
On May 21, 1985, the Commission found reason to believe that the Ohio Republican Party and the Ohio Republican Federal Candidate Finance Committee and you, as treasurer, had violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1), a provision of the Commission's regulations, in connection with the above-referenced MUR. However, after considering the circumstances of this matter, the Commission has determined to take no further action and close its file. The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

The file in this matter will be made part of the public record within 30 days. Should you wish to submit any materials to appear on the public record, please do so within 10 days.

The Commission reminds you that the transfer of funds from a non-federal account to a federal account is a violation of the regulations and immediate steps should be taken to insure that this activity does not occur in the future.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

MUR NO. 2009

RESPONDENTS Ohio Republican Party  
Ohio Republican Federal Candidate

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

It is alleged that the Ohio Republican Party (the "Party") and the Ohio Republican Federal Candidate Finance Committee (the "Finance Committee") and Charles E. Shanklin, as treasurer,<sup>1/</sup> violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1) by transferring \$10,000 from a non-federal account of the Party to the Finance Committee, a registered political committee and the federal account of the Party.<sup>2/</sup>

FACTUAL BASIS AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i), a party committee which finances political activity in connection with both federal and non-federal elections and which has established a separate federal account which is a separate federal political committee, is prohibited from transferring money into the federal account from any other account(s) maintained by the party committee for the purpose of financing activity in connection with non-federal elections.

<sup>2/</sup> Although Ohio state law prohibits corporate contributions, it does allow labor union contributions.

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Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), a labor organization is prohibited from making a contribution in connection with any federal election and a political committee is prohibited from knowingly accepting a contribution prohibited by this section. It is the Commission's interpretation that a contribution is "knowingly" accepted if the recipient knew that it received the contributions at issue. It is not necessary to a finding of knowing acceptance to show the recipient knew the contributions were prohibited in violation of the law.

On the 1984 October Quarterly Report, the Finance Committee reported the receipt of two \$5,000 contributions from individuals and noted in the report that the two checks had been deposited into the state account by mistake and that \$10,000 had now been transferred to the federal account to correct the error.

A Request for Additional Information ("RAFI") was sent to the Finance Committee by the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on December 12, 1984, noting the apparent violation of 11 C.F.R. § 102.5. As no response was received, a Second Notice was sent to the Finance Committee.

On January 2, 1985, Mr. Shanklin responded by stating that the \$10,000 transfer represented two \$5,000 contributions which were meant for the federal account but had been deposited into the state account by mistake. In order to demonstrate that these two contributions had been intended for the federal account, Mr. Shanklin enclosed copies of both checks and a copy of the

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thank-you letter that had been sent to the individuals. On March 11, 1985, a RAD analyst called the Finance Committee and spoke to a representative regarding a transfer of the funds back to the state account. The representative stated that she would have the treasurer call the analyst back. As of this date, the treasurer has not contacted RAD regarding this issue and it does not appear the money has been returned to the state account.

In light of the transfer and the presumption that the \$10,000 was commingled with labor union funds, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission open a MUR and find reason to believe that the Party, the Finance Committee and Charles E. Shanklin, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1). However, based on the fact that the money was intended for the federal account and appears to meet the criteria for an allowable contribution to the federal account (see 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(2)), it is further recommended that the Commission take no further action and close the file.

This matter was referred to the Office of General Counsel by  
the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD").

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

It is alleged that the Ohio Republican Party (the "Party")  
and the Ohio Republican Federal Candidate Finance Committee (the  
"Finance Committee") and Charles E. Shanklin, as treasurer,<sup>1/</sup>  
violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1) by  
transferring \$10,000 from a non-federal account of the Party to  
the Finance Committee, a registered political committee and the  
federal account of the Party.<sup>2/</sup>

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FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

However, based on the fact that the money was intended for the federal account and appears to meet the criteria for an allowable contribution to the federal account (see 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(2)), it is further recommended that the Commission take no further action and close the file in this matter.


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RECOMMENDATIONS

III. BACKGROUND:

Receipt of Funds from a Non-Federal Account

The 1984 October Quarterly Report filed by the Ohio Republican Federal Candidate Finance Committee ("the Committee") disclosed two (2) contributions from individuals totalling \$10,000 (Attachment 2, page 1). A footnote on the supporting schedule stated that "[t]hese two checks were deposited into the state account by mistake and an internal transfer corrected this mistake." (See Attachment 2, page 2).

A Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent on December 12, 1984, informing the Committee of the apparent violation of 11 CFR 102.5 (Attachment 3). On January 3, 1985, a Second Notice was sent for failing to respond to the original RFAI (Attachment 4).

In a response received at the Commission on January 22, 1985, the treasurer stated that the \$10,000 transfer in question represented two \$5,000 checks which "...were federal checks that were deposited into the state account by mistake." The treasurer enclosed copies of both checks from the individuals and a thank you letter which, the treasurer states "shows these checks belonged in the federal account." The response did not indicate a transfer-out of the \$10,000 from the federal account, but did request "...another way to handle this sort of error." (See Attachment 5).

On March 11, 1985, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") analyst called the Committee and explained the need to

transfer-out the funds received from the non-Federal account. The spokesperson stated that she would have the treasurer call the analyst, because he was the only one who could authorize such a transaction (Attachment 6).

To this date, the treasurer has not called, nor has the Committee transferred-out the funds received from its non-Federal account.

Dear Mr. Shanklin:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. The review raised questions concerning certain information contained in the report(s). An itemization follows:

-Schedule A of your report discloses two \$5,000 contributions from individuals which have been transferred into your Federal account from your non-Federal account (see attached). Please be advised that such a transfer is prohibited by 11 CFR 102.5(a)(1)(i), and the full amount of the transfer should be returned to the non-Federal account. Please inform the Commission immediately in writing and provide a photocopy of your check for the transfer-out. In addition, the transfer-out should be disclosed on a supporting Schedule B for Line 27 of your next report.

Although the Commission may take further legal action regarding the acceptance of funds from a non-Federal account, your prompt transfer-out of the funds in question, or clarification of the transaction, will be taken into consideration.

-Please clarify all expenditures made for direct mail fund-raising package. If a portion or all of these expenditures were made on behalf of specifically identified Federal candidates, they should be disclosed on Schedule B for Line 21 and include the amount, name, address and office sought by each candidate. 11 CFR 104.3(b) and 106.1.

-Please amend this report to include a Schedule D showing incurred debts for administrative costs. This outstanding obligation owed to the Ohio Republican Finance Committee should also be included on Line 10 of the Summary Page.


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-Please clarify the nature of the loan made to the Ohio College Republicans.

Your letter of December 12, 1984 addresses five areas that you question in the Ohio Republican Federal Candidate Finance Committee October Quarterly report.

6304033510193  
 The first two paragraphs questions the transfer of two \$5,000 contributions to our federal account from our state account. As my bookkeeper stated on the report, these two checks were federal checks that were deposited into the state account by mistake. Upon learning of the error, my bookkeeper did an internal transfer to get the funds into the federal account. I am enclosing a copy of each check and a Thank You letter that states how the monies are to be used and that shows these checks belonged in the federal account.

If there is another way to handle this sort of error, please inform us as to what method should be used.

Paragraph three inquires about a direct mail fund-raising package. This expenditure was a solicitation for get-out-the-vote activities (I have enclosed a copy of the letter).

Paragraph four discusses administrative costs showing on Schedule D. You will have received my letter dated December 19, 1984 regarding the way we handle administrative costs.

Paragraph five requests clarification of the nature of the loan made to the Ohio College Republicans. This loan was made in order for members of this group to attend the Republican National Convention in Dallas, Texas in August, 1984. To date, \$9,350 of this obligation has been repaid.
