GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. Allegations

Mr. Ward as a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives has failed to file the 30 day post election report for the general election required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1).

II. Evidence

Mr. Ward's name appeared on the Illinois general election ballot as the Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives from the 7th district. Mr. Ward's name does not appear in the index from the Clerk of House of Representatives. He has not filed any reports or statements in regard to his candidacy.

A prior notice was sent to Mr. Ward informing him of his filing requirements as a federal candidate and the dates of reports due in the near future. The prior notice

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was returned to the Commission unclaimed.

Mr. Ward failed to file the 30 day post general election report due December 2, 1976; therefore, the Commission sent the candidate a reason to believe letter for non-filers, December 10, 1976; and a reasonable cause to believe letter for non-filers December 20, 1976. Neither letter was received by the candidate and both were returned to the Commission unclaimed.

The Commission, failing to receive a report from Mr. Ward, published his name on a list of non-filers January 21, 1977. A letter from the General Counsel was sent to the candidate informing him of his name publication and the General Counsel's intention to recommend to the Commission that civil penalties be sought. The publication letter was returned unclaimed.

Mr. Ward received 15,854 votes in comparison to the winner receiving 88,239. The Commission previously found probable cause to believe Mr. Ward violated 2 U.S.C. §432(e)(1) for not designating a principal campaign committee; and 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1) for not filing the 10 day pre general election report.

III. Analysis

Mr. Ward has not filed his 30 day post general election report. The Commission has tried repeatedly to notify Mr. Ward of his continued failure; but the candidate has not responded


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to these efforts by the Commission to correct or prevent a violation.

Through various communications, the Commission has tried to conciliate the case; but Mr. Ward has not utilized his statutory right to the informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion.

IV. Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission find probable cause to believe that a violation has been committed of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1); and that the suit previously filed by the Commission be amended to include this action.

FEC FILES SUIT AGAINST SIX CANDIDATES

WASHINGTON - March 30 - The Federal Election Commission today revealed that it has filed civil suits in six United States District Courts to compel six Federal candidates to comply with the reporting requirements of the Federal Election Campaign Act.

In separate suits involving six candidates for the House of Representatives, the FEC has asked the District Courts to order three candidates to designate a "principal campaign committee", one candidate to file required quarterly reports, six candidates to file the reports required 10 days prior to the November 2 general election, and 30 days after the general election, and, in two of the cases, to also file the January 31 report summarizing financial transactions through December 31, 1976.

The FEC also asked the courts to assess a penalty of not more than \$5,000 against the candidates for "failing and refusing to comply with the Act."

The following are the candidates, their district/state, their political party, and the U.S. District Court in which the suits were filed, (alphabetically, by state):

- Billy Dorsey.....6th Dist. - Alabama
Natl Democratic Party.....(Northern District of Alabama)
- Newell Ward.....7th Dist. - Illinois
Republican.....(Northern District of Illinois)
- James Burns.....Rep. at Large - Nevada
Libertarian.....(District of Nevada)
- Seth Morgan.....1st Dist. - New York
Conservative.....(Eastern District of New York)
- Donald Parker.....5th Dist. - Oklahoma
Independent.....(Western District of Oklahoma)
- Jesse Woods.....2nd Dist. - Pennsylvania
Republican.....(Eastern District of Pennsylvania)

The Commission stated in its court complaints that prior to filing suits it had sent at least two notices to each candidate concerning the failure to file the quarterly reports, and the pre- and post-election reports, and also concerning the failure to designate a "principal campaign committee."

In the case of Dorsey, the FEC sent a "principal campaign committee" designation notice on October 21, 1976, notices about the 10-day pre-election report on October 25 and 27, and notices about the 30-day post-election report on December 10 and 20. The FEC complaint also cited Dorsey for failure to file the required January 31 report.

In the case of Ward, the FEC sent "principal campaign committee" designation notices on September 27 and 30 and October 8 and 22, notices about the 10-day pre-election report on October 25 and 27, and notices about the 30-day post-election report on December 10 and 20.

In the case of Burns, the FEC sent "principal campaign committee" designation notices on September 4, 25 and 30, and notices about the 10-day pre-election report on October 25 and 27.

In the case of Morgan, the FEC sent notices about the required 10-day pre-election report on October 25 and 27, and also sent notices concerning the 30-day post election report on December 10 and 20.

In the case of Parker, the FEC sent notices concerning the 10-day pre-election report on October 25 and 27, and notices about the 30-day post-election report on December 10 and 20.

In the case of Woods, the FEC sent notices concerning the 10-day pre-election report on October 26 and 28, and notices about the 30-day post-election report on December 10 and 20. The FEC complaint also cites Woods' failure to file required quarterly reports and the January 31 end-of-the-year report.

In each case, under FEC compliance procedures, the first notice informed the candidate that the Commission found "reason to believe" a violation of the Act may have occurred, and the second notice informed the candidate the Commission found "reasonable cause to believe" a violation of the Act may have occurred. Prior to filing suit, the Commission voted to find "probable cause" to believe a violation of the Act may have occurred.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. Allegation

Newell Ward as a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives in the 7th District of Illinois has failed to, 1) designate a principal campaign committee required by 2 U.S.C. §432(e)(1) and 2) file the 10 day pre-election report required by 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1).

II. Evidence

Mr. Ward's name appeared on the Illinois general election ballot as the Republican candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives in the 7th District. The candidate has not filed any reports or statements in regard to his candidacy. His name does not appear in the index from the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

A prior notice was sent to Mr. Ward September 30, 1976 from the Commission informing of his filing obligations as a federal candidate. Failing to designate a principal campaign committee, the candidate was sent a reason to believe letter for no principal campaign committee September 27, 1976.

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The prior notice and the reason to believe letter for no principal campaign committee were returned unclaimed.

No action was taken by the candidate to designate a principal campaign committee; therefore, the Commission sent the candidate a reasonable cause to believe letter for no principal campaign committee. The reasonable cause to believe letter was received by Mr. Ward October 8, 1976.

A new address was obtained for Mr. Ward; and the prior notice and the reason to believe letter for no principal campaign committee were resent October 22, 1976. These mailgrams were also returned unclaimed.

The candidate also failed to file the ten day pre-election report. The Commission sent the candidate a reason to believe letter for non-filers October 25, 1976 and a reasonable cause to believe letter for non-filers October 27, 1976. Both of these mailgrams were returned to the Commission unclaimed.

No response was received from the candidate in reference to any letter previously sent. The Commission published Mr. Ward's name on the non-filers list October 30, 1976. The candidate lost the general election receiving 15,854 votes in comparison to the winning candidate receiving 88,239 votes.

A follow up letter was sent to the candidate from the General Counsel informing him of his name publication and the General Counsel's intention to recommend to the Commission that civil penalties be sought. The follow up letter was returned unclaimed.

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III. Analysis

The candidate has not designated a principal campaign committee or filed the ten day pre-election report due October 23, 1976. The Commission has tried repeatedly to contact the candidate in regards to his filing requirements. The candidate has not responded to these efforts to correct or prevent a violation.

The Commission has tried through various communications to conciliate the case; but the candidate has not implemented his statutory right to the informal methods of conference, conciliation, and persuasion.

IV. Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission find probable cause to believe a violation has been committed of 2 U.S.C. §§432(e)(1) and 434(a)(1).



FEC RELEASES LIST OF "NON-FILERS"

WASHINGTON-OCTOBER 30 - The FEC today published the names of House and Senate candidates and their "principal campaign committees" which failed to file the required 10-day "pre-election" report of their campaign finances, due October 23, 1976.

In addition to publishing the names of non-filers, the FEC has the authority to undertake further enforcement action under the statute, including civil court enforcement and imposition of civil fines (\$5,000 for "any violation" and \$10,000 for a "knowing and willful violation").

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended in 1974 and 1976, states that "It shall be the duty of the Commission to...prepare and publish from time to time special reports listing those candidates...for whom...reports were not filed as so required."

Federal candidates and committees must file a "pre-election report 10 days before each election, covering their financial transactions up to 15 days before the election. Under FEC procedures, three notices are sent to the candidates and committees, reminding them of their reporting obligations, and urging compliance. If a report is not filed following these notices, the names of all "non-filers" are made public.

"Prior notice" is the first reminder, sent on a routine basis prior the filing date, to all candidates whose names are on the November 2 general election ballot in their respective states, as certified by their Secretary of State, and confirmed by lists with the Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate. This notice simply reminds candidates and committees of their required 10-day pre-election, and 30-day post-election reports, and the appropriate filing dates.

The second notice is sent, by mailgram, only to candidates and committees whose reports have not been received 8 days before the general election, and states that this "apparent failure...gives the Commission reason to believe" that the candidate or committees is in violation of the reporting requirements.

The third notice is sent, by mailgram, only to candidates and committees whose reports are not filed 6 days before the general election, and states that "continued failure to file has given the Commission 'reasonable cause to believe' that they are in violation, and that "failure to respond may subject [the candidate or committee] to...civil penalties and...to publication of [the candidate's or committee's] name on a list of non-filers."

When a candidate or committee continues to fail to file after receiving the "prior notice" reminder, and the "reason to believe" and "reasonable cause to believe" notices, the Commission publishes the names of the candidates and/or his committee on a list of non-filers.
