Chair Dara Lindenbaum called the Federal Election Commission to order in an open meeting at 10:34 A.M. on Wednesday, April 19, 2023 with a quorum present.

Chair Lindenbaum congratulated all staff at the Federal Election

Commission for receiving the most improved small agency award from the

Partnership for Public Service.

Chair Lindenbaum then recognized Vice Chairman Cooksey who

MOVED that the Commission consider "Press Office Acknowledgement of Complaints" and that the Commission determine, pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 2.7(d)(1), that business so requires, and no earlier public announcement was possible.

FURTHER MOVED to suspend the rules on the timely submission of agenda documents in order that the Commission may consider the late submission of Agenda Documents No. 23-07-A and 23-08-A.

I. DRAFT ADVISORY OPINION 2023-01

U.S. Representative Nanette Diaz Barragán by Brian Svoboda, Esq. and Antionette Fuoto, Esq.

Chair Lindenbaum recognized Mr. Brian Svoboda and Ms. Antionette Fuoto who appeared on behalf of the requestor. Chair Lindenbaum then recognized Ms. Sarah Peck of the General Counsel's Office who presented the matter.

The request asks whether Representative Barragán, as Chair of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus (CHC), may use campaign funds to pay the travel expenses for certain individuals to attend official Caucus events, in particular, for CHC members and other individuals who will serve as speakers or headliners at the official events and for staff facilitating those events. The draft concludes that the proposed use of campaign funds for these travel expenses is permissible under the Act and Commission regulations because the expenses are ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in connection with the requestor's duties as a federal officeholder. Concerning the request, the Commission received a letter from U.S. Representative Brian Steil, Chairman of the U.S. House Administrative Committee, a response to the letter from the requestor, and then a second letter from Representative Steil responding to the requestor's response. The letters are available on the Commission's website.
