Dear Mr. Northam:

Enclosed is the signed copy of the agreement resolving the complaint filed on June 14, 2004 with the Federal Election Commission ("FEC/Commission") against Cannon for Congress, Curtis S. Bramble, Treasurer, Christopher Cannon and Marco Diaz ("Respondents). The agreement for ADR 207-B (MUR 5464) was approved by the Commission on June 3, 2005 – the effective date of the agreement.

Note that paragraph 9 of the agreement specifies that Respondents shall comply with the terms of this settlement within twelve (12) months of the effective date of the agreement. Please forward to this office, a statement confirming Respondents' compliance with the terms listed in paragraph 6 of the aforementioned agreement. The letter should note the date on which Respondents satisfied each of the terms listed in paragraph 6.

As you are aware, the settlement agreement will be made part of the record that is released to the public. The Commission will also place on the record copies of the complaint/referral, correspondence exchanged between your office and this office prior to our entry into settlement negotiations and reports prepared for the Commission by this office to assist in its consideration of this matter. The Commission is obliged by Federal statute to place on the public record documents in closed enforcement and alternative dispute resolution cases; accordingly, copies of documents relative to this matter will be forwarded shortly to the FEC's Public Information Office.

This agreement resolves the matter that was brought to the attention of the FEC by Russell Sias regarding an alleged violation of the federal election campaign laws. I appreciate your assistance in effectively resolving this matter and bringing the case to a mutually acceptable conclusion.
