LEE ANN ELLIOTT Commissioner

Commissioner Elliott was nominated to her third six-year term by President William Clinton on May 3, 1994, and confirmed by the U.S. Senate on July 1, 1994. She served as FEC Chairman in 1984, 1990 and 1996, and as Vice Chairman in 1983, 1989 and 1995.

Prior to her initial appointment in 1981, she served as Vice President of Bishop, Bryant & Associates, Inc. During the 1970s, she was Associate Executive Director of the American Medical Political Action Committee. From 1961-70, she served as AMPAC's Assistant Director.

Commissioner Elliott has also served on the boards of directors of the American Association of Political Consultants and the Chicago Area Public Affairs Group, of which she was president. She was a member of the Public Affairs Committee of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States. In 1979, the National Association of Manufacturers presented her with the Award for Excellence in Serving Corporate Public Affairs.

Commissioner Elliott holds a B.A. degree from the University of Illinois. At Northwestern University she completed the Medical Association Management Executives Program. She is a Certified Association Executive, is a member of the board of directors of Kids Voting, U.S.A., and is president of her homeowners association.
