REASON TO BELIEVE RECOMMENDATION -
2006 APRIL QUARTERLY REPORT

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who either failed to file or failed to timely file, the 2005 April Quarterly Report in accordance with 2 U.S.C. 434(a). On March 22, 2006, Prior Notice was sent to all authorized committees and their treasurers, informing them that the April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 2006. Please note, that due to an administrative oversight, unauthorized committees were not mailed the Prior Notice for the April Quarterly Report. In an effort to correct this oversight, an e-mail notification was sent to all unauthorized electronic filers and a scrolling text message was placed on the FEC website highlighting the April Quarterly Report due date of April 15, 2006. The April Quarterly Report is required to cover the time frame from January 1, 2006 through March 31, 2006.

The committees listed in the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report or filed the report more than five (5) days after the due date. In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties located within 11 CFR §111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached report.

Recommendation

- (1) Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
- (2) Send the appropriate Reason to Believe letters to the committees.

Attached are two lists of political committees and their treasurers against which the Commission has found reason to believe (RTB) and assessed proposed civil money penalties calculated at RTB for failure to file or failure to timely file the 2006 April Quarterly Report. The first list represents the committees that have paid the civil money penalty and the second list represents those committees that have not paid. The committees that have not paid have been given at least forty (40) days from the date of the Commission's RTB finding to remit payment.

In accordance with 11 CFR 111.34 and 11 CFR 111.40, the Commission shall send a final determination notice to those respondents that have either paid or not paid the civil money penalty.

For your information, the Big Tent PAC (AF 1458) filed the 2006 April Quarterly Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$31,005 (previously estimated to be \$108,581), thus lowering the fine from \$5,625 to \$1,125.

Additionally, Constellation Brands Inc. PAC (AF 1465) also filed the 2006 April Quarterly Report after the RTB finding and disclosed a level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty. The committee disclosed total receipts and

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disbursements of \$8,668 (previously estimated to be \$86,342), thus the fine would be lowered from \$3,500 to \$300.

The Republicans for Choice PAC (AF 1483), a required electronic filer, submitted a paper filing on July 17, 2006. Based upon the paper filing, total receipts and disbursements for the April Quarterly reporting period would be \$168,022 (previously estimated at \$288,528), thus the fine would be lowered from \$10,000 to \$6,875.

RAD Recommendation

- (1) Make final determination that the political committees and their treasurers on the attached reports violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) and assess the final civil money penalties so indicated.
- (2) Send the appropriate letters.

On 6/22/2006, the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Maatta for Congress Campaign Committee and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) for failing to timely file the 2006 April Quarterly Report. By letter dated 6/27/2006, the FEC sent you notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage of \$1,725 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. 111.43. Within 40 days of the FEC's RTB finding, you were required to either transmit payment of the calculated civil money penalty or submit a written response challenging either the RTB finding or the calculated civil money penalty.

The FEC did not receive payment of the calculated civil money penalty or your written response within the time permitted. Therefore, the FEC made a final determination on 8/31/2006 that you, as treasurer, and Maatta for Congress Campaign Committee violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$1,725 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. 111.43. II. Creditor Agency will submit debts to Cross-Servicing via Electronic Transmission of "Add Records" or "Update Records," as described in the attached Exhibit A. Each time the Creditor Agency submits a Debt via an Add Record or Update Record, the Creditor Agency is certifying the Debt;

III. Any person who submits Debts via an Add Record or Update Record has or will have delegated authority to certify the Debts on behalf of the head of the Creditor Agency, and the Creditor Agency will provide a copy of this Agreement to any such person; and,

IV. By submitting Debts via an Add Record or Update Record, the person submitting such Debts is certifying to the U.S. Department of the Treasury, under penalty of perjury pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 3716, 31 U.S.C. § 3720A, and 28 U.S.C. § 1746, that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, the following is true and correct:

1. **Valid Debts.** The debts are delinquent, valid and legally enforceable in the amounts stated. No debtor has repaid or agreed to repay the claim under a signed repayment agreement or filed for review of the claim.

2. **No Bar to Collection.** The debts are not subject to any circumstances that legally preclude or bar collection. There are no foreclosures pending with respect to any collateral securing a debt. The Agency's records do not show that any debtor owing a debt has filed for bankruptcy protection. Alternatively, the Agency can clearly establish that any automatic stay has been lifted or is no longer in effect.

3. **Due Process.** The Agency, at a minimum, has made reasonable efforts to obtain payment of the debt, demanded payment, and provided the debtor with the notice and opportunities described below:

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
A. At least 30 days prior to the date of this certification, the Agency has provided, or made reasonable efforts to provide each debtor with:

- written notification, at the debtor's most current known address, of the nature and the amount of the debt, the intention of the Agency to collect the debt through referral to Treasury, and actions that may be taken by Treasury including referral of the debt to a private collection agency and referral of the debt to the Department of Justice for litigation;
- an opportunity to inspect and copy the records of the Agency with respect to the debt; and
- an opportunity for review within the Agency of the determination of the Agency with respect to the debt, including the opportunity to present evidence that all or part of the debt is not past-due or legally enforceable.

B. The Agency has considered any evidence presented by the debtor and determined that the amount of the debt is past-due and legally enforceable and there are no pending appeals of such determination.

4. **Interest and Penalties.** The Agency has complied with all of the provisions of 31 U.S.C. § 3717 and the Federal Claims Collection Standards, as well as other statutes, regulations and policies applicable to the Agency's assessment of interest, penalties and administrative costs. The Agency has mailed a written notice to all debtors explaining the Agency's requirements concerning the charges.
