CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Victory '84 of New Mexico committee, and John B. Irick, as treasurer, (hereinafter "the Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii).

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C.

§ 437g(a)(4)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent Victory '84 of New Mexico is a political committee registered with the Commission.

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2. John B. Irick is the treasurer of the Victory '84 of New Mexico committee.

3. Respondents were required to file the 1984 July Quarterly Report by July 15, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 243 days late.

4. Respondents were required to file the 1984 October Quarterly Report by October 15, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 151 days late.

5. Respondents were required to file the 1984 12 Day Pre General Election Report by October 25, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 141 days late.

V. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate, are required to file, in a calendar year in which a regularly scheduled election is held, a quarterly report which shall be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter. Further, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), those committees are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before any election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and shall be complete as of the 20th day before the election.

VI. Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) by failing to file timely the 1984 July and October Quarterly Reports and 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii) by failing to timely file the 1984 12 Day Pre-General Election Report.

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VII. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Four Hundred and Seventy-Five Dollars (\$475.00) pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondents agree that they shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

XI. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XII. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or

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oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be valid.

I. BACKGROUND



CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission (hereinafter "the Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that the Victory '84 of New Mexico committee, and John B. Irick, as treasurer, (hereinafter "the Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii).

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission and Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over Respondents, and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C.

§ 437g(a)(4)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Respondent Victory '84 of New Mexico is a political committee registered with the Commission.

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2. John B. Irick is the treasurer of the Victory '84 of New Mexico committee.

3. Respondents were required to file the 1984 July Quarterly Report by July 15, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 243 days late.

4. Respondents were required to file the 1984 October Quarterly Report by October 15, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 151 days late.

5. Respondents were required to file the 1984 12 Day Pre General Election Report by October 25, 1984. The report was filed on March 15, 1985, 141 days late.

V. Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate, are required to file, in a calendar year in which a regularly scheduled election is held, a quarterly report which shall be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter. Further, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), those committees are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before any election in which the committee makes a contribution to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and shall be complete as of the 20th day before the election.

VI. Respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) by failing to file timely the 1984 July and October Quarterly Reports and 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii) by failing to timely file the 1984 12 Day Pre-General Election Report.

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VII. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of Four Hundred and Seventy-Five Dollars (\$475.00) pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VIII. Respondents agree that they shall not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431, et seq.

IX. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

X. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed the same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

XI. Respondents shall have no more than thirty (30) days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirements contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

XII. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or

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oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be valid.





Summary of Allegations

On June 21, 1984, the Commission sent a letter to the Committee notifying it of the July 15, 1984, deadline for filing the 1984 July Quarterly Report; the Commission sent a second letter on September 21, 1984, notifying the Committee of the October 15, 1984, deadline for filing the October Quarterly Report. The Committee was further notified on October 1, 1984, that a 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984, if contributions and expenditures, which had not previously been reported, were made in connection with the General Election during the period ending October 17, 1984.

On October 29, 1984, Miguel A. Abeyta, the Committee's treasurer, contacted the Commission to advise that because of the absence of the Committee's bookkeeper he would be responsible for the Committee's reporting requirements.

No further correspondence was received until February 19, 1985, when Mr. Abeyta again cited staff absences for the Committee's filing delays. The Committee's 1984 12 Day Pre

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Primary, July Quarterly, October Quarterly, and 12 Day Pre General Reports were filed on March 15, 1985.^{2/}

Maxine Melbourne, Administrative Director, contacted the Commission on August 12 and 13, 1985. The Committee's failure to file its 1984 July and October Quarterly Reports and 12 Day Pre General Report in a timely manner are in the General Counsel's view, violations of 2 U.S.C.

§§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii).

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**DESCRIPTION OF PRELIMINARY PROCEDURES
FOR PROCESSING POSSIBLE VIOLATIONS DISCOVERED BY THE
FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION**

Possible violations discovered during the normal course of the Commission's supervisory responsibilities shall be referred to the Enforcement Division of the Office of General Counsel where they are assigned a MUR (Matter Under Review) number, and assigned to a staff member.

Following review of the information which generated the MUR, a recommendation on how to proceed on the matter, which shall include preliminary legal and factual analysis, and any information compiled from materials available to the Commission shall be submitted to the Commission. This initial report shall recommend either: (a) that the Commission find reason to believe that a possible violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) may have occurred or is about to occur and that the Commission conduct an investigation of the matter; or (b) that the Commission find no reason to believe that a possible violation of the FECA has occurred and that the Commission close the file on the matter.

Thereafter, if the Commission decides by an affirmative vote of four (4) Commissioners that there is reason to believe that a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) has been committed or is about to be committed, the Office of the General Counsel shall open an investigation into the matter. Upon notification of the Commission's finding(s), within 15 days a respondent(s) may submit any factual or legal materials relevant to the allegations. During the investigation, the Commission shall have the power to subpoena documents, to subpoena individuals to appear for depositions, and to order answers to interrogatories. The respondent(s) may be contacted more than once by the Commission in its investigation.

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If, during this period of investigation, the respondent(s) indicate a desire to enter into conciliation, the Office of General Counsel staff may begin the conciliation process prior to a finding of probable cause to believe a violation has been committed. Conciliation is an informal method of conference and persuasion to endeavor to correct or prevent a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA). Most often, the result of conciliation is an agreement signed by the Commission and the respondent(s). The Conciliation Agreement must be adopted by four votes of the Commission before it becomes final. After signature by the Commission and the respondent(s), the Commission shall make public the Conciliation Agreement.

[If the investigation warrants], and no conciliation agreement is entered into prior to a probable cause to believe finding, the General Counsel must notify the respondent(s) of his intent to proceed to a vote on probable cause to believe that a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) has been committed or is about to be committed. Included with the notification to the respondent(s) shall be a brief setting forth the position of the General Counsel on the legal and factual issues of the case. Within 15 days of receipt of such brief, the respondent(s) may submit a brief posing the position of respondent(s) and replying to the brief of the General Counsel. Both briefs will then be filed with the Commission Secretary and will be considered by the Commission. Thereafter, if the Commission determines by an affirmative vote of four (4) Commissioners, that there is probable cause to believe that a violation of the FECA has been committed or is about to be committed conciliation must be undertaken for a period of at least 30 days but not more than 90 days. If the Commission is unable to correct or prevent any violation of the FECA through conciliation the Office of General Counsel may recommend that the Commission file a civil suit against the respondent(s) to enforce the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA). Thereafter, the Commission may, upon an affirmative vote of four (4) Commissioners, institute civil action for relief in the District Court of the United States.

III. BACKGROUND:

Failure to Timely File Reports

The Victory 84 Committee of New Mexico ("the Committee") failed to file its 1984 July Quarterly, October Quarterly, and 12 Day Pre-General Reports by Election Day, November 6, 1984.

On June 21, 1984, the Commission sent a letter to the Committee notifying it of the July 15, 1984 deadline for filing the 1984 July Quarterly Reports (Attachment 2). The Commission sent a letter on September 21, 1984 notifying the Committee of the October 15, 1984 deadline for filing the October Quarterly Report (Attachment 3). The Committee was notified on October 1, 1984 that a 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984 if contributions and expenditures, which had not previously been reported, were made in connection with the General Election during the period ending October 17, 1984 (Attachment 4).

*The Committee only filed one Statement of Organization on September 13, 1985 enlisting John B. Irick as Treasurer. Other written correspondence indicates that Rhonda Davis, the Committee's present bookkeeper, served as Treasurer immediately preceding Miguel A. Abeyta; however, the Committee's first report was signed by John B. Irick.

A letter was received on October 29, 1984 in which the Committee's treasurer, Miguel A. Abeyta, stated that their bookkeeper had been away from work because of her mother's cancer. Mr. Ayeta said that he would prepare and file the necessary reports as quickly as he could (Attachment 5). However, no correspondence was received from the Committee until February 19, 1985 when Mr. Abeyta sent another letter in which he explained that their first treasurer and bookkeeper had resigned suddenly and their second bookkeeper was diverted from duty because of the need to care for her mother (Attachment 6).

On March 5, 1985 the Committee filed its 1984 12 Day Pre-Primary, July Quarterly, October Quarterly, and 12 Day Pre-General Reports (Attachments 7-10). An Informational Notice ("IN") and Requests For Additional Information ("RFAI") were sent out on August 9, 1985 which requested an explanation for the late filings (Attachments 11-14).

Maxine Melbourne, the Committee's Administrative Director, called the Commission on August 12, 1985. She requested an additional fifteen days in which to respond but was not granted a formal extension (Attachment 15). On August 16, 1985 the Commission received a letter from Ms. Melbourne in which she explained that Mr. Abeyta would not be back in their office until August 28, 1985 to respond to our requests (Attachment 16).

A Second Notice was sent to the Committee on August 29, 1985 (Attachment 17). On September 12, Ms. Melbourne called to notify the Commission that the Committee's reports would be in the mail the next day (Attachment 18). On September 13, the Commission received the Committee's amended reports in which they reiterated their bookkeeping and bookkeepers' problems (Attachments 19-21). In the 12 Day Pre-General Amendment, the Committee stated that some of their expenditures made during the 10/1/84-10/18/84 period were for "the general goal of promoting all republican candidates in New Mexico, both federal and state."


This is in follow-up to my telephone call to you this morning concerning FEC reports for the above committee. **

The Commission sent a letter on September 21, 1984 notifying the Committee of the October 15, 1984 deadline for filing the October Quarterly Report (Attachment 3). The Committee was notified on October 1, 1984 that a 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984 if contributions and expenditures, which had not previously been reported, were made in connection with the General Election during the period ending October 17, 1984 (Attachment 4).

*The Committee only filed one Statement of Organization on September 13, 1985 enlisting John B. Irick as Treasurer. Other written correspondence indicates that Rhonda Davis, the Committee's present bookkeeper, served as Treasurer immediately preceding Miguel A. Abeyta; however, the Committee's first report was signed by John B. Irick.

A letter was received on October 29, 1984 in which the Committee's treasurer, Miguel A. Abeyta, stated that their bookkeeper had been away from work because of her mother's cancer. Mr. Ayeta said that he would prepare and file the necessary reports as quickly as he could (Attachment 5). However, no correspondence was received from the Committee until February 19, 1985 when Mr. Abeyta sent another letter in which he explained that their first treasurer and bookkeeper had resigned suddenly and their second bookkeeper was diverted from duty because of the need to care for her mother (Attachment 6).

On March 5, 1985 the Committee filed its 1984 12 Day Pre-Primary, July Quarterly, October Quarterly, and 12 Day Pre-General Reports (Attachments 7-10). An Informational Notice ("IN") and Requests For Additional Information ("RFAI") were sent out on August 9, 1985 which requested an explanation for the late filings (Attachments 11-14).

Maxine Melbourne, the Committee's Administrative Director, called the Commission on August 12, 1985. She requested an additional fifteen days in which to respond but was not granted a formal extension (Attachment 15). On August 16, 1985 the Commission received a letter from Ms. Melbourne in which she explained that Mr. Abeyta would not be back in their office until August 28, 1985 to respond to our requests (Attachment 16).

A Second Notice was sent to the Committee on August 29, 1985 (Attachment 17). On September 12, Ms. Melbourne called to notify the Commission that the Committee's reports would be in the mail the next day (Attachment 18). On September 13, the Commission received the Committee's amended reports in which they reiterated their bookkeeping and bookkeepers' problems (Attachments 19-21). In the 12 Day Pre-General Amendment, the Committee stated that some of their expenditures made during the 10/1/84-10/18/84 period were for "the general goal of promoting all republican candidates in New Mexico, both federal and state."


Thank you for the assistance of your January 18, 1985 letter and the discussion of our failure to file FEC reports in a timely manner.**

I would like to assure you that we have made every possible effort to comply with the filing requirements outlined by your commission. However, in the past six months we were beset by two occurrences which were beyond any control. First, my predecessor, Rhonda Davis, who was also our bookkeeper, tendered her resignation very unexpectedly. As a result, I came on board, we had a new bookkeeper and quite frankly we had to scramble to get caught up. Then just as it looked like our bookkeeping (and reporting) was ironed out, our bookkeeper's mother was diagnosed as having terminal cancer. Her death followed in two months, and during this time our bookkeeper's time was naturally diverted to the care of her mother.





On _____, 1984, the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that the Victory 84 Committee of New Mexico and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii), provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act") by failing to timely file the 1984 July Quarterly, October Quarterly and 12 Day Pre General Reports. The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you and the committee. Please submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation. Of course, this does not preclude the settlement of this matter through conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe if so desired. See 11 C.F.R. 111.18(d).

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address and telephone number of such counsel, and a statement authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

Summary of Allegations

On June 21, 1984, the Commission sent a letter to the Committee notifying it of the July 15, 1984, deadline for filing the 1984 July Quarterly Report; the Commission sent a second letter on September 21, 1984, notifying the Committee of the October 15, 1984, deadline for filing the October Quarterly Report. The Committee was further notified on October 1, 1984, that a 12 Day Pre-General Report was due on October 25, 1984, if contributions and expenditures, which had not previously been reported, were made in connection with the General Election during the period ending October 17, 1984.

On October 29, 1984, Miguel A. Abeyta, the Committee's treasurer, contacted the Commission to advise that because of the absence of the Committee's bookkeeper he would be responsible for the Committee's reporting requirements.

No further correspondence was received until February 19, 1985, when Mr. Abeyta again cited staff absences for the Committee's filing delays. The Committee's 1984 12 Day Pre

^{1/} The Committee's Statement of Organization, filed on September 13, 1985, listed John B. Irick as Treasurer. Other Committee correspondence indicated that Rhonda Davis and Miguel A. Abeyta preceeded Mr. Irick as Treasurer. The Committee's first report, however, was signed by John B. Irick.

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Primary, July Quarterly, October Quarterly, and 12 Day Pre General Reports were filed on March 15, 1985.^{2/}

An Informational Notice and Requests for Additional Information were sent to the Committee on August 9, 1985, which, in part, requested an explanation for the late filings.

Maxine Melbourne, Administrative Director, contacted the Commission on August 12 and 13, 1985. Because Mr. Abeyta was out of town, she explained, the Committee requested an extension of time to respond to the Commission's notices. A Second Notice, sent on August 29, 1985, granted the extension. On September 13, 1985, the Commission received the Committee's amended 1984 July, October, and 12 Day Pre General Reports.

Legal and Factual Analysis

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate, are required to file, in a calendar year in which a regularly scheduled election is held, a quarterly report which shall be filed no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter. Further, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(ii), those committees are required to file a pre-election report, which shall be filed no later than the 12th day before any election in which the committee makes a contribution

^{2/} Although it appears the Committee was only required to file the 1984 July Quarterly to cover the period April 1, 1984 - June 30, 1984, it filed a 12 Day Pre Primary Report (April 1, 1984 - May 16, 1984) and a July Quarterly Report (May 17, 1984 - June 30, 1984).

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to or expenditure on behalf of a candidate in such election and shall be complete as of the 20th day before the election. The Committee's failure to file its 1984 July and October Quarterly Reports and 12 Day Pre General Report in a timely manner are in the General Counsel's view, violations of 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and (ii).
