SUBJECT: Reason To Believe Recommendation – 2022 April Quarterly Report for the

Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The April Quarterly was due on April 15, 2022.

The committees listed in the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report, filed the report no more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a late filed report), or filed the report more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a non-filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

#### Recommendation

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a

preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.

2. Send the appropriate letters.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. Id. If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Friends of Chris Theodore and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. #### 4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

#### 5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

# REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW ("OAR")

AF# 4297 – Friends of Chris Theodore and Christopher Mark Theodore, in their official capacity as Treasurer (C00776633)

#### **Summary of Recommendation**

Make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty.

#### **Reason-to-Believe Background**

The 2022 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 2022. The respondents filed the report on April 28, 2022, 13 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered late. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1).

On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$5,190 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter was sent to the respondents' email address of record from RAD on June 15, 2022 to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

#### **Legal Requirements**

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") states that the treasurer of a principal campaign committee shall file a quarterly report for the period ending March 30 no later than April 15. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(a). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

#### **Summary of Respondents' Challenge**

On July 20, 2022, the Commission received the written response ("challenge") from the Candidate who also serves as Treasurer. He notes the Committee's pattern of compliance and requests the Commission's consideration. He explains that in March and April 2022,

During these events, I served as her primary care giver. These were emotional, scary days and her pain levels were very high. If you have ever been in a situation in which your spouse's life is on the line, you will understand why my report was late and my focus entirely on her. As soon as her condition stabilized, I filed the necessary paperwork and report.

#### **Analysis**

The Candidate, who also serves as the Committee's Treasurer, explains the 2022 April Quarterly Report was not timely filed because his wife experienced health complications prior to the April 15, 2022 filing deadline. The Reviewing Officer is sympathetic to the circumstances presented and recognizes these circumstances may have impacted Committee operations. However, a committee's treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d). Moreover, unavailability of the treasurer is specifically included at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d) as an example of a circumstance that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond the respondents' control. Therefore, a "best efforts" defense does not succeed in this matter.

The "best efforts" defense is a two-part test: the respondents used best efforts to file on time but were prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond their control, and they filed the report no later than 24 hours after the end of these circumstances. The Commission states in its *Explanation and Justification for Revised 11 CFR § 111.35(b)(3)* – "Best Efforts" Defense, 72 Fed. Reg. 14662, 14664-14666 (Mar. 29, 2007) that respondents must show

...that the reasonably unforeseen circumstances in fact *prevented* the timely and proper filing of the required report...[T]his rule requires a strict causal relationship between the circumstances described in the challenge...and the respondent's inability to file the report timely. It is not sufficient for reasonably unforeseen circumstances to make it merely more difficult than usual for the respondent to file on time. The circumstance must cause the respondent to be *unable* to file in a timely and proper manner, despite the respondent attempting to use all available methods of filing. (emphasis included)

The circumstances presented do not qualify as a "best efforts" defense because unavailability of the treasurer is specifically included at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d) as an example of a circumstance that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond the respondents' control. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty.

#### **OAR Recommendations**

- 1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4297 involving Friends of Chris Theodore and Christopher Mark Theodore, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 2. Make a final determination in AF# 4297 that Friends of Chris Theodore and Christopher Mark Theodore, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty; and
- 3. Send the appropriate letter.

On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$5,190 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On July 20, 2022, the Commission received their written response ("challenge"). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer Recommendation ("ROR") dated September 15, 2022 was forwarded to the Commission, a copy was forwarded to the respondents, and is hereby incorporated by reference.

The Candidate, who also serves as Treasurer, explained the 2022 April Quarterly Report was not timely filed because his wife was seriously ill, and he was serving as her primary caregiver. While sympathetic to their circumstances, the Reviewing Officer determined that the circumstances presented did not qualify as a "best efforts" defense because unavailability of the treasurer is specifically included at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d) as an example of a circumstance that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond the respondents' control. Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty.

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, the respondents may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their

challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). On September 20, 2022, the Candidate requested more information, including legal interpretation and the Commission's precedent in similarly situated matters. *See* Attachment 1, pages 3-4. After consultation with the Commission's Office of the General Counsel, the Reviewing Officer provided the following response:

No step or process in the administrative fines program regulations authorizes the Commission to provide a respondent information or research on the legal interpretation of an issue in the respondent's preparation of a formal response to a ROR. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.30-111.46. Given the regulatory provisions, and the posture of the respondent and Commission staff in this matter, it would be inappropriate for me, as the Reviewing Officer, to conduct or provide research on your questions, nor would it be appropriate for me to provide any legal interpretation of specific facts posed by you. I encourage you to provide your best response to the ROR. This part of the review process is found in 11 C.F.R. § 111.35, and the administrative review process is generally located in 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.30-111.46 (links to eRegulations available at the bottom of FEC Legal | Administrative fines).

You will be provided an additional 10 days to respond to the ROR. Your response must be received by October 13, 2022. Attachment 1, page 2.

On October 13, 2022, the Candidate provided a preliminary response to the ROR and requested an additional 10 days to fully respond. The Reviewing Officer advised the Candidate to submit a formal response by October 24, 2022. Further, if a formal response was not received by that date, the Candidate's October 13, 2022 response would serve as the Committee's formal response. *See* Attachment 1, pages 1-2. To date, the Commission has not received another response.

The Reviewing Officer considered the Candidate's October 13, 2022 response, in which he suggests "...life-threatening medical emergency circumstances are more akin to a disaster than circumstances that merely cause unavailability." While sympathetic to the circumstances presented, the Reviewing Officer's analysis and recommendations are unchanged. The Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty.

#### **OAR Recommendations**

- 1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4297 involving Friends of Chris Theodore and Christopher Mark Theodore, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 2. Make a final determination in AF# 4297 that Friends of Chris Theodore and Christopher Mark Theodore, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$5,190 civil money penalty; and
- 3. Send the appropriate letter.

#### Dear Christopher Mark Theodore:

On June 13, 2022, the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Friends of Chris Theodore and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. By letter dated June 15, 2022, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at \$5,190 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On July 20, 2022, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission's RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that Friends of Chris Theodore and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assess a civil money penalty in the amount of \$5,190 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on September 16, 2022.

On January 11, 2023, the Commission adopted the Reviewing Officer's recommendation and made a final determination that Friends of Chris Theodore and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$5,190. A copy of the Final Determination Recommendation is attached.

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

#### 1. If You Choose to Appeal the Final Determination and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you choose to appeal the final determination, you must submit a written petition requesting that the final determination be modified or set aside. This request must be made within

thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter and sent to the U.S. District Court for the district in which the committee or you reside or transact business. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(C)(iii). If you did not timely raise a factual argument in a challenge to the Commission's RTB finding, your right to present such an argument in an appeal to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109 shall be deemed waived. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

#### 2. If You Choose to Not Pay the Civil Money Penalty and to Not Appeal

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 ("DCIA"), 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. If you do not pay this debt within thirty (30) days and do not appeal the Commission's final determination to the U.S. District Court (see above), the Commission will transfer the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") for collection. Treasury will contact you to request payment within five (5) days of the receiving the debt. Treasury currently charges a fee of 30% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. If the age of the debt is greater than or equal to two years old, Treasury will charge a fee of 32% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. The fee will be added to the amount of the civil money penalty that you owe. Should Treasury's attempts fail, Treasury will refer the debt to a private collection agency. If the debt remains unpaid, Treasury may recommend that the Commission refer the matter to the Department of Justice for litigation.

Actions which may be taken by Treasury to enforce recovery of a delinquent debt may also include: (1) offset of any payments, which the debtor is due, including tax refunds and salary; (2) referral of the debt to agency counsel for litigation; (3) reporting of the debt to a credit bureau; (4) administrative wage garnishment; and (5) reporting of the debt, if discharged, to the IRS as potential taxable income. In addition, under the provisions of DCIA and other statutes applicable to the FEC, the debtor may be subject to the assessment of other statutory interest, penalties, and administrative costs.

In accordance with the DCIA, at your request, the agency will offer you the opportunity to inspect and copy records relating to the debt, the opportunity for a review of the debt, and the opportunity to enter into a written repayment agreement.

#### 3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the civil money penalty, please follow the payment instructions below. You should make payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter.

You may remit payment by Automated Clearinghouse ("ACH") withdrawal from your bank account, or by debit or credit card through Pay.gov, the federal government's secure portal for online collections. Visit <a href="www.fec.gov/af/pay.shtml">www.fec.gov/af/pay.shtml</a> to be directed to Pay.gov's Administrative Fine Program Payment form. Please use the details above to complete the required fields.

#### NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

#### **Partial Payments**

If you make a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination.

#### **Settlement Offers**

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission will be rejected. This includes a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within thirty (30) days from the date of this notification.
