III. BACKGROUND:

Receipt of Apparent Impermissible Funds from Unregistered Organizations and Apparent Excessive Contribution Made to a Federal Candidate Committee

The 1988 October Quarterly Report filed by the Kansas Republican State Committee ("the Committee") disclosed a total of \$1,300 received in apparent impermissible funds from five (5) unregistered, non-federal organizations. The funds ranged in amounts from \$50 to \$1,000 and ranged in date of receipt from September 17, 1988 to September 19, 1988 (Attachment 2).

A Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent on December 7, 1988 which advised the Committee to clarify whether or not the contributions received were permissible under 11 CFR 102.5(a). The RFAI further advised the Committee to either refund any impermissible funds to the donors or transfer the funds, with the donors' consent, to an account not used to influence federal elections (Attachment 3).

On December 22, 1988, the Commission received an amendment from the Committee to its 1988 October Quarterly Report. In a cover letter to the amendment, Duane Nightingale, the Committee treasurer, stated "We have transferred out \$1300 from our Federal Account to our non-federal account." A copy of the transfer check, dated December 20, 1988, was attached to the cover letter (Attachment 4).

The Committee's 1988 October Quarterly Report also disclosed a contribution to Kansans for Meinhardt of \$5,000 on September 17, 1988 for the general election (Attachment 5). Subsequent review revealed that an affiliate of the Committee, the Second District Republican State Committee, had also contributed \$5,000 to Kansans for Meinhardt on August 3, 1988 for the general election (Attachment 6).

On February 22, 1989 an RFAI was sent to the Committee referencing the 1988 October Quarterly Report (Attachment 7). The RFAI informed the Committee that the Act precludes a multicandidate committee and its affiliates from making contributions to a candidate for federal office which, when combined, exceed \$5,000 per election. The RFAI further stated that the Committee should request a refund or redesignation of any excessive contribution.

On March 6, 1989 the Commission received an amendment to the Committee's 1988 October Quarterly Report. The amendment included a copy of the Committee's letter to Phil Meinhardt requesting a refund of the \$5,000 contribution made on September 17, 1988 (Attachment 8).

No further response has been received from the Committee regarding the apparent excessive contribution.

The Committee's 1988 30 Day Post-General Report disclosed a total of \$466 received in apparent impermissible funds from six (6) unregistered, non-federal organizations. The funds ranged in amounts from \$50 to \$100 and ranged in date of receipt from October 7 to November 8, 1988 (Attachment 9).

An Informational Notice ("IN") was sent on March 17, 1989 which advised the Committee to clarify whether or not the contributions received were permissible under 11 CFR 102.5(a). The IN further advised the Committee to either refund any impermissible funds to the donors or transfer the funds, with the donors' consent, to an account not used to influence federal elections (Attachment 10).

On March 27, 1989 the Commission received the Committee's amended 1988 30 Day Post-General Report. In a cover letter to the amendment, Duane Nightingale, the Committee treasurer, stated that the funds had been transferred out of the Committee's account. A copy of the transfer check, dated March 22, 1989, was attached to the cover letter (Attachment 11).

Dear Mr. Nightingale:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. The review raised questions concerning certain information contained in the report(s). An itemization follows:

-The identification of each contributor, including the person's occupation and name of employer, must be provided if the person has contributed in excess of \$200 in the aggregate during the calendar year. Please amend Schedule A supporting Line 11(a)(i) for each entry lacking a contributor's occupation and name of employer.

Note: If your committee has made at least one effort per solicitation, either by a written request or by an oral request documented in writing to obtain this information from the contributor, your committee may have exercised "best efforts." Under 11 CFR 104.7(b), such effort shall consist of a clear request for the information (i.e., name, mailing address, occupation, and name of employer) which request informs the contributor that the reporting of such information is required by law. If you believe that your committee satisfies the "best efforts" provision, you should provide a copy of your solicitation or an explanation of the method(s) used to obtain contribution information. Clarification regarding "best efforts" should be disclosed during each two year election cycle beginning with the first report filed in the non-election year. 11 CFR 104.3(a)(4)(i)

-Schedule A of your report (pertinent portion(s) attached) discloses a contribution(s) from an organization(s) which is not a political committee registered with the Commission. Under 11 CFR 102.5(b),

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organizations which are not political committees under the Act must either: 1) establish a separate account which contains only those funds permitted under the Act, or 2) demonstrate through a reasonable accounting method that the organization has received sufficient funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions in order to make the contribution. AJD

If your committee does not finance non-federal activity, the receipt of the referenced contribution(s) may violate the limitations and prohibitions of the Act. (2 U.S.C. §§441a(f) and 441b) If your committee engages in both federal and non-federal activity, either through a separate non-federal account, or one account that finances activity in connection with both federal and non-federal elections, your committee may be in violation of 11 CFR 102.5(a).

Please clarify whether the contribution(s) received from the referenced organization(s) is permissible. To the extent that your committee has received funds which are not permissible, the Commission recommends that you refund the impermissible amount(s) to the donor(s) in accordance with 11 CFR 103.3(b). Alternatively, if you choose to transfer the funds to an account not used to influence federal elections, the Commission advises that you inform the contributor in writing and provide the contributor with the option of receiving a refund. You may wish to seek a written authorization (either before or after the transfer-out) from the donor for any transfer-out to protect the donor's interests.

Please inform the Commission immediately in writing and provide a photocopy of your check for the refund or transfer-out. Refunds and transfers-out should be disclosed on a supporting Schedule B for Line 26 or 20 of the report covering the period during which they are made.

If the contribution(s) in question was incompletely or incorrectly disclosed, you should amend your original report with the clarifying information.

Although the Commission may take further legal steps concerning the acceptance of prohibited contributions, prompt action by your committee in refunding or transferring-out the amounts will be taken into consideration.

-Your report discloses limited payments for administrative expenses. Each committee utilizing separate federal and non-federal accounts is required to allocate any administrative expenses between the

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accounts in proportion to the amount of funds expended on federal and non-federal elections or on another reasonable basis. Administrative expenses are those day-to-day costs of operating the committee, including rent, utilities, salaries and other miscellaneous office expenses. The federal account of the committee must pay its share of such expenses. 11 CFR 106.1(e) and 102.5(a)(1)(i).

If your organization has incurred such administrative costs and your non-federal account has paid for all such costs, your federal account must reimburse the non-federal account for its portion of the expenses. The amount incurred by the federal account should be disclosed as a debt or obligation owed to the non-federal account on Schedule D supporting Line 10 of the Summary Page. When payments are made toward the debt, they should be reported on Schedule B supporting Line 19 of the Detailed Summary Page and the debt should be reduced by a corresponding amount. Clarification regarding administrative expenses should be disclosed during each two year election cycle beginning with the first report filed in the non-election year.

A written response or an amendment to your original report(s) correcting the above problem(s) should be filed with the Federal Election Commission within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter. 

Please inform the Commission immediately in writing and provide a photocopy of your check for the refund or transfer-out. Refunds and transfers-out should be disclosed on a supporting Schedule B for Line 26 or 20 of the report covering the period during which they are made.

If the contribution(s) in question was incompletely or incorrectly disclosed, you should amend your original report with the clarifying information.

Although the Commission may take further legal steps concerning the acceptance of prohibited contributions, prompt action by your committee in refunding or transferring-out the amounts will be taken into consideration.

This matter was referred to the Office of the General  
Counsel on April 14, 1989, by the Reports Analysis Division

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

A. Receipts From Unregistered Organizations

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), it is unlawful for a corporation or labor union to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a federal election, or for a candidate or political committee to accept such a contribution.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), a political committee has two available alternatives to ensure that prohibited monies are not used in connection with federal elections: (1) it may establish a single account for both federal and non-federal activity, with such an account containing only contributions subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or (2) it may establish a separate federal account for federal activity and a second account for State and local election activity.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act may be deposited in the separate federal account. Under 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(2), contributions that are deposited into an account that finances federal activity must meet three conditions: (1) the contribution must be designated for the federal account; (2) the solicitation must expressly state that the contribution will be used in connection with a federal election; and, (3) the contributors must be informed that all contributions are subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act.

Under 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b), an organization that is not a political committee under the Act which makes contributions or expenditures must either (1) establish a separate account to which only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act shall be deposited and from which contributions and expenditures shall be made, or (2) demonstrate through a reasonable accounting method that whenever such organization makes a contribution or expenditure, that organization has received sufficient funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act to make such contribution or expenditure.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.6(a), transfers of funds may be made without limit on amount between or among a national party committee, a State party committee and/or any subordinate party committee whether or not they are political committees under the Act. The transfers, however, must be made only with funds that are permissible under the Act.

During 1988, the Committee accepted \$1,766 from 11 unregistered organizations, as revealed on the Committee's 1988 October Quarterly Report and 1988 30 Day Post-General Report. The organizations include committees to support a political candidate, local party committees, corporate or other unregistered committees and businesses:

It has not been determined whether any of these unregistered organizations qualify as a political committee under 11 C.F.R. § 100.5, thereby subjecting those committees to the registration and reporting requirements of 2 U.S.C. §§ 433(a) and 434(a). None of the unregistered organizations have been referred to this Office for enforcement and this Office is making no recommendation at this time as to these organizations.

2. Hershey Ready Mix is a corporation organized under the laws the State of Kansas.

3. J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #1 is a registered committee. This contribution, however, was made by J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2, which is an unregistered committee.

Kansas law permits corporations and unions to make contributions or expenditures for political purposes. One of the contributions came directly from a corporate entity: Hershey Ready Mix. In addition, there is no evidence at this time that the funds from the other contributing entities were permissible under the Act. Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe the Kansas Republican State Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a).

**B. Excessive Contribution**

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), it is unlawful for a multicandidate political committee to make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committee with respect to any election for Federal office, which, in the aggregate, exceed \$5,000. Further, under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), it is unlawful for an officer or employee of a political committee to knowingly accept a contribution made for the use or benefit of a candidate in violation of the limitations imposed on contributions under 2 U.S.C § 441a.

Under 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii), all contributions made by political committees established, financed, maintained or controlled by a State party committee and by subordinate State party committees shall be presumed to be made by one political committee.

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On September 17, 1988, the Committee made a \$5,000 contribution for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. An affiliated committee, the Second District Republican Committee, had also contributed \$5,000 for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt on August 3, 1988.

On March 6, 1989, in response to Commission inquiry regarding the apparent excessive contribution, the Committee submitted a copy of a March 2, 1989 letter it mailed to Phil Meinhardt requesting a refund of the \$5,000 contribution made on September 17, 1988. No further response has been received from the Committee regarding the contribution and there is no indication from the reports filed to this date by either the Committee or Kansans for Meinhardt that the excessive contribution has been refunded.

As set forth above, the Committee apparently made an excessive contribution of \$5,000 to Kansans for Meinhardt. Accordingly, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe that the Kansas Republican State Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A).

Although the recipient committee, Kansans for Meinhardt, was not referable to this Office, that committee accepted a \$5,000 excessive contribution. Moreover, although the contributor requested the excessive contribution be returned, Kansans for Meinhardt has not done so. Under these circumstances, this Office further recommends that the Commission find reason to

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believe that Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f).

The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer. You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials, along with answers to the enclosed questions, to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information demonstrating that no further action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of the General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of the General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, the Commission will not entertain requests for pre-probable cause conciliation after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

The term document includes, but is not limited to books, letters, contracts, notes, diaries, log sheets, records of telephone communications, transcripts, vouchers, accounting statements, ledgers, checks, money orders or other commercial paper, telegrams, telexes, pamphlets, circulars, leaflets, reports, memoranda, correspondence, surveys, tabulations, audio and video recordings, drawings, photographs, graphs, charts, diagrams, lists, computer print-outs, and all other writings and other data compilations from which information can be obtained.

"Identify" with respect to a document shall mean state the nature or type of document (e.g., letter, memorandum), the date, if any, appearing thereon, the date on which the document was prepared, the title of the document, the general subject matter of the document, the location of the document, the number of pages comprising the document.

"Identify" with respect to a person shall mean state the full name, the most recent business and residence addresses and the telephone numbers, the present occupation or position of such person, the nature of the connection or association that person has to any party in this proceeding. If the person to be identified is not a natural person, provide the legal and trade names, the address and telephone number, and the full names of both the chief executive officer and the agent designated to receive service of process for such person.

"And" as well as "or" shall be construed disjunctively or conjunctively as necessary to bring within the scope of these interrogatories and requests for the production of documents any documents and materials which may otherwise be construed to be out of their scope.

On August 22, 1989, the Federal Election Commission found that there is reason to believe Kansans for Meinhardt (the "Committee") and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer. You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information demonstrating that no further action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of the General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of the General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, the Commission will not entertain requests for pre-probable cause conciliation after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address, and telephone number of such counsel, and authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A), unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

In the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission learned that Kansans for Meinhardt accepted an contribution which exceeded the limitations of 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), it is unlawful for a multicandidate political committee to make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committee with respect to any election for Federal office, which, in the aggregate, exceed \$5,000. Further, under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), it is unlawful for an officer or employee of a political committee to knowingly accept a contribution made for the use or benefit of a candidate in violation of the limitations imposed on contributions under 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

Under 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii), all contributions made by political committees established, financed, maintained or controlled by a State party committee and by subordinate State party committees shall be presumed to be made by one political committee.

On September 17, 1988, the Kansas Republican State Committee (the "Committee") made a \$5,000 contribution for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. An affiliated committee, the Second District Republican Committee, had also contributed \$5,000

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for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt on August 3, 1988.

On March 6, 1989, in response to Commission inquiry regarding the apparent excessive contribution, the Committee submitted a copy of a March 2, 1989 letter it mailed to Phil Meinhardt requesting a refund of the \$5,000 contribution made on September 17, 1988. There is no indication from the reports filed to this date by either the Committee or Kansans for Meinhardt that the excessive contribution has been refunded.

Therefore, there is reason to believe that Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f).





5. The affiant responds to the interrogatories as follows:

GENERAL COMMENTS

6. The Party emphasizes that any mistakes that may have been made with respect to its 1988 FEC reports were just that: mistakes, and not willful violations of any law or regulation. Further explanation will be provided on that point.

7. Affiant further states that to her knowledge the Party has never been cited previously for any FEC violations. Affiant further states that to her knowledge the Party has never been cited for any violation of the Kansas Campaign Finance Laws, nor has the Party ever been cited for any violations by the Kansas Public Disclosure Commission. The record of the Kansas Republican Party over many years in the area of campaign finance has been excellent. It is affiant's hope that its actions in 1988 will be judged accordingly.

8. Any errors that may have been made were entirely inadvertent and, in some instances, simply the result of staff oversight. The Party has never had any intent to circumvent any federal law or regulation.

MEINHARDT

9. Certain portions of the Commission's inquiries are directed to the congressional campaign of Phil Meinhardt. Affiant's response in this section is directed to those inquiries:

10. On July 25, 1988, the Kansas Republican Party (PARTY) contributed \$5000 to the Meinhardt for Congress Committee (MEINHARDT) for the Primary Election. On September 17, 1988, the PARTY contributed \$5000 to MEINHARDT for the General Election.

11. On August 3, 1988, the Second District Republican Committee contributed \$5000 to the Meinhardt Committee for the General Election. This contribution made by the Second District Republican Committee was made without the knowledge of the officers of the Kansas Republican Party.

12. Under Kansas law, the Kansas Republican Party (The Kansas Republican State Committee) and the Kansas Republican Second District Committee are considered separate and independent. The two organizations are, in fact, run as entirely distinct and autonomous organizations under Kansas law. Both organizations have different sets of officers and entirely different sets of election proceedings. Under Kansas law, the Kansas Republican State Committee does not exercise control over the officers of the Second District Republican Committee. No individual serves as an officer of both committees.

13. The Second District Committee is not established, financed, maintained or controlled by the State Committee. The Second District Committee has not received funds from any party political committee affiliated with the State Committee; and the Second District Committee has not made contributions in cooperation or consultation with, or at the request or suggestion of, the State Committee or its affiliates.

14. Under Kansas law, both the Kansas Republican Party and the Second District Committee may make contributions to a candidate and each committee has a separate contribution limit for that candidate.

15. In addition, the Kansas Republican Party and the Second District Republican Committee have separate, segregated finances. The Kansas Republican Party is not aware of any contributions made by the Second District Committee. The Kansas Republican Party has no control over the collection of or disbursements of Second District Committee money.

16. When the Commission notified the Kansas Republican Party that the Commission believed that an excessive contribution had been made to Meinhardt by the Party, the Party sent a letter to Mr. Meinhardt requesting a refund. This letter was sent to Mr. Meinhardt on March 2, 1989. The Commission was sent a copy of that letter on the same date. Mr. Meinhardt responded that he believed that the Second District Committee and the Kansas Republican Party were considered independent of one another and therefore subject to separate contribution levels. The letter stated that Mr. Meinhardt saw "no reason and no possible way to refund the \$5000 contribution."

17. It is the affiant's understanding that the Second District Republican Committee is registered as a federal political committee with the Federal Election Commission. It is my further understanding that, notwithstanding the separate and unaffiliated natures of the two committees, the Second District Committee incorrectly listed itself as affiliated with the Kansas Republican Party on its statement of organization. This has been brought to the attention of the Second District Committee, and it is this affiant's belief and understanding that the Second District Committee has filed or is about to file an amended statement of organization. This amended statement would correct the mistaken impression that the Second District Committee is affiliated with the Party for purposes of federal campaign activity.

18. The Kansas Republican Party and this affiant have made every effort to work with the Federal Election Commission to rectify the situation.

CONTRIBUTION FROM J.C. NICHOLS COMPANY POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE

19. On September 17, 1988, the Party received and deposited to its federal account a \$1,000 contribution from J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2.

20. Affiant believes that the J.C. Nichols Company has a federally-registered political action committee, and believed that the federally-registered political action committee for J.C. Nichols Company made said contribution and that therefore it was appropriate to place it in the federal account.

21. The Party was unaware that the donation had not been made by the federally-registered account. It accepted the contribution in good faith and any error here is entirely inadvertent and is not willful.

22. When the Commission notified the Party that there was a problem with respect to this contribution, the Party transferred \$1000 from its federal account to its state account and offered to make a refund to the J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee.

23. Any error with respect to this contribution was due to a misunderstanding and the contribution was accepted in good faith in the belief that it had been made from the federally-registered account.

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SMALL CONTRIBUTIONS

24. During the fall of 1988, the Kansas Republican Party accepted contributions from the following groups and inadvertently placed said contributions in the federal account:

25. While affiant would have been unaware as to whether these groups were registered with the Commission, the deposit of these amounts in the federal account was entirely inadvertent and the result of staff oversight. There was no intent to circumvent any regulation and, in fact, all of the money was still in the account and was easily transferred by the Party out of the federal account into the state account.

26. The Commission notified the Party, in two separate memos, of problems with these contributions. The Party has transferred out of its federal account \$766 and placed that sum in its state account to correct the staff oversight. In addition, all of the contributors have been notified and have been offered a refund.

27. The Party accepted these funds in good faith and did everything possible to correct the situation when informed by the Commission that these organizations were unregistered.





Therefore, the contributions from both the Second District and the Kansas Republican Party were donated and accepted in good faith by all parties. The money was spent during the campaign, and the Kansans for Meinhardt Committee was officially terminated still owing about \$25000 in unpaid loans to the candidate. So, I see no reason and no possible way to refund the \$5000 contribution.





If you have made an excessive contribution, you should either notify the recipient and request a refund of the amount in excess of \$5,000 and/or notify the recipient, in writing, of your redesignation of the contribution. All refunds and redesignations must be made within sixty days of the treasurer's receipt of the contribution. Refunds are reported on Line 16 of the Detailed Summary Page and on Schedule A of the report covering the period during which they are received. 



GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On August 22, 1989, the Commission found reason to believe that the Kansas Republican State Committee ("KRSC") and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a) by depositing impermissible funds into the KRSC's account maintained to finance political activity in connection with federal elections. On the same date, the Commission also found reason to believe that the KRSC violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A) and that Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). These latter findings arose from an apparent excessive contribution from the KRSC to Kansans for Meinhardt.

Responses have been received from all Respondents and are included as attachments to this report. In addition, both the KRSC and Kansans for Meinhardt have requested pre-probable cause conciliation. As discussed below, this Office recommends that the Commission deny these requests at this time.

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II. ANALYSIS

A. Contributions from Unregistered Organizations

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), it is unlawful for a corporation or labor union to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a federal election, or for a candidate or political committee to accept such a contribution.

11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a) provides that a political committee has two available alternatives to ensure that prohibited monies are not used in connection with federal elections: (1) it may establish a single account for both federal and non-federal activity, with such an account containing only contributions subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or (2) it may establish a separate federal account for federal activity and a second account for state and local election activity.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act may be deposited into the separate federal account. Under 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(2), contributions that are deposited into an account that finances federal activity must meet three conditions: (1) the contribution must be designated for the federal account; (2) the solicitation must expressly state that the contribution will be used in connection with a federal election; and, (3) the contributors must be informed that all contributions are subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act.

Under 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(b), an organization that is not a political committee under the Act which makes contributions or

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expenditures must either (1) establish a separate account to which only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act shall be deposited and from which contributions and expenditures shall be made, or (2) demonstrate through a reasonable accounting method that whenever such organization makes a contribution or expenditure, that organization has received sufficient funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act to make such contribution or expenditure.

From the period of September 17, 1988 through November 8, 1988, the KRSC accepted \$1,766 from 11 unregistered organizations. The organizations include committees to support a political candidate, local party committees, a corporation, a business and an unregistered political action committee. One of the contributions, in the amount of \$1000, was from J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2. J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #1 is a registered committee; however, J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2 is not a registered committee. The remaining contributions range in amount from \$50 to \$100. One contribution of \$100 was received from a corporate entity.

In response to Commission inquiries, KRSC transferred these funds out of its federal account into KRSC's non-federal account. The transfers were made in two installments: \$1,300 on December 20, 1988, and \$466 on March 22, 1989.

As set forth in its response, KRSC admits that it accepted these impermissible contributions. KRSC states that at the time

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it accepted the contribution from J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2, it believed it was accepting a contribution from the J.C. Nichols Company's federally registered committee. As for the remaining \$766 in contributions, KRSC states that the deposit of these amounts in the federal account was entirely inadvertent and the result of staff oversight. KRSC further stated that there was no intent to circumvent Commission regulations.

B. Excessive Contribution

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), it is unlawful for a multicandidate political committee to make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committee with respect to any election for federal office which, in the aggregate, exceed \$5000. Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), it is unlawful for an officer or employee of a political committee to knowingly accept a contribution made for the use or benefit of a candidate in violation of the limitations imposed on contributions under 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3) provides that all contributions made by political committees established, financed, maintained, or controlled by a state party committee and by subordinate state party committees shall be presumed to be made by one political committee. Under 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3), this presumption shall not apply if: (i) the political committee of the party unit in question has not received funds from any other political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by any party unit; and (ii) the political committee

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of the party unit in question does not make its contributions in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of any other party unit or political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by another party unit.

On August 3, 1988, the Second District Republican Committee contributed \$5000 for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. On September 17, 1988, the KRSC made a \$5000 contribution for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. The reason to believe findings in this matter were based upon the presumption in 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(3) that the contributions made by the KRSC and the Second District Republican Committee were considered to have been made by one political committee, thereby resulting in an excessive contribution from the KRSC.

The KRSC contends that the Second District Republican Committee and the KRSC are not affiliated, but rather are independent of one another. In its response to the Commission, the KRSC states that the Second District Republican Committee is not established, financed, maintained, or controlled by the KRSC. The KRSC further states that the Second District Republican Committee has not received funds from any party committee affiliated with the KRSC. The KRSC also states that the Second District Republican Committee has not made contributions in cooperation or consultation with, or at the request or suggestion of the KRSC.

The response submitted by Kansans for Meinhardt is

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consistent with the assertions made by the KRSC.

Rosemary Boston, treasurer, states that the Second District Republican Committee was considered and represented as a local party committee, independent of the KRSC. Kansans for Meinhardt submitted with its response a letter dated December 19, 1988, from James W. Cates, the former chairman of the Second District Republican Committee. In this letter, Mr. Cates states that he considered the Second District Republican Committee to be independent of the KRSC. Mr. Cates states that he had advised Phil Meinhardt that the Second District Republican Committee was a "separate committee, independent of the State party committee." (Attachment 2, page 5).

On the other hand, the Second District Republican Committee has represented to the Commission that it is affiliated with the KRSC. By letter dated November 16, 1988, the Reports Analysis Division wrote to the Second District Republican Committee concerning the committee's failure to identify any affiliated or connected organizations on its amended statement of organization. (Attachment 3, page 1). In response to the Commission, Anita Heiman, treasurer of the Second District Republican Committee, stated that the committee was "affiliated or [was] classified as a subordinate of the Kansas Republican Party." (Attachment 4, page 1). More recently, the Chairman of the Second District Republican Committee again represented to the Commission that the committee is "affiliated with the Kansas

Republican Party for FEC purposes." (Attachment 5, page 1).<sup>1</sup>

The KRSC has characterized the Second District Republican Committee's assertion that it is affiliated with the KRSC as a "mistaken impression." (Attachment 1, page 5). In its response to the Commission, the KRSC states that "notwithstanding the separate and unaffiliated natures of the two committees, the Second District Committee incorrectly listed itself as affiliated with the Kansas Republican Party on its statement of organization." (Attachment 1, page 5). The KRSC further states that it understood that the Second District Republican Committee had filed or was about to file an amended statement of organization to correct its status as an affiliated committee. To date, the Second District Republican Committee has not filed an amended statement of organization reflecting any change in its status as a local committee affiliated with the KRSC.<sup>2</sup>

1. In this letter, the Second District Republican Committee also cites "the action taken by our affiliate," referring to the KRSC's request for a refund from the Kansans for Meinhardt Committee.

2. A review of records filed by the Second District Republican Committee with the Commission revealed the following disbursements:

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In light of the conflicting information presented thus far with respect to the Second District Republican Committee's affiliation with the KRSC, this Office recommends that the Commission deny the Respondents' requests to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation at this time. Although this matter involves only one possibly excessive contribution, the affiliation issue is a significant one. Upon receipt of further information, this Office will make additional recommendations to the Commission.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Decline at this time to enter into conciliation with the Kansas Republican State Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, and Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.

These transfers of funds to the State Republican Party raise serious questions as to the validity of the KRSC's assertion that the Second District Republican Party is not an affiliated committee.

Below please find the answers to questions asked in the letter of December 14, 1990, from the FEC to Duane Nightingale.

1. The State Party has NO authority or ability to direct or participate in the governance of the Second District Republican Committee. (Enclosed is a copy of the State Party's constitution and by-laws per your request.)

2. The State Party has an Executive Committee which consists of 26 members; included is the Chairman and Vice Chairman of each Congressional District. Therefore, the Second District had two members on the State Party Executive Committee, two out of 26 members. This is the only overlap of membership. (Please note: the Executive Committee does not direct, suggest, or consult on any contributions to federal, state, or local candidates. Contributions by the State Party to candidates are solely the decision of the State Chairman.)

Also, the election of officers to the Second District and the State Party is done by two separate groups. The Second District officers are elected by delegates to the District Convention. The State Party officers are elected by a second group of delegates, delegates to the State Committee.

3. The State Party never requested or suggested how the Second Congressional District spend any of its funds. The Second District is completely autonomous from the State Party.

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

4. There is no arrangement for the transfer of funds from local party units to the State Party. Occasionally a county party will contribute to the State Party. These are contributions, they are not fees, dues, or payments of any form. The amount and timing of the contribution (or if there will even be a contribution) rests in the local unit.

## CONSTITUTION

### Republican Party of Kansas

#### ARTICLE I

##### NAMES

The name of the organization shall be the Republican Party of Kansas

#### ARTICLE II

##### OBJECTIVES

Section 1. **Purpose**—The aims and purposes of the Republican Party shall be

- (a) To support the Constitution and laws of the United States of America and the Constitution and laws of the State of Kansas to the end that government shall be truly and in fact a government of the people, by the people, for the people
- (b) To support the principles, objectives and platforms of the Republican Party of the United States of America
- (c) To develop and maintain a strong, effective and informed Republican Party throughout the State of Kansas
- (d) To encourage able and qualified Republicans to seek office at all levels of government.
- (e) To elect Republican candidates to offices at all levels of government.
- (f) To develop viewpoints and positions on local, district and state issues and to seek implementations of the viewpoints

#### ARTICLE III

##### THE REPUBLICAN PARTY

Section 1. **Membership**—The membership of the party shall be composed of all voters in the State of Kansas who have legally chosen to be identified as members of the Republican Party and are so listed on the official party rolls prepared and maintained by the county election officers.

Sec. 2. **Use of Party Name and Symbols**—The State Committee through its Executive Committee, shall have the sole authority to preserve, protect and govern the use of the name REPUBLICAN and its attendant symbols. Organizations and individuals shall not speak in the name of the Republican Party of Kansas without the written consent of the party.

#### ARTICLE IV

##### STATE COMMITTEE

Section 1. **Management**—The management of the Republican Party shall be vested in the Republican State Committee whose members shall be elected or hold office ex officio as provided in the Kansas Statutes.

Sec. 2. **Meetings**—The organizational meeting of the State Committee shall be held in compliance with the Kansas Statutes. Other meetings of the State Committee may be held at locations designated by the Chairman.

Sec. 3. **Officers**—The officers of the State Committee shall be those specified by the Kansas Statutes and they shall be elected in the manner provided by law. It shall not be necessary for any officer of the State Committee to be a member of the State Committee

Sec. 4. **Executive Committee**—The State Committee may delegate its responsibilities and duties to its Executive Committee which shall have officers, as provided by Kansas Statutes, provided the following items shall not be delegated.

- (a) The election of officers of the State Committee
- (b) Nomination of national committeemen and committeewomen
- (c) Amendment of these Articles and By-Laws

Sec. 5. **Authority for Meetings**—Meetings of both the State Committee and its Executive Committee shall be as provided by law with special meetings to be held as provided by the party By-Laws

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**ARTICLE V**  
**COMMITTEES AND AUXILIARIES**

Section 1. **Standing Committees**—To assist the officers in conducting the business of the party, the Chairman, with the approval of the Executive Committee, may establish standing committees as may be desired. The committees shall be constituted and shall function as provided by the By-Laws.

Sec. 2. **Special Committees**—The Chairman shall have the authority, with the consent of the Executive Committee, to appoint special or ad hoc committees as might be desired. Such committees shall be constituted and shall function as provided in the By-Laws.

Sec. 3. **Auxiliaries**—The State Committee may provide for the organization and operation of official auxiliaries to the Republican Party. The activities of such auxiliary organizations shall be subject to the direction of the regularly constituted party authorities. As provided in the party By-Laws, each auxiliary organization will develop its own articles and by-laws and will elect its own officers. The chairman and vice chairman of each approved auxiliary organization shall be advisory members of the State Committee and of the Executive Committee but shall have no vote in the official business of the party.

**ARTICLE VI**  
**DISTRICT COMMITTEES**

Section 1. **Organization**—The district committees of the Republican Party for each Congressional district shall be organized, shall elect officers and shall function as provided by the Kansas Statutes. It shall not be necessary for any of the officers of any district committee to be a member of any district committee. The district committees may provide for an executive committee for each Congressional district committee.

Sec. 2. **Meetings**—The organizational meeting of the district committee will be held as provided in the Kansas Statutes. Other meetings of the district committee may be held at locations specified by the district chairman.

Sec. 3. **Constitution and By-Laws**—Each district must formulate its own articles and by-laws which must be consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Republican Party of Kansas.

Sec. 4. **Provision for Subdistricts**—For administrative purposes, a district chairman, with the approval of the Executive Committee of the State Committee, may divide a Congressional district into subdistricts, each to have officers in the manner of the district committee and to be elected from its membership by the members of the district committee in each subdistrict. Subdistricts must be made up of contiguous counties and numbered consecutively.

**ARTICLE VII**  
**COUNTY COMMITTEES**

Section 1. **Organization**—The basic component organization of the Republican Party shall be the county central committee. The whole number of precinct committeemen and committeewomen, elected as provided by the Kansas Statutes, shall constitute the county central committee of the party. The county central committee shall elect officers, shall meet and shall function as provided in the Kansas Statutes and according to the By-Laws of the party.

Sec. 2. **Constitution and By-Laws**—Each county must formulate its own articles and by-laws which must be consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Republican Party of Kansas.

**ARTICLE VIII**  
**CITY PARTY COMMITTEES**

Section 1. **Organization**—The Republican precinct committeemen and committeewomen in any city of Kansas may organize a city party committee.

Sec. 2. **Constitution and By-Laws**—Every city party committee must formulate its own articles and by-laws which must be consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of both the Republican Party of Kansas and of the county central committee in which the city is located.

**ARTICLE IX**  
**REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE**

Section 1. **Nomination of Committee Members**—In each year when a President of the United States is to be elected, the State Committee of the Republican Party shall, by majority vote, nominate for membership on the Republican National Committee one national committeeman and one national committeewoman. The election of the nominees to the Republican National Committee, their duties and responsibilities, shall

be governed by the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee and by the By-Laws of the State Committee. Further, as provided by the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee, the State Chairman or any other officers of the State Committee may become members ex officio of the Republican National Committee.

**ARTICLE X**  
**REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION**

Section 1. **Election of Delegates**—In each year when a President of the United States is to be elected, as provided by the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee and by the By-Laws of the State Committee, each Congressional district convention will elect an equal number of delegates and alternates to the Republican National Convention, provided that the first ten places shall be reserved for election at large by the State Convention and provided further that additional delegates and alternates shall be elected at large by the State Convention if the remaining number of delegates cannot be allotted in equal number to the Congressional district conventions.

Sec. 2. **Election of Delegates to Conventions at All Levels**—The State Committee shall prepare all rules and regulations for the election of delegates to all conventions provided for under this Constitution and for the calling and conduct of these conventions.

**ARTICLE XI**  
**PREPRIMARY DESIGNATION PROCEDURE**

Section 1. **State Committee to Develop Procedure**—In the absence of any Kansas Statutes concerning the procedure of preprimary designation of candidates, the State Committee may develop its own procedure providing that the By-Laws governing same shall include but not be limited to the provisions of this Article.

Sec. 2. **One Man-One Vote Principle**—As nearly as possible, the State Committee shall develop the One Man-One Vote Principle which will apply to the county conventions and all other conventions having to do with the preprimary designating procedure.

Sec. 3. **Election of Delegates to Conventions at All Levels**—The State Committee shall prepare all rules and regulations for the election of delegates to all conventions and for the calling and conduct of the conventions.

Sec. 4. **Delegates to Be Elected by Precinct Caucuses**—The basis for building all district and the state conventions shall be precinct caucuses open to all registered Republicans, provided that voting in any precinct shall be limited to those residing in the precinct. Each precinct caucus, according to the established rules, shall elect its assigned number of delegates to:

- (a) The county convention
- (b) The Congressional district convention
- (c) The legislative senatorial convention
- (d) The legislative representative convention

Sec. 5. **County Convention Instead of Precinct Caucuses**—Counties with a small population and a small number of precincts, as provided in the By-Laws, shall be permitted to have a county convention without precinct caucuses.

Sec. 6. **Delegates to Be Elected by Congressional District Conventions**—The delegates elected to the Congressional district conventions will elect delegates to:

- (a) The State Convention
- (b) The Board of Education district conventions

Sec. 7. **Ex Officio Convention Delegates**—

- (a) Other than the county chairman, county vice chairman, county treasurer, and county secretary, there shall be no ex officio delegates to a county convention.
- (b) Other than the chairman, the vice chairman, treasurer, and secretary of a Congressional district, there shall be no ex officio delegates to a Congressional district convention.
- (c) Other than the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, Treasurer, and the Secretary of the State Committee, there shall be no ex officio delegates to the State Convention.

Sec. 8. **Setting Dates for All Conventions**—

- (a) The State Committee shall establish a date for all precinct caucuses, county conventions, Congressional district conventions, legislative senatorial conventions, legislative representative conventions, Board of Education district conventions and for the State Convention.
- (b) There shall be not less than a one-week interval between each level of conventions.

Sec. 9. **50-50 Men and Women Delegates**—The total number of delegates must be approximately equally divided among men and women.

Sec. 10. **One Ballot for Each Office**—Regardless of the number of candidates for a specific office, all candidates receiving 30 per cent of

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the total vote of the delegates at all conventions will receive the endorsement of the party. If no candidate receives a 30 per cent vote total, the vote will be repeated until at least one candidate does receive a 30 per cent vote.

Sec. 11. Preprimary Designation Publicity—All caucuses and conventions at all levels provided for in this Constitution shall be open to the news media. It shall be the duty of the presiding officer of each caucus and convention, immediately after the conclusion of the balloting, to release the results to the news media.

**ARTICLE XII**

**KANSAS LAW AND THIS CONSTITUTION**

No Conflict—No provision of this Constitution or its By-Laws shall supersede or abrogate any of the provisions of the Statutes of the State of Kansas which are in conflict with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Republican Party of Kansas.

**ARTICLE XIII**

**MEETING PROCEDURES**

Section 1. Roberts' Rules of Order—At all meetings of the State Committee and its Executive Committee, ROBERTS' RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED shall govern parliamentary procedures when not inconsistent with this Constitution and By-Laws, the Statutes of Kansas or with the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee.

**ARTICLE XIV**

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. Provision for Notice—This constitution may be amended by the State Committee at any regular or special meeting, provided copies of the proposed amendments, which had been previously approved by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, are mailed to each member with a notice of the meeting at least three months before the meeting date and provided further that the proposal is approved by a two-thirds vote of the members in attendance at a regular or called meeting of the State Committee.

**ARTICLE XV**

**EFFECTIVE DATE**

Section 1. Notice—Voting—This Constitution shall become effective immediately upon receiving an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the State Committee, present and voting at the meeting called for such purpose.

**BY-LAWS**

**Republican Party of Kansas**

**ARTICLE I**

**PARTY ORGANIZATION**

Section 1. County Central Committee—The basic units of the Republican Party shall be the county central Republican committees which shall be elected as provided in KSA 25-3802.

Sec. 2. District Committee—Members of the district committees, Congressional, judicial, legislative or other, shall be elected by the county central committees as provided in KSA 25-3803.

Sec. 3. State Committee—The Republican State Committee, in which the management of the party is vested, shall consist of not more than 132 members, 110 elected by the district committees, 2 appointed by U. S. Senators and 16 ex officio, all as provided in KSA 25-3804, plus the officers of the State Committee.

The Executive Committee of the State Committee shall consist of 22 members, 2 to be appointed by U. S. Senators and 20 ex officio, as provided in KSA 25-3805.

The State Committee and its Executive Committee may elect such associate members as deemed necessary. Associate members may participate in the deliberations of the committee but shall have no vote.

**ARTICLE II**

**MEETINGS**

Section 1. Call of Meetings—A call of meetings of the State Committee shall be in writing and put into the mail to the last address of each regular and alternate member on file at the office of the committee at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting, except when amending the Constitution or By-Laws, as provided in the Constitution and in these By-Laws.

Sec. 2. Time and Place of Meetings—The call shall specify the date, time and place of the meeting and the business intended to be conducted at the meeting provided, however, that the call shall not limit the business of the meeting to those items.

**Sec. 3. Biennial Organizational Meetings—**

(a) The organizational meeting of the State Committee shall be held in the month of January following every general election and as specified in KSA 25-3805.

(b) The organizational meetings of the district committee shall be held prior to December 31 after every general election as specified in KSA 25-3803.


(c) The organizational meetings of the county central committees shall be held within two weeks after each primary election for state offices in accordance with KSA 25-3802.

Sec. 4. Special Meetings—Other meetings of the State Committee, the district committees and county central committees shall be considered to be special meetings and shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by the Chairman, provided that the State Committee must hold each year at least one meeting in addition to that specified in Article II, Section 3. In the event of the Chairman being unable or unwilling to call a meeting the Vice Chairman shall issue the call. In the event of both the Chairman and Vice Chairman being unable or unwilling to act, the Secretary of the committee shall call a meeting upon receiving a request in writing signed by 20 per cent of the committee members.

Sec. 5. Quorum—A quorum of the State Committee shall be a majority of the qualified voting members of the committee. A quorum of the Executive Committee shall be a majority of all its voting members. Voting members of the Executive Committee who are unable to attend any meeting may give a written non-voting proxy to a voting member of the Executive Committee for quorum purposes only.

Sec. 6. Adjourned Meetings—Any meeting of the State Committee, whether a quorum is present or not, may be adjourned from time to time by vote of a majority of the members present and voting. In the absence of a quorum, no other business may be transacted at such meeting. If the adjourned meeting is to be convened in forty-eight hours or less from the time the called meeting was adjourned, no notices of time, place or business to be conducted at the meeting need be given to the members. If a meeting is to be adjourned for a period of time exceeding forty-eight hours, notices shall be sent to each member as provided in the original call.

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Sec. 7. **Committee Meetings**—At no meeting of any standing or ad hoc committee shall any official business be transacted unless a majority of the appointed committee members is present. Minutes of each committee meeting must be carefully kept and copies made for the Chairman, the Vice Chairman and the Secretary of the State Committee.

Sec. 8. **Platform Committee Meeting**—As specified in KSA 25-3810, the platform committee shall meet and function on the last Tuesday of each month in which a primary election for state offices is held. The State Committee, well in advance of this meeting by special committee or otherwise, shall do everything possible to assist the committee in making preparations for the meeting.

### ARTICLE III VOTING

Section 1. **Eligibility to Vote**—Only members of the State Committee and its duly elected officers will be eligible to vote at meetings of the committee provided that regularly elected alternates may vote in the absence of their principal members and provided further that ex officio members may not be represented by alternates.

Sec. 2. **When Electing Officers**—Officers shall be elected by secret ballot provided that voting may be by acclamation when only one person is nominated and, further, provided if a majority of the members of the State Committee is present and voting.

Sec. 3. **Voice Voting**—In the normal transaction of business at meetings of the State Committee and its Executive Committee other than the election of officers, voting on motions shall be by voice vote. Upon the request of 25 per cent of the members, voting shall be by roll call vote.

Sec. 4. **No Voting by Proxy**—No member or alternate member of the State Committee shall vote by proxy.

Sec. 5. **Roberts' Rules of Order Newly Revised**—As provided in Article XIII of the Constitution, ROBERTS' RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED shall govern all voting and parliamentary procedures when not inconsistent with this Constitution and its By-Laws, the Statutes of Kansas and with the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee.

Sec. 6. **Prohibition Against Unit Rule**—At all meetings of all elements of the Republican Party in Kansas each member shall be entitled to register his individual vote, and no members shall be bound by any party or convention rule requiring all members to vote as a unit. All nominations shall be made individually. Elections by states shall be prohibited.

### ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

Section 1. **Officers of the State Committee**—At the organizational meeting of the State Committee, the State Committee shall elect these statutory officers:

- (a) Chairman
- (b) Vice Chairman
- (c) Secretary
- (d) Treasurer

Sec. 2. **Term of Statutory Officers of the State Committee**—Officers elected at the organizational meeting shall hold office until the next organizational meeting; they shall take office immediately upon being elected and shall hold office until their duly elected successors are qualified with the exception of the Treasurer, who shall continue in office until the audit of his office is completed. Such audit shall be completed in not to exceed forty-five days after the date of the organizational meeting.

Sec. 3. **Appointed Officers**—The State Chairman, with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, may appoint the following nonstatutory and nonvoting officers of the State Committee, assign duties and responsibilities and establish compensation:

- (a) Chaplain
- (b) Legal Counsel
- (c) Auditor
- (d) Sergeant at Arms
- (e) Executive Director
- (f) Assistant Treasurer
- (g) Parliamentarian
- (h) Two Associate Vice Chairmen

Sec. 4. **Removal of Elected or Appointed Officers**—Any elected or appointed officer of the State Committee, excepting the Executive Director, may be removed from office for cause at any time by a vote of two-thirds of the membership of the State Committee provided (1) that such meetings may be called by a majority of the members of the State Committee and (2) that a notice in writing giving the date, time, place and purpose of the meeting is put into the mail to every member of the State Committee two weeks before the date of the meeting. The action of the State Committee shall be final. The Executive Director shall hold his position at the pleasure of the State Chairman.

Sec. 5. **Vacancies**—In case of a vacancy in the office of Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer of the State Committee through death, resignation, removal or other cause, the State Committee by majority vote of

members at a meeting of the committee, at which a quorum is present, shall elect a successor to hold office for the unexpired term of the office left vacant.

(a) In case of a vacancy in the office of Chairman, the Vice Chairman shall immediately and automatically assume the title and duties of the Chairman until such time as the State Committee shall meet to elect a successor.

(b) In case of vacancy in the office of treasurer, the Secretary shall immediately and automatically assume the title and duties of the Treasurer until such time as the State Committee shall meet to elect a successor.

Sec. 6. **Duties of State Chairman**—The duties of the State Chairman shall include but not be limited to the following:

- (a) The State Chairman shall be the chief executive officer of the State Committee. He shall issue the call and preside at all meetings of the committee and shall observe and enforce the rules and regulations prescribed by the committee.
- (b) The State Chairman shall be the custodian of all the books, papers, records and proceedings of the State Committee.
- (c) The State Chairman shall have the power to appoint subordinate staff members authorized by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 7. **Duties of State Vice Chairman**—The duties of the State Vice Chairman shall include but not be limited to the following:

- (a) The Vice Chairman shall exercise the functions of the Chairman, as set forth in Section 6 (a) of this article, during the temporary absence from the state or temporary disability of the Chairman.
- (b) The Vice Chairman shall perform such other duties as shall be prescribed by the State Chairman.

Sec. 8. **Duties of the Secretary**—The duties of the Secretary shall include but not be limited to the following:

- (a) The Secretary shall be the chief clerical officer of the State Committee and shall make a complete record of all the proceedings of said committee and the Executive Committee.
- (b) The Secretary shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the State Chairman.
- (c) The Secretary shall attest all calls for meetings of the State Committee.
- (d) The Secretary will file and preserve all permanent records of the State Committee.
- (e) The Secretary will have in readiness at all times an up-to-date listing of all members of the State Committee, of district committees, of standing committees and of all ad hoc committees.

Sec. 9. **Duties of the Treasurer**—

- (a) The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of the State Committee. He shall keep records of all the receipts and disbursements and be responsible for same. He shall assist the officers of the State Committee in the preparation of budgets and estimates.
- (b) The Treasurer shall not write checks to cover any invoices or accounts which have not been approved in writing by either an officer or a committee chairman either of whom has been delegated this authority in writing by the State Chairman who has the basic fiduciary responsibility for and authority over all financial commitments, obligations and disbursements of the State Committee funds.
- (c) The Treasurer shall open and maintain bank accounts in the bank or banks approved by the Executive Committee.
- (d) The Treasurer shall prepare reports each month for the officers and committee chairman, shall prepare special reports as requested and shall make and execute all reports required by the federal government, the State of Kansas and the Republican National Committee.
- (e) The Treasurer, with the written approval of the State Chairman, may make nominal borrowings not to exceed an aggregate principal indebtedness of \$10,000 outstanding at any one time. The Treasurer, with the written approval of the State Chairman and with the approval of two-thirds of the Executive Committee present and voting at a properly called official meeting, may make borrowings not to exceed an aggregate principal indebtedness of \$25,000 outstanding at any one time. Borrowings in excess of \$25,000 aggregate principal amount outstanding at any one time may not be made without the approval of two-thirds of the State Committee present and voting at a properly called official meeting.

### ARTICLE V

#### AUTHORITY TO MAKE PURCHASES AND COMMITMENTS

Section 1. **Budget Procedure — Even-Numbered Years**—The State Chairman shall prepare an annual budget for the fiscal year operation of the State Committee. The fiscal year for the State Committee shall be the calendar year. In even-numbered years (the general election year), said budget shall be submitted to and approved by the Executive Committee in the last quarter of the prior odd-numbered fiscal year; said

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budget shall then be submitted to and approved by a special State Committee meeting at which additional voting rights on the approval of the budget shall be granted to attending county chairmen and vice chairmen who are not members of the State Committee or alternates qualified to vote at said meeting. Said budget may be revised from time to time upon a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Executive Committee provided, however, that county money-raising quotas shall not be increased as a result of said changes in the budget. Said budget will contemplate the setting aside by general election day of an amount sufficient to pay the ordinary operating expenses of the State Committee for a period of ninety (90) days following the general election, and it shall be the responsibility of the State Chairman to assure that such funds are set aside and not obligated prior to said general election day.

**Sec. 2. Budget Procedure—Odd-Numbered Years**—In odd-numbered years (preceding the general election years) the State Chairman shall prepare a recommended budget for the fiscal year for submission to the newly elected officers in January. The newly elected State Chairman shall revise said budget and submit it within thirty (30) days to the Executive Committee for approval by two-thirds affirmative vote. Said budget may be revised from time to time upon a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Executive Committee, provided however, that county money-raising quotas shall not be increased as a result of said changes in the budget.

**Sec. 3. Limitations—Purchases and Commitments**—The State Chairman has the authority to make purchase commitments and other obligations of State Committee funds and authorize disbursements of said funds, the State Chairman also has the responsibility of assuring that obligations do not exceed funds available or limitations of expenditures by the budget. Said authority to make purchase commitments may be delegated in writing by the State Chairman to one or more officers or committee chairmen. No purchase or commitments in excess of \$500 may be made unless said item has approval in the budget.

**Sec. 4. Petty Cash Account**—The State Committee is authorized to set up a petty cash account in the office of the Executive Director, the amount and the modus operandi to be determined by the State Chairman but in an amount not exceeding \$250.00.

## ARTICLE VI

### RELATIONS WITH REPUBLICAN NATIONAL COMMITTEE

**Section 1. National Committeeman and Committeewoman**—As provided in ARTICLE IX of the Constitution, the State Committee, governed by the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee, will nominate such persons as specified. With the approval of the Republican National Committee, the State Committee shall nominate three alternates for each committee person. Whenever it becomes necessary for a committee person to be represented by proxy at a meeting of the Republican National Committee, said alternate must be selected by the State Chairman from the list of approved alternates.

**Sec. 2. Other Representation on the Republican National Committee**—When specified by the rules and regulations of the Republican National Committee, any officer of the State Committee may represent the State Committee on the Republican National Committee when so approved by the Republican National Committee.

**Sec. 3. Delegates to the Republican National Convention**—ARTICLE X of the Constitution provides for the election of delegates to the Republican National Convention. The Republican National Committee will set the number of delegates to be elected.

**Sec. 4. Reimbursement for Expenses**—The State Committee may reimburse Kansas members (or their proxies) of the Republican National Committee for their actual expenses in attending meetings of the Republican National Committee. However, neither Kansas members of the Republican National Committee nor delegates to the Republican National Convention shall be reimbursed for their personal travel expenses in attending the convention. The State Committee shall approve in advance of the convention any allowable expenses for the Kansas delegation.

## ARTICLE VII

### COMMITTEES

#### Section 1. Standing Committees—

- (a) Other than the Executive and platform committees of the State Committee which are provided by law, and the ex officio members of the advisory committee covered in Section 2 of this ARTICLE, the Chairman of the State Committee may appoint such standing committees as may be desired.
- (b) The Chairman of the State Committee shall determine the number of members for each committee and shall designate the chairman and vice chairman of each committee for all committees except the advisory committee. Members of the standing committees

need not be members of the State Committee. The Chairman shall also delineate the responsibilities, activities, and method of operation of each of the standing committees.

**Sec. 2. Advisory Committee**—The members of this committee shall be the incumbent National Committeeman and Committeewoman, all former National Committeemen and Committeewomen, the present State Chairman, and Vice Chairman, all former State Chairmen and Vice Chairmen and not to exceed four members from each Congressional district to be appointed by the Congressional District Chairman. This committee shall meet not less frequently than twice a year at the call of the State Chairman who shall be the chairman.

#### Sec. 3. Ad Hoc Committees—

(a) The Chairman of the State Committee, with the approval of the Executive Committee, may appoint temporary or ad hoc committees for specific assignments in the same manner as for standing committees.

**Sec. 4. Preprimary Designation Procedure**—Should either the Executive Committee or the State Committee by majority vote direct the preparation of rules and regulations for a preprimary designation procedure, the State Chairman shall have the authority to appoint a standing committee to accomplish this objective according to ARTICLE XI of the Constitution and the provisions of these By-Laws.

(a) The standing committee shall have thirty three members, approximately half male, half female, who shall be appointed as follows: The State Chairman shall appoint the chairman and vice chairman; the State Vice Chairman will appoint one member; the State Secretary will appoint one member; the State Treasurer will appoint one member; each Congressional district chairman and vice chairman will appoint two members; each of the other voting members of the Executive Committee will appoint one member.

(b) The rules and regulations for the preprimary endorsement procedure shall not be put into effect until first approved by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee at which meeting a quorum is present and finally approved at a meeting of the State Committee by a majority vote of the State Committee and, provided, this final approval shall not be effective in any general election year unless so approved before March 1 of said general election year.

(c) The preprimary procedure committee, as provided for in these By-Laws, shall review the rules and regulations, consider comments and suggestions sent to the committee, and report its findings and recommendations to the Executive Committee not more than six months after each primary election for statewide offices.

## ARTICLE VIII

### CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN OF OPPOSITE SEX

Section 1. As provided in KSA 25-3811, the chairmen and vice chairmen of the State Committee, the Executive Committee of the State Committee, the district committees, the county central committees and all standing or ad hoc committees shall be of the opposite sex.

## ARTICLE IX

### AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the State Committee at any regular or called meeting of the State Committee provided a written notice of the proposed amendment and a full copy thereof was put into the mail to each member of the committee three weeks in advance of the meeting.

## ARTICLE X

### EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 1. These By-Laws shall become effective immediately upon a two-thirds affirmative vote of the State Committee present and voting at the meeting called for such purpose.

Answering inquiries about transaction that included his participation does not seem correct. He would be able to respond with more knowledge on the decisions made as director than I can as treasurer. I will respond to the inquiries to the best of my knowledge.

1. The Kansas State Republican Committee does not have the authority or ability to participate in the governance of the Second District to my knowledge. I do not have a copy of the by-laws of the Second District but will locate and forward a copy if there is one available.
2. The Second District participates in the State Committee in
3. the fact that the Chairman and Vice Chairman serve as members of the State Executive Committee which has 26 members. They serve as an advisory committee which approves a budget for the State. Contributions are a line item only, they do not decide what contributions are made or to whom. Those decisions are made by the State Committee.
4. There is no transfer of funds from the Second District to the State Committee. The County Committees at times contribute to the State Committee. The only transfers to the State Committee from our accounts that I was able to locate are a check of 250.00 on 4-30-1990 for payment of an ad in the Republican Handbook and a contribution or donation to the State Committee in the amount of \$5,000 on 8-3-88.
5. We are a part of the State Committee in that our Chairman and Vice Chairman serve on the Executive Committee and I don't feel I can respond for Mr. Martin.

Those checks to the State Party are at the beginning for that year. Checks from the State party to local party units/auxillaries are at the end of that year.

1989 pages 21 - 41  
1990 pages 42 - 72  
1991 pages 73 - 79

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On several county checks the words 'contribution' or 'quota' is written in the memo line. Each county is given a quota at the beginning of the year. Any contributions, from individuals living in that county or from the county party, are credited to that county's quota. Several counties meet their quota by collecting the money from individuals, depositing it in their county account, and then cutting a check from the county account to the State Party. They may or may not give us a list of names for thank-you letters. Also, counties prefer not to go over their quota, so a county check may come in for an odd amount. The county quotas are contributions to the State Party, they are not fees, dues, or payment obligations of any form.

Also, the State Party does printing (or copying) and bulk mailings for some auxillaries and counties. These are shown in this packet.

Finally, several county parties and auxillaries buy ads in our yearly Kansas Handbook. These ads range from \$25/\$30 (depending on the year) up to \$400, depending on the size of the ad.

I hope this clarifies the enclosed packet of information.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On August 22, 1989, the Commission found reason to believe that the Kansas Republican State Committee ("KRSC") and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a). On the same date, the Commission also found reason to believe that the KRSC violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A) and that Kansans for Meinhardt ("the Committee") and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f). Both the KRSC and the Committee submitted requests to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation, which requests were denied by the Commission because of the need for additional investigation. As discussed below, this Office now recommends that the Commission take no further action against the Kansas Republican State Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, and Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, and close the file in this matter.

II. ANALYSIS

A. Excessive Contribution

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), it is unlawful for a multicandidate political committee to make contributions to any

candidate and his authorized political committee with respect to any election for federal office which, in the aggregate, exceed \$5000. Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(f), it is unlawful for an officer or employee of a political committee to knowingly accept a contribution made for the use or benefit of a candidate in violation of the limitations imposed on contributions under 2 U.S.C. § 441a.

11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(1988) provides that all contributions made by political committees established, financed, maintained, or controlled by a state party committee and by subordinate state party committees shall be presumed to be made by one political committee.<sup>1</sup> The regulation further provides that this presumption shall not apply if: (A) the political committee of the party unit in question has not received funds from any other political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by any party unit; and (B) the political committee of the party unit in question does not make its contributions in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of any other party unit or political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by another party unit.

On September 17, 1988, the KRSC contributed \$5000 for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. Previously, on August 3, 1988, the Second District Republican Committee

("Second District") had contributed \$5000 for the general election to Kansans for Meinhardt. The reason to believe findings in this matter were based upon the presumption of affiliation between the Second District and the KRSC, thereby resulting in an excessive contribution from the KRSC. 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii).

The presumption of affiliation in 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii) applies to political committees which are established, financed, maintained, or controlled by a state party committee. In its sworn statement filed in response to the Commission's reason to believe notification, the KRSC stated that the Second District is not a political committee which is established, financed, maintained, or controlled by the KRSC. The KRSC stated under oath that the KRSC and the Second District are considered separate and independent under Kansas law.<sup>2</sup> The KRSC has also stated (in an unsworn statement) that it has no authority or ability to participate in the governance of the Second District. The Second District, on the other hand, has asserted that it is affiliated with the KRSC. However, the Second District has failed to provide any basis for its assertion that it is affiliated with the KRSC.

In response to a request for additional information from

2. The provisions of Kansas law to which the KRSC refers have been repealed. Chapter 25, article 38 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated is entitled "Political Parties". K.S.A. 25-3802 through 25-3806, relating to county central committees, district committees, and state committee, were repealed in 1990. Furthermore, K.S.A. 25-3802 through 25-3806 did not address the issue of affiliation between the state committee and district committees.

this Office, the KRSC submitted a copy of its constitution and by-laws. Although the KRSC argues that it has no authority or ability to direct or participate in the governance of the Second District, a review of the provisions of the KRSC's constitution and by-laws indicates that the KRSC has some control over the District Committees. Furthermore, it appears that the District Committees have the ability to participate in the governance of the KRSC.

Article VI of the KRSC's constitution, entitled "District Committees", provides as follows:

Section 1. Organization - The district committees of the Republican Party for each Congressional district shall be organized, shall elect officers and shall function as provided by the Kansas Statutes. It shall not be necessary for any of the officers of any district committee to be a member of any district committee. The district committees may provide for an executive committee for each Congressional district committee.

Section 2. Meetings - The organizational meeting of the district committee will be held as provided in the Kansas Statutes. Other meetings of the district committee may be held at locations specified by the district chairman.

Section 3. Constitution and By-Laws - Each district must formulate its own articles and by-laws which must be consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Republican Party of Kansas.

Section 4. Provision for Subdistricts - For administrative purposes, a district chairman, with the approval of the Executive Committee of the State Committee, may divide a Congressional district into subdistricts, each to have officers in the manner of the district committee and to be elected from its

membership by the members of the district committee in each subdistrict. Subdistricts must be made up of contiguous counties and numbered consecutively.

Article I of the by-laws of the KRSC establishes the basic organization of the Kansas Republican Party as follows:

Section 1. County Central Committee - The basic units of the Republican Party shall be the county central Republican committees which shall be elected as provided in KSA 25-3802.

Section 2. District Committee - Members of the district committees, Congressional, judicial, legislative or other, shall be elected by the county central committees as provided in KSA 25-3803.

Section 3. State Committee - The Republican State Committee, in which the management of the party is vested, shall consist of not more than 132 members, 110 elected by the district committees, 2 appointed by U.S. Senators and 16 ex officio, all as provided in KSA 25-3804, plus the officers of the State Committee.

The Executive Committee of the State Committee shall consist of 22 members, 2 to be appointed by the U.S. Senators and 2 ex officio, as provided in KSA 25-3805.

The State Committee and its Executive Committee may elect such associate members as deemed necessary. Associate members may participate in the deliberations of the committee but shall have no vote.

The foregoing provisions indicate that the KRSC does exercise limited control over the Second District. The KRSC's constitution expressly provides for the establishment of district committees and also provides that the district committees' constitutions and by-laws must be consistent with those of the KRSC. In addition, there appears to be some commonality of membership between the KRSC and the district committees. The KRSC has stated that it has an Executive

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Committee consisting of 26 members, including the chairman and vice chairman of each congressional district. The Executive Committee approves the budget for the KRSC, but does not approve individual contributions. Contrary to the assertions of the KRSC, it does not appear that the KRSC and the Second District are "entirely distinct and autonomous organizations." Therefore, it appears that the Second District is a political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by the KRSC within the meaning of 11 C.F.R. §110.3(b)(2)(ii).

Nevertheless, the presumption of affiliation would not apply if the two conditions set forth in 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(A) and (B) are satisfied. A.O. 1978-9. Section 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(A) relates to the receipt of funds by the party unit in question from any other political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by any party unit. It does not appear from the information received that the Second District has received any funds from the KRSC or any party political committee affiliated with the KRSC. It does appear that the KRSC has received funds from the Second District. During the period of August 3, 1988 through April 30, 1990, the KRSC received five checks totaling \$6,600 from the Second District. These checks from the Second District to the KRSC include one donation in the amount of \$5,000 and four other transfers for a luncheon, advertising, travel and other expenses. However, all five of these checks were deposited into the KRSC's nonfederal account.

The fact that no funds have been transferred from the

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Second District to the KRSC's federal account suggests that the provisions of 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(A) are satisfied. Section 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(A) provides that the presumption of affiliation shall not apply if the political committee of the party unit in question has not received funds from any other political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by any party unit. The regulation itself does not distinguish between a state party committee's federal and nonfederal accounts. A review of past Commission actions, however, indicates that the deposit of funds received from a county party committee into a state party committee's nonfederal account does not prevent the presumption of affiliation from being overcome. In A.O. 1978-9, the Commission held that the presumption of affiliation in 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii) had been overcome despite the fact that the Iowa Republican State Central Committee received funds from county committees, which were not deposited into the State Committee's federal account. See also MUR 1613 (transfer of funds from county committees to the Michigan Republican State Committee's federal account prevents the presumption of affiliation from being overcome and indicates that the state committee is financed in part by the county committees); MUR 655 (transfers received by the Nebraska Democratic State Central Committee from county committees were deposited into the State Committee's single account for federal and state elections). Although the Commission's opinion in A.O. 1978-9 does not specifically address the issue of whether the regulations at 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(A) apply only to

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a party committee's federal account, the holding in that opinion suggests that the regulations should be applied narrowly to focus on a party committee's receipt of funds into its federal account.

The second part of the exception to the presumption of affiliation concerns whether the party unit in question makes its contributions in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of any other party unit or political committee established, financed, maintained, or controlled by another party unit. 11 C.F.R.

§ 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(B). The KRSC stated under oath that the Second District has not made any contributions in cooperation or consultation with the KRSC or any of its affiliates. The KRSC stated (in an unsworn statement) that neither the KRSC nor its affiliates has ever requested or suggested how the Second District spend any of its funds. The KRSC stated under oath that it is not aware of any contributions made by the Second District, and has no control over the collection of or the disbursements of Second District money. In addition, the former treasurer of the Second District stated that she was not aware of any instance during her term when the KRSC has requested or suggested that the Second District make a contribution to a specific federal, state, or local candidate. Accordingly, it appears that the requirements of 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii)(B) have also been satisfied.

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In conclusion, the information available in this matter indicates that the Second District does not receive funds from the KRSC, and that any funds received by the KRSC from the Second District have been deposited into the KRSC's nonfederal account. Further, there is no evidence which suggests that contributions by the Second District are made in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, the KRSC. For these reasons, it appears that the presumption of affiliation in 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(b)(2)(ii) has been overcome in this matter. A.O. 1978-9. In view of the foregoing, this Office recommends that the Commission take no further action against the KRSC with respect to the \$5,000 apparent excessive contribution to Kansans for Meinhardt. This Office also recommends that the Commission take no further action against Kansans for Meinhardt and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer, and close the file as to these Respondents.

B. Contributions from Unregistered Organizations

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a), it is unlawful for a corporation or labor union to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with a federal election, or for a candidate or political committee to accept such a contribution.

11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a) provides that a political committee has two available alternatives to ensure that prohibited monies are not used in connection with federal elections: (1) it may establish a single account for both federal and nonfederal activity, with such an account containing only contributions subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Federal

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Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, or (2) it may establish a separate federal account for federal activity and a second account for state and local election activity.

Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), only funds subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act may be deposited into the separate federal account.

From the period of September 17, 1988 through November 8, 1988, the KRSC accepted a total of \$1,766 from 11 unregistered organizations. See First General Counsel's Report dated August 14, 1989, page 4. These contributions included ten contributions, totaling \$766, in the amount of \$100 or less. The KRSC stated that it inadvertently deposited these contributions into its federal account as a "result of staff oversight." The KRSC later transferred \$766 out of its federal account into KRSC's nonfederal account in response to inquiries from the Reports Analysis Division asking the KRSC to clarify whether the contributions were permissible under 11 C.F.R. § 102.5.

The remaining \$1,000 contribution received from an unregistered organization was received by the KRSC on September 17, 1988 from the J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #2. The KRSC stated that it believed at the time the contribution was accepted that the contribution was from the J.C. Nichols Company Political Action Committee #1, which is a registered committee. The KRSC transferred \$1,000 from its federal account into its nonfederal account on December 20, 1988. Thus, the entire \$1,766 in contributions

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from unregistered organizations has been transferred to the KRSC's nonfederal account.

At this time, this Office also recommends that the Commission take no further action against the KRSC with respect to the receipt of contributions from unregistered organizations.

this Office recommends that the Commission take no further action with respect to the Commission's finding of reason to believe that the Kansas State Republican Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), and close the file in this matter.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Take no further action against the Kansas State Republican Committee and Duane Nightingale, as treasurer, and Kansans for Meinhardt, and Rosemary Boston, as treasurer.
2. Close the file.

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3. Approve the appropriate letters.
