SUBJECT: REASON TO BELIEVE RECOMMENDATION - 2006 (ELECTION-SENSITIVE) OCTOBER QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE FINES PROGRAM

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file or failed to timely file, the 2006 October Quarterly Report in accordance with 2 U.S.C. 434(a). On September 21, 2006, Prior Notice was sent to all political committees and their treasurers, informing them that the October Quarterly Report was due on October 15, 2006. The report should have covered the period ending on September 30, 2006.

Under the Administrative Fines Program, the October Quarterly Report is considered an election-sensitive filing for authorized committees supporting candidates involved in the general election as well as all unauthorized committees. For the committees listed on the attached RTB Circulation Report, the October Quarterly Report was an election-sensitive filing. The committees either filed the report more than five (5) days after the due date, failed to file the report or failed to file the report prior to four (4) days before the general election (considered a non-filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties included on the attached report.

Recommendation

- (1) Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers listed on the Reason to Believe (RTB) Circulation Report violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
- (2) Send the appropriate RTB letters.

Dear Anita Gomez-Palacio:

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file an October Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements in a calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election. This report, covering the period through September 30th, shall be filed no later than October 15th. 2 U.S.C. 434(a). You were previously notified of the due date for this report. Records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that this report was not filed prior to four (4) days before the general election held on November 7, 2006. You should file the report if you have not already done so.

The Act was further amended in 1999 to permit the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 2 U.S.C. 434(a). 2 U.S.C. 437g(a)(4). On 2/6/2007, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Council of School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before October 15th. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$900. It is due by 3/18/2007 and is based on these factors:

Election Sensitivity of Report: Election Sensitive
Level of Activity: \$20,458
Number of Days Late: Not Filed
Number of Previous Civil Money Penalties Assessed: 0

To Pay the Calculated Civil Money Penalty

To pay the calculated civil money penalty, send the enclosed remittance and your payment to the FEC at the address on page 3. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

To Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Calculated Civil Money Penalty

To challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response, including the AF# found on page one, to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review, 999 E Street, NW, Washington, DC 20463. Your response must be received by 3/18/2007. Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty. The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on a factual error, miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC, or the

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existence of extraordinary circumstances that persisted for more than 48 hours that were beyond your control and prevented you from filing the report in a timely manner. Your response must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. Examples of circumstances that will not be considered extraordinary include, but are not limited to, negligence, problems with vendors or contractors, staff illness, computer failures and similar circumstances. 11 C.F.R. 111.35(b)(1)(iii) and (4).

Your failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver of your right to present such argument in a petition to the district court under 2 U.S.C. 437g, 11 C.F.R. 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

If You Do Not Pay the Calculated Civil Money Penalty or Submit a Challenge


If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty or submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Council of School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA") as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 C.F.R. 111.45.

This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the FEC in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. 2 U.S.C. 437g(a)(2). It will remain confidential in accordance with 2 U.S.C. 437g(a)(4)(B) and 437g(a)(12)(A) until it is placed on the public record in accordance with 11 C.F.R. 111.42, unless you notify the FEC in writing that you wish the matter to be made public.


I am counsel to the Council of School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO PAC and I write on behalf of the Treasurer Anita Gomez-Palacio to respond to a letter dated February 8, 2007 assessing a civil penalty for failure to file a quarterly report which was due on October 15, 2006.

We ask that the penalty be reduced or eliminated for the following reasons. First the assessment letter incorrectly stated that the report was "Not Filed". I have attached a copy of the report which demonstrates that the report was filed on November 11, 2006. (Exhibit A.) Second, the letter indicates that "You were previously notified of the due date for this report." We have checked all communications from the FEC and could find no communication alerting us to the change in the report date.

We recognize our responsibility to file on time and assure you that we have instituted a back up system to insure future timely filings without relying on communications from your agency. We ask that you consider our previous record of compliance and timely filing and reconsider the penalty assessed.

COMPLIANCE

- Treasurers of political committees are responsible for both the timeliness and the accuracy of all reports. They may be subject to monetary penalties if reports are inaccurate or are not filed on time.
- Under the Administrative Fine Program, political committees and their treasurers who fail to file their reports on time may be subject to civil money penalties up to \$16,000 (or more for repeat late- and non-filers). On February 6, 2007, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) for failure to file the 2006 October Quarterly Report, an election sensitive report, and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$900 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. They were notified by the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on February 8, 2007 of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty. A second RTB letter with the correct General Election date was faxed to them on March 12, 2007.

Respondents' Response

On March 19, 2007, the Commission received a written response, supporting documentation, and designation of counsel statement ("challenge") from their counsel who requests that the penalty be reduced or waived for two reasons. First, the RTB letter states that the report was not filed but they filed it on November 11 and provide proof of that filing. Second, they can not find any information from the Commission notifying them of the date change for the October Quarterly Report. Counsel says that they know they must file on time and have added a back up system so they do not have to rely on Commission notifications in the future.

Included with the challenge are copies, from the Commission's web site for viewing electronically filed reports, of the Summary and Detailed Summary Pages and Schedules A and B for the October Quarterly Report with the date "Filed: 11/06/2006."

Analysis

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") requires that quarterly reports be filed by the treasurer of a political action committee no later than the 15th day after the last day of each calendar quarter in a calendar year in which a regularly scheduled general election is held. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(4)(A)(i) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(c)(i)(A). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 p.m., Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the prescribed filing date to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(e). The October Quarterly Report is an election sensitive report and is considered not filed if it is not filed prior to four days before the General Election. 11 C.F.R. § 111.43(d) and (e)(2). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

Because the respondents filed the report on November 6, the day before the November 7 General Election, it is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. § 111.43(e)(2). RAD's telecoms (written records of telephone conversations) show that a Compliance Analyst spoke with Pamela Pittman, the Committee's Disclosure Analyst, on February 15, 2007. The Compliance Analyst explained to Ms. Pittman that the Committee filed the report but, because this is an election sensitive report, it was considered not filed for purposes of the Administrative Fine program.

Counsel also asserts that the respondents could not find any information telling them about the date change for the October Quarterly Report. It is not clear why they thought the report's due date changed. The Prior Notice sent to their address of record on September 21, 2006, states that the filing date is October 15. As required by the Act, the Committee's 2002 and 2004 October Quarterly Reports were filed on time as well as its two prior 2006 quarterly reports. They were also notified of the quarterly filing requirement the day after the report was due when the Electronic Filing Office sent a notice on October 16 to the email address which they previously provided, pamel@csa-nyc.org, telling them that they had failed to file it. RAD then sent the Non-Filer Notice to them on November 2. The Commission's reminder notices are sent as a courtesy to committees and their treasurers, and as respondents' counsel correctly points out, it is the Treasurer's responsibility to ensure that reports are filed on time.

The 2006 October Quarterly Report was filed on November 6, 2006, 22 days late. The challenge fails to address any of the three valid excuses enumerated at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). These are: (i) the existence of factual errors; and/or (ii) the improper calculation of the civil money penalty; and/or (iii) the existence of extraordinary circumstances that were beyond their control and that were for a duration of at least 48 hours and that prevented them from filing the report in a timely manner. The Reviewing Officer, therefore, recommends that the Commission make a final determination that they violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) and assess a \$900 civil money penalty.

OAR Recommendations

- (1) Make a final determination in AF# 1559 that the Council of School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO and Anita Gomez Palacio, as Treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) and assess a civil money penalty of \$900; and
- (2) Send the appropriate letter.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file an October Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements in a calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election. This report, covering the period through September 30th, shall be filed no later than October 15th. 2 U.S.C. 434(a). You were previously notified of the due date for this report. Records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that this report was not filed prior to four (4) days before the general election held on November 7, 2006. You should file the report if you have not already done so.

The Act was further amended in 1999 to permit the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 2 U.S.C. 434(a). 2 U.S.C. 437g(a)(4). On 2/6/2007, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Council of School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. 434(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before October 15th. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$900. It is due by 3/18/2007 and is based on these factors:

On February 6, 2007, the Commission found reason to believe (“RTB”) that the respondents violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) for failing to file the 2006 October Quarterly Report, an election sensitive report, and also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$900 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43.

On March 19, 2007, the Commission received the respondents’ written response and supporting documentation (“challenge”). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer’s recommendation dated June 19, 2007 was forwarded to the Commission. A copy was simultaneously forwarded to the respondents. The Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that they violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) and assess a civil money penalty of \$900 because they submitted no evidence that a factual error was made, that the civil money penalty was miscalculated at RTB or that extraordinary circumstances existed which prevented them from filing the report on time.

Instead of filing a written response with the Commission Secretary within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f), the respondents paid the civil money penalty.

On February 6, 2007, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that the Council for School Supervisors and Administrators Local 1 AFSA AFL-CIO and Anita Gomez Palacio, as Treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) for failing to file the 2006 October Quarterly Report. By letters dated February 8, 2007, the Commission sent you notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at RTB of \$900 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On March 19, 2007, the Office of Administrative Review received the written response from you challenging the civil money penalty calculated at RTB.




