SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2022 12-Day Pre-Primary Report

(Texas) for the Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to timely file the 2022 12-Day Pre-Primary Report for the Texas Primary Election in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The 12-Day Pre-Primary Report was due on February 17, 2022 and the Primary Election was held on March 1, 2022.

The committees listed on the attached RTB Circulation Report failed to file the election sensitive report by the required due date. Election sensitive reports filed more than four days prior to the election are considered late, and reports not filed more than four days prior to the election are considered not filed. In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 CFR § 111.43, the committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

Recommendation

- 1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.
- 2. Send the appropriate letters.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file a 12-Day Pre-Primary Report of Receipts and Disbursements in any calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election for which the candidate is seeking election or nomination for election. This report, covering the period January 1, 2022 through February 9, 2022, shall be filed no later than February 17, 2022. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Commission indicate that you did not file this report prior to four (4) days before the election, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty. You should file the report if you have not already done so.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109g(a)(4). On April 13, 2022, the FEC found that there is reason to believe ("RTB") that Jerry Ford for Texas and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to file timely this report on or before February 17, 2022. Based on the FEC's schedules of civil money penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43, the amount of your civil money penalty calculated at the RTB stage is \$2,093. 1. If You Choose to Challenge the RTB Finding and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to challenge the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty, you must submit a written response to the FEC's Office of Administrative Review. Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or May 23, 2022. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(c).

Please note, all challenges to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty **PDF** emailed to converted (Portable Document Format) and administrativefines@fec.gov. The of Commission encourages the use electronic signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date they are electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. Id. Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address, and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Jerry Ford for Texas and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701, *et seq.* The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 C.F.R. § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including making a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section







REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW ("OAR")

AF# 4289 and AF# 4302– Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer (C00780916)

Summary of Recommendation

Terminate the proceedings in AF# 4289 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.37(b) and close the file.

Make a final determination in AF# 4302 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$212 civil money penalty.

Reason-to-Believe Background

The 2022 Texas Pre-Primary Report was due on February 17, 2022. The respondents filed the report on April 27, 2022, 69 days late. The report is election sensitive and was not filed prior to four days before the 2022 Texas Primary Election held March 1, 2022; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(2).

On April 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 Texas Pre-Primary Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$2,093 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter was sent to the respondents' email address of record from the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on April 14, 2022 to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

The 2022 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 2022. The respondents filed the report on May 8, 2022, 23 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered late. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1).

On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$212 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter was sent to the respondents' email address of record from RAD on June 15, 2022 to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

Legal Requirements

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") states that the treasurer of a principal campaign committee shall file a pre-election report no later than 12 days before any primary election in which the candidate seeks election. In addition, the treasurer of a principal campaign committee shall file a quarterly report for the period ending March 30 no later than April 15. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

Summary of Respondents' Challenges

On May 23, 2022, the Commission received the written response ("challenge") for AF# 4289 from the Candidate stating the 2022 Pre-Primary Report was delayed because he needed filing assistance. He further explains that he made multiple calls to RAD in an attempt to reach his assigned RAD Analyst but was unsuccessful. Ultimately, he received the required assistance from another RAD Analyst and filed the Committee's outstanding reports.

On June 27, 2022, the Commission received the challenge for AF# 4302 from the Candidate stating the FEC website was down when he attempted to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. The Candidate also provided a screen shot of the error message he received when attempting to file the April Quarterly Report. The error message states: "This report is already closed. Changes made will not be recorded!" In addition, the Candidate refers to the challenge submitted for AF# 4289, noting he was unable to reach his assigned RAD Analyst for assistance.

Analysis

In both challenges, the Candidate refers to technical issues which prevented the Committee from timely filing the 2022 Pre-Primary and April Quarterly Reports. According to the Commission's Electronic Filing Office ("EFO"), there were no FEC system or software issues which would have prevented the Committee from timely filing these reports. Based on the screenshots provided and review of RAD communication logs, the Reviewing Officer concludes the technical issues are attributed to inexperience with FECFile and reporting requirements, and issues with the Candidate's computer.

The Candidate also generally refers to multiple attempts to contact RAD for assistance for which he received no response. In order to further research the Candidate's call attempts, the Reviewing Officer requested the Candidate provide the number(s) from which he made calls to the FEC. After receiving this information, the Reviewing Officer requested the Office of the Chief Information Officer ("OCIO") research the Commission's telephone service call records from January 1, 2022 through May 31, 2022, to cover any relevant contacts between the FEC and the Candidate. The Reviewing Officer also requested that RAD review its records of contacts with the Committee and note any instances in which RAD did not follow its normal business procedures.

OCIO provided relevant call data and RAD reviewed its records of contact with the Committee.² Commission records indicate RAD has provided filing assistance to the Candidate on numerous occasions, assisting him in filing each report since July 15, 2021. However, after additional research, RAD discovered an isolated incident in which staff inadvertently failed to return one call from the Candidate. The Reviewing Officer notes that Commission records do not support the Candidate's contention that RAD failed to respond to multiple requests for assistance.

The Reviewing Officer provides additional analysis for each RTB finding as follows.

2022 Pre-Primary Report (AF# 4289)

Commission records indicate the Commission appropriately notified and reminded the Committee of its requirement to file the 2022 Pre-Primary Report on multiple occasions.³ On February 18, 2022, the day following the filing deadline, EFO sent a late notification email regarding the 2022 Pre-Primary Report to jerryfordforcongress@gmail.com and ff7196@gmail.com because the report had not yet been filed. On the same day, RAD sent the non-filer notification via email to the same email addresses. Commission records indicate the Candidate contacted RAD for filing assistance that same day, suggesting the Candidate had received the notifications. However, RAD inadvertently failed to return this call and provide the requested assistance.

While the Candidate states he requested assistance multiple times with no response, Commission records indicate the Candidate did not make any subsequent efforts to contact the Commission prior to the RTB finding in this matter. On April 25, 2022, RAD contacted the Candidate regarding the RTB finding. The RAD Analyst provided filing guidance on that day and additional technical assistance on April 26 and 27, 2022. On April 27, 2022, the Committee filed the 2022 Pre-Primary Report, 69 days late.

Their challenge to AF# 4829 fails to address any of the three valid grounds at 11 C.F.R § 111.35(b). These are: (i) the RTB finding is based on factual errors; and/or (ii) the improper calculation of the civil money penalty; and/or (iii) they used best efforts to file on time but were prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond their control and they filed the report no later than 24 hours after the end of these circumstances. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d). However, the Reviewing Officer recognizes that the Candidate's February 18, 2022 request for assistance was not handled in accordance with the Commission's normal business practices. If the Candidate had received assistance when originally requested on February 18, 2022, the Committee may have been able to the file the 2022 Pre-Primary Report that same day. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission terminate the proceedings in AF# 4289 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.37(b) and close the file.

2022 April Quarterly Report (AF# 4302)

Commission records indicate the Commission appropriately notified and reminded the Committee of its requirement to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report on multiple occasions.⁴ The Reviewing Officer recognizes the Committee may have been experiencing on-going technical issues, but Commission records indicate the Committee did not request assistance related to the 2022 April Quarterly Report until after the report was due. On April 25, 2022, ten days after the report was due, RAD contacted the Candidate regarding the RTB finding in AF# 4289. During the discussion, the RAD Analyst also encouraged the Committee to file the April Quarterly Report. RAD provided guidance on that day and additional technical assistance on April 26, April 27, April 29, and May 6, 2022. On May 8, 2022, the Committee filed the 2022 April Quarterly Report, 23 days late.

Their challenge to AF# 4302 fails to address any of the three valid grounds at 11 C.F.R § 111.35(b). These are: (i) the RTB finding is based on factual errors; and/or (ii) the improper calculation of the civil money penalty; and/or (iii) they used best efforts to file on time but were prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond their control and they filed the report no later than 24 hours after the end of these circumstances. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d). The Reviewing Officer concludes that the Commission followed its normal business practices and adequately responded to the Committee's requests for filing assistance. Failure to use filing software properly and inexperience of a treasurer or committee staff are specifically included at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d) as examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond the respondents' control. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination in AF# 4302 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$212 civil money penalty.

OAR Recommendations

- 1. Terminate the proceedings in AF# 4289 that Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and close the file;
- 2. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4302 involving Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 3. Make a final determination in AF# 4302 that Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$212 civil money penalty; and
- 4. Send the appropriate letters.

On April 13, 2022, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Jerry Ford for Texas and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2022 Pre-Primary Report. The Commission also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$2,093 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On June 13, 2022, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Jerry Ford for Texas and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. The Commission also made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$212 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43.

After reviewing your written response and any supplemental information submitted by you and Commission staff, the Reviewing Officer has recommended that the Commission terminate the proceedings and close the file in AF# 4289 and make a final determination and assess a civil money penalty in AF# 4302. On April 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 Texas Pre-Primary Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$2,093 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason RTB that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$212 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On May 23 and June 27, 2022, respectively, the Commission received their written responses ("challenges").

In both challenges, the Candidate referred to technical issues which prevented the Committee from timely filing the 2022 Pre-Primary and April Quarterly Reports. The Reviewing Officer concluded the technical issues were attributed to inexperience with FECFile and reporting requirements, and issues with the Candidate's computer. See ROR. The Reviewing Officer noted that both challenges failed to address any of the three valid grounds at 11 C.F.R § 111.35(b). These are: (i) the RTB finding is based on factual errors; and/or (ii) the improper calculation of the civil money penalty; and/or (iii) they used best efforts to file on time but were prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond their control and they filed the report no later than 24 hours after the end of these circumstances. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d). Moreover, failure to use filing software properly and inexperience of a treasurer or committee staff are specifically included at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d) as examples of

circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond the respondents' control.

The Candidate also generally referred to multiple attempts to contact the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") for assistance for which he received no response. In AF# 4289, the Reviewing Officer recognized that the Candidate's February 18, 2022 request for assistance was not handled in accordance with the Commission's normal business practices. If the Candidate had received assistance when originally requested on February 18, 2022, the Committee may have been able to the file the 2022 Pre-Primary Report that same day. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission terminate the proceedings in AF# 4289 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.37(b) and close the file. In AF# 4302, the Reviewing Officer concluded that the Commission followed its normal business practices and adequately responded to the Committee's requests for filing assistance. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination in AF# 4302 that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$212 civil money penalty. See ROR.

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, the respondents may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). The respondents subsequently indicated their intent to terminate and pay the recommended civil money penalty of \$212. On September 12, 2022, the RAD Analyst assisted the Committee with filing a termination report. *See* Attachment 1. The Committee is now eligible to terminate upon closure of these matters.

OAR Recommendations

- 1. Terminate the proceedings in AF# 4289 that Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and close the file;
- 2. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4302 involving Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 3. Make a final determination in AF# 4302 that Jerry Ford for Texas and Mrs. Sandra Marie Ford, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$212 civil money penalty; and
- 4. Send the appropriate letters.

On April 13, 2022, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Jerry Ford for Texas and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 12-Day Pre-Primary Report. By letter dated April 14, 2022, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at \$2,093 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On May 23, 2022, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission's RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission terminate the proceedings and close the file. The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on July 25, 2022.
