This letter acknowledges receipt of your complaint dated July 12, 1976, alleging certain violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the Act) by Howard Wolpe. In my opinion, your allegations involve the same issue as that raised in the complaint previously submitted by you in this matter: whether certain monies which were allegedly given to support Mr. Wolpe's activities by a state officeholder were reportable contributions within the meaning of the Federal Election Campaign Laws. As I indicated to you by letter dated July 3, 1976, the Commission had decided to end its inquiry into your former complaint. In view of the fact that your present complaint raises no new issues, the Commission has determined not to reopen its file in this matter.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATION

1) Respondent failed to disclose contributions and expenditures

received and expended from an office account maintained and used for the purpose of influencing his nomination to Congress. The office account was established by respondent as a member of the Michigan House of Representatives.

2) Respondent has accepted contributions from individuals to both his office account and principal campaign committee which in the aggregate exceed the limitations contained in 441a.

PRELIMINARY LEGAL ANALYSIS

The underlying issue in this matter is whether contributions made to pay certain of Mr. Wolpe's activities as a Michigan State legislator are reportable contributions under 2 U.S.C. Section 434 after the time Mr. Wolpe became a federal candidate. This issue was raised by Mr. Wolpe in a previous complaint submitted in this matter. Based on an analysis of this issue in a General Counsel's Report, dated June 17, 1976 (attached)

FIRST CLAIM: Failure to disclose contributions and expenditures

5. Respondent Wolpe, a member of the Michigan House of Representatives, maintains an office account allegedly to service constituents in his 46th legislative district.

6. The office account is in fact used for the purpose of influencing the election of respondent Wolpe to Congress.

7. Wolpe is a candidate for U.S. Congress from the 3rd Congressional District of Michigan.

8. Contributions to Wolpe's office account are contributions to a candidate under Buckley v. Valeo. See footnote 24 at page 18 of the Supreme Court's opinion.

9. Wolpe failed to report to the Federal Election Commission a disclosure of the contributions to and expenditures made by his office account pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 434.

#### VI

SECOND CLAIM: Contribution Limitation Violations

10. Complainant incorporates by reference paragraphs 5 through 8, inclusive, above.

11. The Howard Wolpe Campaign Committee (052051) has received contributions of \$1000 each from William Maze, Jr., Judith L. Maze (both of 2524 University Avenue, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49007), William Slavin (1720 Embury Road, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49001), Louis J. Slavin (4923 Ridgewood, Richland, Michigan 49083), Lewis H. Batts, Jr. and Jean M. Batts (both of 2315 Angling Road, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49008).

12. On information and belief the 6 \$1000 contributors, enumerated above in paragraph 11, have made contributions to Mr. Wolpe's office account during 1975 or 1976.

13. 2 U.S.C. Section 441a limits contributions to candidates to \$1000 per election. The office account contributions added to the campaign committee contributions

are in violation of this section.

VII

REQUEST FOR RELIEF

14. The primary election for the 3rd Congressional District of Michigan in which Mr. Hampton faces Mr. Wolpe is scheduled to take place on August 3, 1976.

15. Complainant requests that this matter be investigated and heard by the Commission more than two weeks prior to the date of the primary election.

16. Complainant requests that the Commission:  
(a) order the respondent, pursuant to 2 U.S.C. Section 437d (a)(1), to submit to the Commission in writing a report of all contributions and expenditures received by or made by respondent Wolpe's office account, for the years 1975 and 1976;  
(b) order compliance with 2 U.S.C. Section 441(a), including its application to contributions made to office accounts; and  
(c) take all other steps necessary to correct violations of law revealed by the disclosure of all transactions of respondent's office account.



I. Allegation

A notarized letter from Brian A. Hampton, candidate for Congress from the Third District of Michigan, dated December 3, 1975, alleges that Howard Wolpe, a candidate from the same district, received contributions for a constituent service office operated in the district in which he serves as a Michigan state legislator. Mr. Hampton raises the question whether such contributions made to pay office expenses of a state legislator who is a candidate for Federal office are reportable contributions under 2 U.S.C. §434.

II. Evidence

Mr. Hampton quotes 1974 and 1975 receipts for the alleged constituent service office of Mr. Wolpe but does not indicate the source of the information. The Howard Wolpe Campaign Committee registered with the FEC on October 10, 1975, and filed a report of receipts and expenditures on January 9, 1976. Mr. Wolpe personally filed a statement of receipts and expenditures on

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January 15, 1976. These reports do not indicate amounts as high as those quoted by Mr. Hampton; they also do not report contributions for the constituent office at issue herein.

Mr. Wolpe's notarized reply of February 19, 1976, through his campaign treasurer, advises that a district service office was established shortly after his election to state office in 1972 to provide non-partisan assistance to the citizens of his district. He further states that this office was incorporated as the 46th District Service Office, Inc. (hereinafter District Office) in January 1975 and has been separate from his regular office as a state legislator and his campaign activities as a Federal candidate.

The Articles of Incorporation indicate that the District Office is a non-profit corporation governed by a Board of Directors; that its existence is apparently perpetual; that in the event of dissolution the assets shall be distributed to the State of Michigan, Department of Mental Health or its successors. The Articles of Incorporation list Mr. Chester B. Rogers as an incorporator and initial board member. Mr. Wolpe's Statement of Organization lists Mr. Chester B. Rogers as his campaign chairman.

III. Analysis

There are two underlying issues in this matter:

- (1) Whether monies allegedly received and utilized by Mr. Wolpe for his District Service Office can be characterized as an office account for supporting his activities as a holder of state office:
- (2) If the district office does support Mr. Wolpe's state office activities, is there "reason to believe" that a violation of statutes within the Commission's jurisdiction has been committed? (See 2 U.S.C. Section 437g(a)(2)).

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Although the complaint alleges that Mr. Wolpe raised various sums of money for his office, there is no evidence as to whether the office supported Wolpe's activities as a state office-holder or whether the fundraising occurred after he became a candidate for Federal office; nor is there any evidence that the monies were used in connection with a Federal election. Furthermore, Mr. Wolpe's reply indicates that the office was run as a separate operation, apart from his customary office as a member of the Michigan House of Representatives, and that it served as an ombudsman to provide assistance on a non-partisan basis.

Apart from the tenuous factual nature of the allegations, they are based on a regulation which has been approved by neither the Commission nor Congress (see Section 113.3(d) of the proposed Office Account Regulation). Thus, even if, the allegations are true, there does not appear to be

reason to believe that a violation of statutes within the authority of the Commission has been committed.

Because of the uncertain factual and legal basis for this matter, we are of the view that there is no basis for further investigation.





These Articles of Incorporation are signed by the incorporators for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation pursuant to the provisions of Act 327, Public Acts of 1931, as amended, and Act 284, Public Acts of 1972, as amended, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.**

The name of the corporation is 46th DISTRICT SERVICE OFFICE, INC.

**ARTICLE II.**

The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

1. To organize staff, equip, maintain and operate an office within the 46th legislative district of the State of Michigan available to the public, the purpose of which is to provide direct access for citizens to their government and increase the responsiveness of government to the needs and concerns of area residents. The office will provide the following primary services:

The office will:

- A. Provide a community ombudsman to assist individual citizens having particular problems with agencies and departments of state government, agencies and departments of local governments and charitable or service organizations.
  - B. Provide assistance on a non-partisan basis to individuals or groups to help themselves voice their concerns to local and state officials.
  - C. Seek citizen reaction to pending legislation, keep citizens informed of day-to-day occurrences in state government, and provide research services to the community on a non-partisan basis in connection with specific issues or problems.
  - D. Provide services and assistance to governmental and public welfare agencies.
2. To solicit donations, state and federal grants and funds; provide refreshment concessions at public events and sponsor community programs to raise money to finance the operation of the office.

In response to your request of February 10, 1976 for information which would clarify, explain and treat the matters raised in Mr. Hampton's letter, please be advised:

1. Howard Wolpe was first elected to the Michigan House of Representatives' 46th District in 1972. Shortly following his election, the 46th District Service Office was organized to provide assistance on a non-partisan basis to individuals or groups having particular problems with agencies of state and local government, to inform citizens of legislative occurrences, to obtain citizen input regarding matters of state and local concern, and to provide services to governmental and public service agencies. This office is, and at all times has been, maintained on a non-partisan basis completely separate from any campaign functions whatsoever. There is and has been a strict segregation between campaign and legislative service activities. The 46th District Service Office incorporated January 24, 1975 under an independent board of directors. The articles and bylaws of the corporation provide for continuation of the office irrespective of the individual holding the office or that individual's party affiliation. The Articles of Incorporation further provide that, should the corporation be dissolved, the assets and all property of the 46th District Service Office, Inc. would become the property of the State of Michigan Department of Mental Health. A copy of the Articles of Incorporation are enclosed.

Money received from pledges, contributions and fund raising events was initially insufficient to maintain the office. In 1974, Representative Wolpe had a surplus of campaign funds remaining after his election. With the consent of the contributors, a gift of \$2,734.21 of these unused funds was made to the 46th District Service Office.

Representative Wolpe maintains the customary office of a member of the House of Representatives at the state capital in Lansing and maintains whatever campaign office, etc. he desires separate and apart from the 46th District Service Office. There is no campaign function or related campaign activity carried on, conducted from or associated with the 46th District Service Office.

2. Regarding the status of the Federal Election Commission advisory opinion concerning office expenses for members of Congress, we believe that such an opinion would not be applicable to the present matter for the following reasons:

a. The 46th District Service Office, Inc. does not provide office expenses for Representative Wolpe but is separate from his regular office as above indicated.

b. The 46th District Service Office, Inc. is removed and apart from the 46th District office holder's campaign and state legislative office expenses and is even more removed from the campaign and/or office expenses of a candidate for the Third Congressional District.

c. The 46th District Service Office, Inc. does not provide a campaign office nor are any campaign activities conducted from this office. The Howard Wolpe Campaign Committee has a separate mailing address and campaign correspondence is not channeled through the Service Office.

d. Contributions and expenditures of the 46th District Service Office, Inc. are intended and used for that office and, therefore, do not influence the nomination for election, or election, of Howard Wolpe to federal office.

3. The 46th District Service Office, Inc., and not Representative Wolpe, was responsible for its office maintenance in 1975. The fiscal year of the corporation ends January 31st and appropriate Internal Revenue Tax Returns will be shortly filed by the corporation.



This letter describes a complaint which we now wish to officially file with the Federal Election Commission concerning the activities of another individual. The facts of the case are as follows:

1. Mr. Howard Wolpe, a member of the Michigan House of Representatives, maintains a constituent service office in his 46th legislative district which is funded by private contributions over and above what he receives in appropriations from the state legislature. In 1974 Mr. Wolpe raised \$13,122.66 for his district office, including \$3,241.79 in direct contributions, \$4,344.00 in pledges, \$911.18 from fundraisers, \$1,850.00 from himself, and \$2,734.21 in unused campaign funds transferred from Citizens For Wolpe and Wolpe For State Representative political committees.

2. According to a recent advisory opinion handed down by the FEC, office expenses for members of Congress which are over and above the amount appropriated by Congress and which are paid by private contributions are to be considered as campaign contributions in election years. (I understand that the mentioned opinion has been rejected by the U.S. Senate, but that a far broader opinion is being prepared that appears likely to be accepted.) Regardless of the status of the various opinions, the question which needs to be answered in Mr. Wolpe's case is whether the new advisory now being prepared also applies to members of state legislatures who are running for federal office.

3. Mr. Wolpe is a self-admitted candidate for Congress, as many people in Michigan's Third District fully realize. He has raised far in excess of \$1,000 in private contributions in calendar year 1975 for the purpose of maintaining a district office beyond the level appropriated by the Michigan legislature. (\$9,483.66 in expenditures versus \$6,356 in funds raised and pledged through September 30, 1975.) If the new FEC advisory opinion also applies to members of state legislatures who are running for federal office, then it would seem mandatory for Mr. Wolpe to count all funds raised through private contributions against his lawful limit and disclose in the specified manner and time period or risk a violation of federal law.

4. I presume that Mr. Wolpe has filed a quarterly report with the FEC. If he has not yet filed, and if it is the opinion that private fundraising such as his is reportable, then I presume that he will be required to file a report




