SUBJECT: REFERRAL OF THE CALIFORNIANS FOR MADDY-F

Californians For Maddy-F ("the Committee") has made apparent excessive contributions totalling \$8,000 to two (2) federal candidates. According to the 1987-1988 Reports Analyst Division Review and Referral Procedures for Authorized Committees, an examination by your office is required.

For your information, the Committee registered on March 27, 1980 as the principal campaign committee of Kenneth L. Maddy ("the Candidate") for the 1982 Senate race in California. On January 23, 1982 and December 20, 1985 the Candidate filed letters which he classified as Amended Statements of Organization. The Statements were signed by the Candidate and changed the year of election to 1986 and 1992 respectively. The Candidate's name did not appear on the California State Ballot for the 1982 or 1986 elections. Since its formation in 1980, the Committee has raised \$48,950.

Review of all reports on file with the Commission indicates that the Candidate has not been actively seeking nomination for election to a federal office.

Additionally, the Stark for Congress committee was sent a Request for Additional Information ("RFAI") on January 13, 1989 regarding the 1988 30 Day Post-General Report. The RFAI noted the receipt of an apparent excessive contribution from the Committee. On January 31, 1989, the Stark For Congress committee responded in a letter stating that the Committee had met the requirements to be a multicandidate committee; however, the Committee had failed to amend its Statement of Organization changing it to a multicandidate committee. An RFAI to

Californians for Senator Pete Wilson noting the receipt of an apparent excessive contribution from the Committee was mailed on May 2, 1989. Neither of the committees that received apparent excessive contributions meet the threshold for referral to your office.

III. BACKGROUND:

Apparent Excessive Contributions Made to Federal Candidates

The 1988 Year End Report for Californians For Maddy-F ("the Committee") received on January 24, 1989, disclosed on Schedule B the disbursement of apparent excessive contributions totalling \$8,000 to two (2) federal candidates (Attachment 2). The report disclosed a \$5,000 contribution made to Californians For Senator Pete Wilson on October 18, 1988 and a \$5,000 contribution made to Stark For Congress on October 26, 1988.^{1/} A Request For Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent to the Committee on February 7, 1989 (Attachment 3). The RFAI noted the disbursement of the apparent excessive contributions and requested the Committee to obtain a refund of the amount in excess of the \$1,000 per election limit. In addition, the RFAI noted the possibility of further Commission action concerning the disbursement of apparent excessive contributions. A Second Notice was sent to the Committee on March 2, 1989 for failure to respond to the RFAI (Attachment 4).

The Committee submitted an Amended Statement of Organization (FEC FORM 1) on February 17, 1989 (Attachment 5). The Committee had changed its status from a principal

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campaign committee to a multicandidate committee. The Amended FEC FORM 1 was signed and dated October 18, 1988. The Committee did not indicate if this Amended FEC FORM 1 was a copy of one they had filed in October.

On May 2, 1989 a Reports Analysis Division Analyst called Katherine G. Chrisman ("the Treasurer") (Attachment 6). The analyst asked the Treasurer why the Amended FEC FORM 1 was dated October 18, 1988, although it wasn't received until February 17, 1989. The Treasurer stated that she had signed an amended FEC FORM 1 in October of 1988 and forwarded it to the Sacramento office for mailing. The analyst told the Treasurer that the amended form had not been received and that the Committee should respond to the RFAI and contact the recipient committees and obtain a refund of the excessive amounts. The Treasurer said she would reply.

On May 5, 1989 the Committee responded in a letter (Attachment 7). The letter stated that on October 18, 1988 the Committee realized that they had become a qualified multicandidate committee; they prepared an amended form and sent it to the Sacramento office, who stated that they mailed it to the Secretary of the Senate. The response further stated that the Committee anticipates terminating but will request a refund if necessary. To date, no further action has been taken by Committee.

Dear Ms. Christman:

This letter is prompted by the Commission's preliminary review of the report(s) referenced above. The review raised questions concerning certain information contained in the report(s). An itemization follows:

-Schedule B of your report (pertinent portion attached) discloses a contribution(s) which appears to exceed the limit set forth in the Act. The Act precludes an individual or a political committee, other than a qualified multicandidate committee, from making a contribution to a candidate for Federal office in excess of \$1,000 per election. (2 U.S.C. §441a(a))

If the contribution(s) in question was incompletely or incorrectly disclosed, you should amend your original report with the clarifying information. If the contribution made was excessive, you should notify the recipient and request a refund of the amount in excess of \$1,000. You should inform the Commission in writing of such a refund, and the refund should appear on Line 15 of the Detailed Summary Page and on Schedule A of the report covering the period in which the refund is received.

Although the Commission may take further legal steps, prompt action by you to obtain a refund of the excessive amount(s) will be taken into consideration.

A written response or an amendment to your original report(s) correcting the above problem(s) should be filed with the Secretary of the Senate, 232 Hart Senate Office Building, Washington, DC 20510 within fifteen (15) days of the date of this

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I called the Committee to get additional information on the date of the amended statement of organization and to tell them that they had to obtain a refund of the excessive amounts. I spoke with the Treasurer Ms. Chrisman. I asked her how the amended Form 1 could be dated October 18, 1988 when it wasn't received at the Commission until February 17, 1989. Ms. Chrisman stated that when the Committee realized that they could become a multicandidate committee she prepared an amended form signed it and forwarded it to the Sacramento office for mailing. She said that she did not know what happened to it once it left her office but she would check into it. I told her that we did not get the original form and since we did not receive the amended form until February we would consider the committee qualified as of February 1989. I informed her that based on that assumption she should obtain a refund from the two recipient committees. Ms. Chrisman said that she would respond to the Request for Additional Information by the end of the week.

I. GENERATION OF MATTER

This matter involving Californians For Maddy-F (the "Committee") was referred to the Office of the General Counsel on May 22, 1989 by the Reports Analysis Division (Attachment 1). The referral is based on a review of the reports filed by the Committee.

II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A), it is unlawful for any person to make contributions to any candidate and his authorized committee with respect to any election for Federal office, which, in the aggregate, exceed \$1,000. The term person includes a political committee. 2 U.S.C. § 431(11). Furthermore, under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), it is unlawful for a multicandidate political committee to make contributions to any candidate and his authorized political committee with respect to any election

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for Federal office, which, in the aggregate, exceed \$5,000.

Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(4), a "multicandidate political committee" is a political committee which has been registered with the Commission for at least six months, has received contributions from more than 50 persons, and except for State party political organizations, has made contributions to five or more candidates for federal office.

Under the provisions of 2 U.S.C. § 433, a political committee must file a Statement of Organization with the Commission. Under that Section, a Statement of Organization includes the "type" of committee.

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A political committee registered as a principal campaign committee is not prohibited from converting to a multicandidate committee. Formal notice of conversion from a principal campaign committee to a multicandidate committee is achieved by filing an Amended Statement of Organization. Under 2 U.S.C. § 433(c), however, any change in information previously submitted in a Statement of Organization must be reported to the Commission no later than ten days after the date of the change.

According to the referral materials, the Committee registered on March 27, 1980 as the principal campaign committee of Kenneth L. Maddy (the "Candidate") for the 1982 U.S. Senate race in California. On January 28, 1982, and December 20, 1985 the Candidate filed letters which he classified as Amended Statements of Organization. The Statements of Organization were signed by the Candidate and changed the year of election to 1986 and 1992 respectively. The Candidate's name did not appear on

the California ballot for U.S. Senate in the 1982 or 1986 elections. During the 1987-88 election cycle, the Committee reported \$4,924 in receipts and \$29,669 in disbursements. Review of all the reports on file with the Commission and the Committee's relatively low level of financial activity indicate that the Candidate has not been actively seeking nomination for election to a federal office.

The Committee's 1988 Year End Report disclosed a \$5,000 contribution to Californians For Senator Pete Wilson on October 18, 1988 and a \$5,000 contribution to Stark For Congress on October 26, 1988. A Request For Additional Information ("RFAI") was sent to the Committee on February 7, 1989 noting that the Committee had made apparent excessive contributions.

On February 17, 1989, the Committee submitted an Amended Statement of Organization changing the Committee's status from a principal campaign committee to that of a multicandidate committee. The Amended Statement of Organization was signed and dated October 18, 1988.

On May 5, 1989, the Committee submitted a letter which stated that the Committee realized it had become a qualified multicandidate committee on October 18, 1988. Subsequently, an Amended Statement of Organization was prepared and forwarded to Sacramento, California, for State Senator Maddy's review. The Committee further stated that staff in Sacramento mailed the Amended Statement of Organization to the Secretary of the Senate by regular mail. The date of the mailing was not specified in the Committee's letter. Upon receipt of the RFAI, the Committee

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forwarded another copy to the Commission. The Committee also stated that it anticipates terminating soon, but will request a refund of the above-mentioned contributions should the Commission "feel it necessary[.]"

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In the instant case, the evidence shows that Californians For Maddy-F converted to a multicandidate committee and intended to file an Amended Statement of Organization to reflect the change in its status, but failed to do so prior to making the contributions in excess of \$1,000 described above. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find reason to believe Californians For Maddy-F and Katherine Giel Chrisman, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(c).

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Open a MUR.
2. Find reason to believe Californians For Maddy-F and Katherine Giel Chrisman, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(c).

3. Approve the attached letter and factual and legal analysis.

Dear Ms. Chrisman:

On October 24, 1989, the Federal Election Commission found that there is reason to believe Californians For Maddy-F (the "Committee") and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(c), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). The Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed a basis for the Commission's finding, is attached for your information.

Under the Act, you have an opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer. You may submit any factual or legal materials that you believe are relevant to the Commission's consideration of this matter. Please submit such materials to the General Counsel's Office within 15 days of your receipt of this letter. Where appropriate, statements should be submitted under oath.

In the absence of any additional information demonstrating that no further action should be taken against the Committee and you, as treasurer, the Commission may find probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred and proceed with conciliation.

If you are interested in pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, you should so request in writing. See 11 C.F.R. § 111.18(d). Upon receipt of the request, the Office of the General Counsel will make recommendations to the Commission either proposing an agreement in settlement of the matter or recommending declining that pre-probable cause conciliation be pursued. The Office of the General Counsel may recommend that pre-probable cause conciliation not be entered into at this time so that it may complete its investigation of the matter. Further, the Commission will not entertain requests for pre-probable cause conciliation after briefs on probable cause have been mailed to the respondent.

Requests for extensions of time will not be routinely granted. Requests must be made in writing at least five days prior to the due date of the response and specific good cause must be demonstrated. In addition, the Office of the General Counsel ordinarily will not give extensions beyond 20 days.

If you intend to be represented by counsel in this matter, please advise the Commission by completing the enclosed form stating the name, address, and telephone number of such counsel, and authorizing such counsel to receive any notifications and other communications from the Commission.

This matter will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. §§ 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A), unless you notify the Commission in writing that you wish the investigation to be made public.

For your information, we have attached a brief description of the Commission's procedures for handling possible violations of the Act. If you have any questions, please contact Kenneth E. Kellner, the attorney assigned to this matter, at (202) 376-8200.


This letter is written pursuant to our telephone conversation this date in which I requested an extension of time to respond to the Commission's letter dated November 2, 1989.

Dear Mr. Kellner:

This letter is written on behalf of Californians for Maddy - F, State Senator Ken Maddy and Katherine Giel Chrisman as treasurer. We are requesting pre-probable cause conciliation pursuant to 11 C.F.R. section 111.18(d). As we discussed, we would like to resolve this matter as quickly as possible so that the committee can go forward with its plan to terminate.

Californians for Maddy - F registered as a principal campaign committee for state Senator Kenneth L. Maddy on March 27, 1980. Senator Maddy anticipated making a bid for a U.S. Senate seat in 1982. He decided against joining the crowded race in 1982 but was encouraged by his supporters to consider candidacy in 1986. Again he decided not to join a crowded race. During its first eight years (1980-1988), the committee made five contributions to federal candidates. Thus, although not very active, the committee satisfied all the conditions to qualify as a multicandidate political committee anytime in 1988.

For purposes of pursuing pre-probable cause conciliation, the committee will stipulate that it inadvertently failed to notify the Commission that the committee had elected on October 18, 1988 to convert from a principal campaign committee to a multicandidate political committee pursuant to 2 U.S.C. section 433(c). The Treasurer will declare that she did not know that a filing was necessary once the committee qualified as multicandidate.

In making your recommendation to the Commission, we ask that you consider the following mitigating circumstances:

1. The committee is maintained by a non-professional volunteer treasurer who at all times has attempted to comply with the Act in good faith.
2. There was no intentional violation of the Act.


3. The two \$5,000 contributions made were entirely legal since the Act does not require a committee to notify the Commission of a status change until as much as 10 days after the change. Nonetheless, the committee obtained a \$4,000 refund on one contribution and requested a refund from the recipient of the other contribution. (See attached letter).

4. The committee took immediate remedial steps and amended its Statement of Organization upon receipt of the Commission's letter dated February 7, 1989. The Commission's records indicate that the amended statement was filed February 17, 1989. (See attached conformed copy of FEC 1).

5. Public disclosure of the contributions was not affected since the committee did disclose both \$5,000 contributions during the appropriate reporting period and apparently both recipients disclosed receipt of the contributions.

The conciliation process is designed to "attempt to correct or prevent the violation by informal methods." (11 C.F.R. §111.18(a)). The apparent violation has been corrected. As mentioned, this committee will be terminated upon resolution of this matter. Based on the foregoing, we do not believe a fine is warranted in this case. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to call.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

On October 24, 1989, the Commission found reason to believe Californians for Maddy-F and Katherine Giel Chrisman, as treasurer (the "Committee"), violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(c) for failing to file an Amended Statement of Organization to reflect the Committee's conversion to a multicandidate committee. Notification of the Commission's findings was mailed to the Committee on November 2, 1989.

As set forth in the First General Counsel's Report, signed October 4, 1989, the Committee made \$5,000 contributions on October 18, 1988 and October 26, 1988. It was not until February 7, 1989, however, that the Committee filed an Amended Statement of Organization to change the Committee's status from a principal campaign committee to that of a multicandidate committee.

The Committee responded to the Commission's findings on December 12, 1989. The response is included as an attachment to this report. In its response, the Committee acknowledged that it failed to notify the Commission that it had converted to a multicandidate committee and requested that this matter be resolved through pre-probable cause conciliation. It further stated that the treasurer of the Committee was unaware that a

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filing was required under these circumstances and that this violation of the Act was unintentional.

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CONCILIATION AGREEMENT

This matter was initiated by the Federal Election Commission ("Commission"), pursuant to information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. The Commission found reason to believe that Californians for Maddy-F and Katherine Giel Chrisman, as treasurer, ("Respondents") violated 2 U.S.C. § 433(c).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission and the Respondents, having participated in informal methods of conciliation, prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, do hereby agree as follows:

I. The Commission has jurisdiction over the Respondents and the subject matter of this proceeding, and this agreement has the effect of an agreement entered pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4)(A)(i).

II. Respondents have had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.

III. Respondents enter voluntarily into this agreement with the Commission.

IV. The pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:

1. Californians for Maddy-F is a political committee within the meaning of 2 U.S.C. § 431(4).

2. Katherine Giel Chrisman is the treasurer of Californians for Maddy-F (the "Committee").

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3. Under the provisions of 2 U.S.C. § 433(c), a political committee must file a Statement of Organization with the Commission. Under that Section, a Statement of Organization includes the "type" of committee. Further, under 2 U.S.C. § 433(c), any change in information previously submitted in a Statement of Organization must be reported to the Commission no later than ten days after the date of the change.

4. Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1)(A), a person may make contributions of up to \$1,000 to any candidate or his or her authorized committee per election. Under 2 U.S.C. § 431(11), the term person includes a political committee.

5. Under 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(2)(A), a multicandidate committee may make contributions of up to \$5,000 to a candidate or his or her authorized committee per election.

6. On March 27, 1980, the Committee registered as the principal campaign committee of Kenneth L. Maddy for the 1982 U.S. Senate race in California.

7. The Committee made \$5,000 contributions to Californians for Pete Wilson and Stark for Congress on October 18, 1988 and October 26, 1988, respectively.

8. At the time the Committee made the contributions to Californians for Pete Wilson and Stark for Congress, the Committee was not registered with the Commission as a multicandidate committee.

9. On February 7, 1989, the Committee filed an Amended Statement of Organization to change the Committee's status from a principal campaign committee to that of a multicandidate

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committee.

10. On December 12, 1989, the Committee acknowledged that it failed to notify the Commission in a timely manner that it had converted to a multicandidate committee.

V. Respondents failed to notify the Commission of the Committee's conversion to a multicandidate committee within ten days of the change in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 433(c).

VI. Respondents will pay a civil penalty to the Federal Election Commission in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500), pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(5)(A).

VII. The Commission, on request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute a civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VIII. This agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

IX. Respondents shall have no more than 30 days from the date this agreement becomes effective to comply with and implement the requirement contained in this agreement and to so notify the Commission.

X. This Conciliation Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either party or by agents of either party, that is not contained in this written agreement shall be enforceable.


