FEC SETS EXTENDED HOURS  
FOR ITS PUBLIC RECORDS OFFICE  
DURING JULY REPORTING PERIODS

WASHINGTON--The Federal Election Commission announced today that its Office of Public Records will be open on extended hours from Sunday, July 15, through Friday, July 27, the period covering campaign finance reporting dates for all political committees involved in 1984 Federal elections. These include U. S. Senate and House campaigns, political action committees (PACs), party-related committees, independent expenditure groups and individuals, communication costs filers, presidential campaigns and delegate committees.

Reporters and members of the public may use the Public Records facilities during the following hours:

July 15	Sunday	12 noon to 4 p.m.
July 16-20	Monday-Friday	9 a.m. to 7 p.m.
July 21	Saturday	10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
July 23-27	Monday-Friday	9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Although reports are due on July 15 and July 20, they may not reach the FEC until several days later. Reports are placed on the public record within 48 hours of receipt by the FEC. Reporters and members of the public may place orders for copies of reports by calling (202) 523-4181 or toll free at (800) 424-9530.

The Federal Election Commission's Public Records Office is a library-type facility equipped with computer terminals, microfilm reader-printers, photocopying equipment and ample work space. There is a trained staff to assist in locating documents.
