MATCHING FUND CERTIFICATIONS FOR PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES

WASHINGTON - FEBRUARY 5 - The Federal Election Commission today certified \$1,690,747.56 in federal primary matching funds for 3 Presidential candidates.

The candidates, and amounts certified today, are as follows:

Senator Henry M. Jackson.....	\$ 16,220.00
Congressman Morris K. Udall.....	\$ 18,421.00
Governor George C. Wallace.....	\$1,656,106.56

This raises to \$6,589,496.32 the total amount of primary matching funds certified this year by the FEC for 12 candidates.

Total matching funds including today's certifications, broken down by candidates are as follows:

Only "gifts of money" to a candidate up to \$250 per individual, are eligible for federal matching payments. Under Commission procedures, after a candidate has established "eligibility" for matching funds, the Commission will receive matching requests from the candidate on a twice-monthly basis, on the first and third Mondays of each month, and will certify eligible contributions within fifteen days after their submission.

Currently under review by the FEC staff are another \$1,299,068.49 in matching fund requests from 9 candidates, (Bayh, Bentsen, Carter, Ford, Harris, Reagan, Shriver, Shapp, and Udall). This includes requests submitted through Monday, February 2, 1976.

In addition, the Commission to date has certified \$1,210,000.00 in Presidential Nominating Convention payments, including \$460,000.00 to the Democratic National Committee and \$750,000.00 to the Republican National Committee.
