**CONCILIATION AGREEMENT INQUIRY - MUR 3620**

**RESPONDENTS:** Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee, Paul Johnson, treasurer (DC)  
**COMPLAINANTS:** Benjamin L. Ginsberg, counsel to National Republican Senatorial Committee, on behalf of John D. Heubusch, Executive Director, National Republican Senatorial Committee  
**SUBJECT:** Emergency Motion for Civil Enforcement of Conciliation Agreement: Continuing knowing and willful violation of previous conciliation agreement through failure to implement remedial provisions to tally program; funneling excessive earmarked contributions to specific candidates via coordinated expenditures  
**DISPOSITION:** Took no further action at this time as there appeared to be technical compliance with Conciliation Agreement of August 16, 1995. Sent admonishment letter. Respondents advised to take steps to ensure the improved operation of tally program.

\*There are four administrative stages to the FEC enforcement process:

1. Receipt of proper complaint
2. "Reason to believe" stage
3. "Probable cause" stage
4. Conciliation stage

It requires the votes of at least four of the six Commissioners to take any action. The FEC can close a case at any point after reviewing a complaint. If a violation is found and conciliation cannot be reached, then the FEC can institute a civil court action against a respondent.
