SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2020 Year-End Report for the
Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2020 Year-End Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The Year-End Report was due on January 31, 2021.

The committees listed in the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report, filed the report no more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a late filed report), or filed the report more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a non-filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

In order to determine the level of activity for unauthorized quarterly filers that filed a Year-End Report and were required to but failed to file the 30 Day Post-General Report, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) used the following procedures and criteria:

- Every Year-End Report (YE) submitted by an unauthorized quarterly filer that covered the period from October 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 (92 days) was reviewed for activity which would have required the filing of a 30 Day Post-General Report (30 Day Report). If our research indicated that a 30G was required, we utilized a three-step method to arrive at the activity on which to base the YE fine amount. First, we took the sum of all itemized receipts and disbursements that should have been disclosed on a YE that covered the period from November 24, 2020 through December 31, 2020 (38 days). Second, if the committee had any unitemized activity, a per diem level of this activity was calculated by multiplying the total amount of unitemized activity on the report by 41.30% (38 days (correct YE Filing Period)/92 days (submitted YE Filing Period)). Third, we took the sum of the amounts calculated in steps one and two to arrive at the level of activity assigned to the YE.

Recommendation

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
2. Send the appropriate letters.

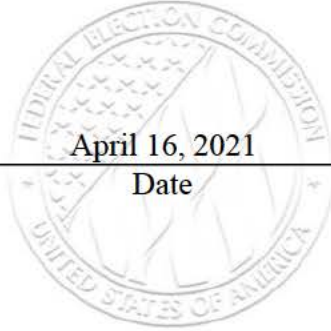

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file a Year-End Report of Receipts and Disbursements every calendar year. This report, covering the period November 24, 2020 through December 31, 2020, shall be filed no later than January 31, 2021. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that you did not file this report within thirty (30) days of the due date, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty. You should file this report if you have not already done so.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4). On April 5, 2021, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that American Composites Manufacturers Association Political Action Committee and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before January 31, 2021. 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At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or May 15, 2021. 11 CFR § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 CFR § 111.36(c).

Please note, the Federal Election Commission's office remains closed to visitors and most of its employees are continuing to telework in an effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The Commission is processing some documents submitted by mail, though processing will not occur daily until the agency resumes normal mail operations. Nevertheless, a challenge to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty must be received on time. Thus, all written responses and supporting documentation should be converted to PDF (Portable Document Format) and must be emailed to administrativefines@fec.gov. The Commission encourages the use of electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date it is electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 CFR § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. *Id.* Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 CFR § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or

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contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 CFR § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that American Composites Manufacturers Association Political Action Committee and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 CFR § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.



Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including making a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

SUBJECT: Administrative Fine Program – Final Determination Recommendation for the 2020 Year-End Report

Attached are two lists of political committees and their treasurers against which the Commission has found reason to believe (RTB) and assessed proposed civil money penalties calculated at RTB for failure to file or failure to timely file the 2020 Year-End Report. The first list represents the committees that have paid the civil money penalty and the second list represents the committees that have not paid the civil money penalty. The committees that have not paid have been given at least forty (40) days from the date of the Commission's RTB finding to remit payment.

In accordance with 11 CFR § 111.34 and 11 CFR § 111.40, the Commission shall send a final determination notice to those respondents that have either paid or not paid the civil money penalty.

For your information, fifty-four (54) committees disclosed a level of activity after the RTB finding which would result in a lowered civil money penalty. An overview of these cases has been provided below.

Alexandra Owensby for The People (AF 4104) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money

penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$173 (previously estimated to be \$32,832), thus the fine would be lowered from \$ 1,267 to \$173.

Allison Fine for Congress (AF 4105) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$147,760), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$6,735).

American Composites Manufacturers Association Political Action Committee (AF 4106) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$4,750 (previously estimated to be \$20,756), thus the fine would be lowered from \$704 to \$351.

Amsted Industries Incorporated PAC (AF 4107) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$44,761), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,583).

Anthony Clark 2020 (AF 4108) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$41,576), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,267).

Armitage for Congress (AF 4110) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$89,742), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$5,237).

Art Robinson for Congress (AF 4111) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$40 (previously estimated to be \$23,187), thus the fine would be lowered from \$704 to \$40.

Badrun for Congress (AF 4112) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$22,885), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$704).

Bentivolio for Congress (AF 4113) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$43,696), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,267).

Blair for Congress 2020 (AF 4115) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$5,807 (previously estimated to be \$91,735), thus the fine would be lowered from \$5,237 to \$422.

Brigid for South Jersey (AF 4118) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$4,469 (previously estimated to be \$221,841), thus the fine would be lowered from \$9,727 to \$351.

Bronx United (AF 4119) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding which disclosed no federal activity (previously estimated to be \$37,225), resulting in no civil penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,267).

Campaign to Elect Antoine Pierce (AF 4121) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$19,440), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$704).

Champion for Congress (AF 4123) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$64,746), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$4,041).

Christine Mann for Congress (AF 4124) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$94,963), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$5,237).

Committee to Elect Frank Mials Scurlock for President (AF 4126) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$452,293), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$14,216).

Committee to Elect Joe Walz (AF 4128) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$14,914), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$880).

Committee to Elect Shelia Bryant (AF 4132) filed a Termination Report, which covered the 2020 Year-End reporting period, after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$6,680 (previously estimated to be \$20,309), thus the fine would be lowered from \$704 to \$422.

Covert for Congress (AF 4133) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$68,306), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$4,041).

David Kim for Congress, Financial Freedom, Love & Justice for All (AF 4134) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$8,341 (previously estimated to be \$35,131), thus the fine would be lowered from \$1,267 to \$422.

Dr Jay for Congress, Inc. (AF 4137) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$180,067), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$10,288).

Eastern Washington Voters (AF 4138) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. The committee disclosed total receipts and disbursements of \$3,885 (previously estimated to be \$12,759), thus the fine would be lowered from \$880 to \$438.

Eugene Yu for Congress (AF 4140) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$29,045), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$1,583).

FRIENDS OF AGATHA (AF 4142) disclosed no activity after the RTB finding (previously estimated to be \$20,099), which would result in no civil money penalty (fine previously assessed to be \$704).

Friends of Clint Koble (AF 4143) filed the 2020 Year-End Report after the RTB finding and disclosed an actual level of activity which would result in a lowered civil money penalty than that assessed at RTB. On April 5, 2021, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that American Composites Manufacturers Association Political Action Committee and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for filing late or failing to file the 2020 Year-End Report. By letter dated April 20, 2021, the Commission notified you of the RTB finding and the preliminary civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage to be \$704 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 CFR § 111.43. Within forty (40) days of the FEC's RTB finding, you, in your official capacity as treasurer, were required to either transmit payment of the calculated civil money penalty or submit a written response challenging either the RTB finding or the calculated civil money penalty.

The FEC did not receive payment of the calculated civil money penalty or a written response within the time permitted. Since that time, the amount of the civil money penalty has been changed to reflect the actual level of activity of the Year-End Report. The FEC made a final determination on December 2, 2021 that American Composites Manufacturers Association Political Action Committee and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$351 in accordance with 11 CFR § 111.43. The civil money penalty is based on these factors:

Election Sensitivity of Report: Not Election Sensitive

Level of Activity: \$4,750

Number of Days Late: Not Filed (reports not filed within thirty (30) days of the due date are considered not filed for the purposes of calculating the penalty)

Number of Previous Civil Money Penalties Assessed: 0

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Appeal the Final Determination and/or Civil Money Penalty

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If you choose to appeal the final determination, you should submit a written petition, within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter, to the U.S. District Court for the district in which the committee or you reside, or transact business, requesting that the final determination be modified or set aside. See 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(C)(iii). Your failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver of the respondents' right to present such argument in a petition to the district court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Appeal

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA") as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 ("DCIA"), 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. If you do not pay this debt within thirty (30) days (or file a written petition to a federal district court - see below), the Commission will transfer the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") for collection. Within five (5) days of the transfer to Treasury, Treasury will contact you to request payment. Treasury currently charges a fee of 30% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. If the age of the debt is greater than or equal to two years old, Treasury will charge a fee of 32% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. The fee will be added to the amount of the civil money penalty that you owe. Should Treasury's attempts fail, Treasury will refer the debt to a private collection agency ("PCA"). If the debt remains unpaid, Treasury may recommend that the Commission refer the matter to the Department of Justice for litigation.

Actions which may be taken to enforce recovery of a delinquent debt by Treasury may also include: (1) offset of any payments, which the debtor is due, including tax refunds and salary; (2) referral of the debt to agency counsel for litigation; (3) reporting of the debt to a credit bureau; (4) administrative wage garnishment; and (5) reporting of the debt, if discharged, to the IRS as potential taxable income. In addition, under the provisions of DCIA and other statutes applicable to the FEC, the debtor may be subject to the assessment of other statutory interest, penalties, and administrative costs.

In accordance with the DCIA, at your request, the agency will offer you the opportunity to inspect and copy records relating to the debt, the opportunity for a review of the debt, and the opportunity to enter into a written repayment agreement.

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. You should make payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter.

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination.


5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 CFR §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within thirty (30) days from the date of this notification.
