CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. Reason to believe has been found that the Jerry Ford for Congress committee ("Respondent") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii) by failing to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report for 1982 and the 1982 Year-End Report.

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondent, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondent, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondent has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondent enters voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

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1. Respondent was the principal campaign committee of Jerry W. Ford during the 1982 primary and general elections.

2. The Respondent was required to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report for 1982 by December 2, 1982. That report has not been filed.

3. The Respondent was required to file the 1982 Year-End Report by January 31, 1983. That report has not been filed.

V. Respondent violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii) by failing to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report for 1982 and the 1982 Year-End Report.

VI. Respondent will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondent will file the 30 Day Post-General Election for 1982 and the 1982 Year-End Report.

VIII. Respondent agrees that it shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this

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agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

XI. Respondent shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.



On August 4, 1983, the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that your committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii), provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. Please submit, within ten days of your receipt of this letter, any materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation. Of course, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe if you so desire. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d).

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address and telephone number of such counsel, and a statement authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee ("Committee") failed to file the (1982) 30 Day Post-General Election Report and the 1982 Year-End Report, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(i) and (ii).

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee is the principal campaign committee of Jerry W. Ford for the 1982 primary and general elections. The Committee was notified on September 27, 1982, that the 30 Day Post-General Election Report was due on December 2, 1982. On January 13, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received the report. A representative of the Commission's Reports Analysis Division attempted, unsuccessfully, to contact the Committee's treasurer on March 29, 1983, concerning the Committee's failure to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report. To date, the Committee has yet to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report.

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As to the 1982 Year-End Report, the Committee was notified on January 7, 1983, that the report was due on January 31, 1983. On April 5, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives has not received the report. At this writing, the Committee has not filed the 1982 Year-End Report.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii), the treasurer of a political committee, which is the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives, is required to file in any calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election for which such candidate is seeking election or nomination for election, a post-general election report no later than the 30th day after any general election in which such candidate has sought election, and which shall be complete as of the 20th day after such general election. Additional quarterly reports are also required to be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter, and shall be complete as of the last day of each calendar quarter, except that the report for the quarter ending December 31 shall be filed no later than January 31 of the following calendar year.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(iii).

The Committee was required to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report and Year-End Report on December 2, 1982, and January 31, 1983, respectively. To date, the Committee has not filed either of the two reports at issue. The Committee's

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failure to comply with the reporting requirements is a violation of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii), in the General Counsel's view. Hence, it is the recommendation of the General Counsel that the Commission find reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii).

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee ("Committee") was referred to the Office of General Counsel by the Reports Analysis Division for failure to file the (1982) 30 Day Post-General Election Report (Attachment 1). On July 19, 1983, the Commission determined to open a Matter Under Review with respect to the Committee's failure to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report and the 1982 Year-End Report.

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

1. The Facts

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee is the principal campaign committee of Jerry W. Ford for the 1982 primary and general elections. */ The Committee was notified on September 27, 1982, that the 30 Day Post-General Election Report was due on December 2, 1982. On January 13, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives had

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not received the report. A representative of the Commission's Reports Analysis Division attempted, unsuccessfully, to contact the Committee's treasurer on March 29, 1983, concerning the Committee's failure to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report. To date, the Committee has yet to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report.

As to the 1982 Year-End Report, the Committee was notified on January 7, 1983, that the report was due on January 31, 1983. On April 5, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives has not received the report. At this writing, the Committee has not filed the 1982 Year-End Report.

2. The law applicable

Hence, it is the recommendation of the General Counsel that the Commission find reason to believe that the Committee violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(ii) and (iii).

Failure to File Reports of Receipts and Disbursements

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee, the principal campaign committee supporting Jerry Wayne Ford in the 1982 General Election, failed to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report. Mr. Ford lost the election with 46.9 percent of the vote. The winner received 53.1 percent of the vote (Attachment 2).

On September 27, 1982, the committee was notified that the report was due on December 2, 1982 (Attachment 3). On January 13, 1983 the committee was notified that the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received the report (Attachment 4). The analyst attempted unsuccessfully to contact the treasurer (Attachment 5).

Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, principal campaign committees of candidates* for Federal office who are on the ballot for the 1982 general elections must file Pre-General Election and Post-General Election Reports due October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. This notice provides filing information for these reports.

WHO MUST FILE

All principal campaign committees of candidates for Federal office in the 1982 general election must file the Pre-General Election and Post-General Election Reports of Receipts and Disbursements covering the dates shown on the calendar on the back of this notice.

The Pre-General and Post-General Election Reports must include all reportable transactions of the principal campaign committee and any other authorized committee(s) together with any activity of the candidate and must be filed by October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. These reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity undertaken during the reporting periods. All campaign-related activity of the candidate (including contributions received, loans received or made, and disbursements made) is considered to be activity undertaken as an agent of the candidate's authorized committee(s) and must be reported by the authorized committee(s).

DATE DUE

The Pre-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office no later than close of business October 21, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 18, 1982.

The Post-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office by close of business December 2, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight December 2, 1982.

*For purposes of the Act, a "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

FAILURE TO FILE REPORTS

Committees should be aware that the names of non-filers may be published by the Commission. In addition, failure to file required reports may result in compliance proceedings under the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

Committees must submit legible reports which can be reproduced clearly. Illegible documents will not be accepted as reports, and committees filing such documents will be required to refile.

Please peel off the label on the envelope used for this mailing and place it on the front of the reporting form. This will assist the Commission in the identification of the committee filing the report.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee ("Committee") failed to file the (1982) 30 Day Post-General Election Report and the 1982 Year-End Report, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(i) and (ii).

FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Jerry Ford for Congress committee is the principal campaign committee of Jerry W. Ford for the 1982 primary and general elections. The Committee was notified on September 27, 1982, that the 30 Day Post-General Election Report was due on December 2, 1982. On January 13, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives had not received the report. A representative of the Commission's Reports Analysis Division attempted, unsuccessfully, to contact the Committee's treasurer on March 29, 1983, concerning the Committee's failure to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report. To date, the Committee has yet to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report.

As to the 1982 Year-End Report, the Committee was notified on January 7, 1983, that the report was due on January 31, 1983. On April 5, 1983, the Committee was informed that the Clerk of the House of Representatives has not received the report. At this writing, the Committee has not filed the 1982 Year-End Report.

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(ii), the treasurer of a political committee, which is the principal campaign committee of a candidate for the House of Representatives, is required to file in any calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election for which such candidate is seeking election or nomination for election, a post-general election report no later than the 30th day after any general election in which such candidate has sought election, and which shall be complete as of the 20th day after such general election. Additional quarterly reports are also required to be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter, and shall be complete as of the last day of each calendar quarter, except that the report for the quarter ending December 31 shall be filed no later than January 31 of the following calendar year.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(2)(A)(iii).

The Committee was required to file the 30 Day Post-General Election Report and Year-End Report on December 2, 1982, and January 31, 1983, respectively. To date, the Committee has not filed either of the two reports at issue. The Committee's

The Pre-General and Post-General Election Reports must include all reportable transactions of the principal campaign committee and any other authorized committee(s) together with any activity of the candidate and must be filed by October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. These reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity undertaken during the reporting periods. All campaign-related activity of the candidate (including contributions received, loans received or made, and disbursements made) is considered to be activity undertaken as an agent of the candidate's authorized committee(s) and must be reported by the authorized committee(s).

DATE DUE

The Pre-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office no later than close of business October 21, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 18, 1982.

The Post-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office by close of business December 2, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight December 2, 1982.

*For purposes of the Act, a "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

Committees should be aware that the names of non-filers may be published by the Commission. In addition, failure to file required reports may result in compliance proceedings under the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

Committees must submit legible reports which can be reproduced clearly. Illegible documents will not be accepted as reports, and committees filing such documents will be required to refile.

GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS FILING NOTICE FOR AUTHORIZED COMMITTEES

Under the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, principal campaign committees of candidates* for Federal office who are on the ballot for the 1982 general elections must file Pre-General Election and Post-General Election Reports due October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. This notice provides filing information for these reports.

WHO MUST FILE

All principal campaign committees of candidates for Federal office in the 1982 general election must file the Pre-General Election and Post-General Election Reports of Receipts and Disbursements covering the dates shown on the calendar on the back of this notice.

The Pre-General and Post-General Election Reports must include all reportable transactions of the principal campaign committee and any other authorized committee(s) together with any activity of the candidate and must be filed by October 21, 1982, and December 2, 1982, respectively. These reports must disclose all financial activity not previously disclosed, and must be filed regardless of the total amount of financial activity undertaken during the reporting periods. All campaign-related activity of the candidate (including contributions received, loans received or made, and disbursements made) is considered to be activity undertaken as an agent of the candidate's authorized committee(s) and must be reported by the authorized committee(s).

DATE DUE

The Pre-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office no later than close of business October 21, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight October 18, 1982.

The Post-General Election Report must be hand-delivered or received by first class mail at the appropriate filing office by close of business December 2, 1982. Reports sent registered or certified mail must be postmarked no later than midnight December 2, 1982.

*For purposes of the Act, a "candidate" is an individual who seeks nomination for election, or election, to Federal office, and who has:

1. Received contributions aggregating in excess of \$5,000 or has made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000; OR
2. Given his or her consent to another person to receive contributions or make expenditures on behalf of such individual and such person has received contributions or made expenditures aggregating in excess of \$5,000.

WHAT FORM TO USE

All authorized committees of House and Senate candidates should use FEC Form 3 with appropriate schedules for filing the Pre-General and Post-General Election Reports. Authorized committees other than the principal campaign committee should file their reports with the principal campaign committee. The principal campaign committee, in turn, files a consolidated form (FEC Form 32), together with its own report and the reports of the authorized committees, with the appropriate Federal and State offices.

FAILURE TO FILE REPORTS

Committees should be aware that the names of non-filers may be published by the Commission. In addition, failure to file required reports may result in compliance proceedings under the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

Committees must submit legible reports which can be reproduced clearly. Illegible documents will not be accepted as reports, and committees filing such documents will be required to refile.

Please peel off the label on the envelope used for this mailing and place it on the front of the reporting form. This will assist the Commission in the identification of the committee filing the report.

Committees should consult the instructions on the back of the Summary Page of FEC Form 3 for information on where to file their reports.
