For your information, the Committee was approved for audit on July 14, 1984 under 2 U.S.C. §438(b). The final audit report was released to the public on September 18, 1984 (see A84-2).

III. BACKGROUND:

**Chronic Late Filing of Reports and Failure to File the 1986
12 Day Pre-General Report by Election Day**

The Long Island Aerospace Political Action Committee Federal (the "Committee") failed to file eight (8) Reports of Receipts and Disbursements in a timely manner for the 1985-1986 election cycle (see attached Chart). The reports were filed between eight (8) and forty-two (42) calendar days late. In addition, the 1986 12 Day Pre-General Report was not filed by Election Day, November 4, 1986.

On February 7, 1986, a Chronic Late Filer Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to file the 1985 March, April, July, October, November and December Monthly Reports in a timely manner (Attachment 10). The Notice advised the Committee that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

On June 20, 1986, the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") analyst met with Mr. Joseph Crumlish, attorney for the Committee. In this meeting, Mr. Crumlish requested that copies of all correspondence to the Committee be sent to his Washington, D.C. office. He was told this could not be done, but if he wished to receive the original letters the Committee could use his address as the address of record.

He stated this was not acceptable, as the Committee should receive the original correspondence. Mr. Crumlish was told, in that case, it was the Committee's responsibility to provide him with copies (Attachment 13).

In his July 10, 1986 letter, Mr. Crumlish again requested copies be sent directly to his office (Attachment 14).

Subsequent to the sending of the Chronic Late Filer Notice, the Committee failed to file the 1986 April Monthly and the 12 Day Pre-General Reports in a timely manner.

NON-ELECTION YEAR 1985

The Commission's records indicate that your committee will file monthly reports during 1985. This notice will assist you in complying with the monthly filing requirements.

* * * *

MONTHLY REPORTS

Monthly reports must be filed no later than 20 days after the last day of each month. 11 CFR 104.5(c)(3) Each report must include all financial activity that occurred during the previous month. For example, the first monthly report this year should be filed by February 20, 1985, and should include all financial activity which occurred between January 1 and January 31, 1985. (See the chart below.)

If you send a report by registered or certified mail, it must be postmarked no later than the filing date in order to be timely filed. If you have your report hand-delivered or mailed first class, it must be received by the close of business on the filing date.

You are required to use FEC Form 3X to file all reports. These forms may be duplicated. Two of them have been enclosed for your use. Should you need additional forms call the Office of Public Communications.

Political committees are fully liable for failure to file any report required under the Act. Failure to file in a timely fashion is a serious violation. Committees are subject to enforcement action for late filing. Illegible reports which can not be clearly reproduced and reports submitted on non-FEC forms will not be accepted. Committees filing such documents will be required to refile.







GENERATION OF MATTER

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

On February 7, 1986, a Chronic Late Filer Notice was sent to the Committee for failing to file the 1985 March, April, July, October, November and December Monthly Reports in a timely manner. The Notice advised the Committee that any additional late filing of reports may result in legal enforcement action.

Subsequent to the Chronic Late Filer Notice, the Committee failed to file the 1986 April Monthly and 12 Day Pre-General Reports in a timely manner. The reports are as follows:

On June 20, 1986, two persons from the Reports Analysis Division met with Counsel for the Committee to discuss its delay in filing and responding to RAD's requests for additional information. Counsel explained that the Committee was in the process of appointing a new treasurer and that the reports would be filed by the new treasurer.

Counsel further requested that copies of all Commission correspondence referencing the Committee be sent to his Washington office. The analyst advised him that his request was not possible but that if the Committee redesignated counsel's address as the address of record, he would receive the original correspondence. Counsel stated that this method was unacceptable. He was advised that it was the Committee's responsibility to provide copies.

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By letter dated July 10, 1986, counsel again requested copies of all Commission correspondence to the Committee.

LEGAL AND FACTUAL ANALYSIS

Pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B), all political committees other than authorized committees of a candidate may elect to file monthly reports in all calendar years which shall be filed no later than the 20th day after the last day of the month and shall be complete as of the last day of the month, except that in lieu of filing the reports otherwise due in November and December in those years in which a regularly scheduled election is held, a pre-general election report and a post general election report shall be filed in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(a)(2)(A)(i) and (2)(A)(ii), respectively. Additionally, a year end report shall be filed no later than January 31 of the following calendar year.

The Committee's failure to file its 1985 March, April, July, October, November, and December Monthly Reports, and its 1986 April Monthly Report and 12 Day Pre-General Report in a timely manner is a violation of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B).



On March 10, 1987, the Federal Election Commission determined that there is reason to believe that the Long Island Aerospace Political Action Committee Federal and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The General Counsel's factual and legal analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against you. You may submit any factual or legal materials which you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit any such materials within fifteen days of your receipt of this letter.

In the absence of any additional information which demonstrates that no further action should be taken against your committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, requests for pre-probable conciliation after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent will not be entertained.

RESPONDENT'S MEMORANDUM OF CIRCUMSTANCES
SURROUNDING ITS ACTIONS

1. Respondent has had no intention of violating the Act.
2. The facts indicate an intent to the contrary. Since its inception, respondent's intent has been to abide by the Act in a conscientious manner.

Statement of Facts

Respondent does not deny the facts outlined in the Summary of Allegations. ^{1/} On or about December, 1985, respondent determined that its treasurer, who was unduly burdened by his other duties, should be allowed to resign. Mr. Stanley Wolin accepted the post of temporary treasurer while a transition was worked out. In the confusion resulting from the changes of treasurer, of bank accounts, and my appointment as custodian of the records, the April 20, 1986 report deadline was inadvertently missed. The Long Island Aerospace Political Action Committee is a non-connected PAC, consisting primarily of suppliers to manufacturers. It thus lacks the structural advantages of a

^{1/} Counsel for Respondent did not state that it was "unacceptable" that his address be the address of record. He stated that the address of record should be that of the PAC's Management for whom he was counsel.

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PAC connected to a pre-existing entity. When the Committee was formed, it elected to report monthly in order to be on top of all transactions and to prevent cumulative mistakes. It would be a shame if such a good faith intention would result in multiple penalties.

When the Commission notified the respondent on February 7, 1986, that six of its 1985 reports were late, this was the first time that the PAC management, apart from the Treasurer, became aware of the extent of their reporting problem. ^{2/} Immediate steps were accelerated to restructure the committee's reporting system. However, the new treasurer actually did not accept this post until May, 1986. (See attachments A and B.) I, as counsel for the respondent was appointed custodian of the records, with responsibility for compiling and filing respondent's commission reports. To this end, I employed a bookkeeper with Political Action Committee experience to audit all past reports and to compile the required reports for timely filing.

We then developed a new reporting system whereby the treasurer would send his monthly transaction data to me

^{2/} In addition, a series of questions were raised by FEC on January 8, January 30, June 11, July 3, and September 17. Through a series of meetings and correspondence, these matters have been resolved.

in Washington. My report would be compiled and timely filed. A copy would be sent to the treasurer in New York for his signature and subsequent filing. ^{3/}

The discipline imposed by this rather awkward system has worked for our 1986 reports, with the exception of April when there was uncertainty as to ^{whether} Mr. Wolin was to be officially our treasurer; and October, discussed above. By our initiatives, the Commission was kept aware of the PAC's transition efforts and the resultant problems.

There is one other minor complication which may in part have contributed to treasurer Wolin's missing the pre-general report deadline. The committee's office is in Baldwin, L.I. and the treasurer is in Westbury, New York. It is possible that in October there was a mixup in the mailing from to the Committee and thence to the new treasurer.

I have met with FEC personnel on several occasions in order to be sure that the Committee was conforming meticulously to Commission requirements. Whenever there was a problem, it was cured as soon as possible.

From the foregoing it should be clear that respondent may be maladroit but has never exhibited an

^{3/} As was pointed out by FEC staff members, the important thing was to file the report on time. The treasurer's signature on the cover page could be filed later as an amendment. In this tale of two cities, this has been our practice.

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intent to violate the Federal Election Law. To the contrary, its modus operandi was always to conform to all requirements faithfully and to respond as soon as possible to any maladjustments caused by new circumstances or new interpretations of the act. All infractions have been rectified. As the court said in Federal Election Commission v. National Ed. Ass'n, 457 F.Supp. 1102 (1978) at 1112, where violations were not in the nature of intentional disregard of rights of others, a civil penalty is unwarranted. In Nat. Right to Work Co. v. Fed. Elec. Comm'n, 716 F.2d 1401 (D.C.D.C. 1783), at 403, the Court found a civil penalty not appropriate because there was no finding . . . "of defiance or knowing conscious, and deliberate flaunting [sic] of the act."

Citing the National Ed. case, the court in Pollgreen v. Morris, 579 F.Supp. 711 (1984) at 718 wrote:

"And, even where a statutory scheme does impose liability for civil penalties regardless of the actor's intent . . . his state of mind may still be considered in mitigation of the penalty."

Also, as the Act states in 2:§4379(g)(4)(A)(i), conciliation is based on probable cause that a violation of the Act has been committed or is about to be committed. The Act provides for conciliation to prevent such violation or to correct such violation. In respondent's cause, no violation is about to be committed (so no prevention is necessary) and any violation which may have taken place has been corrected. Thus penalties would not seem appropriate under the Act. An added consideration is that no one has

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been harmed. On the basis of the foregoing respondent respectfully requests:

1. To be absolved of any past (1985) infractions that may have occurred;
2. That if the two 1986 violations, only one be subject to penalty;
3. That considering all the circumstances, any penalty, if imposed, be nominal.







GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On March 10, 1987, the Commission determined that there is reason to believe the Long Island Aerospace Political Action Committee Federal ("the Committee") and Stanley Wolin, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(B) by failing to file the 1985 March, April, July, October, November, and December Monthly Reports and its 1986 April Monthly and 12 Day Pre-General Reports in a timely manner. By letter dated April 6, 1987, counsel for the Committee requested that this matter be settled prior to a finding of probable cause to believe (Attachment 1).

While Counsel does not directly address the late filing of the Committee's 1985 and 1986 reports, he does allege that the confusion resulting from the change in treasurer in 1986, and the Committee's reporting system may also have contributed to the Committee's delay in filing its 12 Day Pre-General Report and 1986 April Quarterly Report in a timely manner.^{1/}

1/ Counsel to the Committee filed unsigned reports with the Commission in a timely manner and, simultaneously, sent the reports to the treasurer for his signature. Subsequently, he filed an amended, signed report with the Commission. Counsel serves as custodian of record in Washington, D.C., while the treasurer is located in New York.






