$50. Sixteen corporations gave money

to Badham including two insurance companies, two finance companies, and two oil companies. Thirty-seven associations or committees also gave money in the fall of '74: four from the insurance people, three from the medical professions, three from the financial institutions, and three alcoholic beverage associations.

After the '74 general election, Badham transferred all the surplus monies from his Elect Badham '74 account into a new account--The Badham Fund and named himself treasurer. In 1975 this fund only received one contribution, \$500 from the May Co.

Badham formed a new committee at the beginning fo 1975 called the Badham Committee. This committee received a \$500 contribution from the Western Mobile Home Indusrty PAC. This was the only contribution for the reporting period of 1-7-75 to 6-30-75.

The next reporting period was from 7-1-75 to 12-31-75. During this time the Badham Fund reported receiving no monies.

The Badham Committee reported receiving two contributions: \$100 each from Charles Franklin and Ray Campbell.

He formed the Badham Congressional Committee in the summer of 1975.

The first report of this committee showed \$26,400 received in contributions--all from individuals. Among those contributing were: Doroty and Glen Stillwell, \$1,000 each; John Lusk, \$1,000; Ed Ward, \$1,000; John Rau, \$1,000; George Jeffries, \$1,000; K.W. EXPENDITURES

Most of Badham's expenditures, as reported, were related to campaigning. There are, however, a few items I wish to point out.

Either Badham started out 1972 with a surplus of funds from his previous campaigns or he ended the year with a deficit because he spent more in 1972 than he raised. The figures are: raised, \$33,850; spent, \$35,009; deficit, \$1,159.

In the primary of '72 his committee spent \$258 for a poll done by the Orange County Observer--the newspaper of the Orange County Republican Central Committee.

His Elect Badham '74 Committee, in its 1973 report, showed an expenditure of \$31.58 to Nancy Bettcher to attend a campaign college. Bettcher at that time was on his legislative staff not his campaign staff.

Another interesting note is that the 1973 report for the Elect Badham '74 Committee showed \$56,619 in contributions, \$10,893 in expenditures, for a balance of \$45,736. Yet the first filing of the same committee in 1974 showed cash on hand at \$47,217--a net gain of \$1,481 in unaccounted for receipts. Also during the same first report \$38 was reimbursed to Nancy Bettcher for her lodging and expenses at a State Republican function at San Jose, CA.

During this filing period, 1-1-74 to 5-7-74, Badham paid taxes of \$296 Federal and \$2 State on the interest from the investments of the campaign contributions received in 1973.

There were no other expenditures worthy of note in 1974 from this fund.

At the close of the elections in '74, Badham transferred the balance of the money, \$45,972, from Elect Badham '74 to The Badham Fund.

The first filing period for the Badham Fund was 12-8-74 to 1-6-75. During this period it expended \$469.93. Included in the expenditures was a payment of \$114.25 to BankAmericard for "entertainment (staff & constituent)" and \$40.90 for "staff Christmas." Also there was listed \$10 for office petty cash. During this period Badham paid \$593 in U.S. taxes, and \$157 in California taxes on interest earned in 1974.

For the period 1-7-75 to 6-30-75, the Badham Fund spent \$7,516, leaving it with a balance of \$39,134. Included in the expenditures was a total of \$239 ± spent on "staff expense". Nancy Betcher received \$37.

The Badham Committee was formed during this reporting period but showed no expenditures.

In the next reporting period, 7-1-75 to 12-31-75, the Badham Fund spent \$27,092, leaving it with a balance of \$11,997. The big expenditure was the \$20,000 paid to Opinion Research of California for "District/area indepth demographic study and research." The majority of the remaining \$7,000+ was spent under the listing of campaign promotion. For the items listed as staff expenses the total was \$347 ±.

The big expenditure for the Badham Committee for this period was \$250 to the RSCCC for the Congressional Target Dinner Committee.

The congressional committee showed no expenditures for the quarter ending September 30, 1975. But the filing does show debts of \$5,881 accrued from fund raising activities. The year-end report of this committee showed the payments of the above mentioned debts as the only expenditures.

The congressional committee had a balance of \$24,094 at the end of the last quarter.

The following are various points I think you might want to discuss with the attorneys:

- At the end of 1974 when Badham transferred the surplus monies from Elect Badham '74 to The Badham Fund, he listed the business of the Badham Fund as 1649 Westcliff Dr., Newport Beach. This is the address of his legislative office.
- The total of the various staff expenditures mentioned above in the report is \$820 +. Nancy Bettcher received \$108 +. This could be important as Nancy Bettcher as always worked on Badham's Legislative staff and not on his campaign staff. Also, some of the staff expense items are listed in off-election years when he did not have a campaign staff--let alone a campaign headquarters that would require petty cash.
- An item to watch would be the Badham Committee. On the report, under the heading "Name of candidate and office," it listed "Robert E. Badham, Assembly, 74th District." This should be watched to see if any money raised by the committee is used on a campaign other than a campaign in 74th District race.
- A possible inference could be drawn from his expenditures, all those items listed in 1975 as campaign promotion, that he had made his mind up to run long before the official announcement.
- Ninety-two corporations and eighty associations or committees contributed to Badham since the 1972 primary. All the amounts are not available due to the old filing laws.
