Dear Dr. Templeton:

I am writing as a follow-up to my letter of February 27, 2001 and subsequent phone calls regarding the letter you sent the Federal Election Commission concerning federal election campaign contributions you made during the 1999 and 2000 election cycle.

The purpose of the calls is to resolve matters raised as a result of the excess contributions you made during the aforementioned election period. According to the Commission's records, your contributions exceeded the limits specified in 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(3). It is our intention to engage you or your officially designated representative in discussions that will enable us to conclude this matter to our mutual satisfaction.

The ADR office's goal in all matters coming before it is to achieve a resolution of issues raised in cases, avoid engaging the enforcement mechanisms of the Office of General Counsel, and promote compliance with the federal election campaign act. Your letter of March 19, 2001 notes your desire to be in "compliance with the rules and regulations pertaining to federal donations" to federal elections. Our objective in bringing this matter to your attention is to assist you in that effort.

I look forward to hearing from you and expeditiously concluding this matter.
