FEC RELEASES NEW 1988 PRESIDENTIAL REPORT

WASHINGTON — 1988 Presidential candidates raised over \$70 million and spent \$55 million through September 30, according to reports filed with the Federal Election Commission. The FEC has developed a new computer-generated summary of 1988 Presidential financial activity and has provided comparison figures for 1980 and 1984 Presidential campaigns.

The FEC's summary looks only at those major party candidates who have raised or spent over \$500,000. One table provides a listing by campaign, within each party, and shows categories of receipts and disbursements made by each. The importance of the table is that it shows the reader at a glance the comparable figures for each campaign. In addition, the figures provided by the FEC have been adjusted from reports filed, subtracting all contribution refunds, loan repayments, and refunds or rebates received. This gives a clearer picture of monies raised and spent, and will be particularly important as the campaigns increase their financial activity.

The special feature included in the FEC's report is a series of maps graphically portraying the spending by candidates across the United States. The maps readily show the cluster of states where candidates have concentrated their early spending.

NOTE TO EDITORS AND CORRESPONDENTS: Please read the attached notes before drawing conclusions about the information presented. Complex reporting requirements and accounting procedures used by campaigns may sometimes render comparisons inappropriate.

Figures listed in the previous tables are net calculations; that is, amounts have been subtracted for contribution refunds, loan repayments, and refunds or rebates received.

Receipt categories will add up to campaign total except for the following:

*Dole ——— Total includes \$250,000 from Dole for Senate Committee.

**Kemp ——— Total includes \$355,000 from Victory '88 (Eka Kemp Superbowl Brunch.)

@Dukakis — Total includes \$394,300 from Dukakis Gubernatorial Committee.

#Gephardt - Total includes \$90,000 from Gephardt in Congress Committee.

NOTES FOR STATE-BY-STATE EXPENDITURES AND MAPS

The following maps and tables represent state-by-state expenditures as reported by the 1988 Presidential primary campaigns. Before attempting to draw any conclusions about either state-by-state spending or campaigns' financial activity, it is important to consider the following:

- The figures presented must be considered preliminary, since reports to the FEC are often amended due to omissions, errors, and/or changes in the data over time.
- Data for different campaigns may not be comparable. Although FEC regulations require state-by-state allocation of money spent for media, staff, equipment, etc., each campaign employs its own method for determining the distribution of those expenses. Certain expenditures may not be allocated to any state, since they more closely relate to the campaign's "national" effort. Thus, a highly centralized campaign, with a large national staff, might report a smaller proportion of its operating expenses as allocable to given states than a decentralized campaign.

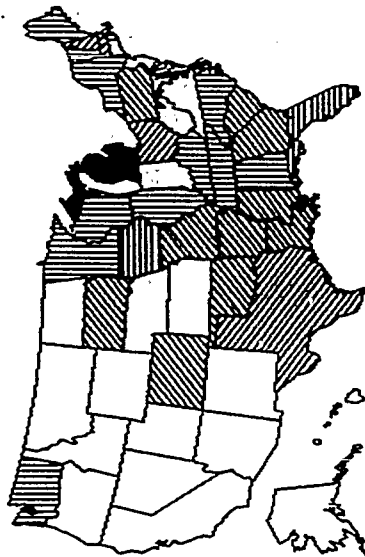

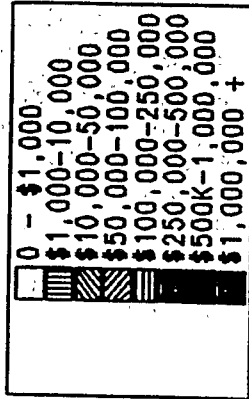

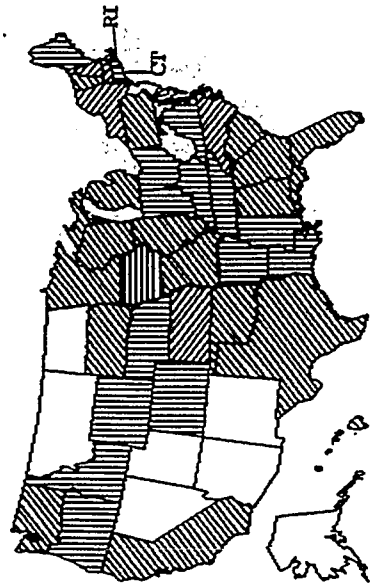

STATE-BY-STATE SPENDING - 1987-88

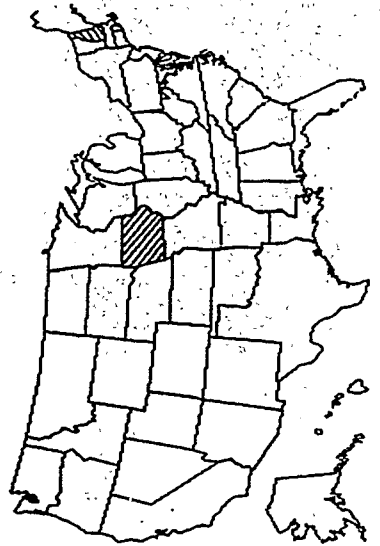

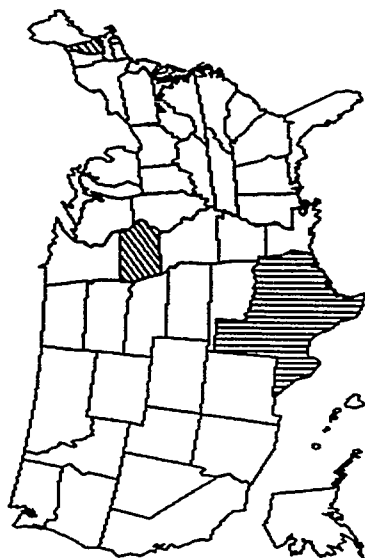

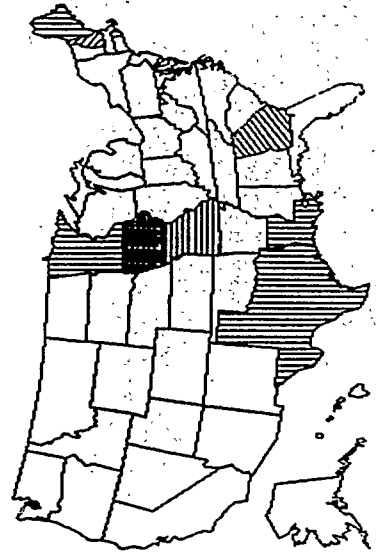
STATE-BY-STATE SPENDING - 1987-88

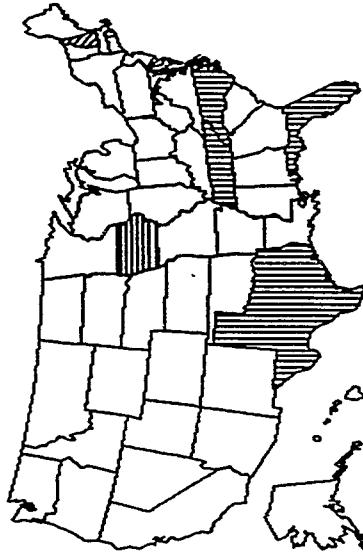

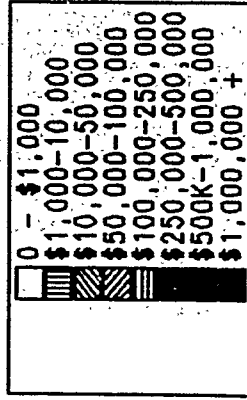

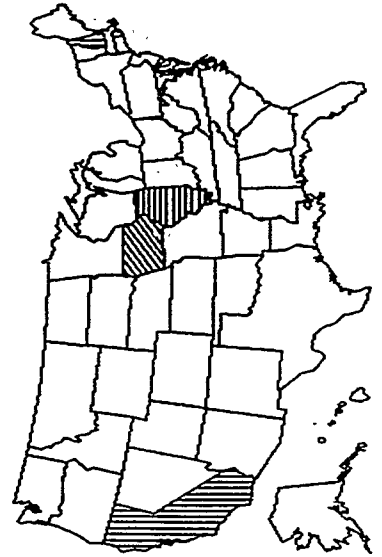
