Enclosed are some enlightening advertisements by the above referenced political action committee. It is interesting to note this committee was formed in Las Vegas on July 29, 1998. They sold memberships that day for \$25.00 each, small business \$100.00 each, silver corporate at \$250.00 and gold corporate at \$500.00 each. Many memberships of varying levels were sold.

As you will note from the enclosed advertisements and articles they continued selling memberships and having fund raisers prior to registering with the Federal Election Commission in February of 1999. They did not report the money collected accurately or the amount collected as of the date they registered.

Note the fund-raisers held with the APG of CA. This is a non-profit tax exempt organization. Note on one of the forms this organization was formerly the California Gamefowl Breeders Association. (The front of their January 2001 newsletter is enclosed. Note on this newsletter a fund-raiser is advertised and was held on February 10, 2001.

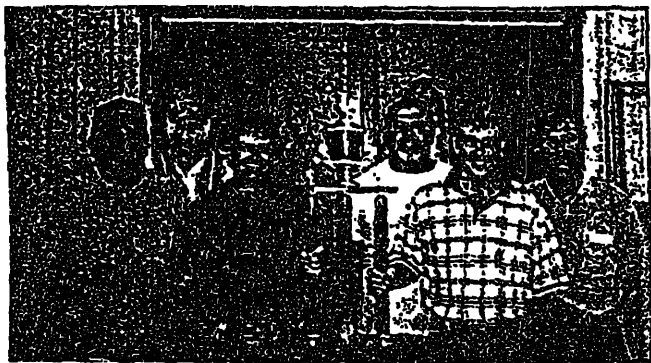
It appears from the posting on the FEC website they requested termination status in November of 2000. If that is the case one would think they would no longer collect funds for a PAC.

It is a fact this group has collected large amount of funds not reported to the FEC and are still doing the same. Most of this money collected was cash.

This information is confidential but could be useful to the FEC if an audit of this PAC is necessary.

fish oil, etc. One half of their diet should be a good 20% protein pellet. So if you mix five pounds of scratch, you should mix five pounds of pellets, then add some dry dog food, a little bit of Calf Manna and if you can find any fish oil, mix a tablespoon per each pound of feed.

I will list some other feeds and the percentage of protein they contain as some of these feeds may be easier to find in your area: Barley 11.6%, Beef Scraps 58%, Coconut Meal 22%, Cowpea 23%, Field Peas 22%, Oat Groats 16%, Peanuts 24%, Soybeans 37%, Sunflower Seeds 16%. Fish meal or fish oil is over 40% protein and is very good for poultry.

Your bird must have clean fresh water before them at all times, but especially during the molt. A

A neglected chicken is like a man in a jail cell. He soon loses his vitality and is in a poor mental state. This is so important that I will give them some greens like lettuce or an apple three times a week, then every ten days I go out at night and give them 1/2 cc of B-12 injectable and a Cod Liver Oil capsule. Then I move them to 3 different coops, this gives them a new territory to see for the next 10 days and keeps them mentally alert. Additionally, I mix a bag of A, D & E powder with a bag of Vita-Tone powder and run this three times a week, 1/2 teaspoon in all the water bowls. When handling the birds, I check for lice & mites. If any are seen, I dab a little wipe around the vent, under each wing & on the back of the neck. Also if the bird is a

chicken deprived of water dies much faster than when deprived of food. Fifty-five percent of the live weight of the chicken is water, and it is water that helps regulate the body temperature during the hot months, that is why the chickens should have clean water every day.

good eater but is not in good flesh, I give him a worm pill.

I fully realize that all this is a lot of work and most people are basically lazy and won't go to all the trouble, but I feel that anything that is worth doing right and all the little extra things you do for your fowl during the molt will definitely pay off later on!

HISTORY IS MADE AAHC-PAC IS FORMED

The formation of the American Animal Husbandry Coalition Political Action Committee is a historical milestone for the game chicken fraternity. Only the creation of the UGBA itself can match the significance of this development. AAHC-PAC brings us up to current standards in political activity. The UGBA Board of Directors voted to encourage and "bless" the AAHC-PAC, but to remain totally independent of AAHC-PAC. It is important for all cockers to know that AAHC-PAC and UGBA are not in competition. AAHC-PAC is available to handle issues such as political involvement, which the UGBA cannot legally do. AAHC-PAC is not another Melville-type movement.

AAHC-PAC (commonly being pronounced ACK-PACK) intends to be an effective force for cockfighters. We will pay lobby taxes on our money, and be registered with the Federal Election Commission, as well as make required reportings to the IRS. We do not have to make apologies or excuses for being cockfighters.

There are no paid employees of AAHC-PAC, and no one is receiving any personal benefit. All funds raised by the PAC will go directly to assist the cockers in our battle to remain legal where we are legal. We also intend to align ourselves with other groups that are having problems with the animal rights movement.

We are immediately beginning our fundraising and membership drives. Once we have money, we will make grants to states that are under assault. For instance, we hope to still be able to help Arizona and Missouri, although the process is way along in those states. We also will provide funds for states that want to fight bad legislation or pass

By the time this article is printed, we will have an official logo. Advertisers can display our logo if they are our members. 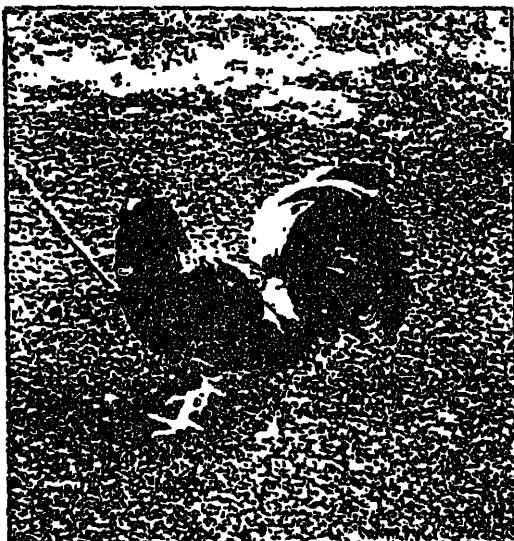

put someone in office or took them out. Mr. Cunningham is willing to take the Political Wing of AAHC-PAC and achieve this Goal. We will finance this endeavor and hopefully with some hard work some Senator will be looking for a job in November of 2000.

In March AAHC-PAC agreed to let UGBA share the cost of hiring J. Bennett Johnston to lobby for us in Washington DC. 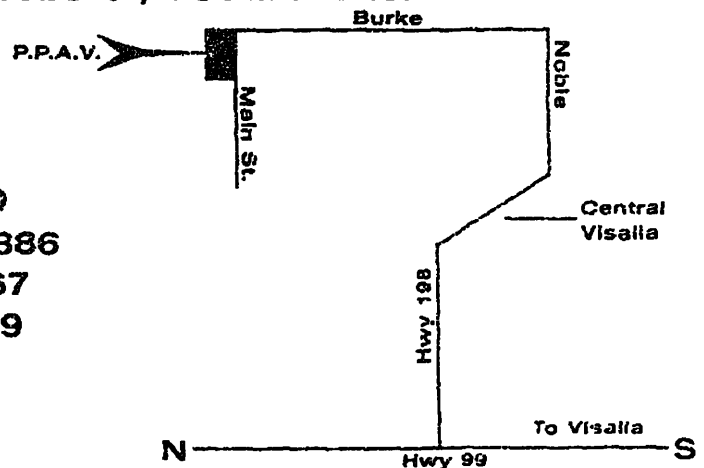

Over the many years I have raised Hennies I have been asked the same question over and over. What strain of chickens are your Hennies? Are the Hennies a Hatch, a Whitehackle breed or some other family of Gamefowl? My answer has been that they are a strain in of themselves originating in this country from Ireland for the most part. This is not to say that once in America they have not had other strains of fowl blended together with them.

Livestock breeders often loosely use the word "strain". Men claim to have a strain of their own when actually they have no such thing. They buy animals here and there, they inbreed a little (and not very skillfully) they outcross frequently, they produce specimens of varying type some good, some bad. They have no right to state that they have a strain at all. Without inbreeding a strain cannot be founded. He who desires to establish one has to rely on home bred animals, whereas he who makes no attempt to build up a family line must place his faith on individuals which he buys or has been given to him on good faith.

The bulls-eye of the breeder with high ambition should be to own collection of birds all of high quality and all so alike in general appearance that they are distinguishable as being of a certain ownership.

When he has achieved this then, and only then, can a breeder claim to have a strain worthy to bear his name. Great success in the ring alone cannot give him the authority to make this assertion because he may have won most of the contests with purchased birds or with some home-bred specimens unrelated and dissimilar general characteristics.

The LGBA is proud to have hard

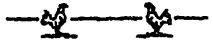

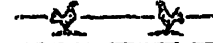

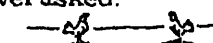

Letter from our President:

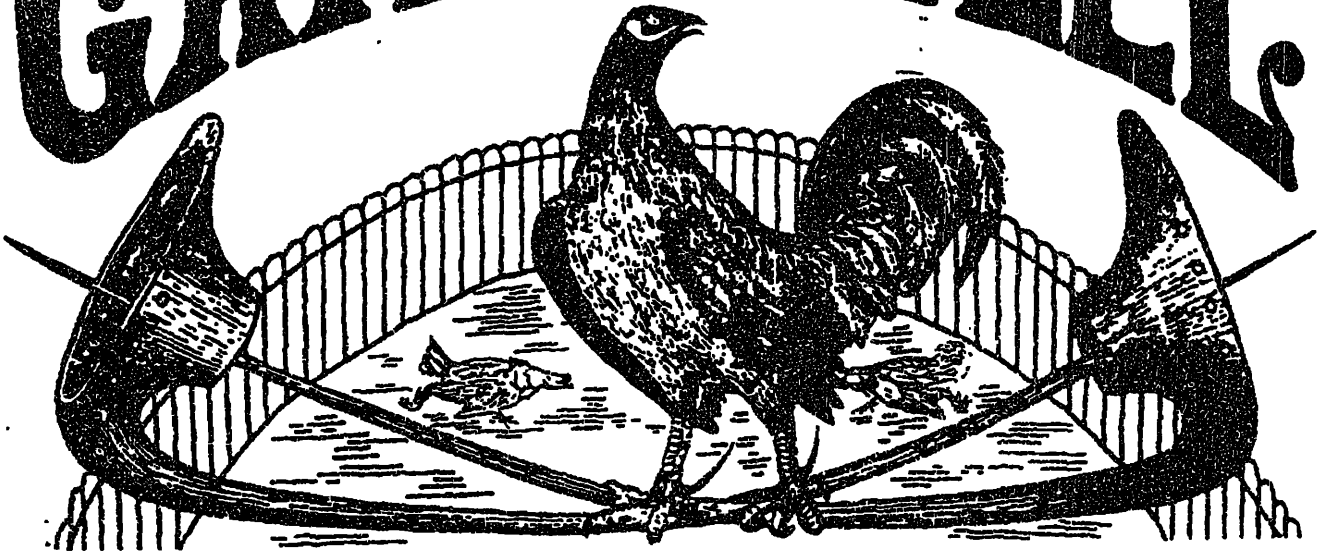

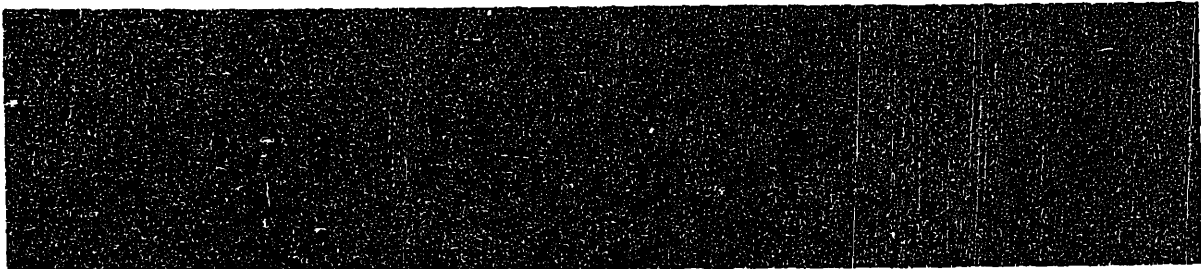

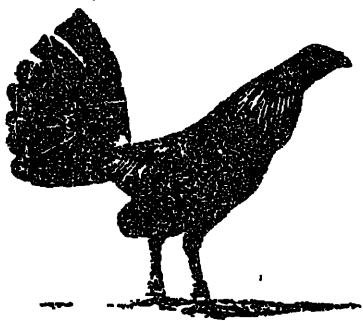
