ELECTION LAW SEMINAR SLATED FOR PHILADELPHIA

WASHINGTON - If you have ever wondered where your dollar went when you checked the box on your income tax form, or if you want to know what you may contribute or do to help your candidate win on election day, plan on attending the Federal Election Commission's Campaign Finance Seminar on Monday, December 3, 1979, at the Sheraton Hotel, 17th & JFK Boulevard, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The Seminar begins at 9:00 a.m., with special workshops scheduled to run from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and again from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

FEC Chairman Robert O. Tiernan and Vice Chairman Max L. Friedersdorf will open the program with a brief background on the Commission and election law. Also participating will be Commissioners Joan D. Aikens, of Philadelphia, and John W. McGarry, of Boston.

The workshops will concentrate on the reporting requirements for U.S. Senate and House campaigns, the rules and regulations governing corporate and union "PAC's", and state and local party committee requirements. The Commissioners and key staff aides will be available for interviews and to answer any questions on campaign finance law.

The Campaign Finance Seminar is being held in conjunction with a two-day Conference on Election Administration, co-sponsored by the Pennsylvania Secretary of the Commonwealth's Office and the FEC National Clearinghouse on Election Administration. State and local election officials from the northeast section of the country will be meeting to discuss common problems involved in administering elections.
