PAC ACTIVITY INCREASES

WASHINGTON — Political action committees raised approximately \$189 million and spent \$183 million from January 1, 1981, through late November 1982, according to preliminary figures released today by the Federal Election Commission.

This represents an increase of \$60 million, or 49%, over total PAC activity for the same time period in the 1979-80 election cycle.

Contributions by PAC's to 1982 Congressional candidates are available only through mid-October 1982. The amount contributed to 1982 U.S. Senate and House races totalled \$70.4 million, or 43% of the \$163.3 million spent by PAC's through October 13. Contributions to all federal candidates, including those with only debt activity from previous elections, totalled \$74.2 million.

A review of 1982 PAC contributions through October 13 indicates an increase of 39% in PAC contribution activity over the same time frame in the 1980 election cycle. The following lists contributions by political committees to various categories of candidates for the past three elections:

Statistical charts on the following page show that incumbents still lead challengers in receiving PAC contributions, with incumbents receiving 69% of all PAC contributions - four times the amount given to challengers.

More extensive information on PAC activity through the end of the 1981-82 election cycle will be available in the spring of 1983.
