SUMMARY OF ALLEGATION

Mr. Miller alleged that Citizens Against Kennedy had failed to file reports with the FEC, listing its contributions and expenditures.

PRELIMINARY LEGAL ANALYSIS

OC 1975-121 (formerly AOR 1975-117) makes clear that YACC or Citizens Against Kennedy must report under 2 U.S.C. §434. Although there has not been a proper report filed, the OC was only issued on 2/23/76.

Thus, the matters could be routinely handled by the Reports Processing Division of AID.

RECOMMENDATION

Close the file and transfer responsibility for the outstanding issues to the Reports Processing Unit.

10 This responds further to your letter of November 25, 1975,
11 requesting an advisory opinion, on whether the Young America's
12 Campaign Committee (YACC), may approve a project entitled
13 "Citizens Against Kennedy." The project is designed to raise
14 funds through mailings, and advertisements placed in news-
15 papers throughout the country, for the purpose of adversely
16 influencing any presidential ambitions Senator Kennedy may entertain.
17 You state that the project has neither sought nor obtained
18 the consent or approval of any person seeking nomination or
19 election to the Office of President or Vice President of the
20 United States, and ask whether the contribution and independent
21 expenditure limitations under the Federal Election Campaign
22 Act of 1971, as amended (the Act), are applicable.

23 The Supreme Court recently held in Buckley v. Valeo,
24 44 U.S.L.W. 4127 (S.C. January 30, 1976), that the Commission
25 as constituted could not be given statutory authority to issue
advisory opinions. Although this part of the Court's
judgment was stayed for 30 days, the Commission has determined
that it will not issue further advisory opinions under 2 U.S.C.
§437f during the stay period.

Thus, this letter should be regarded as an opinion of counsel,
rather than an advisory opinion.

3 Regarding independent expenditure limitations, the
4 Court held in Buckley, inter alia, that §608(e) of Title 18,
5 United States Code, is unconstitutional. Thus the YACC, may
6 make unlimited expenditures on behalf of the "Citizens
7 Against Kennedy" project from funds contributed to the
8 Committee. Of course since YACC is a "political committee"
9 under the Act, these independent expenditures will have to
10 be reported. See 2 U.S.C. §434.

11
12 With regard to contribution limitations, I am of the
13 opinion that only the \$25,000 aggregate calendar year
14 limit on individuals under 18 U.S.C. §608(b)(3) is applicable
15 since the money received is intended to influence the course
16 of a Federal election. Thus, an individual could contribute
17 as much as \$25,000 to the YACC for the described project,
18 provided he or she made no other contributions with respect
19 to the 1976 elections.

20 The foregoing constitutes an opinion of counsel which
21 the Commission has noted without objection.

In October, the committee approved a project known as "Citizens Against Kennedy." In the early part of this month, the Committee made a mailing in the nature of the fund-raising appeal to approximately 61,000 addresses throughout the country. There is attached hereto as Exhibit B a two-page letter signed by John S. Buckley, National Chairman of Citizens Against Kennedy; as Exhibit C, a proposed advertisement; and, as Exhibit D, a return envelope, all of which are self-explanatory.

The Committee has neither sought nor obtained the consent nor approval with respect to the project known as "Citizens Against Kennedy" from any person seeking nomination or election to the office of President or Vice-President of the United States.

On the basis of all available evidence to the Committee, Senator Kennedy is not a candidate for nomination or election to the office of President of the United States.

In view of these circumstances and the facts which have been presented to you, the Committee asks for an advisory opinion with respect to whether ~~under the provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, other related campaign expenditure laws, and regulations promulgated by the Commission,~~ it is bound by any limitation on the receipt of contributions and the making of expenditures with respect to the Committee's project, known as "Citizens Against Kennedy."

**YOUNG AMERICA'S CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE
CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.**

ARTICLE ONE - Name

The name of this association shall be Young America's Campaign Committee.

ARTICLE TWO - Purpose

Young America's Campaign Committee is a non-profit, voluntary, unincorporated Association. The objects or purposes to be promoted or carried on are:

1. To assist through the contribution of funds and the providing of research assistance, candidates for elective Federal, state and local office.
2. To assist campaign committees for such candidates.
3. To contribute to campaign committees of national political parties and entities thereof, and political action committees of a non-political party nature, whether such committees are established for the election of government or non-government offices.
4. To raise money through direct mail campaigns and other fund raising procedures.

ARTICLE THREE-- Directors

1. All powers of the Association shall be exercised by the Board of Directors who may delegate to officers and committees of their own number such powers as they may see fit in addition to such powers as are specified in this Constitution and By-laws.
2. The number of directors which shall constitute the whole Board shall not exceed five.

3. The term of office of directors shall be two years.

4. The Board of Directors shall meet at least once a year at a time and place to be agreed upon by the Board. Notice of all regular meetings shall be mailed to each director not less than 15 days prior to the date of the meeting and shall include an agenda of said meeting.

5. The directors may hold their meetings and keep the books of the Association outside of the District of Columbia.

6. On written petition of three directors, such petition to be submitted to the Chairman, the Board shall meet at the office of the Association within ten days of such petition to discuss and vote upon the specific issues raised by such petition.

7. At all meetings of the Board of Directors, three directors shall constitute a quorum.

8. Any vacancies in the Board of Directors shall be filled by a majority vote of the directors then in office. Directors elected to fill vacancies shall serve only the unexpired term of the director replaced.

9. Any director may terminate his membership on the Board of Directors by written resignation at any time. Any director may be removed from the Board by two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors. In cases of removal, the action of the Board is final.

ARTICLE FOUR - Officers

1. The Chairman and the Treasurer shall be the general officers of the Association, and they shall be elected from the membership of the directors of the Association. All officers will be elected by the Board of Directors for a two year term subject to removal by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board of Directors as defined in Article 3 Section 9.

2. The Chairman shall be Chairman of the Board of Directors and the senior officer of the Association, and as such shall determine the policy and have general supervision of the affairs of the Association, in consultation with and subject to the direction of the Board of Directors. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Association. He shall appoint all committees, temporary or permanent. He shall see that all books, records, reports and papers as required by law are properly filed and kept, and he shall be one of the officers who may sign checks or drafts of the Association; provided that such checks and drafts also be signed by one other officer designated by the Board of Directors.

3. The Treasurer shall serve as Chairman in case of the disability, illness or absence of the Chairman.

4. The Treasurer shall have the care and custody of the funds and securities of the Association and shall keep full and accurate accounts of the receipts and disbursements of all monies received and paid by him on account of the Association; he shall exhibit such books of account and records to any of the directors at any time upon request at the office of the Association and shall render a detailed statement to the directors as often as they shall require it. He shall cause to be deposited in such regular business bank or trust company as the Board of Directors authorize, the funds of the Association.

5. The Treasurer shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall record all the proceedings and votes of the meetings of the Board of Directors, and may sign the notices of the meetings thereof. The Treasurer shall keep the minutes and the records of the Association in appropriate books. It shall be his duty to file any papers required by any authority

federal or state. He shall give and serve all notices, shall perform, in general, the duties incident to the office subject to the control of the Board of Directors and to the provisions of this Constitution and By-laws, and he shall be one of the officers who shall be authorized to sign checks or drafts of the Association provided that such drafts or checks also be signed by one other authorized director.

ARTICLE FIVE - Offices

1. The principal office of the Association shall be located within the City of Washington, District of Columbia.
2. The Association may also have offices at such other places, either within or without the District of Columbia, as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE SIX - Funds and Securities

1. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, in the name of and on behalf of the Association to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument, or to sign checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money or notes or other evidences of indebtedness, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances; and, unless so authorized by the Board of Directors or by these By-laws, no officer shall have the power or authority to bind the Association by any contract or engagement or to render it pecuniarily liable for any purpose or to any amount.

2. No loan shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no negotiable paper shall be issued in its name unless authorized by the vote of the Board of Directors or by this Constitution. When authorized by the Board of Directors to do so, any officer of the Association may effect loans and advances at any time for the Association from any bank, trust company, or other institution, or from any firm, corporation or individual. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

3. All funds of the Association not otherwise employed shall be deposited to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select, or as may be selected by any officer or officers of the Association to whom such power may from time to time be delegated by the Board of Directors or by this Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE SEVEN - Fiscal Year

The fiscal year shall be fixed by resolution of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE EIGHT - Notices

Whenever, under the provisions of this Constitution and By-laws the Certificate of Association or any statute, notice is required to be given to any director, officer, or member, it shall not be construed to be a personal notice, but such notice may be given in writing by mail or by telegram, addressed to such officer, director, or member at such address as appears on the books of the Association. Any director, officer or associate may waive any notice required to be given by law, the Certificate of Association or this Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE NINE - Parliamentary Procedure

All matters not covered by this Constitution and By-laws of this Association shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order Revised.

ARTICLE TEN - Amendments

The Board of Directors, by vote of two-thirds of the directors, may amend this Constitution and By-laws provided that a motion for amendment must have been submitted at a previous meeting at least thirty days earlier.



For the record, I received a phone call today from Loye Miller, Jr. of Knight Newspapers, regarding a committee called "Citizens Against Kennedy". Miller said he had received a solicitation from this group for funds, and wondered if 1) it had to register with us as a political committee, and if so 2) if it had registered.

The solicitation which Miller received described the committee as an "umbrella group" for several other conservative groups, and it listed the board chairman, & John Buckley, and board members on the solicitation. Specifically, the pamphlet listed a budget for the upcoming year, detailing \$3,000 worth of advertising, to be placed in the Los Angeles press, expressing anti-Kennedy sentiments. A draft of the advertisement was enclosed. In addition, the contribution envelope stated that the committee had filed a report with the FEC, which was available to the public at cost.

After talking with Miller, I spoke with Kent Cooper, who assured me that no such group had registered with us. A conversation with Peter Roman ascertained that such a group should register in accordance with 431 (d).

Mr. Miller did not want to file a formal complaint against the committee. He did indicate, however, that he would send to us a xerox of the material he received.
