I hereby make a formal complaint, and request that an investigation be undertaken against the following Political Action Committees;

National Council of Field Labor Locals PAC (NCFLL PAC)
FEC #C00301564, and AFGE Local 2391 PAC, FEC #C00301572.

It is my understanding from speaking to Mr. Dave Gray in the FEC Records Division, that no reports other than the original "Statement of Organization," FEC FORM 1, has been filed for these PACs, in apparent violation of the reporting requirements contained in the Statute.


Mr. Gray related that since their organization in March of 1995, the two PACs have filed no mid-year reports, end of year reports, first quarter of 1996 reports, nor any close out reports if required.

In addition to the reporting irregularities, I also have serious concerns that these PACs may have used members dues monies to improperly fund PAC activities. I have no firm evidence to support this allegation. However, I have had since April 5, 1995, a complaint pending with the Chicago office of the Office of Labor Management Standards (DOL) requesting to see the financial records of the NCFLL. I have been refused repeatedly.

If at all possible, I would like to be kept apprised of the progress of any investigation instigated by this formal complaint. I would also like to have copies of any reports filed by these two PACs that would normally be considered a public record.


Enclosed is a copy of the May, 1996, NCFLC *Courier*, the newsletter of the National Council of Field Labor Locals.

Council Leaders Meet With Sen. Harkin

A delegation of Council leaders met recently with Sen. Tom Harkin (D-IA), a long-time member of the Senate Labor Committee and a 1992 presidential candidate, to extend the Council's thanks to Harkin for his outstanding support for the Department of Labor and its programs. Harkin is a key figure in the drive to raise the federal minimum wage. He was the point man in the successful Senate opposition to the first Ballenger bill which would have gutted OSHA. (See related story on Ballenger II.)

Harkin responded positively when NCFLC Treasurer Jack Cunningham and Vice President Hugh Smith expressed the Council's concern over the increasingly hostile anti-government

Budget Passage Ends Furlough Threats But 7% Cut Pinches Programs

The on-and-off battle to pass a FY 1996 budget was ended when President Clinton signed DOL's budget appropriation bill on April 26. The budget agreement ended the threat of DOL furloughs for the remainder of the fiscal year. Pressure from the AFL-CIO and every affiliated union was a deciding factor in winning final passage.

Council President Jesse Rios specifically thanked AFL-CIO Safety and Health Director Peg Seminario who coordinated labor's lobbying on the bill. "Our membership should be very proud of the role

they played in responding to our pleas for calls, faxes and letters to their senators and congressional representatives. Without that pressure, we might have continued in limbo for a long time," he added.

The overall budget reflects a 7 percent cut department-wide, but several agencies escaped the worst possible cuts when the measure finally passed OSHA, for instance, although originally

targeted for a 15.5 percent cut, realized a funding level only 2 percent below 1995 funding. When the money which Congress earmarked for enforcement is factored in, OSHA's budget actually increased. Nevertheless, according to the AFL-CIO's analysis of the budget, OSHA remains a "seriously underfunded agency."

The Republican leadership succeeded

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
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Budget Agreement Ends Threat of Furloughs for Remainder of FY '96

in imposing limits on OSHA's ergonomics enforcement, but the bill was actually softened from earlier efforts which would have prohibited OSHA from working on any ergonomics issues at all — including collecting data to determine the extent of the problem.

Like OSHA, MSHA fared better than expected, with funding cuts of \$3.5 million below FY 1995, but \$11.5 million more than the original House measure.

Final passage came nearly seven months after the original October 1 deadline for budget legislation. In all, Congress passed 15 short-term continuing resolutions that kept DOL afloat.



DOL Facts

With the agreement on DOL's 1996 budget, staffing levels at the Department have reached an all-time low. According to the Department's official statistics as of March 1996, full time equivalents (FTEs) total 15,703 — the lowest level since before World War II. There are 5,483 jobs in the National Office, 10,220 listed as field.

- 565 Part Time
- 30 Intermittent

Of that employment total, 11,233 DOL employees are in bargaining units, 4,469 are outside

There are 2,432 supervisors on the rolls; 13,271 non supervisors

Ballenger Bill Just Won't Die

North Carolina Republican Rep. Cass Ballenger resurrected his plan to gut OSHA in April, convening a fast-track committee meeting to markup the controversial measure before sending it on to the House floor for a vote.

Now designated as H.R. 3234, the "Small Business OSHA Relief Act of 1996," the bill would seriously weaken OSHA's enforcement authority and exempt thousands of workplaces from inspection.

Ballenger and his Republican colleagues railroaded the bill through in a strictly partisan 7 to 5 committee vote.

While the outnumbered Democrats on the committee could not bottle-up the bill, they successfully forced the committee record to show that the bill is not a "reinvention; that there was no consultation with Democrats on the content; that cost-benefit calculation is a bad basis for standard setting; that the bill is not aimed solely at small businesses as

Ballenger had said, and nothing in the bill would protect workers' rights," reported Jim Lynch, Council Legislative Representative.

MSHA Investigator, Spouse Injured in Truck Bomb Blast

Authorities are investigating the truck bomb blast that left Mine Safety and Health Inspector Gene Ainsle and Rita Ainsle, his wife, badly burned in Vacaville, California, in April.

Ainsle was driving to his home in his privately-owned truck around 4:15 on April 12. Because he had been on assignment that day, Ainsle was unaware that the MSHA office in Vacaville had been evacuated earlier in the day because of a telephone threat. The caller reportedly alluded to the trial of terrorists accused of the bombing of the Oklahoma federal building a year earlier.

Before the incident occurred, the

union and federal security officials had called for tighter security measures in anticipation of possible violence as the anniversary of the Oklahoma City bombing approached.

The NCFLL issued a statement calling on federal agency heads and congressional leaders to condemn gratuitous criticism and verbal attacks on federal workers.

"The often irresponsible and inflammatory language that has encouraged domestic terrorists to target federal workers must be tempered," declared NCFLL President Jesse Rios.

Sen. Harkin to DOL Workers: 'Thanks for the Work You Do'

rhetoric which may have indirectly encouraged the recent attack on an MSHA employee in California.

"Government bashing," said Harkin, has "cheapened" the political discourse to the detriment of employee morale and a sense of security. "What businessman in this country would go around denigrating the workers of his company?" Harkin asked.

Harkin urged federal employees to

exercise their political rights under the reformed Reich Act, a reform which he championed for over 20 years.

Concluding the hour long meeting, Harkin said:

"I just want to express my appreciation for the work that you do on behalf of American workers to assure a workplace where they may lead safe and productive lives, where children can expect both their parents to live to nurture them and where they are guaranteed proper pay for the work they do."

Leave Paid Back for Furlough Victims

Negotiations between the Council and management have resulted in a decision by DOL to pay back so-called "use or lose" annual leave for workers who were unable to make schedule their excess leave during the end-of-year DOL furlough.

Any employees whose leave records showed loss of accrued leave beyond the use or lose limit during the 13-day furlough period should have had those hours restored effective with your current time and attendance reports.

Using guidelines which were published by OPM, the union contract and past practice as evidence, the union successfully argued that furloughed workers should not have been charged with leave that they were forbidden to utilize because of the furloughs, reported Council Vice President Nancy Wylie.

DOL conceded the point to the union and has since reinstated that leave. Employees need not take any action on this issue unless they find that they were shortchanged in their leave records. Members who have questions about this issue should contact their local union steward.

Reich Orders Bonuses Restored

As of Thursday, May 9, the Council was advised that Labor Secretary Robert Reich had ordered all bonus payments restored. Reich's order directs all DOL agencies to authorize amounts of up to 1 percent of salaries for recognition of employee performance.

Leadership Conference Features Contract Review

Delegates attending the Council's annual leadership conference at the George Meany Center for Labor Studies in Silver Spring, Maryland, were briefed on contract issues and discussed the union's options on dealing with the NCFL National Agreement as the deadline approaches for expiration of the pact. The meeting agenda included extensive coverage of representational issues and contract interpretation. Council officers will review recommendations from the delegates for consideration as formal contract proposals if and when the contract is reopened for negotiation, said Ron Yarman, Council Executive Vice President.

Some 60 local presidents, officers and stewards from the Council's local unions also heard from AFGE President John Sturdivant and Martin Dunleavy, director of the National AFGE Political Action

Committee program.

The three days of sessions provided extensive discussions of pending legislative issues in a briefing by the Council's Legislative Representative Jim Lynch.

Butch Foutz of the AFL-CIO led a ranging discussions on legislative issues for the delegates.

North Dakota Democratic Sen. Byron L. Dorgan spoke to the delegates on the final day, prior to the opening of the formal session. Dorgan told the group that he is "fed up with federal-worker basing by politicians." The Senator's remarks were well received and boosted morale among those in attendance.

The Council's annual leadership conference provides delegates selected based upon their activist roles in their local unions with a complete briefing on the union's programs and goals as well as practical representation information.





I would like to report, and have your office investigate, what appears to be false, untrue and/or incomplete information contained in the Form LM-3, **Labor Organization Annual Report**, filed by the National Council of Field Labor Locals - Council 73, for the time period July 1, 1994 through June 30, 1995.

The apparently false information was provided in response to question number 12, "During the reporting period did your organization have a political action committee (PAC) fund? The answer was negative.

The answer is apparently false. I have attached, from the Federal Election Commission, a copy of FECFORM 1, *Statement of Organization*, dated March 7, 1995, establishing a Political Action Committee. Please note that the name of the committee is the National Council of Field Labor Locals PAC (NCFL PAC) and lists as its Connected organization the National Council of Field Labor Locals. On this form the NCFL states it has established a PAC fund. (see FECFORM 1, Section 5 e)

Please also be advised that I have filed a formal complaint with the Federal Election Commission because the NCFL has not filed any reports with the FEC on the activities of this PAC, apparently in violation of the law.

If required to investigate this matter, please consider this a formal complaint against the National Council of Field Labor Locals and a further reason to vigorously pursue my right to see the financial records of the NCFL. A right that the NCFL has been denying me since April 5, 1995.

It is my understanding from speaking to Mr. Dave Gray in the FEC Records Division, that no reports other than the original "Statement of Organization," FEC FORM 1, has been filed for these PACs, in apparent violation of the reporting requirements contained in the Statute


Mr. Gray related that since their organization in March of 1995, the two PACs have filed no mid-year reports, end of year reports, first quarter of 1996 reports, nor any close out reports if required.

In addition to the reporting irregularities, I also have serious concerns that these PACs may have used members dues monies to improperly fund PAC activities. I have no firm evidence to support this allegation. However, I have had since April 5, 1995, a complaint pending with the Chicago office of the Office of Labor Management Standards (DOL) requesting to see the financial records of the NCFLL. I have been refused repeatedly.

If at all possible, I would like to be kept apprised of the progress of any investigation instigated by this formal complaint. I would also like to have copies of any reports filed by these two PACs that would normally be considered a public record.




I enclose a copy of a letter to the Office of Labor-Management Services of the U. S. Department of labor for your information.

I am writing concerning an LM-3 report filed by the NCFLL/AFGE/AFL-CIO for the period July 1, 1994, to June 30, 1995.



GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION.

The cases listed below have been identified as either stale or of low priority based upon evaluation under the Enforcement Priority System (EPS). This report is submitted to recommend that the Commission no longer pursue these cases.

II. CASES RECOMMENDED FOR CLOSURE.

A. Cases Not Warranting Further Action Relative to Other Cases Pending Before the Commission

EPS was created to identify pending cases which, due to the length of their pendency in inactive status or the lower priority of the issues raised in the matters relative to others presently pending before the Commission, do not warrant further expenditure of resources. Central Enforcement Docket (CED) evaluates each incoming matter using Commission-approved criteria which results in a numerical rating of each case.

Closing such cases permits the Commission to focus its limited resources on more important cases presently pending before it. Based upon this review, we have identified 34 cases which do not warrant further action relative to other pending matters.¹

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Attachment 1 to this report contains summaries of each case, the EPS rating, and the factors leading to assignment of a low priority and recommendation not to further pursue the matter.

B. Stale Cases

Effective enforcement relies upon the timely pursuit of complaints and referrals to ensure compliance with the law. Investigations concerning activity more distant in time usually require a greater commitment of resources, primarily due to the fact that the evidence of such activity becomes more remote and consequently more difficult to develop. Focusing investigative efforts on more recent and more significant activity also has a more positive effect on the electoral process and the regulated community. In recognition of these facts, EPS also provides us with the means to identify those cases which, though earning a higher rating when received, remained unassigned due to a lack of resources for effective investigation. The utility of commencing an investigation declines as these cases age, until they reach a point when activation of a case would not be an efficient use of the Commission's resources.

The U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, however, held in *Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee v. FEC*, Civil Action No. 95-0349 (D.D.C. April 17, 1996) that 24 months was too long a time in which to hold a case in an inactive status.

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Twenty one cases have remained on the Central Enforcement Docket for a sufficient period of time to render them stale, all of which are recommended for closure in this Report.⁴ This group includes four MURs that became stale several months ago, but were held pending criminal prosecution by the Department of Justice.⁵ DOJ obtained convictions in the two criminal cases related to these four MURs (*U.S. v. Jay Kim* and *U.S. v. Dynamic Energy Resources*) based upon guilty pleas by the key defendants, who are also the principal respondents in our pending matters. Pursuit of civil enforcement action in view of the satisfactory results obtained in the criminal cases would not be the most effective use of the Commission's scarce resources at this time.

We recommend that the Commission exercise its prosecutorial discretion and direct closure of the cases listed below, effective August 29, 1997. Closing these cases as
