RE: FORMAL COMPLAINT, VIOLATION OF FEDERAL ELECTION LAWS BY THE OREGON DEMOCRATIC PARTY

Dear Ms. Lerner:

Per your letter of January 4, 1990, stating the specific requirements for an FEC inquiry into the matter of Oregon Democratic Party mis-handling of funds, I am now able to provide the following information.

1. The Complaint: That the Oregon Democratic Party violated Federal Election Law during the 1998 election cycle under the following specific provisions:

- 2 U.S.C. §441b: Prohibition on corporate contributions.
- 2 U.S.C. §441f: Prohibition on contributions in the name of another.
- 26 U.S.C. §9003: Limitations on contributions to candidates receiving monies from the Presidential Election Campaign Fund.

2. Source of information: My only knowledge of this matter comes from documents which are public record. I have attached a copy of those filings. On July 31, 1989 the Oregon Democratic Party filed a report with your commission as required by law. Several questions are raised by that filing and by previous filings in relation to the 1988 election cycle. More questions are raised by a report filed by the House Democratic Caucus with the Secretary of State showing five payments

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in October 1988 to the Oregon Democratic Party totally nearly \$88,000. The stated purpose of the checks in the report was "absentee ballot mailing."

3. The Violations: Under Oregon law, candidates, campaign committees and political parties are allowed to accept corporate contributions in unlimited amounts for state and local races and party activities.

The January 1989 FEC report and prior reports show a debt to the federal account from the non-federal account of \$4,833.28. This obligation is shown on at least two previous FEC filings for 1988.

In the July 1989 report there is a large jump in the debt owed to the federal account by the non-federal account for "overpayment of operating expenses." Nine disbursements totalling \$15,615.92 are made to the non-federal account for "operating expenses." In addition, five disbursements totalling \$32,000 are made to the non-federal account between January and April. The stated purpose of the disbursement is "Transfer of funds." The debt owed to the federal account is increased to \$36,833.28 by these transfers, exactly \$32,000 more than the previous report. The nature of the total increased debt is shown as "overpayment of operating expenses."

The House Democratic Caucus sent five checks to the Oregon Democratic Party between October 4, 1988 and October 28, 1988 totalling nearly \$88,000. The Caucus Campaign and Expenditure reports, filed with the Oregon Secretary of State, made notations that the money was for absentee ballot mailing. The House Caucus received a total of \$65,000 in seven checks between September 9, 1988 and October 27, 1988 from Project 500, a Democratic PAC based in Washington, D.C.

These actions, as documented by the filing records, constitute a violation of the statues cited under (1) above, if the following questions cannot be satisfactorily answered:

a. The amount shown as an obligation from the non-federal account to the federal account would appear to be an illegal debt. The practice of creating a debt by the non-federal account in a state such as Oregon which allows corporate contributions, permits the party to circumvent the prohibition against corporate donations for federal candidates. Is this practice permissible, and has it occurred in other election cycles in

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the Oregon Democratic Party's federal account?

b. Can the Oregon Democratic Party prove that the disbursements totalling \$32,000 were actually made for legitimate operating expenses that are allowable under FEC regulations? The transfers were made in the early months of a non-election year and a) were not identified as being made for operating expenses at the time of the disbursements; b) were in addition to other disbursements made specifically for operating expenses, and c) are shown as increasing the debt owed by the non-federal account in an amount exactly equal to the transfers of funds.

c. A large absentee ballot mailing was paid for by the House Democratic Caucus but sent through the Party. Should any of this expense have been allocated to the Dukakis campaign? If part of the effort benefited a presidential campaign, was it legal to pay for it with money that, at least partially, came from corporate sources.

d. Was money from Project 500 laundered through the House Democratic Caucus books to help pay for an absentee ballot mailing that benefited federal candidates?


I am enclosing newspaper clippings related to these violations of election laws, and the recent fines levied by the Oregon Secretary of State, Barbara Roberts.



## Party may be stamped 'postage due'

**T**he U.S. Postal Service is auditing the Democratic Party of Oregon's bulk mailing account, spurred on by charges that the party made illegal use of its non-profit postal permit during the 1988 general election.

Postal inspectors in Portland are sorting through allegations that the party improperly used its special bulk-rate permit to mail campaign literature paid for by individual candidates. That money may have been laundered through the House and Senate caucus political action committees.

Robert Groff, a Postal Service spokesman, confirmed the audit, noting, "Our only concern is that postal revenues have been received properly."

Powerful evidence of improprieties has been prepared by Republicans who were victimized by heavy Democratic mailings in 1988.

They are represented by Warren Deras, the tenacious, keenly motivated Portland attorney. Deras filed the 1975 suit that inspired the Oregon Supreme Court to declare campaign spending limits unconstitutional on free-speech grounds.

Like every state committee of a political party, the Democratic Party of Oregon is armed with a powerful postal weapon: a special bulk rate that allows the party to mail at the cheapest available price.

On carrier routes, that rate is 5.3 cents per piece, 48 percent less than the regular bulk price tag.

But there's a catch: The party is only allowed to ship its own mail at the special rate. Postal regulations forbid the use of that rate when any candidate or committee — such as the House Democratic Caucus PAC — helps prepare or mail the material, or pays any of the mailing costs.

**T**he rules are "real restrictive," said Jim Moriarity, who works in the bulk-mail room in Portland. "It's very iron-clad. On any non-profit mail, it must belong to, and be published, printed and paid for by, the permit holder."

Deras has amassed compelling evidence that Oregon's Democratic Party abused its postal privileges with a big

Sowa, D-Oregon City, confirmed the modus operandi.

Sowa wrote checks to the caucus totaling \$12,616 during his re-election effort, more than \$9,400 of that in the final month of the campaign.

The caucus, Sowa explained, was doing all of the mailings for his campaign: designing the flyers, supervising the printing and mailing the goods.

"As I remember, the reason we were using them was they had access to a bulk mailing permit," Sowa said. "I think it was a working relationship with the Democratic Party of Oregon. They told people it was available. It started during the primary and continued through the general."

If postal inspectors determine that the Democratic Party shipped Sowa's mail out at the 5.3-cent bulk rate, the party violated postal regulations.

The possible penalty? The party spent at least \$160,000 on postage in 1988, so it may owe the Postal Service an additional \$145,000. In addition, Groff said the party's special permit could be revoked.

To determine the extent of the violations, postal inspectors must, to quote the Watergate adage, "Follow the money."

**"T**here are tricky money trails," Deras said, "but a lot of them are blatantly obvious." Postal inspectors may not need hiking boots to investigate charges that:

- The House Democratic Caucus PAC contributed \$244,463 to the Democratic Party of Oregon, according to the party's contribution and expenditure report. Asked what that money bought, Judy Carnahan, who stepped down as party chairwoman in January, said, "Services to the candidates. Mailings."

- Between Oct. 4 and Oct. 28, the caucus wrote five checks to the party totaling \$87,700. Each check was earmarked for "absentee ballot program" on the caucus' original expenditure report for the second pre-election reporting period.

If the party is allowed to mail absentee ballot information at the bulk rate, the caucus clearly isn't allowed to foot the bill.

A curious footnote: Someone in the caucus apparently realized these earmarked checks might cause a problem. On the amended C&E, the explanation for the checks has been altered simply to read, "Donation."

- The caucus administrator, Carl Wiederanders, bragged in January that the caucus engineered three districtwide hit pieces that the party mailed on behalf of Rep. Kevin Mannix, D-Salem.

Speaking at a January meeting of the Democratic Business Forum, Wiederanders said one of the mailings was paid for by House Speaker Vera Katz.

- The party used its special permit to mail general election pieces for Rep. Dave McTeague, D-Milwaukie, that are almost identical to pieces the candidate designed, mailed and paid for during the primary. And that ain't all, folks. Trust me.

# State hits Demos with fines

□ A record punishment is imposed on party members in the House for election law violations

SALEM — Secretary of State Barbara Roberts fined Oregon House Democrats a record \$61,234 for election law violations Tuesday, an action that drew opposite responses from the two Democratic legislators who must pay most of the penalties.

House Majority Leader David Dix, D-Eugene, quickly apologized for his role in filing inaccurate campaign finance reports and said he would pay his share of the fine.

But Dix's predecessor, Portland Democrat Shirley Gold, denounced the secretary of state's action and said she would mount a legal challenge against the fines.

Roberts hit the Democrats with the largest election law fines in state history for what she described as "bookkeeping out of control" in the required public reports prepared by the House Democratic Caucus. Along with a separate \$3,906 fine levied against the Democratic Party of Oregon, Roberts in total assessed the Democrats \$65,140 in civil penalties.

Roberts said she didn't uncover any evidence that the House Democrats were trying deliberately to conceal any contributions or expenditures.

"It appeared to just be lots of money coming in and not being handled with care — a little fast or

Roberts launched an investigation this fall after news reports on a number of omissions and errors in the two political action committees operated by the House Democratic Caucus.

In the end, Roberts said she learned that the main political fund operated by the caucus had received more than \$25,000 from Democratic legislators that was never listed. There was another \$20,000 in various transactions that also went unreported.

The other political action committee, the House Majority Fund, had more than \$16,000 in unreported transactions, Roberts said.

Either Dix or Gold, who was majority leader until Nov. 10, 1988, and is now in the state Senate, was listed as treasurer for most of the reports, and they are thus ultimately responsible for paying the fines under state law.

Dix, who is at a conference in Hawaii this week, issued a statement saying that he would pay the \$23,872 in fines assessed against him, either with his own money or by obtaining contributions from donors specifically for this purpose.

"The caucus membership is not" responsible for paying the fines, said caucus political administrator Sam Adams. "Dave has accepted responsibility for paying it off."

However, Gold held a news conference immediately after Roberts' announcement to say that she would not pay what Gold called the "rather large and exorbitant" fines.

Instead, Gold said she would file an administrative appeal arguing that Roberts didn't have the authority to levy the fines so long after the campaign reports had been filed. Gold said she had no indication while she was majority leader that anything was wrong with the reports.

Carl Wiederaenders and Kyle

resigned after Roberts started her investigation, also were fined more than \$8,800 since they acted as treasurer for some of the reports. Wiederaenders is also under investigation for possible misdemeanor charges because he took a key page from a campaign disclosure report filed with the secretary of state.

Dix aide Mark Wiener said that if the two former aides could not or would not pay the fines, Dix would bear the responsibility for paying them.

Dix has told Democratic legislators that he wants to pay the fines quickly in an attempt to put the issue behind him. But some Democratic legislators are worried that the controversy could hurt their fund-raising efforts in coming elections and will be used by Republicans as an issue against them.

"I think Democrats will have to work hard to prove to people they have cleaned up their act," said Rep. Peter Courtney, D-Salem.

Rep. Tom Hanlon, D-Cannon Beach, one of the three Democratic legislators to conduct a review of the campaign finances for the caucus, said he thought that the issue would only be defused if Dix stepped down from his post.

In addition, Oregon Republican Chairman Craig Berkman said he intended to keep the issue alive.

Berkman charged that Roberts was "either grossly negligent ... or protecting David Dix" in not also fining the Democrats for additional election law violations.

Roberts fined the Oregon Democratic Party \$3,906 for several "minor omissions" in the party's campaign finance reports.

Roberts said it was possible there could be further inaccuracies in the Democratic campaign finance reports. She said her audit did not account for every transaction, and in fact, her auditors were still nearly \$6,000 away from balancing the

Attached please find an amended Contributions and Expenditures report for the Democratic Party of Oregon. This amended report is the supplemental report for the 1988 general election. The changes made in this amended report are as follows:

1. Transfers from the DPO's "Federal Account" have been re-labeled to more clearly indicate where they came from. Our Federal Account is registered with the Federal Election Commission. All monies raised in this account were in compliance with the FEC regulations, and are reported as required in reports filed with the FEC. Copies of our FEC reports are also filed with your office.
2. Several transfers from another non-Federal DPO account were inadvertently listed as transfers from the Federal account. These internal transfers should not have been listed, and have been deleted from this amended report. This account has now been closed out. There were no funds deposited into this account during this reporting period, other than bank interest payments which were recorded as required in this report.
3. We discovered several donors that contributed over the \$50 limit for reporting individual donors (almost all of these donors contributed \$00 during the election cycle). These donations were incorrectly lumped into several transfers from our "Commercial Account" (at the Commercial Bank) in the original report, and have been listed individually as required in this amended report.



This is the response of Project 500 to the Commission's notification that a complaint has been filed by Richard L. Campbell alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("FECA"). For the reasons stated below, no action should be taken against Project 500 in response to this complaint.

Project 500 is a political organization established in order to support Democratic state legislative and gubernatorial candidates, and Democratic Party organizations, in preparation for the 1992 reapportionment process. Consistent with this purpose, Project 500 raises and spends funds solely on nonfederal elections, activities that are outside Commission jurisdiction. Thus, Project 500 is not a federal political committee as defined by the FECA. It incurs no registration or reporting obligations under the FECA or related Commission regulations. Instead, Project 500 is governed by the laws of the states in which it operates, and has registered only with state election commissions, as required by the states in which it is active.

The complaint you have forwarded to us apparently surrounds campaign activity in Oregon during the 1988 election

cycle.<sup>1/</sup> During this cycle, Project 500 did make contributions to various Oregon State Party organizations, including the Oregon Democratic House Campaign Committee and the Oregon Democratic Senate Campaign Committee. These contributions were in complete compliance with Oregon law, and were accompanied by a letter stating:

It is the understanding of Project 500 that this contribution will be used for the promotion of non-federal races. Project 500 is solely a non-federal campaign committee. Funds from Project 500 may not be utilized to support the election of Federal candidates, or applied to any Federal account.

The complaint contains no information contrary to these facts as stated. Indeed, the complaint's only reference to Project 500 is a somewhat inexplicable allegation that "money from Project 500 [was] laundered through the House Democratic Caucus books to help pay for an absentee ballot mailing that benefited federal elections." This allegation is wholly unsubstantiated. The complaint cites no evidence indicating any connection between Project 500 and the House Democratic Caucus; does not allege any such connection outside of its glib accusation; and does not even state the federal electoral involvement of the Caucus. In fact, Project 500 is not mentioned anywhere in the complaint's supporting documents.

In any event, Project 500 categorically denies the complaint's accusation. Project 500 and the House Democratic Caucus are completely separate entities. They are not affiliated or coordinated in any way. Moreover, Project 500 has no knowledge that its contributions have been used to influence a campaign for federal office. Any such unlawful use would be contrary to Project 500's explicit instructions.

Project 500 engages solely in nonfederal activity outside of the Commission's jurisdiction. The complaint offers no evidence of any violation of the FECA on the part of Project 500. Therefore, we respectfully request that the Commission find no reason to believe that the complaint sets forth a possible violation of the FECA by Project 500 and, accordingly, that the Commission close the file in the matter.



This response is filed on behalf of the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. The complainant alleges that the Oregon House Democratic Caucus paid for absentee ballots which were mailed at the expense of the Democratic Party of Oregon. The complainant questions whether "any of this expense [should] have been allocated to the Dukakis campaign?"

The complainant has provided no information, and we know of none, that would link the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc., to these mailings with respect to personnel or use of the candidate's name or likeness on the distributed materials. Moreover, even if such a connection had existed, no violation would appear to have occurred. The FEC's Regulations at 11 C.F.R. 100.7(b)(9) permit state and local party committees to pay the costs of preparing and mailing sample ballots listing three or more candidates, provided that the costs associated with federal candidates are paid from a "federal" account.

We note that the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc., was not named as a respondent by the complainant, but rather was so treated at the discretion of the Commission. We very much appreciate the opportunity to respond at the earliest possible time to any allegations that might conceivably affect the Committee. Nevertheless, the complainant has provided no factual or legal information that suggests any "reason to believe" that the Dukakis Committee has violated the Act.

I am advised by my client that the Democratic Party of Oregon maintains the constant practice of depositing all eligible funds into the federal account. All operating expenses are paid out of the non-federal account and periodically funds are transferred from the federal account to the non-federal account, to pay for the portion of the expenses of the Democratic Party of Oregon, which benefit federal candidates.

It is my understanding that a prior complaint of Rick Campbell, Renaissance Man, has previously been dismissed and I hope that this complaint is also dismissed.

Would you please let me know what further information you require?

Turning to page 3 of the Renaissance Man's complaint, Judy Carnahan is no longer chairman of the Oregon Democratic Party, Barbara Burton is no longer treasurer of the Oregon Democratic Party and David Dix is no longer leader of the Oregon House Democratic Caucus. The chair of the Democratic Party of Oregon for the past year and a half has been Wayne Anderson.

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

As I have previously indicated to you, I represent Mr. Dix. This letter is response to the complaint filed by Mr. Rick Campbell of Portland, Oregon and addresses the complaint as it deals with Mr. Dix.

A complaint under 2 USC §437G must allege in the complaint that a person has "committed such a violation." 2 USC §437G(a)(1). I have read Mr. Campbell's complaint several times trying to find an allegation against Mr. Dix. I cannot find any allegation that alleges that Mr. Dix did anything. It is not alleged that Mr. Dix signed any of the checks, filed any of the filings, or otherwise had any responsibility for any of the allegations made.

The complainant attaches 65 pages of various reports to his complaint. He states that his "only knowledge of this matter comes from documents which are public record." Mr. Dix' name does not appear on any of those 65 pages. The complainant also attaches copies of two newspaper articles, one dealing with allegations of postal service bulk mailing violations (Mr. Dix' name does not appear in that article) and one dealing with a fine levied against Mr. Dix for state campaign finance report violations. Of course, neither of these fall within your jurisdiction and the newspaper articles themselves do not allege violations under federal campaign laws.

The complainant lists Mr. Dix as the leader of the Oregon House Democratic caucus in the House Majority office. The correct title is Majority Leader. Mr. Dix was elected Majority Leader on November 10, 1988 and served through the end of February, 1990 in that capacity. My reading of the allegations are that

whatever violations Mr. Campbell is alleging, occurred on or before November 8, 1988, at least 2 days before Mr. Dix was elected Majority Leader. From the position of majority leader, Mr. Dix could not have committed any of the violations alleged by Mr. Campbell.

Finally, I have discussed this matter in detail with Mr. Dix as to his knowledge of fund raising and expenditures in 1988. Mr. Dix knows of no violations of the federal law and he certainly denies that he was involved in any violations of federal election law, whatever they may be.

Mr. Dix has apparently been named as a respondent in this complaint because his name appeared in one of the newspaper articles concerning state election law reporting. We suspect that Mr. Dix is named, also, because he is a Democrat running for re-election this year.

We respectfully request that this complaint against Mr. Dix be dismissed.

**I. GENERATION OF MATTER**

On July 30, 1990, the Commission received a complaint from Rick Campbell alleging that the Democratic Party of Oregon (the "State Party") violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"), during the 1988 election cycle. Attachment 1. The complaint lists as respondents: Judy Carnahan, Chairman of the Democratic Party of Oregon; Barbara Burton, treasurer of the Democratic Party of Oregon; and David

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Dix, Majority Leader for the Oregon House Democratic Caucus.<sup>1</sup> Further, the complaint makes reference to the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. and Edward Pliner, as treasurer (the "Committee"), as well as Project 500, an unregistered entity.

All named Respondents were notified of the complaint in this matter. Further, the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. and Project 500 were notified since they were implicated in the complaint.

## II. FACTUAL AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

### A. Complaint

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Complainant raises several questions in the complaint and alleges the possibility of violations of the Act by the parties referenced therein. It appears that primary issue in the complaint is whether the State Party, in sending a large "absentee ballot" mailing which complainant states was "paid for by the House Democratic Caucus but sent through the Party," used funds from the non-federal account to pay for portions of the mailing that benefited federal candidates. If the "absentee ballot" mailing was for the benefit of federal candidates, complainant further questions whether any of the related expenses should have been allocated to Dukakis/Bentsen. Complainant also cites to a possible violation of 26 U.S.C. § 9003, which places certain prohibitions on the acceptance of contributions by candidates receiving monies from the Presidential Election Campaign Fund.

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1. The present treasurer of the Democratic Party of Oregon is Annabelle Jaramillo.

According to a newspaper article attached to the complaint (Attachment 1 at 5), the Democratic Party of Oregon had a special bulk-rate postal permit that allowed the party to mail at the cheapest available rates. The article states that between October 4 and 28, 1988, the House Democratic Caucus wrote five checks to the State Party totaling \$87,700. Each of these checks was earmarked for the "absentee ballot" mailing and initially reported on the Caucus' state expenditure report for the second pre-election reporting period as such. However, according to the article, someone in the Caucus apparently realized that these earmarked checks may cause a problem and, therefore, on the amended expenditure report the explanation for the contributions was altered to read "Donation." Id.

Complainant further questions whether the funds for the mailing from the House Democratic Caucus included receipts from corporate sources or from Project 500, a Democratic PAC based in Washington, D.C. Complainant cites to a possible violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b, which prohibits corporate contributions. Further, complainant also cites to a possible violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441f, which prohibits contributions in the name of another.

Complainant also alleges that the amount shown in the State Party's reports as an obligation from the non-federal account to the federal account during the 1988 election cycle appears to be an "illegal debt." The amount of the alleged "illegal debt" totals \$36,833.28 and includes \$32,000 in funds transferred from the federal account to the non-federal account

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during the first few months of 1989. Complainant alleges that an "illegal debt" results because the practice of creating a debt by the non-federal account in a state such as Oregon, which allows corporate contributions, permits the party to circumvent the prohibition against corporate donations for federal candidates. Finally, the complaint questions whether the \$32,000 in disbursements from the federal account to the non-federal account were actually made for legitimate operating expenses.

**B. Responses to Complaint**

**1. Democratic Party of Oregon**

In the response from the Democratic Party of Oregon (Attachment 2), counsel states that the State Party maintains the constant practice of depositing all eligible funds into the federal account. Counsel further states that all operating expenses are paid out of the non-federal account and, therefore, periodically funds are transferred from the federal account to the non-federal account, to pay for the portion of the expenses allocable to federal candidates.

**2. Oregon House Democratic Caucus**

In response to the complaint dated September 21, 1990 (Attachment 3), counsel for David Dix, former Oregon House Majority Leader for the Oregon House Democratic Caucus, denies that Mr. Dix was involved in any violation of federal election law. While acknowledging that Mr. Dix was named as a respondent in the complaint, counsel correctly notes that the complainant alleges no violations by his client. Mr. Dix' name

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appears in only two newspaper articles which were attached to the complaint. See Attachment 1 at 5 and 6. Both articles deal with violations of state law, not federal campaign laws.

Counsel further states that Mr. Dix was not in the position of Majority Leader at the time the violations by the State Party occurred. Mr. Dix was only elected Majority Leader on November 10, 1988, and his term expired as of February, 1990.

Counsel's submission does not address the culpability of the House Democratic Caucus.

3. Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc.

In response to the complaint (Attachment 4), counsel for Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. maintains that the complainant has provided no information that would link the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. to the "absentee ballot" mailing at issue with respect to personnel or use of the candidate's name or likeness on the distributed materials. Moreover, counsel argues that even if such a connection existed, no violation would have occurred because the regulations permit state party committees to pay the costs of preparing and mailing sample ballots listing three or more candidates, provided that the costs associated with federal candidates are paid from a "federal" account.

Counsel asserts that complainant has provided no factual or legal information that suggests any "reason to believe" that the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. violated the Act.

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4. Project 500

In response to the complaint (Attachment 5), counsel for Project 500 states that Project 500 is a political organization established in order to support Democratic state legislative and gubernatorial candidates and Democratic Party organizations, in preparation for the 1992 reapportionment process. Counsel further states that consistent with this purpose, Project 500 raises and spends funds solely on non-federal elections and is governed by the laws of the states in which it operates. Counsel also asserts that Project 500 and the House Democratic Caucus are completely separate entities. He states that they are not affiliated or coordinated in any way.

Counsel categorically denies that any contributions from Project 500 were made for the purpose of influencing federal elections. According to counsel, during the 1988 election cycle, Project 500 made contributions to the Oregon Democratic House Campaign Committee and the Oregon Democratic Senate Campaign Committee; however, each of these contributions were accompanied by a letter (Attachment 6) stating that the contributions were to be used for the promotion of of non-federal races. In part, the letters stated:

Project 500 is solely a non-federal campaign committee. Funds from Project 500 may not be utilized to support the election of Federal candidates, or applied to any Federal account.

Therefore, counsel argues that if any contributions were used to influence a federal campaign, any such use would be contrary to

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Project 500's explicit instructions. Furthermore, counsel states that Project 500 has no knowledge that its contributions may have been used to influence a campaign for federal office.

Lastly, counsel argues that the complaint offers no evidence of any violation of the Act by Project 500, nor does it allege any connection between Project 500 and the House Democratic Caucus beyond its "glib accusation" that "money from Project 500 [was] laundered through the House Democratic Caucus books to help pay for an absentee ballot mailing that benefited federal elections." In counsel's view, this allegation therefore, is "wholly unsubstantiated."

C. LEGAL ANALYSIS

1. Absentee Ballot Mailing

The Act permits local party committees to make certain disbursements that are exempt from the definition of contribution or expenditure. These exempt payments include the costs of preparation, display, or mailing or other distribution incurred by such committee with respect to printed slate cards, sample ballots, or other printed listing, of three or more candidates (2 U.S.C. § 431(8)(B)(v) and 11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(9)); and get-out-the-vote activities on behalf of the presidential nominee. 2 U.S.C. § 431(8)(B)(xii). Commission regulations further provide that the payment by the local party committee of the portion of such costs allocable to federal

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candidates must be made from funds subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act. 11 C.F.R. § 100.7(b)(9). Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a), each committee which plans to support the federal and state candidates may establish two separate accounts. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a). Therefore, all disbursements or expenditures by a committee in connection with any federal election shall be made from its federal account. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a)(1)(i). Thus, since 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a) prohibits the making and acceptance of contributions by corporations in connection with a federal election, a committee would be prohibited from depositing any corporate contributions into its federal account.

Complainant alleges that a large "absentee ballot" mailing was paid for by the House Democratic Caucus and sent through the State Party. According to complainant, the House Democratic Caucus sent five checks to the Oregon Democratic Party between October 4, 1988 and October 28, 1988 totaling nearly \$88,000. These checks were initially reported as being for "absentee ballot" mailing. Complainant questions whether any of the expenses for the mailing should be allocated to the Dukakis campaign and whether any prohibited transfers occurred.

The complainant also alleges that money from Project 500 was laundered through the House Democratic Caucus books to help pay for the "absentee ballot" mailing. Complainant asserts that the House Democratic Caucus received seven checks totaling \$65,000 between September 9, 1988 and October 27, 1988 from Project 500, a Democratic PAC based in

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Washington, D.C. It appears complainant is implicitly alleging that this method was used to disguise the original source and nature of the funds.

Although the complainant does not provide a copy of the mailing in question, it is referred to as an "absentee ballot." The mailing occurred during a federal election year and, consequently, it is likely that it contained the names of federal candidates.<sup>2</sup> Thus, since the State Party would be subject to the limitations and prohibitions of the Act, it must be determined whether the associated disbursements or expenditures for the mailing were made from the State Party's federal account.

According to the schedules of disbursements attached to the State Party's October Quarterly Report and Pre-General Report filed with the Commission on September 22, 1988 and October 3, 1988 the State Party's federal account paid \$8,000 to the Postmaster in Salem, Oregon. The purpose for both of these disbursements was reported as "absentee ballot." Therefore, contrary to the allegations set forth in the complaint, it

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2. Even if the mailing did not specifically mention candidates for federal office, it may have been for the purpose of influencing an election for federal office. In Advisory Opinion ("AO") 1978-10, the Commission held that a political party's voter registration and get-out-the-vote activity in a Federal election year, even though not expressly on behalf of candidates for federal office, was nevertheless for the purpose of influencing the persons contacted to vote for all candidates of the political party. Further, in AO 1978-50, the Commission concluded that expenditures of the Party for the purpose of identifying and motivating persons to support the Party's Gubernatorial nominee are, in part, for the additional purpose of influencing the election of persons to Federal office.

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appears that the "absentee ballot" mailing, or at least the portion thereof which benefited federal candidates, was in fact paid for by the State Party's federal account. Consequently, this Office recommends the Commission find no reason to believe that the State Party violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act with regard to the "absentee ballot" mailing.

As set out above, in their response to the complaint (See Attachment 4), counsel for Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. emphasizes that even if the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee was included in the mailing, Commission regulations exempt payments for sample ballots from the definition of contribution. Therefore, it does not appear that any of the expenses for the mailing should have been allocated as contributions to the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee. This Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. and Edward Pliner, as treasurer, violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

According to the attachments to the complaint, it appears that the payments designated for the mailing from the House Democratic Caucus were deposited into the non-federal account of the State Party.<sup>3</sup> Therefore, since these payments were

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3. In their response to the complaint (Attachment 2), the State Party asserts that it maintains the constant practice of depositing all eligible funds into the federal account. Thus, it would appear that the payments from the House Democratic Caucus, which were designated for the "absentee ballot" mailing and deposited into the non-federal account, were possibly ineligible for deposit into the federal account. For example, the payments may have been rendered ineligible for deposit into

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deposited into the non-federal account, and are not subject to the prohibitions and limitations of the Act, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe the House Democratic Caucus violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act.<sup>4</sup>

In regard to the contributions from Project 500, which were given to the House Democratic Caucus, as stated above, all contributions from the House Democratic Caucus were deposited into the State Party's non-federal account. Aside from complainants bare allegation of a "money laundering scheme," there is no evidence that any of the funds from Project 500 or the House Democratic Caucus were used for the benefit of federal candidates. Furthermore, in their response to the complaint (Attachment 5), counsel for Project 500 states it is a political organization which raises and spends funds solely on non-federal elections and is governed by the laws of the states in which it operates. Therefore, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe Project 500 violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

the federal account because they included corporate monies.

4. Attached to the complaint is a newspaper article (Attachment 1 at 5) which states that the checks from the House Democratic Caucus to the State Party were initially earmarked and reported as being for the "absentee ballot" mailing, but on the amended report the explanation for the contributions was altered to read "Donation." Since it appears that the checks from the House Democratic Caucus were deposited into the State Party's non-federal account, the explanation for these contributions does not appear to be an issue in this matter.

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**2. Transfers of Funds**

Complainant makes two allegations concerning the \$32,000 transferred from the State Party's federal account to the non-federal account during January and April of 1989. First, complainant alleges that the obligation from the non-federal account to the federal account appears to be an "illegal debt." Secondly, complainant appears to be alleging that even if the federal account is allowed to make such transfers, these transfers may not have represented payments for legitimate operating expenditures.

Commission regulations provide that each committee which plans to support the federal and state candidates may either maintain one account for both federal and non-federal activity or establish two separate accounts. 11 C.F.R. § 102.5(a). Further, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 441b, corporations are prohibited from making any contributions or expenditures in connection with a federal election. Therefore, a committee would be prohibited from depositing corporate contributions into an account established for the purpose of federal activity.

The first allegation, concerning the possibility of an "illegal debt," appears to be based upon the fact that Oregon allows corporate contributions in state elections. Complainant seems to be alleging that the creation of a debt by the non-federal account to the federal account presents a problem because any repayment on such a debt by the non-federal account would likely result in the depositing of corporate funds into

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the federal account in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441b and 11 C.F.R. § 102.5.

According to the State Party's Reports filed with the Commission since 1984, the State Party has reported on its Schedule Ds debts owed to the non-federal account for the purpose of operating expenses. Based on these Schedule Ds, it appears that the federal account transferred funds to the non-federal account in order to eliminate these debts. Beginning in 1985, however, transfers from the State Party's federal account to the non-federal account exceeded the balance of the debt owed to the non-federal account. The State Party continued to report further transfers to the non-federal account on the State Party's Schedule Bs showing itemized disbursements. However, the State Party also reported, as they did on their 1985 Mid-Year Report Schedule D of debts and obligations, a negative balance on the obligation it owed to the non-federal account. On subsequent reports filed by the State Party, the amount of the negative entries has steadily increased. The State Party's 1988 Year End Report shows a negative balance of \$4833.28 on its Schedule D for the debt it owed to the non-federal account. However, there have been no reported transfers or repayments from the non-federal account to the federal account.

The Party's transfer of funds from the federal account to the non-federal account is permissible under the Act and Commission regulations. Commission regulations do not prohibit the transfer of funds from the federal account to the

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non-federal account or the use of funds deposited into the federal account for non-federal election purposes. See Advisory Opinion 1986-27 at 11,305 n. 2. While Oregon law permits corporations to make contributions in state elections, the transfers in this matter were made from the federal to the non-federal account. Therefore, since these transfers do not alone result in a prohibited transfer, and apparently there have been no repayments by the non-federal account to the federal account, this Office recommends the Commission find no reason to believe the State Party violated the Federal Election Campaign Act with regard to this matter.<sup>5</sup>

3. Operating Expenses

In addition to the "illegal debt" allegation, complainant alleges that the \$32,000 in disbursements from the federal account to the non-federal account may not have been for legitimate operating expenses. The transfers from the federal account to the non-federal account are listed on the State Party's Schedule B of itemized disbursements as "transfer of funds." According to complainant, these transfers are suspicious because they occur in the early months of a

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5. The reporting of a negative entry by the State Party is an unusual reporting practice because, instead of showing the obligation as one owed to the State Party federal account, the State Party is showing it as a negative balance on debts and obligations owed by the State Party. However, since the Party did report the transfers, this Office is making no recommendation at this time as to any reporting violation by the State Party with regard to the negative entry reporting. If the Commission follows our recommendations and closes the file in this matter, this Office will advise the State Party as to the correct procedure for the reporting of debts owed to the federal account by the non-federal account.

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non-election year and were not identified as being made for "operating expenses" at the time of the disbursements. Other than his assertion that these transfers are suspicious, complainant provides no evidence which would show that the transferred funds totaling \$32,000 were not used for legitimate operating expenses.

Given the lack of evidence submitted by complainant, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the State Party violated any provision of the the Federal Election Campaign Act with regard to whether the transferred funds were for legitimate operating expenses.

4. Conclusion

Based on the foregoing analysis, this Office recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the Democratic Party of Oregon and Annabelle Jaramillo, as treasurer, violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act. This Office also recommends that the Commission find no reason to believe that the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. and Edward Pliner, as treasurer, the Oregon House Democratic Caucus and Project 500 violated any provision of the Act.

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Find no reason to believe the Democratic Party of Oregon and Annabelle Jaramillo, as treasurer, the Dukakis/Bentsen Committee, Inc. and Edward Pliner, as treasurer, the Oregon House Democratic Caucus and Project 500 violated any provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act on the basis of the complaint filed in MUR 3096.

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2. Approve the appropriate letters.
3. Close the file.
