Dear Dr. Templeton:

Thank you for your recent letter and clarification regarding your contributions to federal election campaigns during the 2000 election cycle. The information is helpful in correcting the record and allocating the appropriate contributions to you.

The adjustments to the record of your federal campaign contributions brings the total of your aggregate contributions during 2000 election cycle to below the \$25,000 limit. While those adjustments will address questions that may arise regarding violations of the FECA, there remains the need to definitively conclude this matter and for the Commission to reach closure on the case that was initiated with your letter of November 8, 2001. The enclosed agreement is designed to conclude our discussions of this matter and enable the Commission to officially close the file on this matter.

The advantage to the agreement is that it addresses the issues that arose during our extensive exchange of correspondence and resolves questions that may arise at a later date regarding your contributions to federal election campaigns. Since it intended to be a mutually achieved negotiated settlement, the enclosed document is intended as a draft subject to your review and concurrence.

The enclosed agreement is an appropriate conclusion to our extensive exchange of documents and records. It is the appropriate vehicle for concluding our exchanges and will enable the Commission to official conclude this matter. Without such action on the part of the Commission there will be no official closure to this case.

Please review the agreement and let me of any questions or concerns you may have regarding this matter.
