Dear Mr. Noble:

This letter constitutes a complaint against the Anderson for Congress Committee ("Anderson Committee" or "respondent") and Inge A. Fisher, as Treasurer, for knowingly and willfully violating the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act").

**Introduction**

Robert Anderson is a candidate for the United States Congress from the seventh district of North Carolina. His principal campaign committee, the Anderson for Congress Committee, lists as its address 511 Argyll, Fayetteville, N.C. 28303. Anderson's opponent is Congressman Charlie Rose.

In short, the Anderson Committee has violated the disclaimer requirements of the Act by failing to disclose who paid for a series of mailings advocating the election of Robert Anderson to Congress.

**Facts**

Attached are <sup>three</sup> ~~two~~ mailings sent out by the Anderson Committee which clearly and expressively advocate the election of Robert

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Anderson to Congress. Neither of the mailings includes a disclaimer statement.

### **The Violation**

The Anderson Committee mailings fail to comply with the requirements of the Act, by failing to include any disclaimer. The disclaimer requirements of the Act are set forth in 2 U.S.C. section 441d and provide that whenever a candidate pays for mailings that the mailings must clearly state that it has been paid for by the candidate's authorized committee:

(a) Whenever any person makes an expenditure for the purpose of financing communications expressly advocating the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, or solicits any contribution through any . . . direct mailing, . . .

(1) if paid for and authorized by a candidate, an authorized political committee of a candidate, or its agents, shall clearly state that the communication has been paid for by such authorized political committee . . . (emphasis added)

The regulations promulgated by the Commission on this issue are quite clear with respect to the disclaimer requirements:

. . . a disclaimer . . . shall appear and be presented in a clear and conspicuous manner to give the reader, observer or listener adequate notice of the identity of persons who paid for and, where required, who authorized the communication. 11 cfr section 110.11(a)(1) (emphasis added)

The violations of section 441d are easily established on the face of the attached mailings. These mailings (1) are communications and (2) expressly advocate the election of Robert Anderson and the defeat of Charlie Rose. For example, the phrases "...help defeat a liberal trial lawyer- Charlie Rose," "Anderson for U.S. Congress," "get rid of Charlie Rose," and "Vote Robert Anderson" all appear in the mailings. The mailings also solicit contributions to the Anderson Committee.

No disclaimers are apparent from the face of the attached mailings, which are true and accurate copies of originals. The

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
Anderson Committee is blatantly disregarding the requirements of section 441d.

The Anderson Committee mailings fail to comply with either the letter or the spirit of section 441d, and for that reason, the Commission should find reason to believe that the Anderson Committee has violated the Act, open an investigation into this matter, and require the maximum civil penalty authorized by law. In addition, the Commission should seek to have the Anderson Committee cease and desist from using these mailings until the disclaimer fully meets the requirements of the Act.



## ANDERSON FOR U.S. CONGRESS

Robert C. Anderson was born November 6, 1942 in St. Louis, Missouri. He has been married to Mary Jo Detilo Anderson for 30 years. The Andersons have one son, Sean, age 24, who resides and works in Fayetteville. The family attends St. Patrick's Church.

Anderson received a Bachelor of Arts (Political Science) from Benedictine College in Atchinson, Kansas and a Masters in Public Service from Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green.

Anderson also was awarded the Soldiers' Medal-the Army's highest peacetime medal for bravery -for risking his life to save a drowning child in the Republic of Columbia.

The Anderson family originally came to Fayetteville in 1978, when Anderson was attending the Foreign Area Officer School at the John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center at Ft. Bragg. In 1983, the Andersons returned to Ft. Bragg, where Robert retired in February 1989 after a career that took the Andersons through 32 states and 20 foreign countries. The Andersons decided to make North Carolina their permanent home because of the warmth of the people, climate, and the state's natural beauty.

Anderson challenged Rose as the GOP Congressional nominee in both 1990 and 1992. After overcoming primary opposition, Anderson went on to capture three counties (New Hanover, Onslow, & Pender) in 1992, marking the first time that Rose, a 22 year incumbent, has lost counties in the general election. Anderson is now poised to realize victory in 1994, as voters express their outrage at Rose's unapologetic liberalism and lock-step support for President Bill Clinton's agenda of raising taxes, socializing medicine, and tearing apart our National Defense.







## N.C.'s 7th District ANDERSON vs. ROSE

What in the world was House Administration Committee Chairman Charlie Rose (D.-N.C.) doing in Chicago recently, hobnobbing with the rich and famous at the palatial home of the billionaire Fritsker family?

The answer lies in the way he was introduced to the wealthy guests by the burly, disheveled Windy City pol who shepherded the North Carolinian around. "Meet the next speaker of the House," said Rep. Dan Rostenkowski of Rose. So reported columnist Jack Anderson.

After 22 years in the House, Rose (American Conservative Union rating: 20%) was raising money (\$100,000 so far) for his Leadership America political action committee to give to candidates throughout the country and claiming that he had "counted fully 127 members of the Democratic Caucus who are either firmly committed or almost firmly committed to me for speaker."

Even more surprising than Rose's prospective challenge to sitting Speaker Tom Foley (Wash.) was his cheerleader that night in Chicago, Ways and Means Committee Chairman Rostenkowski. As to the reason for a Rosty-Rose coup against Foley, Anderson speculated that "Rostenkowski faults Foley for appeasing reform-minded freshman Democrats at the expense of veteran committee chairmen like himself."

*Speaker of the House Charlie Rose? And Dan Rostenkowski at his right arm?*

Not really all that mind-boggling. The 54-year-old Rose, like soul-mate Rosty, finds "reform" an obscenity and has had several run-ins with congressional ethics. As Administration Com-

mittee chairman, he has overseen the House Post Office (riddled by charges of embezzlement of stamps and drug dealing among employees), the now defunct House Bank (with its overdrafts by scores of members, including Rose himself), and the House restaurant, owed \$250,000 in unpaid bills by members.

Rose was cited by the House ethics committee in 1988 for diverting \$64,000 in campaign funds for personal use and, a year later, was hit by a civil lawsuit from the U.S. Department of Justice that charged him with failing to report more than \$138,000 in personal loans from his campaign. After three years of legal maneuvering, a federal judge upheld the Justice Department's position and Rose was forced to pay \$30,000 in fines.

As Rose's ethical problems grow—the post office he oversaw was a central player in the current 17-count indictment against Rostenkowski—so do the prospects of his Republican challenger, decorated Vietnam air ace and retired Lt. Col. Robert C. Anderson. As a first-time candidate with only \$26,000 in 1990, he drew 34% of the vote; in his second run last year, after reapportion-

ment, Anderson shot up to 41%. Now fresh from a smashing nomination for a third race and better organized than ever, Anderson feels that time and events have vindicated his charges that Rose is "a walking advertisement for term limitation" and a "pathological liar."

Anderson, who owns a general contracting company (A.A.E.S.I., Ltd.), is confident that he can unseat Rose, noting that he beat the incumbent in three counties (New Haven, Pender and Onslow) and held him to 51% of the vote in Cumberland County two years ago. Anderson has improved his organization with eight top-notch campaign chairmen—one in each of the district's counties. Three have excellent experience from working for the re-election campaign of North Carolina's senior Sen. Jesse Helms (R.) in 1990 and the 1992 bid of freshman Sen. Lauch Faircloth (R.).

As in his past campaigns, Bob Anderson boils his agenda down to straight talk: He's pro-life and for term limitations, would never vote for or accept a pay raise, would shun the franking privilege save to communicate with constituents about their personal needs, and would never accept money from political action committees. In his words, "I'm the antithesis of Charlie Rose."

Hanging over this race is the scenario of a Rosty-Rose axis running the next House. Perhaps it could not happen, but who would have thought that scandal would have toppled Speaker Jim Wright (D.-Tex.) after just over three years in office, thrusting the gavel into Tom Foley's hands? Rather than risking the gavel going to Charlie Rose, conservatives should make sure Rose is replaced by Bob Anderson.



# Helms' feud with Rose intensifies

North Carolina's two most powerful members of Congress — Sen. Jesse Helms and Rep. Charlie Rose — have long been political enemies. And the feud shows no signs of letting up.

Their bad blood traces back at least 15 years. It is part political: Helms is a conservative Republican and Rose is a liberal Democrat. And it's part personal: They have exchanged nasty words, Helms' political organization has run candidates against Rose, and Rose has brought lawsuits against Helms' political organization.

The latest round of sniping occurred when Rose, the influential chairman of the House Administration Committee,

Rose, a Fayetteville lawyer, described himself as Helms' opposite.

That did not sit well with Helms, the ranking Republican on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and a former Raleigh TV commentator.

In prepared remarks to the state Republican issues convention held recently in Research Triangle Park, Helms belittled Rose's bid to become House speaker, saying "nobody believes he will be."

Then Helms got tough.

"Deep down in 'The Observer's' story, Charlie Rose did a bit of boasting that he is the 'opposite' of Senator Jesse Helms," Helms said. "That sure did relieve my mind — he and I are indeed opposites. For openers, I've been married to the same same lady for nearly 52 years. He's had at least two and may be working on number three. I would never have even thought about walking out

was interviewed for a profile in The Charlotte Observer.

Rose was quoted as saying, "I don't think anyone of us is an island in this place.

When you act like an island, as Jesse appears to do, you cut yourself off from a lot of other people."

Helms also got in a further dig, according to Brant Clifton, a columnist for The Robesonian and former Helms staffer: "I've never been hauled in front of the Ethics Committee or had the Justice Department spend years trying to get back money I took from my campaign to buy a house or a boat."

The Ethics Committee reprimanded Rose for borrowing money for his personal use from his campaign committee.

Rose denied charges — brought by the state Republican Party during his 1986 reelection campaign — that he illegally borrowed money from his campaign fund for his personal use. He said the money was a repayment of loans that he and his father had made to his campaign.

The House Ethics Committee reprimanded Rose. And the Justice Department filed suit in 1989 charging Rose with failing to report the loans and seeking \$30,000 in civil penalties. Rose has said the suit is a political vendetta pushed by Helms and his political allies.

Rose is separated from Joan Rose, his wife of 12 years. He divorced his first wife Sara in 1982.

**GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT**

**I. INTRODUCTION**

This report is the General Counsel's Report to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue the identified lower priority and stale cases under the Enforcement Priority System.

**II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSING**

**A. Cases Not Warranting Further Pursuit Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission**

A critical component of the Priority System is identifying those pending cases that do not warrant the further expenditure of resources. Each incoming matter is evaluated using Commission-approved criteria and cases that, based on their rating, do not warrant pursuit relative to other pending cases are placed in this category. By closing such cases, the Commission is able to use its limited resources to focus on more important cases.

Having evaluated incoming matters, this Office has identified 10 cases which do not warrant further pursuit relative to the other pending cases.<sup>1</sup> A short description of each case and the factors leading to assignment of a relatively

low priority and consequent recommendation not to pursue each case is attached to this report. See Attachments 2-11. As the Commission requested, this Office has attached the responses to the complaints for the externally-generated matters and the referrals for matters referred by the Reports Analysis Division in instances where this information was not previously circulated. See Attachments 2-11.

**B. Stale Cases**

Investigations are severely impeded and require relatively more resources when the activity and evidence are old. Consequently, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission focus its efforts on cases involving more recent activity. Such efforts will also generate more impact on the current electoral process and are a more efficient allocation of our limited resources. To this end, this Office has identified 33 cases that

do not

warrant further investment of significant Commission resources.<sup>2</sup>


