SUBJECT: Reason to Believe Recommendation -

Failure to File 48-Hour Notices under the Administrative Fine Program

Attached is the name of a principal campaign committee that has failed to file 48-hour notices with the Commission for contributions of \$1,000.00 or more received from the close of books for the New Jersey 12-Day Pre-Primary Report up to 48 hours before the July 7, 2020 Primary Election¹ in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and 11 CFR. § 104.5(f). The committee, BECCHI FOR CONGRESS, represents a candidate who lost the 2020 General Election. The committee is being referred for failing to file 48-hour notices for contributions totaling \$26,758.73.

A 48-hour notice is required to report all contributions of a \$1,000.00 or more, to any authorized committee of a candidate, including contributions from the candidate, loans from the candidate and other non-bank sources and endorsements or guarantees of loans from banks, as per 11 CFR § 104.5(f).

 $^{^{1}}$ On 4/8/2020, the New Jersey Governor changed the congressional primary election date from 6/02/2020 to 7/07/2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This caused the 48-Hour Notice period to span both the 2020 July and October Quarterly Reports.

In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties outlined within 11 CFR § 111.44, this committee should be assessed the civil money penalty so indicated. Recommendation

Dear Mr. Steiner,

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 52 U.S.C. § 30101, et seq. ("the Act"), requires principal campaign committees of candidates for federal office to notify in writing the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") and the Secretary of State, as appropriate, of any contribution of \$1,000 or more, received by any authorized committee of the candidate after the 20th day, but more than 48 hours before, any election. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(6)(A). The Act further requires notification to be made within 48 hours after the receipt of the contribution and to include the name of the candidate and office sought, the date of receipt, the amount of the contribution, and the identification of the contributor. Id. These notification requirements are in addition to all other reporting requirements. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Our records indicate that BECCHI FOR CONGRESS did not submit 48-Hour Notices for contributions of \$1,000 or more, received between June 18, 2020 and July 4, 2020, totaling \$26,758.73, as required by 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(6)(A). Attachment 1.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4). On August 18, 2021, the FEC found that there is Reason to Believe ("RTB") that BECCHI FOR CONGRESS and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file the 48-Hour Notices. Based on the FEC's schedule of civil money penalties at 11 CFR § 111.44, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$2,826. Please see the attached copy of the Commission's administrative fine regulations at 11 CFR §§ 111.30-111.55. Attachment 2. The Commission's website contains further information about how the administrative fine program works and how the fines are calculated. http://www.fec.gov/af/af.shtml. 11 CFR § 111.34. The amount of the civil money penalty is \$151 for each non-filed notice plus 10 percent of the dollar amount of the contributions not timely reported. The civil money penalty increases by 25 percent for each prior violation. Send your payment of \$2,826 within forty (40) days of the finding, or by September 27, 2021.

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or September 27, 2021. 11 CFR § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 CFR § 111.36(c).

Please note, the Federal Election Commission's office remains closed to visitors and most of its employees are continuing to telework in an effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The Commission is processing some documents submitted by mail, though processing will not occur daily until the agency resumes normal mail operations. Nevertheless, a challenge to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty must be received on time. Thus, all written responses and supporting documentation should be converted to PDF (Portable Document Format) and must be emailed to administrative fines@fec.gov. The Commission encourages the use of electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date it is electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 CFR § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. Id. Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 CFR § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee

computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 CFR § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that BECCHI FOR CONGRESS and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 CFR § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in

correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the FEC in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities. 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(2). Unless you notify the FEC in writing that you wish the matter to be made public, it will remain confidential in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(B) and 30109(a)(12)(A) until it is placed on the public record at the conclusion of this matter in accordance with 11 CFR § 111.42.

REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW ("OAR")

AF# 4225 – Becchi for Congress and David Steiner, in their official capacity as Treasurer (C00711572)

Summary of Recommendation

Make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$1,853 civil money penalty.

Reason-to-Believe Background

In connection with the 2020 New Jersey Primary Election held on July 7, 2020, the respondents were required to file 48-Hour Notices for contributions of \$1,000 or more received between June 18, 2020 and July 4, 2020. On August 18, 2021, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file 48-Hour Notices for fifteen (15) contributions totaling \$26,758.73 and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$2,826 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44. A letter was e-mailed to the respondents' e-mail address of record from the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on August 24, 2021 to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

Legal Requirements

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") requires that the principal campaign committee of a candidate notify the Commission, in writing, of any contribution of \$1,000 or more received after the 20th day but more than 48 hours before an election. The principal campaign committee must notify the Commission within 48 hours of receipt of the contribution. The 48-hour notification shall be in addition to all other reporting requirements under the Act. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(f). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

Summary of Respondents' Challenge

On September 1, 2021, the Commission received the written response ("challenge") from the Committee. The Committee acknowledges that it failed to file 48-Hour Notices for contributions totaling \$17,025. However, the Committee states that the \$9,733.73 in contributions from the Candidate on June 30, 2020 were individually below the \$1,000 48-Hour Notice threshold. The Committee further explains that these in-kind contributions from the Candidate were reported as lump sums based on the type of expense. The Committee provided a spreadsheet detailing the individual transactions totaling \$9,733.73.

Analysis

At the time of RTB, the Commission calculated the civil money penalty based on the Committee's failure to file 48-Hour Notices for fifteen (15) contributions totaling \$26,758.73. After receiving the challenge, the Reviewing Officer requested the Committee correct the public record to accurately itemize the six (6) in-kind contributions from the Candidate totaling \$9,733.73. On September 19, 2021, the Committee filed an FEC Form 99 (Miscellaneous Electronic Submission)¹ to provide the detailed itemization of the contributions totaling \$9,733.73. The Reviewing Officer confirms that the eighty-six (86) individual contributions totaling \$9,733.73 are all below the \$1,000 threshold which triggers the 48-Hour Notice requirement.² 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(6)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(f).

The Reviewing Officer confirms that \$9,733.73 should be removed from the calculation of the civil money penalty. The Committee still failed to timely file 48-Hour Notices for nine (9) contributions totaling \$17,025. The civil money penalty calculation for 48-Hour Notices is contained at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44. The calculation is \$151 plus 10% of the amount of the contributions not reported on *each* 48-Hour Notice, plus 25% for each previous violation. The number of missing notices should be calculated by determining the minimum number of notices the Committee could have filed to cover the contributions in question. The minimum number of 48-Hour Notices the Committee could have filed to cover the contributions in question equals one (1). Thus, the amount of the civil money penalty is [(\$151 x 1 missing notice) + (.10 x \$17,025 in total contributions)] or \$1,853.

OAR Recommendations

- 1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4225 involving Becchi for Congress and David Steiner, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 2. Make a final determination in AF# 4225 that Becchi for Congress and David Steiner, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$1,853 civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$2,826); and
- 3. Send the appropriate letter.

On August 18, 2021, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file 48-Hour Notices for fifteen (15) contributions totaling \$26,758.73 and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$2,826 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44. On September 1, 2021, the Commission received their written response ("challenge"). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer Recommendation ("ROR") dated October 21, 2021 was forwarded to the Commission, a copy was forwarded to the respondents, and is hereby incorporated by reference. The Reviewing Officer confirmed that \$9,733.73 in contributions should be removed from the calculation of the civil money penalty, and the civil money penalty should instead be calculated based on the Committee's failure to timely file 48-Hour Notices for nine (9) contributions totaling \$17,025. The Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$1,853 civil money penalty (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$2,826).

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, the respondents may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). The respondents have since indicated they will not be submitting a response to the ROR.

On August 18, 2021, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Becchi for Congress and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing for failing to timely file 48-Hour Notices for fifteen (15) contributions totaling \$26,758.73. By letter dated August 24, 2021, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at RTB of \$2,826 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.44. On September 1, 2021, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission's RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission reduce the RTB civil money penalty because the civil money penalty should be calculated based on the failure to timely file 48-Hour Notices for nine (9) contributions totaling \$17,025. The Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that Becchi for Congress and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$1,853 civil money penalty in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.44 (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$2,826). The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on October 21, 2021.

On December 8, 2021, the Commission adopted the Reviewing Officer's recommendation and made a final determination that Becchi for Congress and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104 and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$1,853 (reduced from the RTB civil money penalty of \$2,826). A copy of the Final Determination Recommendation is attached.

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Appeal the Final Determination and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you choose to appeal the final determination, you should submit a written petition, within 30 days of receipt of this letter, to the U.S. District Court for the district in which the committee or you reside, or transact business, requesting that the final determination be modified or set aside. See 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(C)(iii). Your failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver of the respondents' right to present such argument in a petition to the district court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Appeal

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA") as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 ("DCIA"), 31 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq. If you do not pay this debt within 30 days (or file a written petition to a federal district court - see below), the Commission will transfer the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") for collection. Within 5 days of the transfer to Treasury, Treasury will contact you to request payment. Treasury currently charges a fee of 30% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. If the age of the debt is greater than or equal to two years old, Treasury will charge a fee of 32% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. The fee will be added to the amount of the civil money penalty that you owe. Should Treasury's attempts fail, Treasury will refer the debt to a private collection agency ("PCA"). If the debt remains unpaid, Treasury may recommend that the Commission refer the matter to the Department of Justice for litigation.

Actions which may be taken to enforce recovery of a delinquent debt by Treasury may also include: (1) offset of any payments, which the debtor is due, including tax refunds and salary; (2) referral of the debt to agency counsel for litigation; (3) reporting of the debt to a credit bureau; (4) administrative wage garnishment; and (5) reporting of the debt, if discharged, to the IRS as potential taxable income. In addition, under the provisions of DCIA and other statutes applicable to the FEC, the debtor may be subject to the assessment of other statutory interest, penalties, and administrative costs.

In accordance with the DCIA, at your request, the agency will offer you the opportunity to inspect and copy records relating to the debt, the opportunity for a review of the debt, and the opportunity to enter into a written repayment agreement.

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. You should make payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within 30 days from the date of this notification.
