This matter was initiated as a result of the attached article in the August 12, 1976 Washington Post which alleges that Lanny Davis accepted loans in May 1976, the proceeds of which were used in his campaign, but were not reported as contributions. With a letter dated August 14, 1976 which is supplemental to a conversation between myself and David Speigel and Sheldon Hochberg, attorney for Lanny Davis, Mr. Davis filed amended reports reporting these loans as contributions.

In addition, he indicates that he has:

1. refunded \$100 of a \$1,000 loan from Barbara Boggs which would have put her over contribution limit, and
2. refunded \$1,075 of a \$2,000 loan from his father which would have put him over his contribution limit.

In my opinion these actions bring Mr. Davis in compliance with the disclosure requirements and no further action is necessary. Close file. Refer reports to Al Keema.

Dear Mr. Oldaker:

Enclosed is a copy of the amended thirty-day post-election report of receipts and expenditures for a candidate (FEC Short Form 6) covering the period May 4, 1976, through June 7, 1976, that I am filing on Monday with the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives. I would like to take this opportunity to give you and the Commission a complete explanation as to why I have concluded that such an amendment is necessary.

On May 7 I received a personal loan of \$5,000 from my parents that was secured by a promissory note from me, payable over a three year period, at six percent interest. On May 8 I received additional loans of \$500 each from Elliot Cole and Joseph Brand, and \$1000 each from Mary Patton and Barbara Boggs, also secured by a personal note from me payable at six percent interest over a three year period. Also on May 8, I received a \$500 loan from Charles Verrill, repayable by August 31, 1976, at six percent interest. The total of all of these loans was \$8,500.

While I intended that the proceeds of these loans might be used in part for my own personal living expenses, since at the time I was only working parttime for my law firm, it was also my intention that a large part might be used for the purpose of loans from me to my campaign committee for the primary election in Montgomery County's eighth congressional district on May 18. At this time, the counsel to my campaign, Sheldon Hochberg, and I believed that since I had borrowed this money personally, at my own liability, these funds constituted my own resources and thus were not campaign loans under the federal campaign law as

it stood at that time. I subsequently loaned \$9,500 to my campaign committee in interest-free loans which were duly reported by my campaign committee to the Commission.

In light of the May, 1976, amendments to the campaign finance law and my understanding of your recently proposed regulations, and in light of the discussions which Mr. Hochberg had yesterday with Mr. Sterling and Mr. Spiegel of your staff, I now realize that these personal loans should be regarded as loans to my campaign under the Act and thus subject to the disclosure requirements and contribution limitations. Accordingly, I am today filing with the Clerk of the House of Representatives amended candidate's reports for the relevant periods in question which reports all of the above-mentioned personal loans as campaign contributions to me.

In addition, I have taken a new look at all of these transactions, and in order to bring myself into full compliance with what I now understand the requirements of the Act to be, I have taken the following steps:

First, since Barbara Boggs' \$1,000 loan to me is now to be regarded as a campaign contribution, she would be deemed to exceed the applicable limits on individual contributions to my primary campaign by \$100 (since she had previously made a contribution to my campaign committee of \$100). I am therefore immediately repaying Barbara Boggs \$100 of her personal loan to me so that she will be within her \$1,000 contribution limit.

Second, the present principal balance of my parents' loan is \$2,000, since I repaid them \$3,000 on their \$5,000 loan two weeks ago. My parents loaned me funds which they had obtained by taking out a joint passbook loan, secured by their jointly held savings account. While my mother had signed the \$5,000 check to me, my promissory note was inadvertently made out only to my father rather than to both parents. In light of the possible ambiguity as to whether the loan from my parents should be attributable to both of my parents or just to my father, I am now regarding the loan as coming directly from my father alone and have now reported it as such. Since I now understand that parents are each subject to the \$1,000 contribution limits applicable to non-family members, to bring the outstanding balance of my father's loan within the

applicable limits on contributions, I have today repaid my father an additional \$1,075 so as to bring the outstanding balance of my personal loan from him to \$925.00. Since my father had previously made a contribution of \$25 on one occasion and \$50 on another to my campaign committee, the total balance of campaign contributions and outstanding loans from my father in connection with the primary campaign is presently \$1,000.

None of the other personal loans that I borrowed would cause the individual lenders to exceed their contribution limitations under the Act.

Finally, I would like to add--and to emphasize--that there was never any intent by me to evade either the spirit or the letter of the campaign finance law, which I have always fully supported and still do. As I am sure you know, the requirements of the campaign finance law on this particular issue were from my perspective at that time complex and unclear. Both I and my campaign committee have always tried to comply with what we understood those requirements to be. Moreover, I have never made any effort to hide the fact of these loans from the public. Last February I had disclosed my net worth statements and I indicated to the press at that time that updated versions of my financial statements would always be made readily available.

If there is anything further you wish me to do so that I may bring myself into full compliance with all of the requirements of the law, please contact me and I will be more than happy to take whatever appropriate action is necessary.

Davis Defends Failure To List Sources of Loans

Lanny Davis, the Democratic congressional candidate in Montgomery County, received \$8,500 in loans for use in his primary election campaign but failed to disclose the original sources of the money as required on federal campaign finance reports.

A total of \$3,500 of the money originally came from persons associated with Davis' law firm, Patton, Boggs & Blow. The balance came from Davis' parents in Jersey City, N.J.

Davis said in interviews with the Washington Post last week that those individuals lent the money directly to him. On the campaign finance reports, however, those sources were not named and the money was listed as a loan of Davis' own money to his campaign.

Federal regulations, which were designed to permit identification of campaign contributors, require disclosure of all loans and contributions of \$100 or more to a candidate or to his volunteer committee for use in an election campaign.

Davis said he had no intention of violating "either the spirit or the letter" of the campaign finance laws through his actions. "There is nothing ... hidden about it," he said.

Davis said he sought the money for use in the campaign. He used personal loans to himself rather than to the campaign committee because he felt they would be more secure for the lenders, he said. "I will swear to you on my children that this is the truth," Davis said.

"The problem in my mind was securing a loan to a campaign committee (his own) that had no assets. It seemed to me that the better thing to do was secure the loan myself."

The source of the loans was not immediately disclosed because they had been made to him personally, Davis said. He said he believed at the time that the money amounted to "personal

funds" and as such did not have to be itemized in his campaign report.

Davis added, however, that he would file an amended campaign report itemizing the loans in order to clear up any ambiguities.

According to documents provided by Davis, all of the loans were in excess of \$100. On May 9, he borrowed \$500 each from three members of his law firm—Charles Verrill, Joseph Brand and Elliott Cole. In addition, he borrowed \$1,000 each from the wives of two partners in the firm—Barbara Boggs, the wife of Thomas Boggs Jr., and Mary Patton, the wife of James R. Patton Jr.

Davis also received a \$5,000 loan from his parents, Mortimer and Frances Davis, who obtained the money through a \$5,000, 6-percent passbook





Davis Defends Neglecting To Bare Sources of Loans

loan from the First National Bank of Jersey City on May 4.

All of the loans to Davis were made at 6 per cent annual interest. One was payable in six months; the others over three years. Davis provided The Washington Post with copies of the promissory notes indicating those terms. The loans that Davis in turn made to his campaign committee, Citizens for Davis for Congress, were interest free.

At the time that Davis obtained the money, there were no limits on the amount that an individual could contribute from personal funds to his own campaign for federal office.

Davis said some of the money was used to pay personal living expenses. At the time, he was on leave of absence with half pay from the firm to devote more time to the campaign.

Other sums of the money were used, however, for campaign expenses, he said, particularly to pay the cost of mailing materials on the eve of the May 18 primary.

"It's which dollar in and which dollar out," he said. "I had money in the bank, it was all mixed together."

In a Jan. 30 decision, the Supreme Court gave a strict interpretation of what constituted candidates' personal funds. The court said the money had to be funds over which the candidate would ordinarily have control regardless of his status as an office seeker.

The money lent to Davis does not appear to fall into this category. He has said that it was solicited for use in the campaign.

At the time the Davis loans were obtained, the federal committee had yet to issue guidelines clearly defining "personal funds" in the same terms outlined by the court.

However, an FEC spokesman said yesterday that even though no guidelines had been issued, the loans would have been "discouraged" had Davis sought the FEC's opinion.

Davis said he did not do that because the status of the agency was unclear. "There was no FEC," he said. Instead, he asked the advice of lawyer Sheldon Hochberg, and was told that the loans would be proper.

"We had nothing to turn to but our own interpretation of the Supreme Court regulation," Davis said.

The FEC regards all loans as contributions subject to its limits until the loans are repaid. However, none of the loans violate those limits.

Neither of Davis's parents had contributed any money to the campaign

previously. Under the laws in effect at that time, they were permitted to give up to \$25,000 to the campaign. New laws pending before Congress would restrict parental contributions to \$1,000 each.

Boggs had contributed \$250, Patton had given \$500, and altogether, members of the firm had made contributions totaling \$1,350.

Davis has repaid \$3,000 to his parents, he said. The remainder of the loans remain unpaid, along with another \$2,500 loan made to the campaign committee earlier by Davis, and \$3,800 in loans by individuals to the campaign committee for Davis's unsuccessful effort in 1974.

If the FEC determines that loans are intentionally made in violation of its regulations, the candidate could be required to return the money or pay a fine of up to \$5,000.

Alexandria YMCA Fire Injures Nine

Eight persons staying at the Alexandria YMCA and a city fireman suffered smoke inhalation early yesterday during a fire that caused \$20,000 damage at the YMCA building at 420 E. Monroe St., fire officials reported.

Four of the roomers were admitted to Alexandria Hospital, where they were reported in fair condition, while the other injured persons were treated there and released, a hospital spokeswoman said.

A total of 36 residents were evacuated from the building when the fire was reported at 12:30 a.m., a YMCA official said.

The fire began in a pile of carpets that were stored in a lower-level stairwell near the building's parking garage, according to investigator Everett Ailstock of the city fire department. He said the fire was of a "suspicious origin."

Smoke escaped into residents' quarters on the second floor through an open stairwell door, Ailstock said. Other stairwell doors were closed, he said.

Ailstock said the fire resulted in \$15,000 in damage to the building, primarily in the stairwell and second floor areas, and \$5,000 to the building's contents.

The YMCA will be closed down "for a couple of weeks" for repairs, according to an official there.
