Administrative Fine Program

Attached is a list of political committees and their treasurers who failed to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report in accordance with 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). The April Quarterly was due on April 15, 2022.

The committees listed in the attached RTB Circulation Report either failed to file the report, filed the report no more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a late filed report), or filed the report more than thirty (30) days after the due date (considered a non-filed report). In accordance with the schedule of civil money penalties for reports at 11 C.F.R. 111.43, these committees should be assessed the civil money penalties highlighted on the attached circulation report.

Recommendation

1. Find reason to believe that the political committees and their treasurers, in their official capacity, listed on the RTB Circulation Report violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and make a

preliminary determination that the civil money penalties would be the amounts indicated on the RTB Circulation Report.

2. Send the appropriate letters.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"), requires that your committee file an April Quarterly Report of Receipts and Disbursements in a calendar year during which there is a regularly scheduled election. This report, covering the period January 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022, shall be filed no later than April 15, 2022. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). Because records at the Federal Election Commission ("FEC") indicate that you did not file this report within thirty (30) days of the due date, the report is considered not filed for the purpose of calculating the civil money penalty.

The Act permits the FEC to impose civil money penalties for violations of the reporting requirements of 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a). 52 U.S.C. § 30109g(a)(4). Your response must include the AF# (found at the top of page 1 under your committee's identification number) and be received within forty (40) days of the Commission's RTB finding, or July 23, 2022. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(a). Your written response must include the reason(s) why you are challenging the RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty and must include the factual basis supporting the reason(s) and supporting documentation. The FEC strongly encourages that documents be submitted in the form of affidavits or declarations. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(c).

Please note, all challenges to an RTB finding and/or calculated civil money penalty be converted **PDF** (Portable Document Format) and emailed to should administrativefines@fec.gov. The Commission encourages the use signatures on electronically submitted documents, but scanned copies of ink signatures will be accepted. Electronically submitted challenges will be deemed received on the date they are electronically received by staff.

The FEC will only consider challenges that are based on at least one of three grounds: (1) a factual error in the RTB finding; (2) miscalculation of the calculated civil money penalty by the FEC; or (3) your demonstrated use of best efforts to file in a timely manner when prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond your control. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). For a challenge to be considered on the basis of best efforts, you must have filed the required report no later than 24 hours after the end of these reasonably unforeseen circumstances. Id. Examples of circumstances that will be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) a failure of Commission computers or Commission-provided software despite your seeking technical assistance from Commission personnel and resources; (2) a widespread disruption of information transmissions over the Internet that is not caused by a failure of the Commission's or your computer systems or Internet service provider; and (3) severe weather or other disaster-related incident. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(c). Examples of circumstances that will not be considered reasonably unforeseen and beyond your control include, but are not limited to: (1) negligence; (2) delays caused by vendors or contractors; (3) treasurer and staff illness, inexperience or unavailability; (4) committee computer, software, or Internet service provider failures; (5) failure to know filing dates; and (6) failure to use filing software properly. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(d).

The "failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver" of your right to present such argument in a petition to the U.S. District Court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 C.F.R. § 111.38.

If you intend to be represented by counsel, please advise the Office of Administrative Review. You should provide, in writing, the name, address, and telephone number of your counsel and authorize counsel to receive notifications and communications relating to this challenge and imposition of the calculated civil money penalty.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Submit a Challenge

If you do not pay the calculated civil money penalty and do not submit a written response, the FEC will assume that the preceding factual allegations are true and make a final determination that Galveston County Republican Party and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a civil money penalty.

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA"), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. The FEC may take any and all appropriate action authorized and required by the DCA, as amended, including transfer to the U.S. Department of the Treasury for collection. 11 C.F.R. § 111.51(a)(2).

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the calculated civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. Upon receipt of your payment, the FEC will send you a final determination letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the calculated civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assesses upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The Galveston County Republican Party, (GCRP) is in receipt of the referenced letter and challenges the findings and assessed penalties.

In March 2022, we reviewed the **INSTRUCTION FOR FEC FORM 3X AND RELATED SCHEDULES** and determined that the GCRP would not have revenue or expenses in the first quarter of 2022 exceeding \$12,500. Therefore, in accordance with **Who Must File** we determined that we were not required to submit a report for the first quarter. On April 14, 2022, we reviewed that section again and came to the same conclusion.

On May 11, 2022, I received an email advising that we should have submitted the quarterly report by April 15th and were therefore delinquent. I called Analyst, Kevin Fortkiewicz and explained our rationale for not submitting a report. Mr. Fortkiewicz replied that the minimum cutoff of \$12,500 was only for nonelection years and requested our report. I could not find the reference to nonelection years but agreed to submit the report.

Preparing the report in May, made it automatically delinquent, but after several attempts to use the FEC software to upload the document, it was submitted on May 27, 2023.

The GCRP has used its best efforts to comply with the FEC and Texas Ethics Commission reporting requirements. I therefore request that the FEC waive the accessed penalties.

REVIEWING OFFICER RECOMMENDATION OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW ("OAR")

AF# 4299 – Galveston County Republican Party and William Cline Hoffman, in their official capacity as Treasurer (C00764159)

Summary of Recommendation

Make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$448 civil money penalty.

Reason-to-Believe Background

The 2022 April Quarterly Report was due on April 15, 2022. The respondents filed the report on May 27, 2022, 42 days late. The report is not election sensitive and was not filed within 30 days of the due date; therefore, the report is considered not filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.43(d)(1) and (e)(1).

On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$448 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. A letter was sent to the respondents' email address of record from the Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") on June 15, 2022 to notify them of the Commission's RTB finding and civil money penalty.

Legal Requirements

The Federal Election Campaign Act ("Act") states that the treasurer of a political committee not authorized by a candidate which is filing on a quarterly basis shall file, in an election year, a report for the period ending March 31 no later than April 15. 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(c). Reports electronically filed must be received and validated at or before 11:59 pm Eastern Standard/Daylight Time on the filing deadline to be timely filed. 11 C.F.R. §§ 100.19(c) and 104.5(e). The treasurer shall be personally responsible for the timely filing of reports. 11 C.F.R. § 104.14(d).

Summary of Respondents' Challenge

On June 29, 2022, the Commission received the written response ("challenge") from the respondents explaining, in part:

In March 2022, we reviewed the INSTRUCTION FOR FEC FORM 3X AND RELATED SCHEDULES and determined that the GCRP would not have revenue or expenses in the first quarter of 2022 exceeding \$12,500. Therefore, in accordance with Who Must File we determined that we were not required to submit a report for the first quarter. On April 14, 2022, we reviewed that section again and came to the same conclusion.

After receiving a notification from the FEC on May 11, 2022, the Committee called the RAD Analyst to explain the Committee's rationale for not filing the report. The RAD Analyst explained that the \$12,500 threshold did not apply in non-election years and confirmed the Committee's requirement to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. The Committee filed the report on May 27, 2022.

The Committee states that it has used its best efforts to comply with federal and state reporting requirements and requests that the penalty be waived.

Analysis

The respondents state they did not file the 2022 April Quarterly Report based on their interpretation of the Commission's *Instructions for FEC Form 3X and Related Schedules* ("*Instructions*"). The Committee believed that it was not required to file the report because it did not have revenue or expenses exceeding \$12,500 for the first quarter.

The Reviewing Officer notes that the referenced \$12,500 threshold only applies to a committee's requirement to file *in an electronic format*. 11 C.F.R. § 104.18(a)(3)(ii). The *Instructions* state, in part:

A political committee is considered to have reason to expect it will exceed the electronic filing threshold for the next two calendar years after the calendar year in which it exceeds \$50,000 in contributions or expenditures. If it is a new committee, it is considered to have reason to expect it will exceed the electronic filing threshold if it exceeds \$12,500 in contributions or expenditures during the first calendar quarter of the calendar year, or \$25,000 in contributions or expenditures in the first half of the calendar year. (emphasis added)

The Reviewing Officer confirms that all political committees registered with the FEC must file regular reports, regardless of activity. In election years, political party committees must file at least quarterly. 11 C.F.R. § 104.5(c)(1). A committee's obligation to file regular financial disclosure reports continues until the committee requests to terminate and that request is approved

by the FEC. 11 C.F.R. § 102.3. Therefore, the Committee was required to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. ²

The challenge fails to adequately address any of the three valid grounds at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). These are: (i) the RTB finding is based on factual errors; and/or (ii) the improper calculation of the civil money penalty; and/or (iii) they used best efforts to file on time but were prevented from doing so by reasonably unforeseen circumstances that were beyond their control and they filed the report no later than 24 hours after the end of these circumstances. 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). The Reviewing Officer recommends that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$448 civil money penalty.

OAR Recommendations

- 1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4299 involving Galveston County Republican Party and William Cline Hoffman, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 2. Make a final determination in AF# 4299 that Galveston County Republican Party and William Cline Hoffman, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$448 civil money penalty; and
- 3. Send the appropriate letter.

On June 13, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe ("RTB") that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to timely file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and made a preliminary determination that the civil money penalty was \$448 based on the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On June 29, 2022, the Commission received their written response ("challenge"). After reviewing the challenge, the Reviewing Officer Recommendation ("ROR") dated August 25, 2022 was forwarded to the Commission, a copy was forwarded to the respondents, and is hereby incorporated by reference. The Reviewing Officer confirmed that the Committee was required to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report and noted that the challenge failed to adequately address any of the three valid grounds at 11 C.F.R. § 111.35(b). Therefore, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that the respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$448 civil money penalty.

Within 10 days of transmittal of the recommendation, the respondents may file a written response with the Commission Secretary which may not raise any arguments not raised in their challenge or not directly responsive to the ROR. 11 C.F.R. § 111.36(f). The Committee filed a response indicating their intent to pay the recommended civil money penalty. *See* Attachment 1.

OAR Recommendations

- 1. Adopt the Reviewing Officer recommendation for AF# 4299 involving Galveston County Republican Party and William Cline Hoffman, in their official capacity as Treasurer, in making the final determination;
- 2. Make a final determination in AF# 4299 that Galveston County Republican Party and William Cline Hoffman, in their official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assess a \$448 civil money penalty; and

On June 13, 2022, the Federal Election Commission ("the Commission") found reason to believe ("RTB") that Galveston County Republican Party and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) for failing to file the 2022 April Quarterly Report. By letter dated June 15, 2022, the Commission sent notification of the RTB finding that included a civil money penalty calculated at \$448 in accordance with the schedule of penalties at 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. On June 29, 2022, the Office of Administrative Review received your written response challenging the RTB finding.

The Reviewing Officer reviewed the Commission's RTB finding with its supporting documentation and your written response. Based on this review, the Reviewing Officer recommended that the Commission make a final determination that Galveston County Republican Party and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assess a civil money penalty in the amount of \$448 in accordance with 11 C.F.R. § 111.43. The Reviewing Officer Recommendation was sent to you on August 25, 2022.

On December 1, 2022, the Commission adopted the Reviewing Officer's recommendation and made a final determination that Galveston County Republican Party and you, in your official capacity as Treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed a civil money penalty in the amount of \$448. A copy of the Final Determination Recommendation is attached.

At this juncture, the following courses of action are available to you:

1. If You Choose to Appeal the Final Determination and/or Civil Money Penalty

If you choose to appeal the final determination, you should submit a written petition, within 30 days of receipt of this letter, to the U.S. District Court for the district in which the committee or you reside, or transact business, requesting that the final determination be modified or set aside. See 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(4)(C)(iii). Your failure to raise an argument in a timely fashion during

the administrative process shall be deemed a waiver of the respondents' right to present such argument in a petition to the district court under 52 U.S.C. § 30109. 11 CFR § 111.38.

2. If You Choose Not to Pay the Civil Money Penalty and Not to Appeal

Unpaid civil money penalties assessed through the Administrative Fine regulations will be subject to the Debt Collection Act of 1982 ("DCA") as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 ("DCIA"), 31 U.S.C. § 3701, et seq. If you do not pay this debt within 30 days (or file a written petition to a federal district court - see below), the Commission will transfer the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") for collection. Within 5 days of the transfer to Treasury, Treasury will contact you to request payment. Treasury currently charges a fee of 30% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. If the age of the debt is greater than or equal to two years old, Treasury will charge a fee of 32% of the civil money penalty amount for its collection services. The fee will be added to the amount of the civil money penalty that you owe. Should Treasury's attempts fail, Treasury will refer the debt to a private collection agency ("PCA"). If the debt remains unpaid, Treasury may recommend that the Commission refer the matter to the Department of Justice for litigation.

Actions which may be taken to enforce recovery of a delinquent debt by Treasury may also include: (1) offset of any payments that the debtor is due, including tax refunds and salary; (2) referral of the debt to agency counsel for litigation; (3) reporting of the debt to a credit bureau; (4) administrative wage garnishment; and (5) reporting of the debt, if discharged, to the IRS as potential taxable income. In addition, under the provisions of DCIA and other statutes applicable to the FEC, the debtor may be subject to the assessment of other statutory interest, penalties, and administrative costs.

In accordance with the DCIA, at your request, the agency will offer you the opportunity to inspect and copy records relating to the debt, the opportunity for a review of the debt, and the opportunity to enter into a written repayment agreement.

3. If You Choose to Pay the Civil Money Penalty

If you should decide to pay the civil money penalty, follow the payment instructions on page 4 of this letter. You should make payment within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter.

NOTICE REGARDING PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND SETTLEMENT OFFERS

4. Partial Payments

If you make a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty, the amount of your partial payment will be credited towards the full civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination.

5. Settlement Offers

Any offer to settle or compromise a debt owed to the Commission, including a payment in an amount less than the civil money penalty assessed or any restrictive endorsements contained on your check or money order or proposed in correspondence transmitted with your check or money order, will be rejected. Acceptance and deposit or cashing of such a restricted payment does not constitute acceptance of the settlement offer. Payments containing restrictive endorsements will

be deposited and treated as a partial payment towards the civil money penalty that the Commission assessed upon making a final determination. All unpaid civil money penalty amounts remaining will be subject to the debt collection procedures set forth in Section 2, above.

The confidentiality provisions at 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12) no longer apply and this matter is now public. Pursuant to 11 C.F.R. §§ 111.42(b) and 111.20(c), the file will be placed on the public record within 30 days from the date of this notification.
