FEC PUBLIC RECORDS OFFICE
SETS EXTENDED HOURS DURING
GENERAL ELECTION REPORTING PERIOD

WASHINGTON--The Federal Election Commission has set extended hours for its Office of Public Records from Monday, Oct. 15, through Monday, Nov. 5, enabling the press and the public to have full access to campaign finance reports filed prior to the General Election on November 6.

Reports are required of presidential campaigns, U. S. Senate and House campaigns, political action committees (PACs), party-related committees, independent expenditures groups and individuals, communication costs filers and delegate committees.

Reporters and members of the public may use the Public Records facilities on the following schedule:

Oct. 15 through Nov. 5	Monday--Friday	9 a.m. to 7 p.m.
Oct. 20, 27 and Nov. 3	Saturdays	10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Oct. 21, 28 and Nov. 4	Sundays	12 noon to 4 p.m.

Reports of candidate and political committees that report on a quarterly basis are due by the end of business Oct. 15, and cover the period from July 1 through Sept. 30.

September reports of presidential candidates and political committees on a monthly reporting basis are due on Oct. 20.

All candidate and political committees involved in the General Election are to file 12-day pre-General Election reports on Oct. 25, covering campaign finance activities from Oct. 1 through Oct. 17.

Reports are placed on the public record by the FEC within 48 hours of receipt. Copies of reports may be obtained by calling (202) 523-4181 or toll free at (800)424-9530.

The Commission's Public Records Office is a library-type facility equipped with computer terminals, microfilm reader-printers, photocopying equipment and ample work space. There is a trained staff to assist in locating documents.
