
Dear Mr. Eberle:

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. Reason to believe was found that the Bob Eberle for Congress committee ("Respondent") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(iii) by failing to file the October 15 and Year End 1982 Quarterly Reports.

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this Agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent was the principal campaign committee for congressional candidate, Bob Eberle, who lost in

September 14, 1982, Washington primary.

2. Respondent did not file the October 15, 1982, Quarterly Report, which was due on October 15, 1982, until August 3, 1983.

3. Respondent did not file the 1982 Year End Report, which was due on January 31, 1983, until August 3, 1983.

V. Respondent violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(iii) by failing to timely file the October 15 and Year End 1982 Quarterly Reports.

VI. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Respondent shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

SUBJECT: MUR 1560 - Bob Eberle for Congress

On August 4, 1983, the Commission found reason to believe that the Bob Eberle for Congress committee violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a)(2)(A)(iii) by failing to file the October 15 and Year End 1982 Quarterly Reports.

On September 6, 1983, the candidate, Bob Eberle, responded to the Commission's finding by stating that the reports in question had been filed. (The reports were filed on August 3, 1983). In addition, Mr. Eberle explained that the delay was due to his loss in the September 1982 primary election and the amount of time it took to sort records and verify data necessary to complete the reports. Mr. Eberle requested to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation.

In light of Mr. Eberle's request and the fact that no further investigation is needed in this matter, the General Counsel recommends that the Commission enter into pre-probable cause conciliation with the committee.

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Recommendations

1. Enter into pre-probable cause conciliation with the Bob Eberle for Congress committee.
2. Approve the attached conciliation agreement.
3. Approve the attached letter.

Dear Mr Chairman:

I am in receipt of Commission letters to Mr W J Fitzpatrick, Renton Washington, which have been forwarded to me at my temporary address in the Washington D C area: 507 N Roosevelt, #C115, Falls Church, Va 22044.

The final letter, dated August 9, referenced Commission action on August 4, concerning the Bob Eberle for Congress Committee failure "to file the October 15 and Year End 1982 Quarterly Reports". I call your attention to the fact that the FEC did receive the named reports on August 1, as I have verified at the Commission records office.

I very much regret the delay in providing the Commission with the required reports. You can no doubt appreciate the dissolutionary effect that the loss of the September 1982 primary election had on the Eberle campaign organization. Since the bookkeeping was a part of the volunteer organization, it simply became involved in the post-election chaos which surrounded the canceling of all campaign effort. I, myself, was not aware that deadlines had been missed until sometime during the first quarter of 1983.

In the meantime, it has taken considerable time to sort records and verify accuracy of data needed for the subject reports. Although we attempted to do so as expeditiously as possible, we were unable to accomplish this prior to August of this year.

For your consideration, I would like to offer the following as extenuating circumstances relative to the Eberle Committee actions in this affair:

- (1) As evidence of a good faith approach toward FEC reporting requirements I note that during the time when I was a candidate for Congress, no FEC report deadline was missed, and timely response was made to all commission inquiries.
- (2) As evidence of the Eberle Committee's intention to correct deficiencies in our reporting status, I note that we are currently operating in a catch-up mode, and expect to have the June 1983 report in-the-mail to the commission within the next three weeks.

I hereby request that prior to the Commission making a decision to proceed with additional action, I desire to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation on this matter.

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

Of course, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe if you so desire. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d).



**October Filing Notice for Unauthorized Political Committees
Filing Third Quarterly or Monthly
Reports of Receipts and Disbursements**

This notice summarizes the October reporting obligations of political committees which are not authorized by any Federal candidate. The notice explains requirements for filing reports of receipts and disbursements under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

THIRD QUARTERLY REPORT

Unauthorized political committees (i.e., committees not authorized by any Federal candidate) must file the Third Quarterly Report unless they are filing on a monthly basis (see below).

On this report, committees must disclose all reportable transactions from the later of:

- The date of registration, if this is the committee's first report;
- or
- The date of the close of books of the last report filed.

The Third Quarterly Report must disclose all financial activity of the committee not previously disclosed through September 30, 1982, and must be filed regardless of the amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period.

The Third Quarterly Report may be hand delivered no later than close of business October 15, 1982. Reports mailed first-class must be received no later than close of business October 15, 1982. Unauthorized committees reporting on a monthly filing schedule must file their monthly report by October 20, covering activity from September 1 through September 30, 1982. This report is filed in lieu of the Third Quarterly Report. 11 CFR 104.5(c)(3).

WHAT FORM TO USE

All unauthorized political committees should use FEC Form 3X with appropriate schedules for filing the report. If an unauthorized committee has qualified as a multicandidate committee during this reporting period, it should check the appropriate box on page one of FEC Form 3X. (See FEC Regulations at 100.5(e)(3) for the definition of a multicandidate committee.)

WHERE TO FILE

Committees should consult the instructions on the reverse side of the Summary Page of the reporting form for details on where to file their reports.

FAILURE TO FILE REPORTS

Committees should be aware that failure to file required reports may result in compliance proceedings under the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act. According to a revised Commission policy, although political committees that are not authorized by any Federal candidate will no longer receive mailgram notification of their failure to file reports, they nevertheless remain fully liable for failure to file any report required under the Act.

Unauthorized political committees (i.e., committees not authorized by any Federal candidate) must file the Third Quarterly Report unless they are filing on a monthly basis (see below).

On this report, committees must disclose all reportable transactions from the later of:

- The date of registration, if this is the committee's first report;
or
- The date of the close of books of the last report filed.

The Third Quarterly Report must disclose all financial activity of the committee not previously disclosed through September 30, 1982, and must be filed regardless of the amount of financial activity involved during the reporting period.

The Third Quarterly Report may be hand delivered no later than close of business October 15, 1982. Reports mailed first-class must be received no later than close of business October 15, 1982. Reports sent by registered or certified mail must be post-marked no later than midnight October 15. 11 CFR 104.5(c)(1)(i) and 104.5(e).
