SUBJECT: REASON TO BELIEVE RECOMMENDATION -  
FAILURE TO FILE 48-HOUR NOTICES UNDER THE  
ADMINISTRATIVE FINE PROGRAM

Attached is the name of a principal campaign committee that has failed to file 48-hour notices with the Commission for contributions of \$1,000.00 or more received from the close of books for the Missouri 12 Day Pre-Primary Election Report up to 48 hours before the August 8, 2006 Primary Election in accordance with 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(f). The committee, Talent for Senate Committee, represents a candidate who, as an incumbent, won the 2006 Primary Election in the state of Missouri. The committee failed to file 48-hour notices for contributions totaling \$27,000 .

On July 3, 2006, Prior Notice was sent to the committee which included a section detailing the requirements for filing 48-hour notices. The section read as follows:

“Notices are required if the committee receives contributions **(including in-kind gifts or advances of goods or services; loans from the candidate or other non-bank sources; and guarantees or endorsements of loans to the candidate or committee)** of \$1,000.00 or more, during the period of July 20 through August 5, 2006. The notices must reach the appropriate federal and state filing offices within 48 hours of the committee’s receipt of the contribution(s).”

A 48-hour notice is required to report all contributions of a \$1,000.00 or more, to any authorized committee of a candidate, including contributions from the candidate, loans from the candidate and other non-bank sources and endorsements or guarantees of loans from banks, as per, 11 C.F.R § 104.5(f).

We have attached an information sheet which includes the name, date of receipt and amount of the contributions for which a 48-hour notice was not filed.

In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties outlined within 11 C.F.R §111.44, this committee should be assessed the civil money penalty so indicated.

**Recommendation**

1. Find reason to believe that Talent for Senate Committee and Shirley J. Simmons, Treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a)(6) and make a preliminary determination that a civil money penalty of \$3,030.00 be assessed.
2. Send the appropriate letter.

Dear Shirley J. Simmons:

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires principal campaign committees of candidates for federal office to notify in writing either the Secretary of the Senate or the Federal Election Commission ("FEC"), and the Secretary of State, as appropriate, of any contribution of \$1,000 or more, received by any authorized committee of the candidate after the 20th day, but more than 48 hours before, any election. The Act further requires notification to be made within 48 hours after the receipt of the contribution and to include the name of the candidate and office sought, the date of receipt, the amount of the contribution, and the identification of the contributor. The notification of these contributions shall be in addition to all other reporting requirements. 2 U.S.C. § 434(a). You were previously notified of the requirement to file these notices. Records at the FEC indicate that you did not submit 48-Hour Notices for contributions of \$1,000 or more, received between 7/20/2006 and 8/5/2006, totaling \$27,000. See Attachment 1.

The Act was further amended in 1999 to permit the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 2 U.S.C. § 434(a). 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(4). On 12/11/2008, the FEC found that there is Reason to Believe ("RTB") that Talent for Senate Committee and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) by failing to file the 48-Hour Notices. Based on the FEC's schedule of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$3,030. Send your payment by 1/20/2009. The amount of the civil money penalty is \$110 for each non-filed notice plus 10 percent of the dollar amount of the contributions not timely reported. The civil money penalty increases by 25 percent for each prior violation.

**To Pay the Calculated Civil Money Penalty**

To pay the calculated civil money penalty, send the enclosed remittance and your payment to the FEC at the address on page 4. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

**To Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Calculated Civil Money Penalty**

To challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response, including the AF# found on page one, to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review, 999 E Street, NW, Washington, DC 20463. Your response must be received by 1/20/2009. Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty. The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on a factual error in the RTB finding; miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. In order for a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to, a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite you seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and severe weather or other disaster-related incident. **Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to, negligence; delays caused by vendors or contractors; treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; committee computer, software, or internet service provider failures; failure to know filing dates; and failure to use filing software properly.** Your response must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35.

Your failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver of your right to present such argument in a petition to the district court under 2 U.S.C. § 437g. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

**If You Do Not Pay the Calculated Civil Money Penalty or Submit a Challenge**

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty or submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Talent for Senate Committee and you, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA") as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 C.F.R. § 111.45.


On December 11, 2008, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Talent for Senate Committee and you as treasurer violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a) for failing to file 48-Hour Notices for contributions of \$1,000 or more, received between July 20, 2006 and August 5, 2006, totaling \$27,000. By letter dated December 12, 2008, the Commission sent you notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage of **\$3,030** in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44.

On February 9, 2009, the FEC received payment of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage. The FEC made a final determination on February 25, 2009 that you as treasurer and Talent for Senate Committee violated 2 U.S.C. § 434(a), assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of **\$3,030** in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.44 and voted to close the file.

The confidentiality provisions at 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. The file will be made a part of the public record pursuant to 11 C.F.R. § 111.42(b). Although the file must be placed on the public record within thirty (30) days from the date of the Commission's notification, this could occur at anytime following certification of the Commission's vote.
