WASHINGTON — Thomas J. Josefiak, a native of Adams, Massachusetts, has been named by the Secretary of the U.S. Senate as his Special Deputy to the Federal Election Commission.

Created by Congress in 1974, the FEC administers the Federal Election Campaign Act, the Presidential Election Campaign Fund Act and the Presidential Primary Matching Payment Account Act.

Prior to his appointment, Mr. Josefiak served as Legal Counsel to the National Republican Congressional Committee, which serves Republican incumbents in and candidates to the U.S. House of Representatives.

He holds an A.B. degree from Fairfield University, Connecticut, and a J.D. degree from Georgetown University Law Center, Washington. Following graduation, he became Legislative Assistant to Congressman Silvio O. Conte, and later served as Special Counsel on Federal Election Law on the Minority Staff of the Committee on House Administration, U.S. House of Representatives.

Mr. Josefiak presently is a resident of Alexandria, Virginia.
