Dear Mr. Noble:

The National Republican Senatorial Committee charges that the Ann Wynia for U.S. Senate Committee violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, ("FECA") 2 USC 431 *et seq.* by receiving prohibited in-kind contributions that are in excess of the legal limits violating 2 USC 441b(a) & (f), 11 CFR 114.2(c) and by failing to disclose the total amount of receipts and/or disbursements as required by 2 USC 434(b), 11 CFR 104.3(a) and/or 104.3(b). Federal Election Commission (FEC) regulations provide that a debt of over \$500 must be reported as of the date on which the debt is incurred. 11 CFR 104.11(b).

President Clinton was the main attraction for an Ann Wynia fundraiser on September 23, 1994. He traveled to Minnesota via Air Force One. There are substantial unreported costs associated with the fundraiser since the Pentagon estimates the hourly cost of operating Air Force one at \$25,767. All costs associated with Mr. Clinton's trip made on behalf of Ann Wynia should have been: (1) reimbursed or paid in advance - therefore being listed as a disbursement on the September or at least the Pre-general report; (2) recorded as a debt or obligation on the date it was incurred; or (3) handled as a reimbursement or debt through a coordinated expenditure by an appropriate party committee (i.e., Democratic National Committee, Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee, or the Minnesota Democratic Committee). The expensive travel costs were not addressed as required by law.

The National Republican Senatorial Committee respectfully urges the Commission to conduct a prompt and thorough investigation into the allegations in this Complaint, and to declare that the Ann Wynia committee has violated the FECA and Commission regulations.

COMPLAINT OF THE
NATIONAL REPUBLICAN SENATORIAL COMMITTEE

1. This complaint charges that the respondent violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, ("FECA") 2 USC 431 *et seq.*, by receiving prohibited in-kind contributions that are in excess of the legal limits violating 2 USC 441b(a) & (f), 11 CFR 114.2(c) and by failing to disclose the total amount of receipts and/or disbursements as required by 2 USC 434(b), 11 CFR 104.3(a) and/or 104.3(b). Federal Election Commission (FEC) regulations provide that debts of \$500 or less must be reported as of the time payment is made or not later than 60 days after such obligation is incurred, whichever comes first. A debt of over \$500 must be reported as of the date on which the debt is incurred. 11 CFR 104.11(b). President Clinton was the main attraction for an Ann Wynia fundraiser on September 23, 1994. All costs associated with Mr. Clinton's trip made on behalf of Ann Wynia should have been: (1) reimbursed or paid in advance - therefore being listed as a disbursement on the September or Pre-general report; (2) recorded as a debt or obligation on the date it was incurred; or (3) handled as a reimbursement or debt through a coordinated expenditure by an appropriate party committee (i.e., Democratic National Committee, Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee, or the Minnesota Democratic Committee). The expensive travel costs were not addressed as required by law.

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PARTIES

2. The complainant, the National Republican Senatorial Committee ("NRSC") is a "political committee" registered with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") in accordance with the law and established by Republican Members of the United States Senate to support incumbent and non-incumbent Republican Senate candidates.
3. The respondent, Ann Wynia for U.S. Senate, is a principal campaign committee registered at the Federal Election Commission.

APPLICABLE STATUTES AND REGULATIONS

4. Travel Expenses On Behalf Of A Federal Candidate Are Contributions. In defining the term *contribution*, the FECA uses the term *anything of value* to include all in-kind contributions. In addition, it considers the provision of any goods or services without charge or at a charge which is less than the usual and normal charge for such goods or services to be a contribution. In-kind contributions must be reported just as monetary contributions are reported to the FEC. 2 USC 431(8); 11 CFR 100.7(a)(1)(iii).
5. Reporting Requirements. The FECA requires principal campaign committees to disclose the total amount of receipts and disbursements for each reporting period and to itemize receipts and disbursements in excess of \$200. 2 USC 434(b); 11 CFR 104.3(a) and (b). The FEC regulations provide that an in-kind contribution shall be considered to be made on the date that the goods or services are provided by the contributor. 11 CFR 110.1(b)(6).
6. Debts And Obligations Must Be Reported. FEC regulations provide that debts of \$500 or less must be reported as of the time payment is made or not later than 60 days after such obligation is incurred, whichever comes first. A debt of over \$500 must be reported as of the date on which the debt is incurred (with certain exceptions not applicable here). 11 CFR 104.11(b).

GROUND FOR COMPLAINT

I. RECEIVING PROHIBITED IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS IN EXCESS OF LEGAL LIMITS

7. President Clinton was the main attraction at a \$100-a-person afternoon rally for Ann Wynia on September 23, 1994. This fundraiser was held in the state of Minnesota requiring substantial travel expenses for President Clinton and his political staff. An

Associated Press Writer wrote in a news article that President Clinton arrived in the Twin Cities aboard Air Force One around 11:35 a.m. for a visit that was intended to fire up support for Democratic candidates, particularly U.S. Senate nominee Ann Wynn. (See Exhibit 1 for September 24, 1994 article).

8. Since there is no record of reimbursement or outstanding obligation by the Ann Wynn for U.S. Senate committee the result is a contribution from Mr. Clinton and the U.S. Government which exceeds the legal limit of \$1,000. (Violating 2 USC 441b(a), 11 CFR 114.2(c)) Neither is there a record in the respondent's FEC reports of any direct or in-kind contribution for costs associated with Mr. Clinton's trip made on behalf of Ann Wynn. Other expenses for the September 23rd event are itemized by the respondent's FEC report for the time period in which they occurred. The Design Group was paid \$559.50 for event setup. The Minneapolis Convention Center was paid \$2,250 for rental of space. Your Insurance Agency was paid \$680.00 for event insurance. Kelber Catering was paid \$1,704.09 for catering services. (See Exhibit 2 for relevant FEC pages from the 8/25/94 - 9/30/94 report.) Additional information concerning FEC reporting requirements which have been violated are addressed below in part II of this complaint.

9. A contribution includes any direct or indirect payment, services, or anything of value to a federal political committee in connection with the election. 11 CFR 114.1(a)(1). The term anything of value includes all in-kind contributions such as mailings and travel costs. The provision of any goods or services without charge or at a charge which is less than the usual and normal charge for such goods or services is a contribution. 11 CFR 100.7(a)(1)(iii)(A). According to the Pentagon, the hourly cost of operating Air Force one is \$25,767. There are substantial costs associated with Mr. Clinton's travel on behalf of Ann Wynn.

II. FAILING TO DISCLOSE TOTAL AMOUNT OF DISBURSEMENTS AND OBLIGATIONS

10. There is no indication in respondent's FEC reports of any direct or in-kind contributions or expenditures for the costs associated with Mr. Clinton's visit. The failure by respondent to disclose the total amount of receipts and disbursements for this event is a violation of 2 USC 434(b), 11 CFR 104.3 (a) and (b). Further, respondent's failure to list any debt with regard to this fundraiser constitutes a violation of 11 CFR 104.11(b). That regulation provides that debts of \$500 or less must be reported as of the time payment is made or not later than 60 days after such obligation is incurred, whichever comes first. A debt of over \$500 must be reported as of the date on which the debt is incurred (with certain exceptions not applicable here.)

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RELIEF

11. The National Republican Senatorial Committee respectfully urges the Commission to conduct a prompt and thorough investigation into the allegations in this Complaint, and to declare that the Respondent has violated the FECA and Commission regulations.

ST. PAUL (AP) - The nation's No. 1 Democrat came to Minnesota today, making some Republicans about as happy as the Democrats. President Clinton arrived in the Twin Cities aboard Air Force One around 11:35 a.m. for a visit that was intended to fire up support for Democratic candidates, particularly U.S. Senate nominee Ann Wymia.

But voters are not enamored with Clinton, whose approval level has been falling. A Wirthlin Group poll in August, before the Haiti crisis, put Clinton's approval rating at about 43 percent. In addition, midterm elections historically are tough for whichever party is in power. Voters who gave Democrats a chance in 1992 may be ready to toss some chances to the Republicans.

"The fact that Bill Clinton is not terribly popular among Americans at large or Minnesotans increases Republican fortunes," IR Party Chair Chris Georgacas said Friday. "Having him come to Minnesota at the very time when the popularity of his policies is at a very low ebb strengthens our hand."

U.S. Rep. Rod Grams, Wymia's Independent-Republican opponent, says he's delighted that Clinton is weighing in on Wymia's side. Grams has been trying all along to paint Wymia as a Clinton clone.

"Ann Wymia has tied herself directly to the tax-heavy, big-government-knows-best philosophy of Bill Clinton, Paul Wellstone and their liberal cronies," Grams campaign manager Dwight Tostenson said Friday. "That suits us just fine."

Even some Democrats campaigning around the country are distancing themselves from Clinton.

So who wants to be associated with a relatively unpopular president? Many candidates here plan to get as close as they can, getting campaign photographs and basking in the presidential aura.

Clinton was scheduled to speak at a \$1,000-a-plate luncheon in Minneapolis and was to be the main attraction at a \$100-a-person afternoon rally for Wymia. The visit, his third trip to the state in six months, was expected to raise about \$300,000.

"He's more popular here than elsewhere," said Wymia spokesman Kevin Chandler. "The man's the president of the United States. The fact is, to have the president of the United States come in is a real strong boost for any campaign. It signals the importance of the race."

Gubernatorial nominee John Marty planned to skip the luncheon, saying it conflicts with his principle of avoiding big-money contributions. He did plan to attend the less-expensive Wymia rally.

Independent-Republicans planned a \$1-a-person counter-rally before the Wymia gathering, featuring peanuts and soda pop. President Bush has raised money for them in years past, but now they can throw the charge of elitism at Democrats.

Wymia has had about a 2-to-1 fund-raising lead over Grams, but Grams picked up \$400,000 of his own last week from the Republican Senate Campaign Committee. He also took in another \$62,000 from a \$1,000-per-person breakfast fund-raiser and about \$20,000 from a fund-raiser featuring Marilyn Quayle, wife of the former vice president.

This response is submitted on behalf of President Clinton. We are writing in response to a November 15, 1994, letter from Ms. Mary Taksar regarding a complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission (FEC) by the National Republican Senatorial Committee (Complainant or NRSC) against the Ann Wymia for U.S. Senate Campaign (Wymia Campaign). Complainant alleges that the Wymia Campaign violated the Federal Election Campaign Act (the Act or FECA) by:

receiving prohibited in-kind contributions that are in excess of the legal limits violating 2 USC 441b(a) & (f), 11 CFR 114.2(c) and by failing to disclose the total amount of receipts and/or disbursements as required by 2 USC 434(b), 11 CFR 104.3(a) and/or 104.3(b).

Complaint at 1.

Complainant asserts that the hourly operating costs of Air Force I is \$25,767. *Id.* at 3. Complainant alleges that these "substantial travel expenses for President Clinton and his political staff" to attend the Wymia Campaign fundraiser in Minneapolis, Minnesota on September 23, 1994, "were not addressed as required by law." *Id.* at 2. The result, according to Complainant, was "a contribution from Mr. Clinton and the U.S. Government which exceeds the legal limit of \$1,000." *Id.* at 3. Since the Wymia Campaign did not disclose an expenditure of at least \$25,767, Complainant alleges that the Wymia Campaign received and failed to disclose a prohibited contribution in the amount by which the hourly operating costs of Air Force I exceeded \$1,000.

I. Complainant Fails to State a Violation of FECA

Complainant's allegations with respect to the President's travel to Minnesota do not state a violation of the Act. The President personally did not make any contribution, either in cash

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or in-kind, to the Wynia Campaign; moreover, the Federal government cannot make a contribution. It is well-established that "person" for the purposes of the term "contribution" does not include the Federal government (or any of its components). See, 2 U.S.C. § 431(11); 11 C.F.R. § 100.10. See also, H.R. Rep. No. 4221, 96th Cong., 1st. Sess. at 7-8 (1979) (definitions of "contribution" and "expenditure" were amended "to incorporate the Commission opinion that the use of appropriate (sic) funds of the Federal Government is not an expenditure"). Accordingly, any funds expended by the Federal government would not, for purposes of the Act, constitute a contribution.

II. Travel Costs Were Allocated on a Reasonable Basis, Consistent with Practice of Three Prior Administrations

Even if the Federal government could make a contribution, which it cannot, the Wynia Campaign paid those costs reasonably attributable to the President's and his staff's travel to Minneapolis for the fundraiser. The FEC regulations provide "that the portion of the trip attributed to each candidate shall be allocated on a reasonable basis." 11 C.F.R. § 106.3(c)(1). For the past three administrations, Presidential (and accompanying staff) travel on behalf of a candidate for elected office has been allocated using the hard-time formula, which has been incorporated into the regulations implementing the Hatch Act Reform Amendments of 1993. See 5 C.F.R. § 734.503. Using this formula and the FEC method for allocating Presidential candidate travel, see 11 C.F.R. § 9034.7(b)(5)(i), a candidate must pay the airfare associated with each passenger -- including the President -- travelling on Air Force I for political or mixed (official and political) purposes. This approach ensures that travel (and all other) costs are allocated on a reasonable basis.

Prior to the President's travel, the Wynia Campaign entered into an agreement with the White House to pay those travel costs associated with the President's trip to Minneapolis, pursuant to the aforementioned approach. The Wynia Campaign has paid those travel costs as required. The NRSC has provided no evidence to the contrary.

III. NRSC's Complaint is Frivolous and Alleged in Bad Faith

From its experience with Presidential travel during the past two administrations, the NRSC is intimately familiar with the method used to allocate costs for Presidential travel on behalf of other candidates. The NRSC's allegation that the Wynia Campaign has received a prohibited contribution in the amount of the hourly operating costs of Air Force I is completely inconsistent with the FEC's approach for allocating the costs of the use of government conveyance. In particular, for travel between cities with

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regularly scheduled commercial service, the regulations have never required candidate campaigns to pay a charter rate or hourly cost of operation.

In view of the NRSC's knowledge of the aforementioned facts, we believe this complaint is not only frivolous, but is also alleged in bad faith. NRSC's allegations are not only inconsistent with more than twelve years of established practice for allocating Presidential travel on behalf of another candidate, it also is inconsistent with the approach outlined in the FEC regulations for Presidential candidate travel.

IV. Conclusion

In light of the failure by Complainant to state a violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act by the President, we request that your agency dismiss the President as a respondent in this matter (MUR 4132). Moreover, because of Complainant's bad faith in filing this complaint, we also seek whatever sanctions are available against Complainant.

Enclosed please find a Statement of Designation of Counsel form signed by the Attorney General authorizing me to represent the United States Government in the above-captioned Matter Under Review. For the reasons stated below, the United States Government has not violated the Act and, therefore, no action should be taken against the United States Government in this matter.

By letter dated November 15, 1994 (and received by the Department of Justice on November 23, 1994), Ms. Mary Taksar of your staff wrote to the Attorney General regarding the complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") by the Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee. That complaint alleged that the travel expenses related to President Clinton's September 23, 1994 trip to Minnesota constituted an unreported in-kind contribution "from Mr. Clinton and the U.S. government" to the Ann Wymia for U.S. Senate committee, in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act ("the Act").

In 1979, the statutory definitions of "contribution" and "person" contained in the Act were amended by the Federal Election Campaign Act Amendments of 1979, Pub. L. No. 96-187, to emphasize that the use of appropriated funds by the Federal Government does not constitute a "contribution" within the meaning of the Act. Specifically, the definition of "contribution" was narrowed by adding the phrase "by any person," see 2 U.S.C. § 431(8), to ensure that only a "person" can make a campaign contribution as defined in the Act. At the same time, the Act's definition of "person" was explicitly narrowed to provide that the "term [person] does not include the Federal

Government or any authority of the Federal Government." See 2
U.S.C. § 431(11).

Since only persons, as defined in the Act, may make campaign contributions, and the Federal Government is not a "person" within the meaning of the Act, the expenditure of appropriated funds by the United States Government cannot constitute a political campaign contribution within the meaning of the Act. See H. Rep. 96-422, 96th Cong., 1st Sess. at 7-8 (1979), reprinted in 1979 U.S.C.C.A.N. 2860, 2866 (explaining that the definitions of "contribution" and "person" within the Act were amended to "incorporate the [Federal Election] Commission opinion that the use of appropriated funds of the Federal Government is not a [campaign] contribution").

Therefore, since the United States Government cannot make a campaign contribution, as defined in the Act, it has not violated the Federal Election Campaign Act.



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

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION

This report is the General Counsel's Report to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue the identified lower priority and stale cases under the Enforcement Priority System.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSING

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Pursuit Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission

A critical component of the Priority System is identifying those pending cases that do not warrant the further expenditure of resources. Each incoming matter is evaluated using Commission-approved criteria and cases that, based on their rating, do not warrant pursuit relative to other pending cases are placed in this category. By closing such cases, the Commission is able to use its limited resources to focus on more important cases.

Having evaluated incoming matters, this Office has identified 10 cases which do not warrant further pursuit relative to the other pending cases.¹ A short description of each case and the factors leading to assignment of a relatively

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low priority and consequent recommendation not to pursue each case is attached to this report. See Attachments 2-11. As the Commission requested, this Office has attached the responses to the complaints for the externally-generated matters and the referrals for matters referred by the Reports Analysis Division in instances where this information was not previously circulated. See Attachments 2-11.

B. Stale Cases

Investigations are severely impeded and require relatively more resources when the activity and evidence are old. Consequently, the Office of General Counsel recommends that the Commission focus its efforts on cases involving more recent activity. Such efforts will also generate more impact on the current electoral process and are a more efficient allocation of our limited resources. To this end, this Office has identified 33 cases that

do not

warrant further investment of significant Commission resources.²

This Office recommends that the Commission exercise its prosecutorial discretion and no longer pursue the cases listed below in Section III.A and III.B effective February 13, 1996. By closing the cases effective February 13, 1996, CED and the Legal Review Team will respectively have the additional time necessary for preparing the closing letters and the case files for the public record.


