

CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that C.O.R.K. and Rick Woodrow, as treasurer, ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(i) and (iv) by not filing reports in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having duly entered into conciliation pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i), do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding.

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent, C.O.R.K., is a political committee registered with the Commission.
2. Respondent, Rick Woodrow, is treasurer of C.O.R.K.

3. Respondents filed the 1983 Year End report, due January 31, 1984, on February 10, 1984, 10 days late.

4. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv), an unauthorized committee shall file semi-annually in a non-election year. The first report is due July 31 and the second report is due January 31 of the following year.

5. Respondents filed the 1984 April Quarterly report, due April 15, 1984, on June 4, 1984, 50 days late.

6. Respondents filed the 1984 October Quarterly report, due October 15, 1984, on February 13, 1985, 121 days late.

7. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i), an unauthorized committee shall file quarterly reports in an election year. The reports are due no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter.

V. Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv) by filing the 1983 Year End, 1984 April Quarterly and 1984 October Quarterly reports late.

VI. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. Respondents agree that they shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

VIII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this

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agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

IX. This agreement shall become effective as of the date all parties hereto have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

X. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XI. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Commission and the Respondents on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, any written or oral, made by any party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement, shall be valid.



The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of thirty to ninety days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement. **II. Legal Analysis**



GENERAL COUNSEL'S BRIEF

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

C.O.R.K. failed to file three reports in a timely manner during the 1983-84 election cycle. The reports were filed between 10 and 121 days late.

On June 14, 1984, a Chronic Late Filing Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for failing to file the 1983 Year End report and the 1984 April Quarterly report in a timely manner. The notice advised C.O.R.K. that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

Subsequently, on November 6, 1984, a Non-Filer Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for its failure to file the 1984 October Quarterly report. A Reports Analysis Division analyst called the treasurer, Rick Woodrow, on December 4, 1984. Mr. Woodrow said that he had assigned the responsibility to file the report to another committee representative. He said he was sorry for the delay and said the report would be filed within ten days. The October Quarterly report was filed by C.O.R.K. on February 13, 1984.

II. LEGAL AND FACTUAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) requires a political committee such as C.O.R.K. to file quarterly reports in an election year.

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The reports are due no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv) requires C.O.R.K. to file semi-annually in a non-election year. The second report is required to be filed on January 31 of the following year covering July 1 through December 31 of the previous year.

C.O.R.K. had filed its 1983 Year End and the 1984 April and October Quarterly reports late. The 1983 Year End report was filed February 10, 1984, 10 days late; the 1984 April Quarterly report was filed June 4, 1984, 50 days late; the 1984 October Quarterly report was filed February 13, 1985, 121 days late.

C.O.R.K. reported minimal activity on its 1983 Year End report, \$2,049 in receipts and \$3,167 in expenditures; and on its 1984 April Quarterly report, no receipts and \$6 in expenditures; and on its 1984 October Quarterly report, no receipts or expenditures.\*/

On January 14, 1985, the Commission found reason to believe C.O.R.K. and Rick Woodrow, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv) for failing to file reports and notified the respondents accordingly. Mr. Woodrow phoned the Commission in reply to the reason to believe notification letter; no written response has been submitted.



Based on information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission, on January 14, 1985, found reason to believe that C.O.R.K. and you, as treasurer, had violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (iv), and instituted an investigation in this matter.

After considering all the evidence available to the Commission, the Office of General Counsel is prepared to recommend that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

Submitted for your review is a brief stating the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within fifteen days of your receipt of this notice, you may file with the Secretary of the Commission a brief (10 copies if possible) stating your position on the issues and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. (Three copies of such brief should also be forwarded to the Office of General Counsel, if possible). The General Counsel's brief and any brief which you may submit will be considered by the Commission before proceeding to a vote of probable cause to believe a violation has occurred.

If you are unable to file a responsive brief within 15 days, you may submit a written request to the Commission for an extension of time in which to file a brief. The Commission will not grant any extensions beyond 20 days.



SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

C.O.R.K. failed to file three reports in a timely manner during the 1983-84 election cycle. Two of the reports were filed between 10 and 50 days late and one, the 1984 October Quarterly report, has not been filed to date. At this time, the 1984 October Quarterly report appears to be the only required report not filed as of Election Day, November 6, 1984.

On June 14, 1984, a Chronic Late Filing Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for failing to file the 1983 Year End report and the 1984 April Quarterly report in a timely manner. The notice advised C.O.R.K. that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

On November 6, 1984, a Non-Filer Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for its failure to file the 1984 October Quarterly report. A Reports Analysis Division analyst called the treasurer, Rick Woodrow, on December 4, 1984. Mr. Woodrow said that he had assigned the responsibility to file the report to another committee representative. He said he was sorry for the delay and said the report would be filed within ten days. As of this writing, the October Quarterly report has not been received by the FEC.

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FACTUAL BASIS AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) requires a political committee such as C.O.R.K. to file quarterly reports in an election year. The reports are due no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv) requires C.O.R.K. to file semi-annually in a non-election year. The second report is required to be filed on January 31 of the following year covering July 1 through December 31 of the previous year.

C.O.R.K. had filed its 1983 Year-End and 1984 April Quarterly reports late. The 1983 Year-End report was filed February 10, 1984, 10 days late; the 1984 April Quarterly report was filed June 4, 1984, 50 days late. Additionally, C.O.R.K. had not filed its 1984 October Quarterly report which was due October 15, 1984.

It should be noted that C.O.R.K. reported minimal activity on its 1983 Year-End report, \$2,049 in receipts and \$3,167 in expenditures; and on its 1984 April Quarterly report, no receipts and \$6 in expenditures. The 1984 July Quarterly report, which is not a subject of this matter, reflected no receipts or expenditures.

The Office of General Counsel recommends opening a MUR and finding reason to believe that C.O.R.K. violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) by filing the 1983 Year-End and 1984 April Quarterly reports late and by failing to file the 1984 October Quarterly report.



SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

C.O.R.K. failed to file three reports in a timely manner during the 1983-84 election cycle. Two of the reports were filed between 10 and 50 days late and one, the 1984 October Quarterly report, has not been filed to date. At this time, the 1984 October Quarterly report appears to be the only required report not filed as of Election Day, November 6, 1984.

On June 14, 1984, a Chronic Late Filing Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for failing to file the 1983 Year End report and the 1984 April Quarterly report in a timely manner. The notice advised C.O.R.K. that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

On November 6, 1984, a Non-Filer Notice was sent to C.O.R.K. for its failure to file the 1984 October Quarterly report. A Reports Analysis Division analyst called the treasurer, Rick Woodrow, on December 4, 1984. Mr. Woodrow said that he had assigned the responsibility to file the report to another committee representative. He said he was sorry for the delay and said the report would be filed within ten days. As of this writing, the October Quarterly report has not been received by the FEC.

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FACTUAL BASIS AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) requires a political committee such as C.O.R.K. to file quarterly reports in an election year. The reports are due no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter.

2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(iv) requires C.O.R.K. to file semi-annually in a non-election year. The second report is required to be filed on January 31 of the following year covering July 1 through December 31 of the previous year.

C.O.R.K. had filed its 1983 Year-End and 1984 April Quarterly reports late. The 1983 Year-End report was filed February 10, 1984, 10 days late; the 1984 April Quarterly report was filed June 4, 1984, 50 days late. Additionally, C.O.R.K. had not filed its 1984 October Quarterly report which was due October 15, 1984.

It should be noted that C.O.R.K. reported minimal activity on its 1983 Year-End report, \$2,049 in receipts and \$3,167 in expenditures; and on its 1984 April Quarterly report, no receipts and \$6 in expenditures. The 1984 July Quarterly report, which is not a subject of this matter, reflected no receipts or expenditures.

The Office of General Counsel recommends opening a MUR and finding reason to believe that C.O.R.K. violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) by filing the 1983 Year-End and 1984 April Quarterly reports late and by failing to file the 1984 October Quarterly report.
