SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2019 October Quarterly Report for the Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2019 October Quarterly Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The October Quarterly Report was due on October 15, 2019.

The committees listed on the attached RTB Circulation Report failed to file the report. In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

**Recommendation**

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
2. Send the appropriate letters.

Dear Mr. Smith,

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file an October Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements every calendar year. This report, covering the period July 1, 2019 through September 30, 2019, shall be filed no later than October 15, 2019. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that this report was not filed within thirty (30) days of the due date, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty. You should file this report if you have not already done so.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4). On June 29, 2020, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Shaun Brown for Virginia and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before October 15, 2019. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$7,994. Please see the attached copy of the Commission's administrative fine regulations at 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.30-111.55. Attachment 1. The Commission's website contains further information about how the administrative fine program works and how the fines are calculated. See <http://www.fec.gov/af/af.shtml>. 11 C.F.R. § 111.34. Your payment of \$7,994 is due within forty (40) days of the finding, or by August 8, 2020, and is based on these factors:

### **1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty**

If you should decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or August 8, 2020. 11 CFR § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 CFR § 111.36(c).

Please note, on June 18, 2020, the Federal Election Commission began the initial phase (Phase I) of its return to normal operations. At this stage, the agency's offices will remain closed to visitors and most of its employees will continue to telework in an effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The Commission is processing some documents submitted by mail, though processing will not occur on a daily basis until the agency resumes normal mail operations. Nevertheless, a challenge to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty must be received on time. Thus, all written responses and supporting documentation should be converted to PDF (Portable Document Format) and must be emailed to [administrativefines@fec.gov](mailto:administrativefines@fec.gov). The Commission encourages the use of electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date it is electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 CFR § 111.35(b). In order for a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. *Id.* Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 CFR § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff

illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 CFR § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

## **2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge**

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Shaun Brown for Virginia and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 CFR § 111.51(a)(2).

## **3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty**

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

## **NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS**

### **4. Partial Payments**

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

### **5. Settlement Offers**

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a

payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the FEC in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(2). Unless you notify the FEC in writing that you wish the matter to be made public, it will remain confidential in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(B) and 30109(a)(12)(A) until it is placed on the public record at the conclusion of this matter in accordance with 11 CFR § 111.42.

I am providing this challenge to the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty. My treasurer is currently in quarantine caring for a family member While available by phone it is too risky at the moment for me to meet face to face regarding this challenge.

The **October 2019 Quarterly** report has been filed. There was no activity. A notice of my self surrender to the Norfolk Federal Courthouse in Norfolk, Virginia on March 20,2019 in route to Alderson Federal Prison, was provided anticipating no campaign finance activity.

No bank fees were subtracted by Old Point National Bank of Hampton, Virginia as reflected in the report. The RTB finding indicates a Level of Activity of \$179,167. "

**REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION  
OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW (“OAR”)**

AF# 3758, AF# 3778, and AF# 3826 – Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer (C00615013)

**Summary of Recommendations**

Make a final determination in AF# 3758 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty.

Make a final determination in AF# 3778 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty.

Make a final determination in AF# 3826 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty.

**Reason-to-Believe Background**

The 2019 October Quarterly Report was due on October 15, 2019. The Committee filed the report on September 4, 2020, 325 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was not filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1). On June 29, 2020, the Commission found reason to believe (“RTB”) that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2019 October Quarterly Report. The Commission also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter dated July 9, 2020 was sent to the respondents’ email address of record by the Reports Analysis Division (“RAD”) to notify them of the Commission’s RTB finding and civil money penalty.

The 2019 Year-End Report was due on January 31, 2020. The Committee filed the report on September 4, 2020, 217 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was not filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1). On June 29, 2020, the Commission found RTB that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2019 Year-End Report. The Commission also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter dated July 20, 2020 was sent to the respondents’ email address of record by RAD to notify them of the Commission’s RTB finding and civil money penalty.

The 2020 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 2020. The Committee filed the report on September 4, 2020, 142 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was not filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1). On June 29, 2020, the Commission found RTB that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2020 April Quarterly Report. The Commission also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter dated July 15, 2020 was sent to the respondents' email address of record by RAD to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

## **Legal Requirements**

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") states that the treasurer of a principal campaign committee shall file a report for the quarter ending September 30 no later than October 15, a report for the quarter ending December 31 no later than January 31 of the following calendar year, and a report for the quarter ending March 31 no later than April 15. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a)(1)(i). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

## **Respondents' Challenges**

On September 8, 2020, the Commission received the written responses ("challenges") from the Candidate for AF# 3758, AF# 3778, and AF# 3826. She indicates she was previously incarcerated, and the 2019 October Quarterly, 2019 Year-End, and 2020 April Quarterly Reports have now been filed. She states that there was no activity for each of the reporting periods.

## **Analysis**

The Candidate indicates the civil money penalties calculated at RTB were calculated using an incorrect level of activity. At the time of the RTB findings, the Commission used an estimated level of activity (\$179,167) to calculate the penalties because the reports had not yet been filed. 11 C.F.R. § 111.43(d)(2)(i). On September 4, 2020, the Committee filed the 2019 October Quarterly, 2019 Year-End, and 2020 April Quarterly Reports. Each of the reports discloses \$0 in total receipts and \$0 in total disbursements during each of the reporting periods. For authorized committees, the level of activity is the amount of total receipts plus total disbursements disclosed on the report. 11 C.F.R. § 111.43(d)(3)(i). Therefore, the actual level of activity for the 2019 October Quarterly, 2019 Year-End, and 2020 April Quarterly reporting periods is \$0. Using the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43(a), no civil money penalty should be assessed for a level of activity of \$0.

The Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination in AF# 3758, AF# 3778, and AF# 3826 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalties.

**OAR Recommendations**

- (1) Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 3758 involving Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- (2) Make a final determination in AF# 3758 that Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$7,994);
- (3) Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 3778 involving Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- (4) Make a final determination in AF# 3778 that Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$7,994);
- (5) Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 3826 involving Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- (6) Make a final determination in AF# 3826 that Shaun Brown for Virginia and Octavianus Smith, in his official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$7,994);
- (7) Send the appropriate letters.

On June 29, 2020, the Commission found reason to believe (“RTB”) that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2019 October Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43 (AF# 3758). On June 29, 2020, the Commission found RTB that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2019 Year-End Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43 (AF# 3778). On June 29, 2020, the Commission found RTB that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2020 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$7,994 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43 (AF# 3826).

On September 8, 2020, the Commission received their written response (“challenge”). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer Recommendation (“ROR”) dated November 6, 2020 was forwarded to the Commission, a copy was forwarded to the respondents, and is hereby incorporated by reference. The Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination in AF# 3758, AF# 3778, and AF# 3826 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess no civil money penalties.

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, they may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). To date, a response has not been received.

On June 29, 2020, the Federal Election Commission (“the Commission”) found reason to believe (“RTB”) that Shaun Brown for Virginia and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2019 October Quarterly Report. By letter dated July 9, 2020, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at RTB of \$7,994 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On September 8, 2020, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission’s RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission reduce the RTB civil money penalty because it was calculated using an estimated level of activity, make a final determination that Shaun Brown for Virginia and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and based on the actual level of activity disclosed on the 2019 October Quarterly Report filed September 4, 2020 (\$0), assess no civil money penalty in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on November 6, 2020.

On February 17, 2021, the Commission adopted the Reviewing Officer’s recommendation and made a final determination that Shaun Brown for Virginia and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and based on the level of activity disclosed on the 2019 October Quarterly Report (\$0), assessed no civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$7,994). It is based on the same factors used to calculate the civil money penalty at RTB except that the actual rather than the estimated level of activity was used. A copy of the Final Determination Recommendation is attached.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within 30 days from the date of this notification.
