Re: Complaint

Dear Mr. Thomas:

I am filing this complaint against the Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion, Inc., the Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion PAC, Polly Rothstein, its Director, and against a Federal PAC called PROCHOICE VOTER for gross and substantial violations of the Federal Elections Law committed in the 1998 Federal Election cycle for the US Senate in New York, as well as for Congressional races in the 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th Congressional Districts in New York, or any Federal races they are found to have participated in.

In support of this complaint, the following information is enclosed:

1. Pro-Choice, Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion-PAC 1998 Voting Guide;
2. Copy of telephone call from WCLA to my residence;
3. Copy of Newspaper article indicating endorsements;
4. Copy of WCLA-PAC campaign finance statement pages for the past year;
5. Copy of PROCHOICE VOTER (Committee ID#C00202804) campaign finance statements for 1999 procured from the FEC WebSite.

THE COMPLAINT

The Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion, Inc., is a New York State Non-for-Profit Corporation, incorporated in New York State on July 23, 1990 according to a call to the NYS Secretary of State's office. As of this writing, I do not know if they have qualified for tax exempt status. Hereinafter the Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion, Inc. shall be referred to as WCLA.

WCLA has long been active in elections, including the 1998 elections. The circulation of the Voting Guide according to their own admission at page (2) of the Voting Guide is 72,000 copies. The Voting Guide is sent out using a Non-Profit Organization Permit from the Postal Service. It is interesting to note that the WCLA refers to themselves as a Charity (see Page 3). A check with the New York State Attorney General's office confirms that WCLA has not registered as a Charity.

References to Federal Elections or Federal legislation appear on the inside cover, pages 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14.

Each year, WCLA operates a telephone bank. The purpose of this phone bank, as evidenced by the taped message included with this complaint, is to urge the election of candidates that support the extreme Pro-Choice views of the WCLA, rather than the more mainstream and tolerant pro-choice views. This year, according to my personal knowledge, calls were made in support of Chuck Schumer, and against Al D'Amato. WCLA's director, Polly Rothstein, in late September held a press conference supporting Chuck Schumer, in front of the Westchester County Courthouse. Upon information and belief, calls were made in Congressional races affecting Westchester County.

**THERE IS NO REFERENCE IN ANY OF THE ABOVE MATERIALS THAT WCLA IS ACTING OR HOLDS THEMSELVES OUT AS A DULY REGISTERED FEDERAL POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE, OR ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL ELECTION LAWS, IN FACT IT IS APPARENTLY IN GROSS VIOLATION OF THE LAW.**

In response to the telephone message left on my tape, I requested that Polly Rothstein call me to discuss references to NYS Attorney General Dennis Vacco having been reprimanded for incompetence. Having served on the Westchester County Fair Campaign Practice Committee, I was offended by the attack of a personal nature. When Polly Rothstein returned my call, a discussion between us took place. She indicated that WCLA is registered as a Federal PAC, under some other name - a name that bears no resemblance to WCLA. A search of the FEC Web Site indicates that the PAC is PROCHOICE VOTER.


When I asked Polly about the source of funds for WCLA's political activity, since they were participating in Federal elections, she unequivocally stated that WCLA received and had received no corporate funds. You can imagine my shock when I pulled the WCLA PAC state campaign finance filings and discovered that Polly lied. There in the reports is proof that corporate contributions are accepted by WCLA (see 1997 report). I note for the record that WCLA, Inc. itself is a corporation.

There is no indication how the Voting Guide is paid for. Presumably, contributions are funneled through the WCLA, but not listed as political contributions. Political contributions are sought for WCLA, not for WCLA-PAC (See page 17 of Voting Guide). In fact, a review of the State PAC statements list very few expenditures. The 11/20/98 to 11/26/98 filing indicates that payments were made to Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion for \$7,028 for phone payrolls, and \$7,835.77 for phone bills. How is this allocation decided upon? The phone calls made as attested to by the telephone message was 50% for a Federal candidate, yet I was shocked again when I found that no Qualified Federal funds were used in this effort, according to the FEC filing for PROCHOICE VOTER, which lists no expenditures for phone calls or payroll, only \$526.69 in receipts and no disbursements for the entire year.

How can thousands of calls be made for Federal elections, impact those elections, use corporate money, and not be subject to reporting? Ms. Rothstein cannot be allowed to operate outside of the law with impunity.

It is apparent that an FEC investigation is merited to rectify the apparent gross violations of Federal Election Laws, and to ensure that the appropriate campaign finance laws are complied with. If anything additional is required, please do not hesitate to contact me.



## Statewide Offices Can Go Pro-Choice

### • Chuck Schumer vs. Al D'Amato: The Choice is Clear

This November Westchester Coalition for Legal Abortion will play an active role in replacing one of the leading opponents of choice in the US Senate Al D'Amato with a true champion of choice Chuck Schumer

The contrast between the two candidates is stark. Schumer and D'Amato were both elected to Congress in 1980. During that period Schumer has voted 100% pro-choice while D'Amato has voted nearly 100% against a woman's right to choose. Schumer wrote the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE) to protect women, doctors, and clinics from violence. D'Amato authored a constitutional amendment to overturn *Roe v. Wade*. Time and time again, Schumer and D'Amato have stood on opposite sides of this critical issue.

Schumer's FACE bill is a good example. Alarmed by the frightening and deadly rise of violence at reproductive health clinics across the nation, Schumer became determined to pass legislation that would afford doctors and their patients the freedom to access basic health care without running a gauntlet of

### • Spitzer Earns Pro-Choice Support; Vacco Degrades Department of Law

Eliot Spitzer won the four-way Democratic primary to challenge incumbent Attorney General Dennis Vacco, and has earned the support of pro-choice groups statewide for his flawless stance. He promises to support and enforce laws that protect a woman's right to choose and prosecute extremists who attempt to unlawfully interfere with that right.

After years devoted to prosecutorial and public interest law, Spitzer is well prepared for the role of Attorney General and will ensure that the office well serves all the people of New York.

Spitzer is a Phi Beta Kappa and honors graduate of Princeton University and an honors graduate of Harvard Law School, where he was an editor of the Harvard Law Review.

As Assistant District Attorney in Manhattan, Spitzer was Chief of the Labor Racketeering Unit from 1986 through 1992. Governor Cuomo appointed him to the position of Counsel to the NYS Commission for the Study of Youth Crime and Violence. In 1992, Spitzer founded the Center for the Community Interest, a non-profit public interest law center. In his role as an authority on

## For Governor, It's 'Awful' vs. 'Better'

WCLV has made an endorsement in the gubernatorial race, but has assessed the candidates because WCLV voters expect us to shed light on the top position in the state race in terms of the choice issue. Neither meet the criteria to be called "pro-choice" (though both make the claim). All things considered, however, Vailone would be better.

The governor is the most powerful person in the state with regard to abortion

and family planning. He proposes, signs and vetoes legislation. He has budget power and makes crucial appointments such as Commissioner of Health and high level judges. Peter Vailone would be better for women's reproductive choice than Pataki.

Vailone's running mate for Lt. Governor, Sandra Frankel, is unreservedly pro-choice. Pataki chose a partner, Mary Donohue, who is not

## Keep Your Eye on the Prize and VOTE

Even before the Starr Report, there was such public disgust with politicians and political fund-raising that pollsters were predicting a low turnout for the November elections. Please don't let your emotions keep you away from the polls. A low turnout by pro-choice voters could give religious conservatives just what they've been literally praying (and organizing) for — more strength in Congress.

Right-wing ideologues are thoroughly politicized and are considered "likely voters" by pollsters. Despite the GOP leadership's rush to put every graphic sexual detail of Clinton's escapade before the public, their goal isn't destroying Clinton as much as electing a veto-proof GOP right-wing anti-choice Senate majority — they already have one in the House — and the presidency in 2000. If conservatives own the White House as well as Congress, they'll be able to criminalize abortion. Our rights hinge on who goes to the polls. Nothing else counts.

If pro-choice voters come out in droves, they will decide whether the religious right's candidates win elections or whether pro-choice moderates and progressives get elected. We can swing this election if we don't take November 3 off.

Congress is already controlled by the religious right and its puppets. They are against family planning, abortion rights, gay rights, separation of church and state, environmental protection, a competent and independent judiciary, and protection of the poor and ill. A few more votes in the

## Loaded Terminology Hurts the Pro-Choice Cause

The anti-choice movement won a significant battle in the abortion war by insinuating their emotionally loaded and inaccurate terminology into the lexicon. WCLA isn't the first to point out that those who control the language frame the debate, which is one of the keys to winning it. Many anti-choice loaded terms are routinely used by the press.

The most frequent example is "pro-life" to describe abortion opponents. A 1992 letter to *The New York Times* said that the semanticist who coined the term "pro-life" was dealing in "very valuable currency indeed." Yale Law School librarian Fred Shapiro said, "The truth is that 'pro-life' is a clever slogan presenting a negative position in a positive light." We prefer the more accurate "abortion foes" or "anti-abortion advocates."

The made-up term "partial birth abortion" is also routinely used by the press. There is no acceptable substitute term for this non-existent medical procedure.

Another unfair usage is "mother" instead of "woman" when referring to a pregnant woman who is considering or having an abortion. Having children makes one a mother. Pregnancy does not.

Senate are very important to them. New York could make it more difficult by replacing Senator D'Amato with Chuck Schumer. It would be tragic for us to let the hard-right keep control of Congress or increase their margin in either house. The same goes for the New York State Legislature.

WCLA's yellow voting guide will be in your mailbox in late October; be sure to save it, copy it for friends, and carry it with you openly when you vote. *Above all, vote.*

## More on No-Shopping Gifts

In the last issue of *ProChoice*, we suggested an alternative to giving material gifts to people who don't need anything: make donations in-memory-of and in-honor-of people, especially young ones. A friend of ours has for three years been giving his 8-year-old \$50 at Christmastime to donate to the charity (or charities) of his choice. Another friend gives signed checks for specified amounts for the recipient to fill in "pay to the order of."

Raising funds is the most difficult part of WCLA's work. The competition is fierce. Most organizations rent lists from list brokers and hire consultants to produce attractive and expensive packets. WCLA writes its own materials and uses a list we compiled ourselves. We keep mailings to a minimum.

To reduce gift shopping and wrapping, try our do-good, no-shopping idea. And when you decide on a recipient, please think of WCLA, 237 Mamaroneck Ave., White Plains, N.Y. 10605.

Old news: maternal smoking and second-hand smoke harm fetuses. New research: the fetus actually processes the carcinogen. Yet, the fetus protectors are silent. The tobacco industry blames illness on smokers who should have known the dangers of smoking — but that can't apply to fetuses. Abortion foes fail to take on the tobacco industry because congressional anti-abortion leaders get big bucks from it.

Anti-abortionists push parental notification and parents' rights laws. But when the parents of an Illinois 12-year-old who was raped by her brother decided to help their daughter end the incestuous pregnancy, a prosecutor barged in with a court order to stop them. He just wanted "to make sure she wasn't being rushed out of town by parents who were embarrassed." The judge finally okayed the abortion at 29 weeks. Apparently anti-abortionists favor "parents' rights" only if it gives them a shot at stopping their daughter's abortion.

In his speech to the Christian Coalition, Sen. John Ashcroft snatched the catch-phrase "Vote your values" from the Women Leaders Online's website, [www.womenvote.org](http://www.womenvote.org). I don't think he meant the same values.

I do feel better.

## Local Elections Provide Few Races That Could Go Either Way How WCLA Researches Candidates' Positions

**W**CCLA has a reputation for accuracy in its voting guide and works hard to uphold its credibility. Determining candidates' positions is a time-consuming job, much like sleuthing in some cases.

Incumbents, of course, have a record on the issue. For all except Right to Life candidates, WCLA sends a questionnaire. WCLA follows up tardy candidates with calls - often many calls - seeking the document. When all else fails, WCLA sends a letter by certified mail, stating that failure to respond will result in their rating as opposing our position.

WCLA also reads media reports and follows-up questionable information on phoned reports by discussing the allegation with the candidate. WCLA also interviews candidates whenever it has questions or needs clarification. Regarding judicial candidates, WCLA interviews them within the guidelines of judicial ethics, and without seeking any commitment on how they'd rule in any case.

## Sue Kelly Votes Anti-Choice WCLA Endorses Collins

**D**ick Collins, a Democrat running for Congress in the 19th district against Sue Kelly, thinks of himself as a product of the American Dream, which he hopes will continue for all Americans. The district includes northern Westchester, Putnam, most of Dutchess, and a bit of Orange Counties.

Born in Vermont, he graduated from Dutchess Community College and then the State University of Utica/Rome, served in the Air Force, and for the past twenty years taught electronics at Green Haven Correctional Facility. He has been involved in union activities and politics and a member of the New York State Democratic Committee.

Collins is strongly pro-choice, commenting, "Having two daughters, I want to protect women's rights, not only their right to choose but to have them treated equally in the work force and at home." He told of college friends who were forced to have "back-room" abortions with, in one case, fatal consequences and in the other, sterility.

He would also focus on saving Social Security, improving medical treatment for veterans, creating jobs that increase the tax base without raising taxes, and protecting the environment.

### Whatever happened to Sue Kelly?

**I**n 1994 and 1996, WCLA supported Sue Kelly in Republican primaries in Congressional District 19. In 1996, WCLA co-endorsed Sue Kelly and her challenger. But once into her second term, Kelly has slipped into a mixed record on choice. On the crucial issue of so-called partial birth abortions, she switched sides and voted for the ban, and voted twice to override President Clinton's veto. She also voted for another religious right bill to make it a federal crime for anyone other than a parent or guardian to take a minor across state lines for an abortion to avoid parental involvement laws in the home state.

Deeply disappointed, WCLA president Polly Rothstein wrote to Sue Kelly in a letter that her turnaround had damaged WCLA's credibility as well as her own. The abortion ban matters because it aims at Roe v. Wade - attempting to force the Supreme Court to revisit that ruling. "You have lost the trust of pro-choice constituents," Rothstein wrote.

Kelly also voted in 1998 for a religious-right bill to permit school vouchers to pay for religious school tuition in Washington, DC.

## Paul Feiner Takes On Incumbent Ben Gilman

**B**en Gilman has represented the 20th CD for 16 years and has quite consistently voted pro-choice, including voting against the "Partial Birth Abortion Act." But in a 1997 written response to a constituent letter opposing the bill, he said that he opposed the bill because it lacked an exception for the "mother's" health. But he added, "I understand that the Supreme Court has interpreted 'health' in a broad manner, and I do not support those who perform abortions on women for psychological, financial or emotional reasons. However, I do support exceptions for a woman's physical health. In fact, an amendment was offered that outlined a very strict, narrowly defined exception for a woman's physical health. I supported this amendment, which was voted down." Gilman has voted for final versions of international family planning bills that contained anti-abortion language. WCLA's support for him in the 1998 elections is lukewarm, maintained in recognition of his years of voting pro-choice and his steadfast vote on the so-called "Partial Birth Abortion Act," qualified language notwithstanding.

Paul Feiner, on the other hand, is unequivocally pro-choice. From the age of 13, when he first entered politics, Feiner, first a county legislator and now Supervisor of the Town of Greenburgh, has stood by his principles on issue after issue. Known for his innovative ideas, Feiner led the campaign to open committee meetings of the Westchester County Board of Legislators to the public. This successful effort prompted Common Cause to name him one of six national recipients of their Public Service Achievement Award in 1982.

There are two other Westchester Congressional elections. Nita Lowey, the House pro-choice leader, has no Republican opponent.

# Womenvote: Online Guide to Voting Your Values

*ProChoice* readers get WCLA-PAC's yellow voting guide, but most American voters are left wondering where candidates really stand on the issues they care about

The Women's Voting Guide at [www.womenvote.org](http://www.womenvote.org) was created to let voters "Vote Your Values" by allowing you to compare your positions on key issues with those of the candidates who want your vote

The Women's Voting Guide is the creation of the Women Leaders Online Fund, a non-partisan group that is using the Internet to educate women about issues in politics, society, the economy, the media, and cyberspace

The site is quick and easy to use. First you enter your state and your congressional district (you can search by zip code

or the name of the incumbent). Then you check on items in a list of the most important votes cast by Congress since 1995. You press "Get Your Voting Guide" for a detailed and easy-to-read report, which compares your positions with those of the candidates.

If a candidate agrees with you on an issue, the candidate gets a bright blue check. Disagreement brings a bright red X. Candidates are listed side-by-side, for direct comparison on each issue. At the bottom of the report is a score from 0 to 100, representing the percentage of issues on which the candidate agrees with you.

The Women's Voting Guide is a fantastic tool for ordinary voters to cast informed votes. It puts information right at your fingertips -- and it's free! (Donations are gratefully accepted, of course.)

The Women's Voting Guide was founded by Antoma Stolper, a partner in a major New York law firm who has been politically active for 25 years. The bipartisan Founding Committee includes people like Victoria Reggie Kennedy and Sarah Brady. It does not accept money from any political party.

Ms. Stolper says she created the Women's Voting Guide to make it easier for women to participate in politics. "Voters used to get involved in campaigns because they cared about the issues," Stolper says. "But now campaigns are name-calling contests run by expensive hired guns. The Women's Voting Guide gives voters the information to participate in the political process as fully informed citizens, not merely as passive viewers of negative campaign ads."

effective family planning is the best way to reduce the number of abortions.

And D'Amato has consistently voted for anti-choice restrictions to federal budget bills, including measures to bar women in the armed services from using their own funds to obtain abortions in military hospitals overseas, prohibit federal employees from obtaining insurance with abortion coverage, and prevent the District of Columbia from using its own funds to provide abortion coverage for poor women. In each case Chuck Schumer stood

with women and for the right to choose.

The Christian Coalition has released its 1998 Voter Guide, in which legislators are rated on the percentage of votes in which they agreed with the coalition. D'Amato received 92 percent, and Schumer 0 percent.

This November the choice is clear. New Yorkers can elect Chuck Schumer -- a strong supporter of a woman's right to choose and an author of legislation to protect that right, or Al D'Amato -- an opponent of abortion rights, even in the case of rape and incest.

Eliot Engel, a Democrat whose record on choice is perfect, is expected to defeat his anti-choice opponent Peter Fiumefreddo.

## Supreme Court, County Court Seats to be Filled

Two NY Supreme Court seats are open. The Democrats have endorsed William J. Giacomo, a Port Chester attorney and town justice. They also named a former Orange County judge, William A. Glass. Giacomo and Glass are endorsed by WCLA. The Republican candidates are County Court judge John LaCava, a three-time Right to Life Party candidate. The other candidate is incumbent judge David Ritter, a Right to Life Party candidate for the second time. Turn to page 17 for a story on LaCava's egregious violation of judicial ethics.

Both candidates vying for County Court Judge, Democrat Les Adler of Scarsdale and Republican/Conservative Janet DiFiore of Bronxville have been endorsed by WCLA. Adler, a lawyer with 25 years of trial experience both in prosecution and defense has also been a Councilman in Greenburgh for the last 14 years. DiFiore, has been for the past five years County Chief of Narcotics in the District Attorney's office. She was twice appointed deputy village counsel in Bronxville.

## Matusow vs. LaMotte Spices State Races

Most hotly contested will be the race between three-term incumbent Naomi Matusow, whom WCLA has endorsed, and Ursula LaMotte.

True to longstanding precedent, WCLA endorses pro-choice incumbents who have been leaders on the choice issue over all challengers. Matusow certainly is a leader, especially on the restoration of family planning funds that Gov. Pataki has cut from the budget. She lobbies the speaker, organizes the Westchester delegation, leads the fight among colleagues, and makes a floor speech on the importance of

# Gary Bauer, President of the Family Research Council

For a reality check, tune into Gary Bauer's national radio address on any day and you will hear the Family Research

**"The Family Research Council believes that defunding Title X [America's family planning program] is the first step in removing the federal government's imprimatur on out-of-wedlock sex and to halt its role in distributing contraception to minors without parental consent... Title X's contraceptive approach does not protect... young girls... It only equips them for... abuse."**

Council (FRC) president deploring the scourge on society of public education, defense budget cuts and the National Endowment for the Arts. If James Dobson, Pat Robertson, and Pat Buchanan are the top bananas of right-wing conservatism, Gary Bauer is also high in the bunch. In some ways it is hard to tell the men apart.

Bauer, a Reagan administration official, longs for the 1980s when his former boss was rolling back the significant gains made for women and minorities. He openly declares that there should be

no wall of separation in church-state relations. "Religion is not only the ally of limited government," he says, "but a necessary condition for it to prosper." FRC is against sex education and has

made defunding Title X (America's family planning program) a priority. Another priority of his right-

wing agenda is stopping the "immoral homosexual lifestyle." Bauer and his Family Research Council are openly homophobic and hateful towards gays and lesbians. On FRC's web-site, one can read under the heading "homosexual culture" how AIDS receives too much funding. FRC devotes entire publications to exposing the "radical gay lobby."

The Family Research Council split from James Dobson's Focus on the Family in 1988 and now acts as its lobbying arm in Washington.

**"The sexual revolution promotes the idea that each individual has the license to do as he or she pleases with his or her own body, thereby elevating individual autonomy to the highest good. However, in the pursuit of this 'highest good,' sex reaps its most devastating consequences: AIDS, sexually transmitted diseases, out-of-wedlock pregnancy, illegitimacy, abortion, abandonment, rape, pedophilia, and sexual molestation, among others. And yet those who adhere to this philosophy of extreme individualism are unapologetic about the havoc that is wreaked as they attain the short-term (and short-sighted) benefit of momentary pleasure. They believe, then, that government, religious organizations, families and educators should have no say in their 'individual habits' because sex is purely a matter of choice."**

Bauer and Dobson can often be seen as a two-man tag-team, tackling the issues contributing to America's "moral decay" and injecting their "family values"

rhetoric into the mainstream. And they have the money and the clout to do it. FRC, like Focus on the Family, is a multi-million dollar organization with a staff of "experts" hailing from right-wing organizations such as the Eagle Forum and the Christian Coalition. Bauer also heads the Campaign for Working Families, a separate PAC that has raised millions more to advance his political agenda.

Naturally, abortion is at the top of their list of issues contributing to this moral decay. "I'm sick and tired of the political party that stands for death [Democrats] being bold and outspoken, while my party [Republican] appears to be afraid," Bauer says. "If we can't find someone to stand up for the sanctity of life... I'll do it myself." Bauer's presidential aspirations may be short lived, however, due to the rift he and Dobson have created with the Republican Party. The party, they complain, has not sufficiently followed through with their promised "pro-family," conservative congressional agenda. "We are the party," Bauer says. Their self-confidence and

arrogance could very well isolate them in the weeks before the November election. We'll know on November 4 just how much clout they really have.

# Using the Fetus as a Weapon Against Women

The assault on reproductive rights is relentless. The notion of "fetal rights" has given the opposition a new avenue to controlling women's lives. Punishing a woman for her behavior during pregnancy has become one of the biggest issues in reproductive law right now. At least 30 states have attempted prosecutions of women for conduct during their pregnancies.

## **Punish woman for possible effect on fetus**

In South Carolina and Wisconsin, drug use during pregnancy can result in punishment, including incarceration, rather than the early intervention and counseling that would promote maternal and child health. The real agenda is exposed in the law itself, which states "life begins at conception." Therefore, the pregnant woman and the fetus are separate and punishment of the woman for alleged harm to the fetus before birth is appropriate.

Christina Nifong, a staff writer for the *Christian Science Monitor*, reports: "The controversy began roughly a decade ago as a solution was sought for a tragic and costly public health problem: babies born with addictions to crack cocaine and other illegal drugs." Nationwide, there are an estimated 70,000 pregnant women annually who are also cocaine users, according to a federal survey. Those who pose the solution of legal action against pregnant women are ignoring the real needs of both the women and their babies.

Focusing on drug use may be hypocritical. Alcohol and tobacco do far more damage to far more fetuses than cocaine, marijuana, and heroin. Yet states won't deny pregnant women the right to use perfectly legal alcohol and tobacco. Perhaps advertising dollars have something to do with this.

Nifong speaks about one of today's major cases, Cornelia Whitner, "who admitted to smoking crack cocaine. But she was not charged for taking an illegal narcotic. Mrs. Whitner's crime is lighting up while pregnant - specifically, more than six months pregnant -- and in South Carolina. For that she is serving an eight-year prison sentence for child neglect, while her mother cares for her children.

## **Capital Punishment for Killing a Fetus**

South Carolina does it again. Its Supreme Court upheld the death sentence of a man who was convicted of killing his girlfriend and, because she was pregnant, also convicted of killing a fetus. "Now, the rights of unborn, viable children are firmly enshrined in South Carolina," said State Attorney General Charlie Condon.

The South Carolina Court upheld the death sentence of Joseph Ard for shooting his girlfriend, Madalyn Coffey, in 1993, when she was 8 1/2 months pregnant. The state Supreme Court in 1984 ruled that a fetus that was viable at the time of death is considered a "person" in murder cases. The prosecutor sought the death penalty under the state law that permits the death penalty for killing two or more people or killing a child 11 or younger.

Joseph Savitz, deputy chief attorney for the state Office of Appellate Defense, said the legislature had "not even thought about" the fetus issue when it amended the death penalty law in 1986. He said he fears that with the new ruling, "it will become politically popular for solicitors to seek the death penalty against women who have late-term abortions and anybody who aided and abetted." Attorney General Condon said such women wouldn't be prosecuted.

Whitner has become the focus of an unusual legal battle that could hold significance for the abortion debate. Can a woman be punished for her behavior while pregnant?"

New York Times columnist Bob Herbert cited another South Carolina case, that of Melissa Ann Crawley. "She smoked crack cocaine when she was pregnant in 1991. It doesn't matter that her son from that pregnancy is now 6 years old and quite healthy, or that Mrs. Crawley overcame her drug habit, obtained employment and has successfully been raising three children. Those kids are now with relatives and Mrs. Crawley is in prison." One of her lawyers, C. Rauch Wise, said "My frank opinion is that more harm is being done to those children by her being sent to jail than was ever remotely done to her 6-year-old by her cocaine use."

Herbert reports that health-care and social service officials in South Carolina are required by law to report women who take drugs, drink, or engage in other behavior that poses a risk to the fetus, or face criminal prosecution themselves. This is supposedly done to protect the fetus, but exactly the opposite is the result. Most health-care professionals and organizations, including the American Medical Association, the American Academy of

Pediatrics, and the March of Dimes, believe that holding out the threat of imprisonment is a wildly misguided approach. Pregnant women who are addicted to drugs and know that health-care officials are required by law to report them to authorities will, in many cases, refuse to seek prenatal care or drug abuse counseling.

Providing funds for early education, intervention, and treatment is the sensible and effective way to deal with this difficult problem. For the pregnant addict, however, there is little help. The American Medical Association has concluded that drug and alcohol treatment is often not an available option for a pregnant woman. Surveys have shown that most treatment programs either will not accept pregnant women or are inadequate for their needs.

## **The fight for control of the fetus**

The attempt to separate woman and fetus is an assault on the very essence of women. In *A Forum on Reproductive Laws For The 1990's*, Janet Gallagher says it all: "Society's relationship to the fetus must be mediated by the woman in whose body it is. Someone has to make decisions, and, given the geography of the situation, that person has to be the pregnant woman."

# Morning-After Pills Women Can Keep on Hand

**B**y the time you read this, Preven, the morning-after pills or emergency contraceptive pills (ECP) will be available in pharmacies throughout the nation.

In September the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved the first sales and marketing of ECPs that women can take up to 72 hours after unprotected sex to prevent pregnancy. Researchers from Princeton University's Office of Population Research estimate that ECP can halve the 300 million unplanned U.S. pregnancies each year.

Preven kits contain a pregnancy test, four high-dosage estrogen and progestin birth control pills, and a detailed patient information booklet. Greg Clements, vice president of Gynetics, Inc., the company producing the kits, called the FDA approval a breakthrough. "The opportunity for women to use this has been around for years, and only 1 percent of women use it," he said. "This makes it a much more viable contraceptive option." The kits were scheduled to be available by prescription by the end of September.

ECPs are not abortion in that they prevent a pregnancy from occurring. The pregnancy test is included in the kit because ECPs have no effect on established pregnancies. Different from the French abortion pill RU-486, the pills work by blocking or delaying ovulation. The hormone exposure also alters the lining of the uterus, which may have the additional effect of making the uterus incompatible with implantation of a fertilized egg. ECPs are 75 percent effective in preventing pregnancy. The most common side effects are nausea and vomiting, serious side effects have been rare.

In a 1997 Kaiser Family Foundation survey, the vast majority of physicians and midlevel practitioners responded that they considered emergency contraception treatment safe and effective. The foundation contends that the reason women have not been

using ECPs is that physicians have not been teaching their patients about it and therefore women don't know to ask for it.

University of Pennsylvania bioethicist Arthur Caplan offers another explanation. He asserts that Americans' inability to address sex and its consequences is why it has taken so long — far too long — to get a safe and effective form of emergency contraception into the hands of our wives, sisters and daughters. "He called the wait for FDA approval and for a company to make the product a tragedy that "has left American women without the best treatment that medicine has to offer."

In February of last year the FDA acknowledged that six brands of birth control pills were safe and effective as morning after pills. They published details about pills and dosages and invited manufacturers to apply for approval to re-label or reformulate birth control pills as emergency contraception. Until now, none did, apparently deterred by fears of political reprisals and litigation.

Anti-choice organizations are split on whether to condemn emergency contraception. The National Right to Life Committee has said that "it takes no position on drugs or devices that act to prevent fertilization." Dr. Carolyn Grester, past president of the NRLC, said, "Nobody dies with contraception." American Life League's Judie Brown, however, called the FDA approval a "political action" that has created "a shift from the abortion mill to the kitchen." The real reason for opposition to the drugs may be summed up in a recent editorial in the San Francisco Examiner: "Drugs like Preven," the editorial asserts, "give women autonomy over basic reproductive choices — and deny abortion opponents their vulnerable targets."

*The Washington Post* said that ECP "could ultimately join the ranks of smoking cessation products — like nicotine gum and the patches," which the FDA made available without a prescription "to increase their use."

## We Can Laugh About Viagra — Can't We?

*(Adapted from an Internet posting)*

What if we placed restrictions on Viagra similar to those placed on birth control and abortion for women? Consider these:

1. Viagra shall be used only for procreation
2. All minors must obtain parental permission
3. Prior to writing a prescription, a doctor (and only a doctor) must explain to the patient all the possible risks, including pregnancy and abortion, and alternatives, including celibacy. The doctor may not discuss benefits.
4. A 24-hour waiting period is required between the time the doctor writes a prescription and a pharmacy fills it.
5. Anyone taking an underage male across state lines to obtain Viagra will be prosecuted.
6. Viagra will not be dispensed at overseas military hospitals, even if soldiers pay for it themselves.
7. No Medicaid or Medicare funds may be used for Viagra.
8. International agencies receiving US funds may not provide, distribute information about, or lobby for the legality of Viagra.
9. Government employees' insurance will not cover Viagra.
10. Patients over the age of 70 must get a court order affirming that they understand the possible consequences of an erection.
11. The FDA is prohibited from conducting research on erectafacients.
12. Viagra used for masturbation is illegal except in a sperm bank.
13. Viagra may not be discussed in abstinence-only sex education classes.

# Activists Defeat Mid-Hudson Catholic-Secular Hospital Merger

A planned three-way hospital merger in the Mid-Hudson Valley fell apart in mid-July, after more than a year of escalating community protests against demands by the Catholic hospital that many reproductive health services be banned at the two secular hospitals.

A coalition of three grassroots groups, assisted by FPA'S MergerWatch project and Planned Parenthood of Mid-Hudson, besieged the hospitals with petitions, letters to the editor, newspaper advertisements, bumper stickers ("No religious hospital merger"), lawn signs ("People of all faiths use our hospitals"), demonstrations, rallies and even roadside billboards proclaiming "The hospital merger is taking us in the wrong direction."

Behind the scenes, the hospitals were consumed by a lengthy Federal Trade Commission investigation into the likely anti-competitive effects of the regional health care monopoly that would have been created by the merger. With the guidance of the National Women's Law Center and MergerWatch, the community coalition submitted to the FTC information demonstrating the likely harmful effects on consumers.

Under such intensive pressure, and suffering from a severe clash of their own corporate cultures, the two secular hospitals (Kingston and Northern Dutchess) called off their nearly-completed two-way merger, which had been presented as the first step toward the three-way religious merger.

"If we had not spoken up quickly and loudly, all three of our hospitals would have been married by now!" said Gale Wolfe of the Rhinebeck-based Save Our Services group. She praised the community's success at slowing down the three-way merger. Wolfe added, "Imagine the clash of cultures that would have

occurred in a merger of secular and religious hospitals"

While relieved at the news, the community activists immediately began working to ensure that Kingston Hospital does not independently pursue a merger with Benedictine Hospital that would involve accepting religious health care rules. The New York Archdiocese has insisted that any secular hospital merging with Benedictine must agree to ban contraception, abortions, sterilization, and infertility services.

"This community will remain vigilant and watch very closely what our hospitals do next," said Miriam Berg of the Ulster County Coalition for Choice. "We will remain strong as a community coalition working to ensure a health care system which respects everyone's beliefs and serves everyone's needs. Our work is far from over"

The coalition organized a public forum attended by 200 people in Kingston to address the question "The hospital merger: Where do we go from here?" Guest speaker Lois Uttley, MergerWatch project director, called on the hospitals to include consumers in any planning for future mergers. "Thousands of Mid-Hudson Valley residents have made it clear that consumers must be at the table in any future merger discussions, not left outside the door."

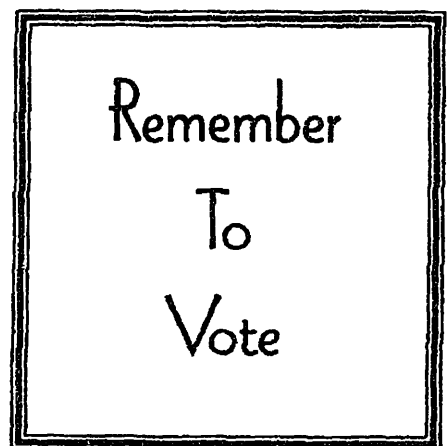
## Who Thinks Up This Stuff Anyway?

When I was a teenager in about 1940 I baby-sat the two children of a lovely young divorced woman named Helen. She had few employable skills, an exhausting, poorly paid job and her ex-husband only occasionally made child-support payments. Suddenly she died.

The children came to live with me and my family for a few weeks while custody was sorted out. The six-year-old curled up in my arms and talking about their mother's death, he said, "Momma just bled and bled and we couldn't help her."

## Judge LaCava Violates Judicial Ethics in Letter Seeking Right to Life Party Support

County Court judge and NYS Supreme Court candidate John LaCava has violated the Code of Judicial Conduct that could cost him his election.

The Code says that a candidate for judicial office:

- "should not make pledges or promises of conduct in office other than the faithful and impartial performance of the duties of the office; announced his views on disputed legal or political issues...."
- "may not discuss how he would decide a case that might come before him."
- "should not create the impression that the judge is not approaching the case as an 'open-minded' weigher of law and fact."

In a letter to the Right to Life Party seeking its endorsement, LaCava wrote, "My commitment to the sanctity of life from the moment of conception and my strong moral opposition to the source of abortion and the termination of the lives of millions of human beings in the womb has remained constant and unwavering. I am, of course, outraged by the continuation of the heinous and barbaric partial birth abortion procedure in this state.... In sum, as a committed pro-life candidate..."

For unrelated reasons, LaCava, a three-time RTL candidate, is not on the line this year. Nonetheless, he has made it clear that a party in an abortion case won't get fair or impartial treatment in his courtroom.

I was too young to guess what that might mean. Several years later my mother told me that Helen had died of a botched abortion attempt. She impressed upon me what a sorrowful and serious choice an abortion would be, but that it should be safe and legal because sometimes it was the best alternative.

The children were raised by their father, a sweet but irresponsible alcoholic, and a series of stepmothers. The girl had a terrible, tumultuous adolescence, but after several children and a broken marriage, is a stable, wonderful, middle-aged woman. The boy was killed in a gambling accident.

I think society would have been much better served if Helen could have had a safe, legal abortion and raised her two children herself.

## The Deceptive Practices of Crisis Pregnancy Centers

In the Yellow Pages, "Abortion Alternatives" appears before "Abortion Providers." If a Manhattan woman seeks an abortion provider in the yellow pages, she will first see an ad for "Pregnancy Help, Inc." The ad reads, "Pregnant? Need Help? Free Pregnancy Test." Although it appears that this group might perform abortions, it does not. This is typical of the deceptive advertising occurring across the nation.

Many "pregnancy help centers" use a handbook called How to Start and Operate a Pro-life Outreach Pregnancy Service Center, published in 1984 by the Pearson Foundation, a Catholic organization headquartered in St. Louis, Missouri. The sole purpose of these centers is to dissuade pregnant women from having abortions. They employ a carefully calculated subterfuge in their efforts, and claim an 87 percent success rate with the women who come to the centers. The 84-page handbook covers everything from choosing the right name for the center, to keeping a pregnant girl away from parental influence. Excerpts from the handbook.


